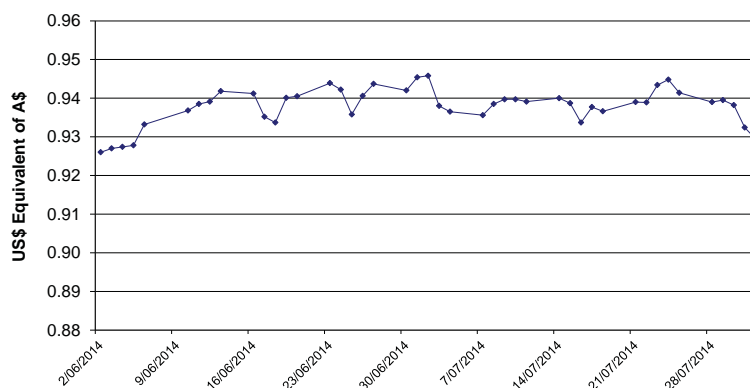

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$ each or/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

June - July Exchange rate



The AUD/USD exchange rate dipped slightly towards the end of the month with a slightly lower average compared to June.

Offal Prices

Halal and Sheep offal prices were generally weaker in July due to Ramadan with heavy purchases in June prior to the commencement. In other markets beef offals were generally steady. The exception was products for the Chinese market, particularly omasum and honeycomb.

The trends in head offal prices are shown in Figure 1.

The average price of cheek meat was back to normal prices at around \$4.00 with both domestic and export prices quoted.

The average price of head meat was 27¢ higher than the June price at \$3.43/kg. The average price is a combination of Halal and non-Halal prices.

Beef lips remained steady at around \$2.78/kg.

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

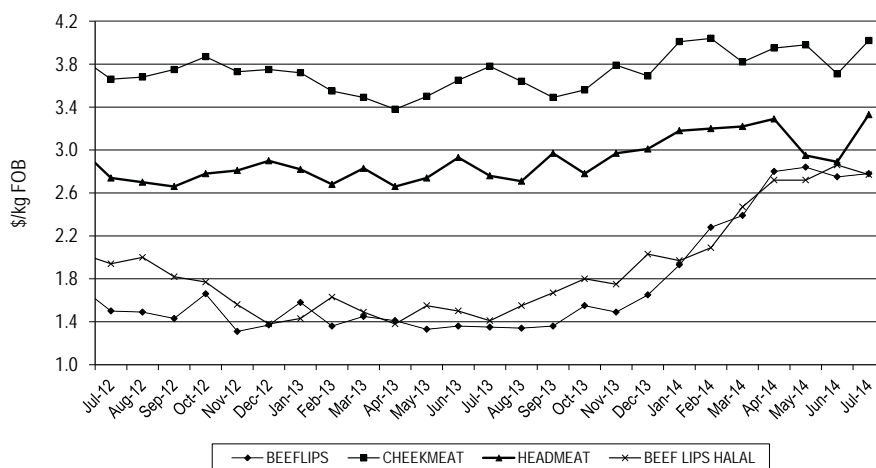
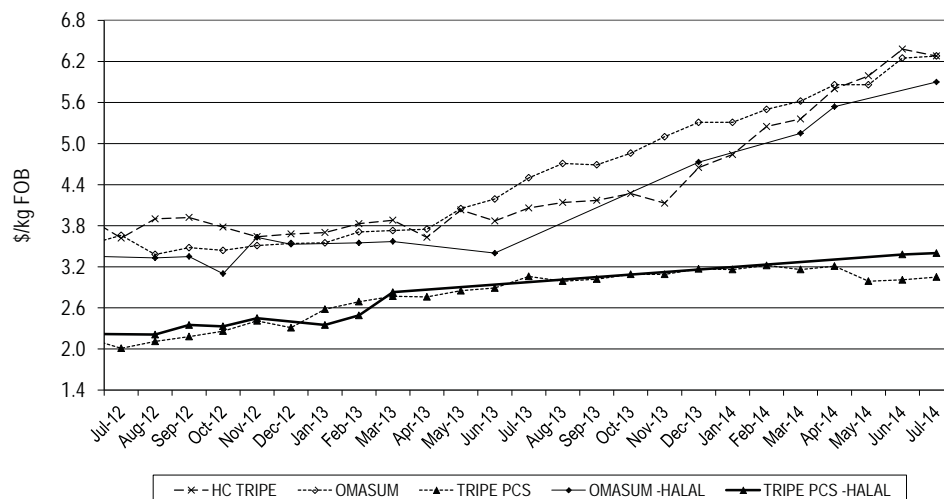


Figure 2: Trends in beef tripe prices



The average price of tripe pieces was steady at \$3.05/kg and halal tripe pieces flat.

Demand for omasum and honeycomb in Hong Kong remains firm.

Honeycomb prices were 10¢ lighter at an average price of \$6.28/kg and omasum prices were steady at an average price of \$6.28/kg.

Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices

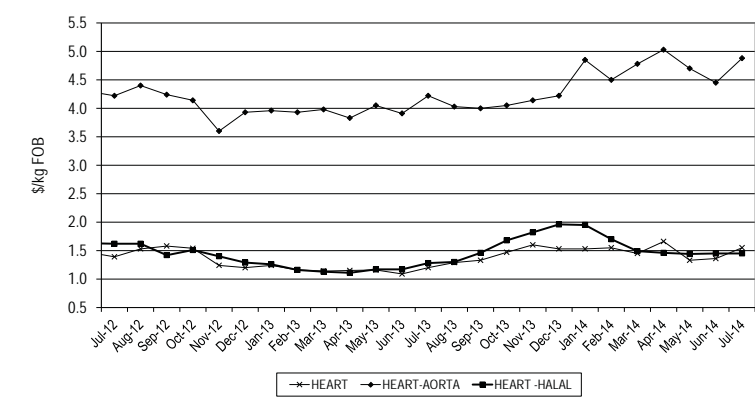


Figure 3b: Trends in beef offal prices

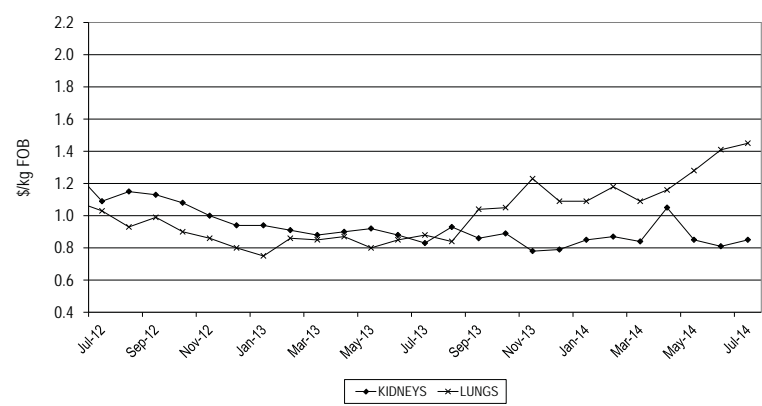
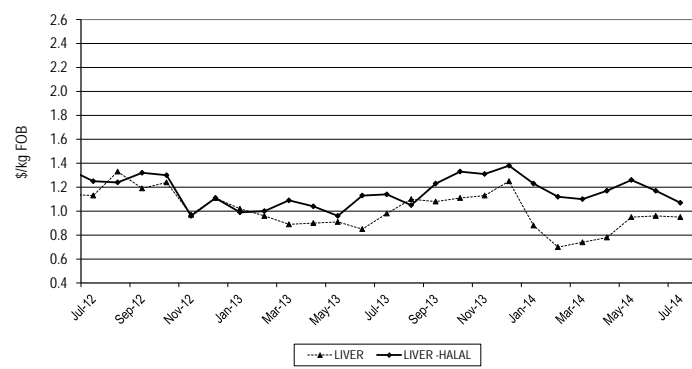


Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



Hearts both halal and non-halal remained strong with a improvement of 18c for non-halal product averaging \$1.55/kg. Halal hearts were steady at \$1.45/kg. Aorta clawed back some of last months loss to average \$4.88/kg, up 37¢.

Kidneys remain flat whilst halal lungs strengthened 5c/kg.

The average price of non-Halal liver was almost unchanged at \$0.96/kg whilst halal livers slumped with the Ramadan lull from \$1.17 t \$1.07, a 10 cent drop.

Japanese Offals

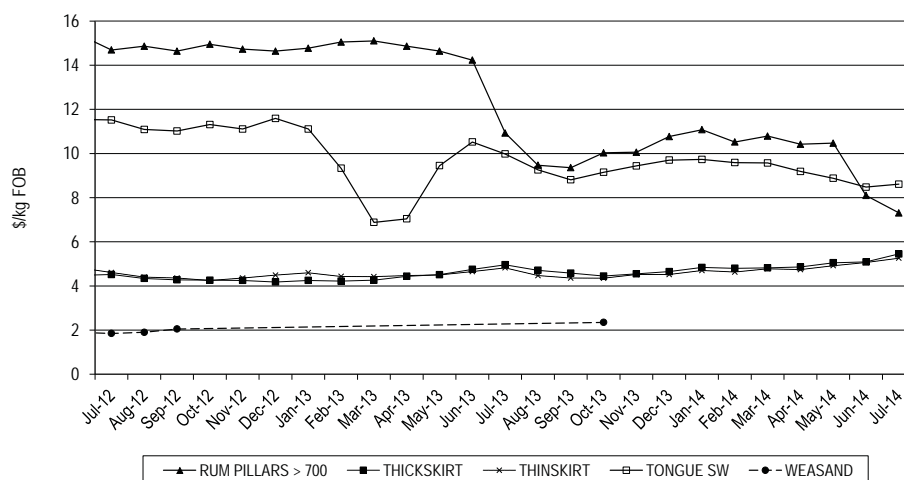
The Japanese tongue market remained steady at the lower levels seen recently.

The average price of tongues to Japan was 13¢ higher at \$8.61/kg. Prices have been affected by the availability of USA tongues and weaker seasonal demand.

Prices of rumen pillars were lower. The average price of high weight-range pillars (>700g) was \$0.79 lower at \$7.31/kg. The average price of 500-700g pillars was \$1.28 lower at \$4.81/kg. The average price of <500g pillars was \$0.81cents lower at \$3.50/kg.

Demand in the Korean market is firm. Thick skirt prices were 36¢ higher at an average price of \$5.45/kg and the average price of thin skirt was 20¢ higher at 5.26/kg. The Japanese market is not matching the Korean price for thick and thin skirt and product is going mainly to Korea. The average price of cheek meat was higher at about \$4.00/kg up from around \$3.70.

Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices

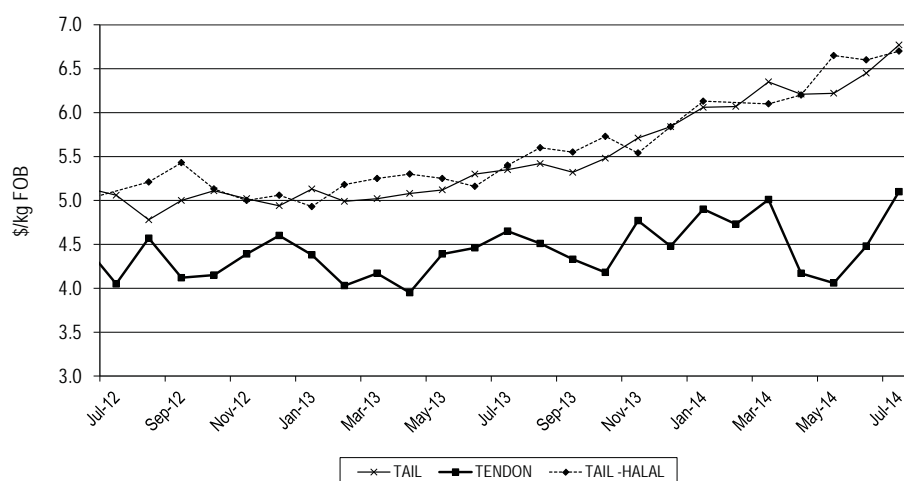


Tails and Tendons

Tail prices continued to rise, up 32¢ to \$6.75/kg whilst halal tails felt the Ramadan lull, falling 10¢ to \$6.50/kg.

Tendons continued last months recovery moving 62¢ to average \$5.10, the highest average for the last two years.

Sheep Offals

Trends in sheep offal prices were mostly lower in July again due to Ramadan.

Sheep tripe prices were 12¢ lower at an average price of \$3.65/kg. Demand for tripe in Hong Kong is reported to be steady.

The average price of kidneys was 20¢ lower in July falling to \$3.60/kg. The price of sheep livers was 5¢ lower at an average price of \$1.28/kg. The average price of sheep heart was 7 cent higher in July at \$1.48/kg for bulk-packed hearts.

Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices

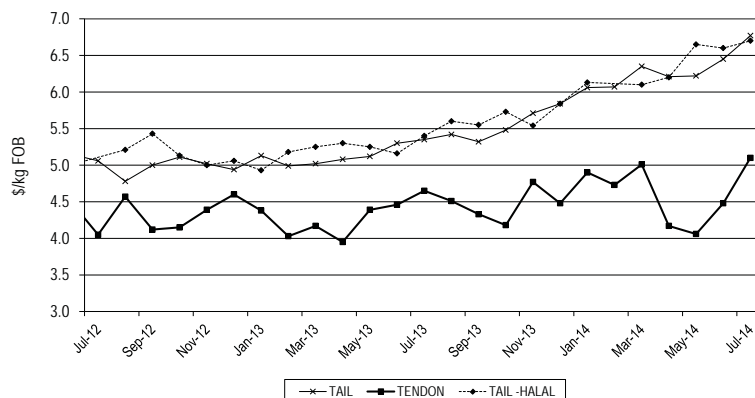
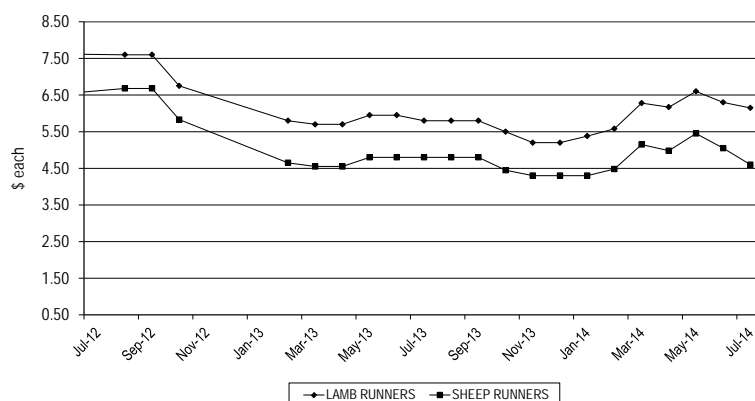


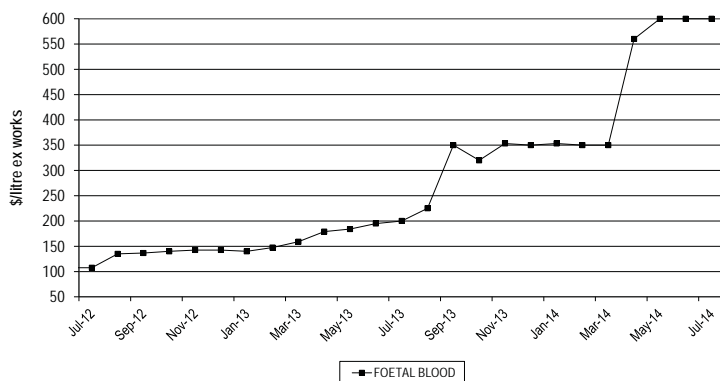
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb runners was 15¢ lower in July at \$6.30/piece. The average price of sheep runners was 45¢ lower at \$4.60/piece.

Pharmaceutical products

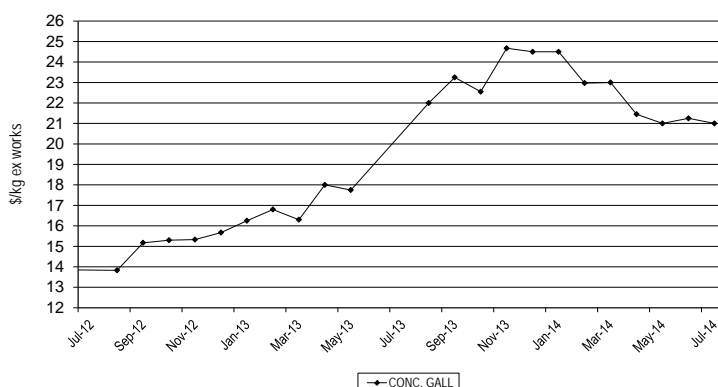
Figure 7a: Trends for foetal blood prices



The average price of foetal calf blood was \$600/litre in July with price remaining at the same level as the previous two month. The two major producers of foetal blood serum products, GE Health Care and Life Technologies, continue to compete for market share and have pushed up prices of Australian foetal calf blood.

