Amendment Advice 7/2014 - 22nd August 2014

TO: All Meat Standards Australia (MSA) licensed sheep processors ATTENTION: MSA Coordinator

It is a requirement of a Meat Standards Australia (MSA) licensed sheep processor to adhere to the relevant sections of the current MSA Standards Manual for the processing of lamb and sheep that follow MSA pathways.

MSA advises an amendment has been made to the MSA Standards which have been reformatted into supply chain sections. The sections relevant to MSA sheep processors include:

Section 1 – Foreword and Introduction

Section 3 – Licence and Trade Mark

Section 8 - Processors

Section 12 – Compliance and audit requirements

Section 13 - Suspension or Termination and Dispute Resolution

Section 14 – MLA Privacy Policy

SUMMARY OF MAJOR AMENDMENTS

Section 12 – Compliance and audit requirements	Amendment has been made to the training requirements for carcase measurements.
Audit guidance material 12.9.2 - Processors, Independent Boning Rooms / Value Adders	All graders must hold current appropriate qualifications For Sheep – minimum training requirements as per the Aus-Meat National Accreditation Standards Appendices 4 Carcase Measurements
Criteria 8.6	
	If no evidence is available to show grader currency then a MAJOR non-conformance is issued. If the person grading has not undergone the required training then a MAJOR non-conformance is to be issued.
