Beef Co-products

Beef offal prices in February were firmer across most items while tongues, cheek meat, tripe pieces and halal heart prices eased.



Head offal

Head meat averaged \$6.47/kg which was \$1.10/kg higher year-on-year and 10¢/kg above last month. Cheek meat was \$1.41/kg dearer than year-ago levels, averaging \$9.33/kg, to be 44¢/kg lower month-on-month.


Lip export prices to the US and Mexico firmed 22¢/kg month-on-month, averaging \$4.57/kg to be 55¢/kg up on last year. Halal lips averaged \$5.03/kg to be 71¢/kg firmer than March 2021 and 21¢/kg firmer than last month.



Beef offal trends

Omasum firmed 18¢/kg from last month, to average \$7.35/kg, up \$1.57/kg from year-ago prices. Halal omasum averaged \$7.63/kg, up 68¢/kg year-on-year and 28¢/kg higher month-on month.

Halal tripe pieces averaged \$2.90/kg down 30¢/kg year-on-year and 33¢/kg softer than last month. Non-halal tripe pieces were 36¢/kg down year-on-year and 7¢/kg lower than February to average \$2.31/kg. Honeycomb tripe averaged \$6.98/kg to be 1¢/kg below year ago prices and 13¢/kg up on last month.




Beef offal trends continued...

Aorta firmed to average \$12.65/kg up \$3.48/kg month-on-month and \$4.70/kg above the March 2021 price.


Heart prices were up from last month, averaging $3.01 \, \text{kg}$, to be $57 \, \text{kg}$ below year-ago levels but $30 \, \text{kg}$ above the February price. Halal hearts averaged $3.01 \, \text{kg}$, easing $38 \, \text{kg}$ month-on-month and down $87 \, \text{kg}$ from March 2021.

Kidneys were not reported while lungs realised \$2.10/kg up 25 ¢/kg from year ago levels but 5 ¢/kg softer month-on-month, while halal lungs averaged \$4.86/kg, up \$2.21/kg year-on-year and 1 ¢/kg higher than last month.


Figure 4: Trends in beef offal prices



Beef offal trends continued...

Liver prices averaged \$1.85kg, up 9¢/kg month-on-month and 31¢/kg firmer than year-ago levels. Halal livers were 1¢/kg down on last month's price to average \$2.00/kg to be up 38¢/kg on last year prices.

Figure 5: Trends in beef offal prices




Japanese and Korean Offals

Tongue prices were \$2.33/kg down from February to average \$18.67/kg but were \$4.82/kg above year-ago levels.

Thick skirt was \$2.10/kg higher year-on-year but 17¢/kg softer than last month, averaging \$10.67/kg. Thin skirt averaged \$10.42/kg, up 17¢/kg from February and \$1.63/kg above year-ago prices.

Rumen pillars firmed with heavy weight product averaging \$11.40/kg, up 32¢/kg month-on-month and 45¢/kg higher than March 2021 levels.


Figure 6: Trends in Japanese offal prices



Tails and Tendons

Tail prices firmed 85¢/kg from last month, averaging \$18.35/kg, to be \$6.65/kg above year-ago levels. Halal tails averaged \$18.31/kg, down 45¢/kg from last month but \$6.54/kg above year-ago prices. Tendons averaged \$7.73/kg to be 10¢/kg above March 2021 price but \$4.42/kg down on last month.

Sheep Co-products

Sheep offal prices fluctuated with kidneys and tripe under downward pressure.



Sheep offal

Sheep hearts averaged \$5.22/kg, up 40¢/kg month-on-month and \$1.64/kg dearer than year-ago levels. Sheep kidneys were reported at \$4.72/kg which was 90¢/kg below the February price. Sheep liver averaged \$2.82/kg to be \$1.06/kg firmer month-on-month and \$1.14/kg higher than March 2021.

Sheep tripe was averaged \$2.80 this month to be \$2.45 below year ago price. Long cut tongues averaged \$6.25/kg up 30¢/kg month-on-month and \$1.60 firmer than last year.

Lamb runners averaged \$7.07/piece firming 82¢/piece year-on-year and 62¢/piece up from February while sheep runners were reported at 6.07/piece, up 79¢/piece month-on-month and up 82¢/piece year-on-year.




The average foetal calf blood price has firmed \$155/litre year-on-year to average \$615/litre, up \$1.67/litre on last month.

Rendered products

Rendered products remained firm with tallow prices remaining very strong based on biofuel demand from Singapore and the USA coupled with reduced production.



The price for 50% protein MBM firmed \$57/tonne from last month, averaging \$798/tonne which was \$93tonne above March 2021 levels. Blood meal averaged \$1337/tonne, up \$117/tonne compared with last year's price, but \$113/tonne softer month-on-month.

Tallow prices were very firm, with the price for 1% FFA tallow averaging \$2370/tonne, up \$1155/tonne from March 2021 and \$130/tonne above last month price.

Hides

The hide market eased with orders lighter than usual for the period whilst shipping costs continue to rise with all parties of the transport chain blaming the other for the massive increases and consumers wearing the cost.




Figure 13: Trends in hide prices (East Coast Ex Works)