Concentrated gall remains relatively steady at prices similar to May and June.

Rendered Products

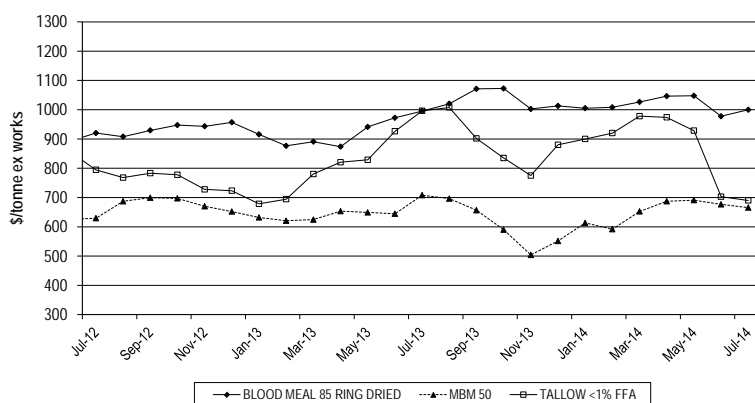
Figure 8 shows the trends in prices paid for rendered co-products. Prices are bulk ex-works/tonne.

Tallow prices were lower in July. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$13 lower at \$690/tonne ex. works. The average price of 2% FFA tallow was \$4 higher at \$676/tonne and the average price of 4% FFA tallow was \$4 higher at \$654.67/tonne.

Meat and bone meal prices were weaker in July with the average price for 50% down to \$665.50, a fall of around \$11.00. Customers in Indonesia had bought forward to make sure that they are covered during Ramadan in July. Supplies in Australia are high due to high kills and USA supplies are also strong making US product available in S.E. Asia. The average price of blood meal was \$23 higher at \$1000/tonne.

Australian tallow prices have been supported by demand from Neste Oil in Singapore to produce renewable fuel for sale in the USA. Neste Oil has scheduled a maintenance shut down in October/November and has stopped buying tallow. In addition, subsidies for renewable fuel in the USA have changed and may not be available for foreign produced fuel. Neste Oil may return to the market for Australian tallow but may not pay large premiums compared with the other markets. In the meantime traders are re-establishing the traditional markets in China, Taiwan and Pakistan where tallow has to be priced relative to palm stearine. The price of palm stearine was slightly higher in July at US\$767/tonne FOB Malaysia .

Co-product values/head

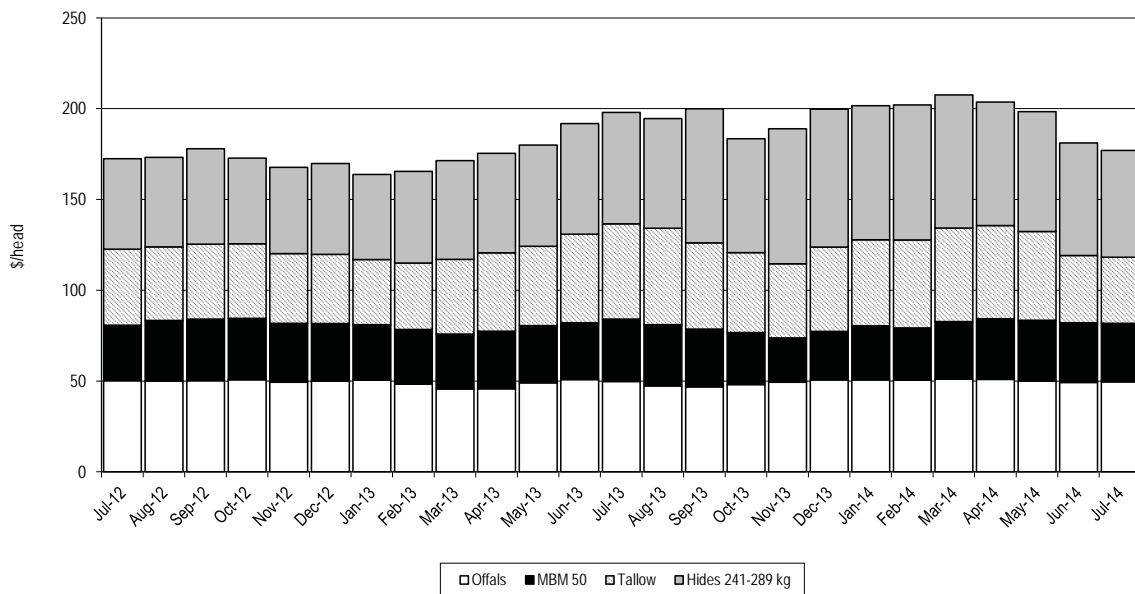
Figure 11. Co-product values for Japanese steer

The following tables and figures (Figures 11-13 with accompanying tables) show the relative value of co-products for different classes of stock over the last two years. The value of co-products/head is calculated by applying an estimated yield for each item of co-product for each type of stock and multiplying the estimated yield by the average price for the month. The estimated yields of edible offals/head were reset in April 2012 to reflect yields reported in the MLA report “Best Practice for Offal Collection”, Project A.COP.0037.

Co-product values were \$5.15 to \$6.75/head lower in July. The effect of the drop in tallow had already been felt in June and falls were mainly on the back of lower hide prices as northern hemisphere tanners are on summer holidays.

