## **Beef Co-products**

Due to COVID-19 some of the usual respondents were unavailable to provide their data which may impact the veracity of some price averages.

Beef offal prices remained firm across the range of products with honeycomb tripe, omasum and lungs and livers trending down.

### Head offal

Prices for head offal products were generally firmer this month. Head meat averaged \$5.37/kg which was 43¢/ kg higher year-on-year and 42¢/kg above last month. Cheek meat was 19¢/kg dearer than year-ago levels, averaging \$7.92kg, and 20¢/kg firmer than last month.

Lip export prices to the US and Mexico firmed 9¢/kg month-on-month, to average \$4.02/kg and 59¢/kg up on last year. Halal lips averaged \$4.32/kg, down 43¢/kg from last month and 77¢/kg higher than March 2020.





Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

### Beef offal trends

Omasum eased 48¢/kg from last month, to average \$5.78/kg, down \$1.92/kg from year-ago prices. Halal omasum averaged \$6.95/kg, down 92¢/kg year-on-year but 65¢/kg firmer month-on month.

Halal tripe pieces averaged \$3.20 down 48¢/kg year-on-year but 40¢/kg up from last month. Non-halal tripe pieces were even year-on-year but 12¢/kg higher than February to average \$2.67kg. Honeycomb tripe averaged \$6.99/kg to be 71¢/kg below year ago prices and 31¢/kg below last month.






### Beef offal trends continued...

Aorta traded stronger to average \$7.96/kg up 37¢/kg month-on-month but even with March 2020 price.

Heart prices were up from last month, averaging \$3.58/kg, to be \$1.38/kg above year-ago levels and 16¢/kg above February prices. Halal hearts averaged \$3.88/kg, firming 13¢/kg month-on-month and up \$1.40/kg from March 2020.



Kidneys averaged \$1.12/kg, down 3¢/kg on February price but 13¢/kg firmer than a year ago. Non-halal lungs were reported at \$1.85/kg down 18¢/kg from year ago levels and 75¢/kg softer month-on-month, while halal lungs averaged \$2.65/kg, up 53¢/kg year-on-year.

#### Beef offal trends continued...

Liver prices averaged \$1.54/kg, up 14¢/kg month-on-month but 4¢/kg softer than year-ago levels. Halal livers were down 21¢/kg from last month's price to average \$1.62kg, down 9¢/kg on last year prices.




### Japanese and Korean Offals

Tongue prices were 62¢/kg up from February to average \$13.85/kg, and \$1.65/kg above year-ago levels.

Thick skirt was 60¢/kg softer year-on-year and 13¢/kg lower than last month, averaging \$8.57/kg. Thin skirt averaged \$8.79/kg, down 4¢/kg from February but \$1.34 below year-ago prices.

Rumen pillars firmed with heavy weight product averaging \$10.95/kg, up \$1.28/kg month-on-month and \$4.05/kg cheaper than March 2020 levels.

### Tails and Tendons

Tail prices to Korea firmed 28¢/kg from last month, averaging \$11.70/kg, to be \$1.45/kg above year-ago levels. Halal tails averaged \$11.77/kg, up 37¢/kg from last month but \$1.07/kg above year-ago prices. Tendons averaged \$7.63 this month to be down 55¢/kg month-on-month and even with last March.



## **Sheep Co-products**

Sheep offal prices were generally firmer for March. with additional reporting helping to provide a wider range of prices.



### Sheep offal


Sheep hearts averaged \$3.58/kg, down 17¢/kg month-on-month and 40¢/kg dearer than year-ago levels. Sheep kidneys were reported at \$5.78/kg which was \$1.22 above last year price. Sheep liver price averaged 1.68/kg to be 35¢/kg down year-on-year.

Sheep tripe averaged \$5.25/kg, which is \$1.30/kg above year ago prices and up 15¢/kg month-on-month, Long cut tongues were quoted at \$4.65/kg.

Lamb runners averaged \$6.25/piece firming \$3.00/piece year-on-year while sheep runners were reported at \$5.25/piece, up \$3.45/piece from March 2020.



#### Figure 9: Trends in runner prices





Rendered meals and tallow prices remained firm on the back of reduced production.

The price for 50% protein MBM firmed \$23/tonne from last month, averaging \$705/tonne which was \$195/ tonne above March 2020 levels. Blood meal averaged \$1220/tonne, up \$295/tonne compared with last year's price, and \$90/tonne firmer month-on-month.

Tallow prices were firmer, with the price for 1% FFA tallow averaging \$1215/tonne, up \$115/tonne from March 2020 and \$110/tonne above last month prices.

Local prices for hides continued to improve with prices for better quality product up \$10 to \$15 per piece above year ago levels.






## **Currency exchange**

The Australian dollar eased on average against the US dollar during March. It opened the month at 77.45US¢ to trade up to 78.27US¢ before easing to finish the month at 76.02US¢ to average 77.11US¢, an increase of 0.44US¢ month-on-month, and up 14.82US¢ from March 2020.
