


# Lot feeding brief



## RESULTS FOR THE JUNE QUARTER 2016 FEEDLOT SURVEY


- The latest ALFA/MLA feedlot survey results indicate that, at the end of the June quarter, 910,967 head of cattle were on feed nationally, down marginally from the previous quarter and 5% lower year-on-year. Compared to the March quarter, declines of 2% in NSW (285,128 head), 32% in SA (16,990 head) and 24% in WA (30,393 head) were offset by a greater number of cattle on feed in Queensland (up 4%, to 515,088 head) and Victoria (up 1%, to 63,368 head).
- The A\$ traded at an average of 75US¢ for the June quarter – 4% lower than year-ago levels. Against the Yen, the A\$ was also weaker, with the quarterly average falling 15% year-on-year to 80.57¥. Against the Korean Won, however, the A\$ lifted 2% from the same time last year, averaging 867.73₩.
- Australian grainfed beef exports for the June quarter 2016 were up 5% (2,975 tonnes swt) from the corresponding period last year, to 68,928 tonnes swt following a 3% year-on-year increase in grainfed cattle turnoff (712,504 head).
- Grainfed shipments to Japan increased 1% year-onyear, to 35,316 tonnes swt - with increased volumes of brisket (up 23%) enough to offset declines in

manufacturing beef, fullset and chuck roll, as competitive pressure from US product increases. Volumes to Korea lifted 23% from year-ago levels, to 12,799 tonnes swt for the June quarter, consisting mostly of blade and brisket.




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## Results for the 2016 feedlot survey - June quarter


- Grainfed exports to China reached 5,546 tonnes swt, up 6% from the June guarter 2015, while shipments to the EU lifted 15%, to 4,897 tonnes swt. In contrast, exports to the Middle East (1,578 tonnes swt) and the US (3,392 tonnes swt) for the guarter declined 41% and 22% year-on-year, respectively.
- For the April to June period, the eastern states feeder cattle indicator averaged 311¢/kg lwt, up 56¢/kg lwt year-on-year, largely driven by strong restocker competition following widespread rain and an above average seasonal outlook.



Somewhat offsetting the higher cattle prices for lot feeders were lower feed grain and fodder prices during the quarter, largely due to high global grain availability and recent widespread rain. Barley ex-Darling Downs declined 22% year-on-year, to \$248/tonne, sorghum was 26% lower, averaging \$225/ tonne, and wheat averaged \$268/tonne for the guarter, down 17% from the corresponding period last year.