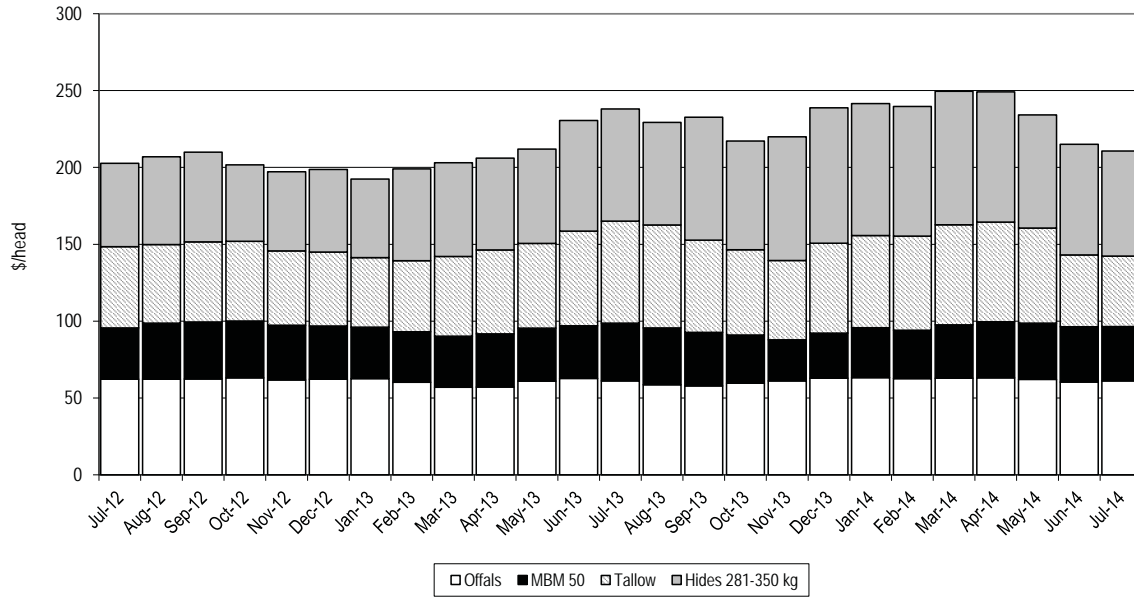
The USDA reports the co-product values of different classes of stock on a daily or weekly basis. The co-product values reported by the USDA are not directly comparable with values shown in Figures 11-13. The USDA figures are based on live weight, they allow for a proportion of condemnation of offals which is different to the model used to create Figures 11 to 13 and they do not include the value of some offals e.g. mountain chain tripe.

Table 2 shows co-product values/head reported by the USDA for the period March 2014 to July 2014.

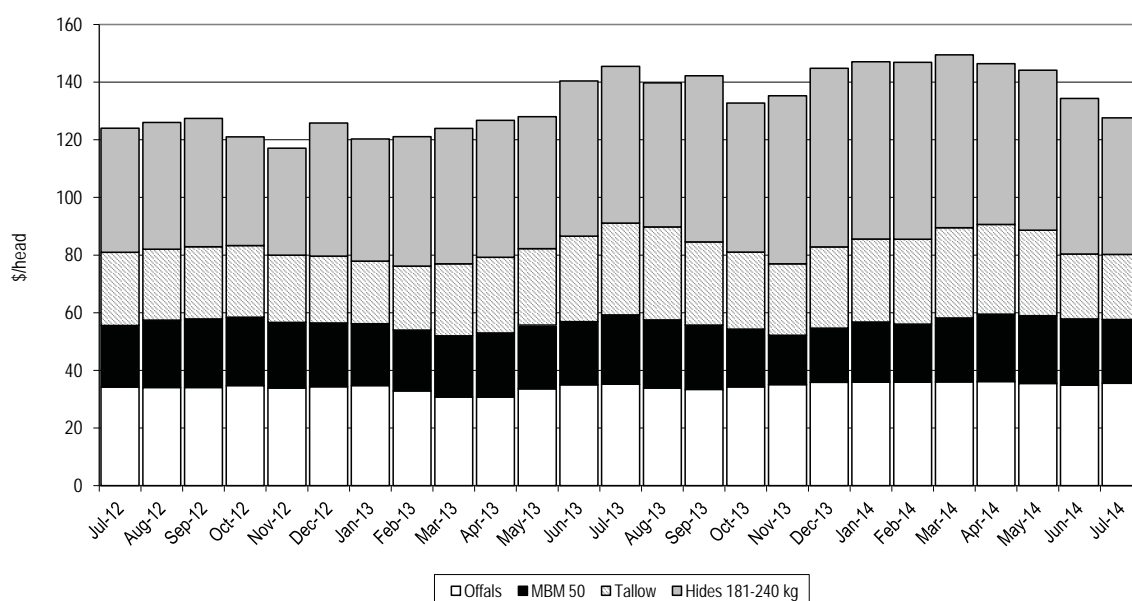
Figure 12. Co-product values for Prime steer

