




Co-product market report

Beef Co-products

Due to COVID-19 some of the usual respondents were unavailable to provide their data which may impact the veracity of some price averages.

Beef offal prices were firmer across most products, with cheek meat and head meat softer.

Head offal


Prices for head offal products were down this month. Head meat averaged \$5.05/kg which was 68¢/kg softer year-on-year and 18¢/kg lower than last month. Cheek meat was 52¢/kg dearer than year-ago levels, averaging \$7.56kg, but 28¢/kg softer than last month.

Lip export prices to the US and Mexico eased 18¢/kg month-on-month, to average \$3.15/kg and 25¢/kg down on last year. Halal lips averaged \$3.72/kg, down 1¢/kg from last month and 22¢/kg higher than December 2019.

Beef offal trends

Omasum firmed 28 ¢/kg from last month, to average \$6.58/kg, up 55 ¢/kg from year-ago prices. Halal omasum averaged \$6.79/kg, down \$1.91/kg year-on-year but 56 ¢/kg firmer month-on month.

Halal tripe pieces averaged \$2.98 down 42¢/kg year-on-year and 15¢/kg down from last month. Non-halal tripe pieces were 52¢/kg down year-on-year and 6¢/kg lower than November to average \$2.80/kg. Honeycomb tripe averaged \$7.36/kg to be 94¢/kg below year ago prices but 25¢/kg above last month.




Beef offal trends continued...

Aorta traded firmer to average \$7.85/kg up 2¢/kg month-on-month but down 28¢/kg from December 2019 price.


Heart prices were up from last month, averaging \$3.15/kg, to be 62 ¢/kg above year-ago levels and 19 ¢/kg above November prices. Halal hearts averaged \$3.15/kg, firming 12 ¢/kg month-on-month, but up 70 ¢/kg from December 2019.

Kidneys averaged \$1.48/kg, up 60¢/kg on November price and 50¢/kg firmer than a year ago. Non-halal lungs were reported at \$2.09/kg up 66¢/kg from year ago levels and 32¢/kg firmer month-on-month, while halal lungs averaged \$2.55/kg to be 15¢/kg up month-on-month but 80¢/kg up on year ago prices.


Figure 4: Trends in beef offal prices



Beef offal trends continued...

Liver prices averaged \$1.28/kg, 19¢/kg up month-on-month and 19¢/kg firmer than year-ago levels. Halal livers were up 11¢/kg from last month's price to average \$1.50kg, down 25¢/kg on last year prices.

Figure 5: Trends in beef offal prices




Japanese and Korean Offals

Tongue prices were \$2.41/kg up from November to average \$11.27/kg, and \$1.93/kg below year-ago levels.

Thick skirt was \$1.53/kg softer year-on-year and 27¢/kg lower than last month, averaging \$8.28/kg. Thin skirt averaged \$8.94/kg, down 39¢/kg from November and \$1.02 below year-ago prices.

Rumen pillars firmed with heavy weight product averaging \$9.96/kg, up 6¢/kg month-on-month but \$6.17/kg cheaper than December 2019 levels.


Figure 6: Trends in Japanese offal prices



Tails and Tendons

Tail prices to Korea eased 3¢/kg from last month, averaging \$10.63/kg, to be 45¢/kg above year-ago levels. Halal tails averaged \$11.15/kg, up 40¢/kg from last month and 82¢/kg above year-ago prices. Tendons averaged \$7.73 this month to be 10¢/kg up month-on-month and 73¢/kg dearer than last December.

Sheep Co-products

Sheep offal prices have been lightly reported for some time but were generally softer.



Sheep offal

Sheep hearts averaged \$3.30/kg, down 25¢/kg month-on-month but 2¢/kg dearer than year-ago levels. Sheep kidneys were not reported while sheep livers were reported at \$1.50/kg up 5¢/kg from November and 2¢/kg softer year-on-year.


Sheep tripe was reported to average 5.20/kg, which is 1.07/kg above year ago prices but down 7¢/kg monthon-month, whilst long cut tongues were not reported.

Lamb runners averaged \$4.88/piece to be \$1.51 up year-on-year while sheep runners were reported at \$3.75/piece which is \$1.92/piece firmer than a year ago.




Foetal calf blood has firmed \$47/litre year-on-year to average \$460/litre.



The price for 50% protein MBM firmed \$8/tonne from last month, averaging \$682/tonne, and \$195/tonne above December 2019 levels. Blood meal averaged \$1118/tonne, up \$327/tonne compared with last year's price, and \$133/tonne firmer month-on-month.

Tallow prices were firmer, with the price for 1% FFA tallow averaging \$1040/tonne, up \$77/tonne from November and \$134/tonne above year-ago prices.

The hide market continues to show further signs of recovery with the upholstery and automotive sector showing improved demand.




Figure 13: Trends in hide prices (East Coast Ex Works)



Currency exchange

The Australian dollar firmed against the US dollar during December. It opened the month at 73.68US¢ to trade up to finish the month at 77.02US¢ to average 75.20US¢, an increase of 2.56US¢ month-on-month, and up 6.43US¢ from December 2019.