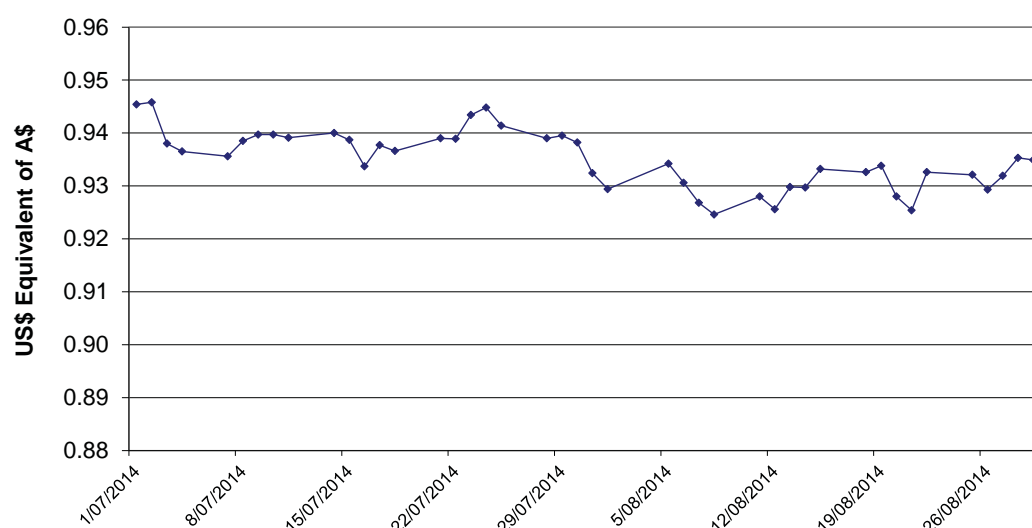

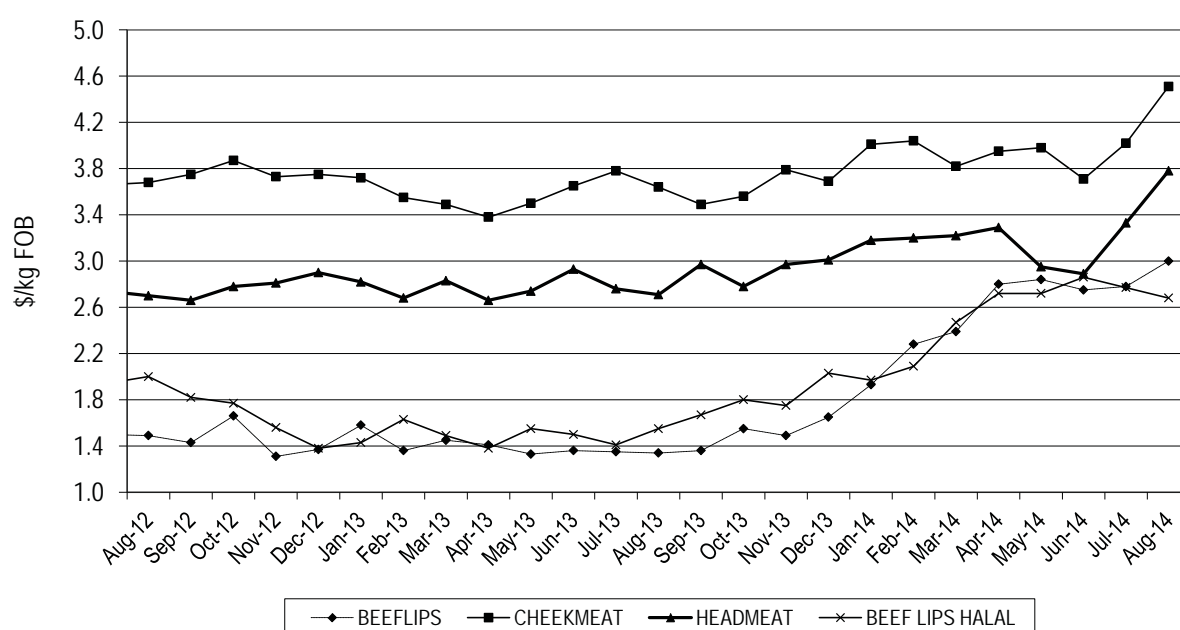
June - July Exchange rate

The trends in head offal prices are shown in Figure 1.

Whilst the trend month on month for head offals has seen a 30 to 40¢ improvement the year on year figures show significant improvement.

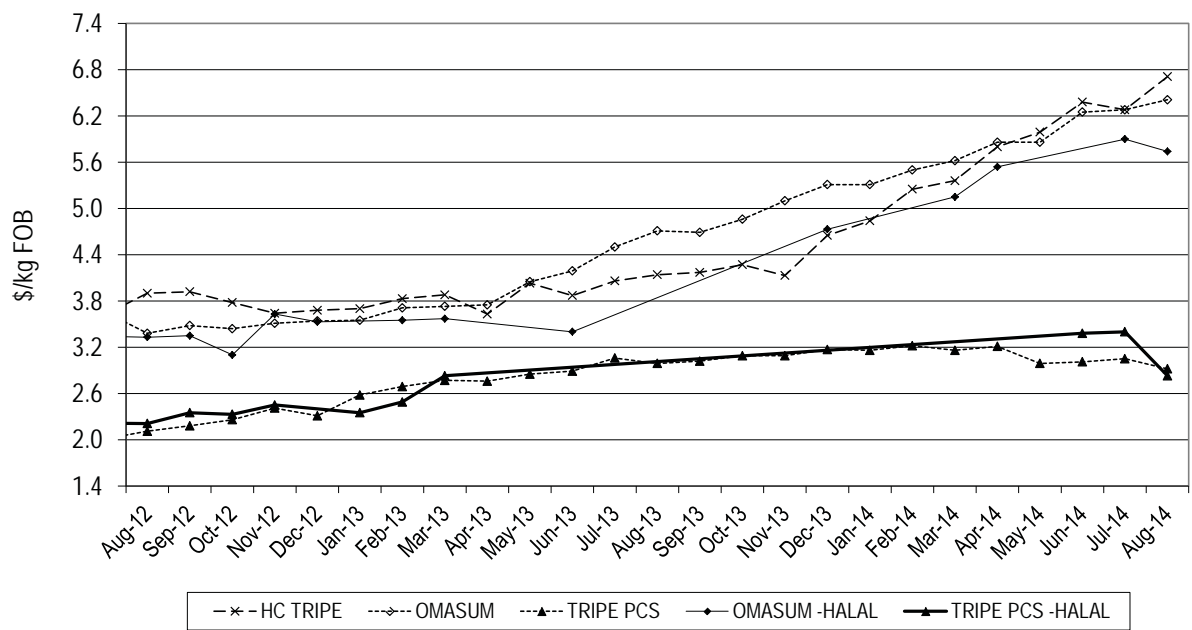
Cheek meat rose 87¢ higher than the August 2013 price to average \$4.51/kg.

The average price of beef lips has improved \$1.66/kg to average \$3.00/kg whilst Halal lips rose \$1.13 to \$2.68.

Head meat also showed similar improvement over the same period to rise \$1.07 and finish at \$3.78/kg.

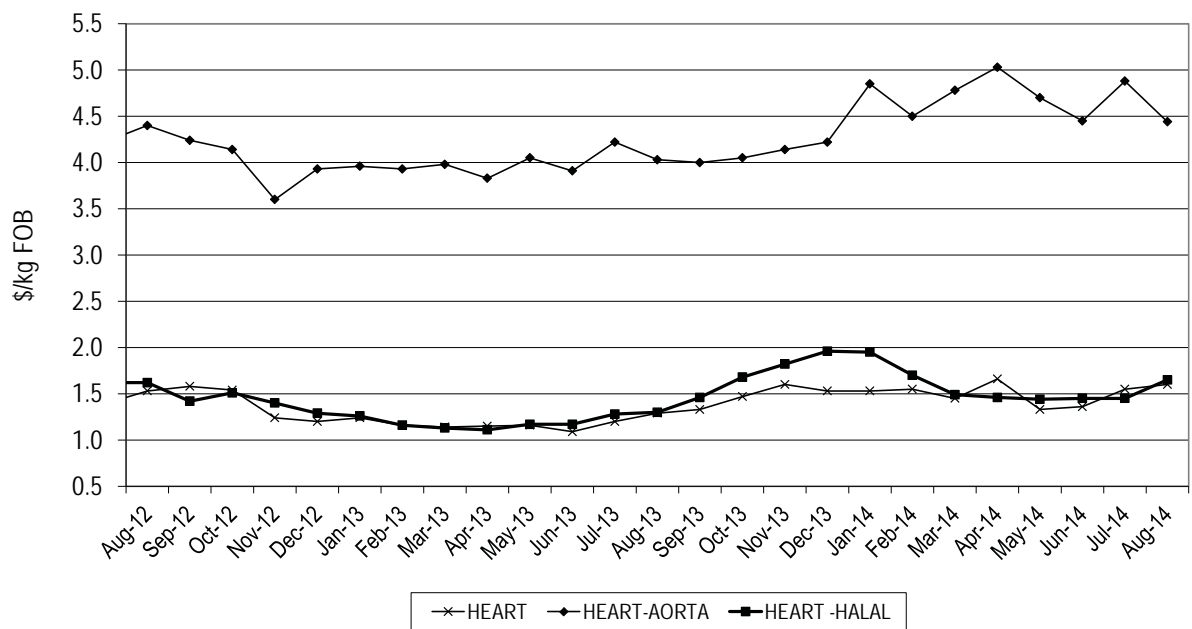

Figure 2: Trends in beef tripe prices



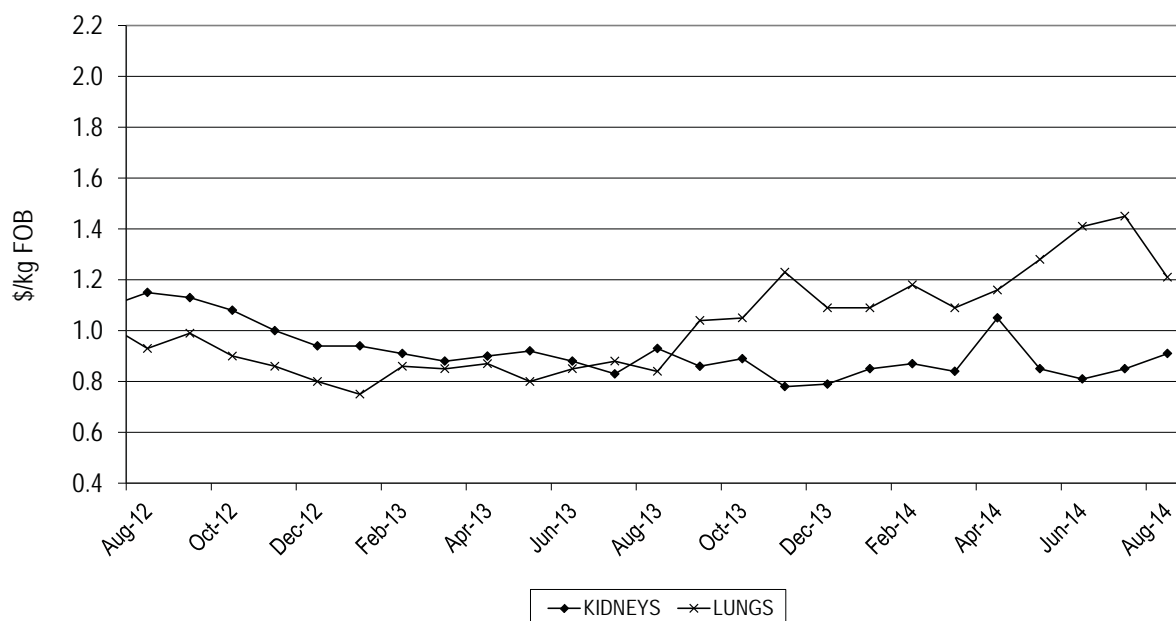
The average price of tripe pieces fell year on year 7¢ to \$2.92 with halal product steady at \$2.83/kg Demand for omasum and honeycomb in Hong Kong remained firm which has seen the omasum price rise from \$4.14 a year ago to the current level of \$6.41/kg. Honeycomb prices also saw average prices rise by \$2.57/kg to an average price today of \$6.71/kg.

Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



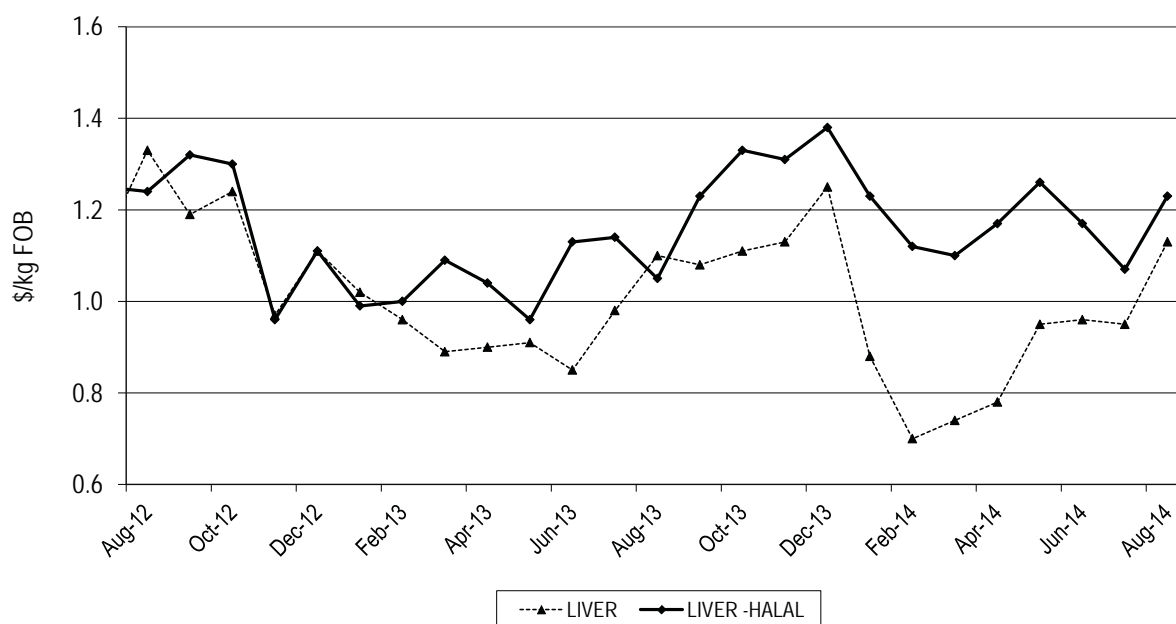
Hearts both halal and non-halal improved over the year by approximately 33¢ for non-halal product averaging \$1.60/kg and halal hearts at \$1.65/kg. Aorta rose 41¢ to average \$4.44/kg, but fell 44¢ from last month.

Kidneys remain flat at 91¢/kg whilst halal lungs strengthened 37¢/kg to \$1.21/kg and non-halal product improving 72¢/kg across the year to \$1.56/kg.

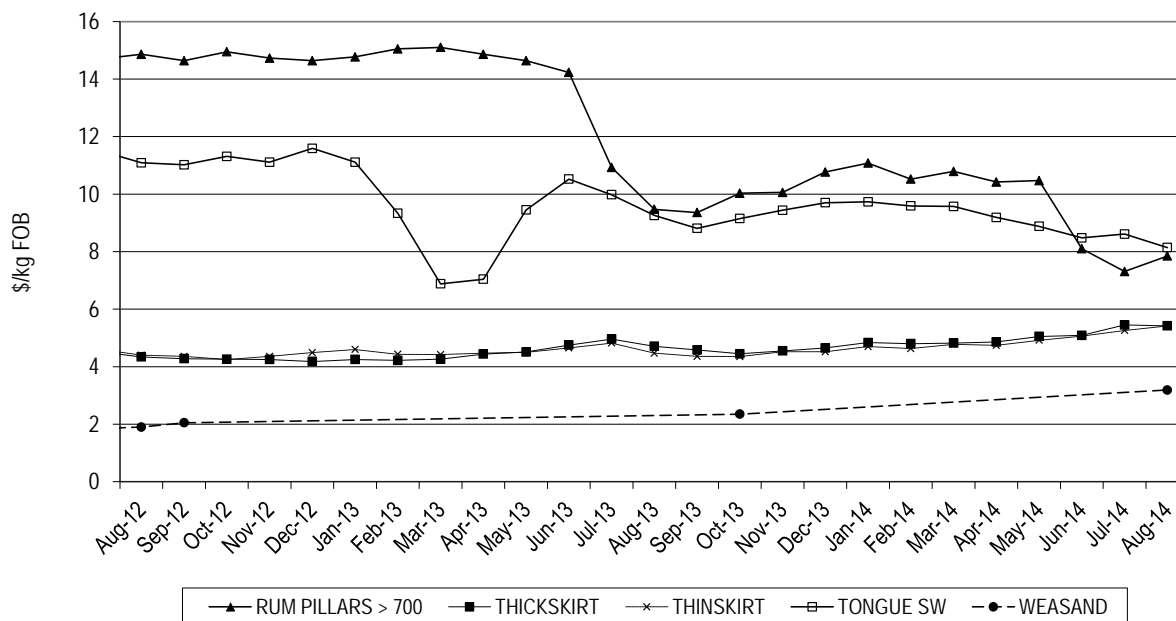
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



The average price of non-Halal liver was almost unchanged at \$1.13/kg whilst halal livers improved 18¢/kg to \$1.23 from this time last year.

The tongue market fell \$1.12/kg across the year to \$8.14/kg and continues to show a downward trend with 37¢ of that occurring in the last month.

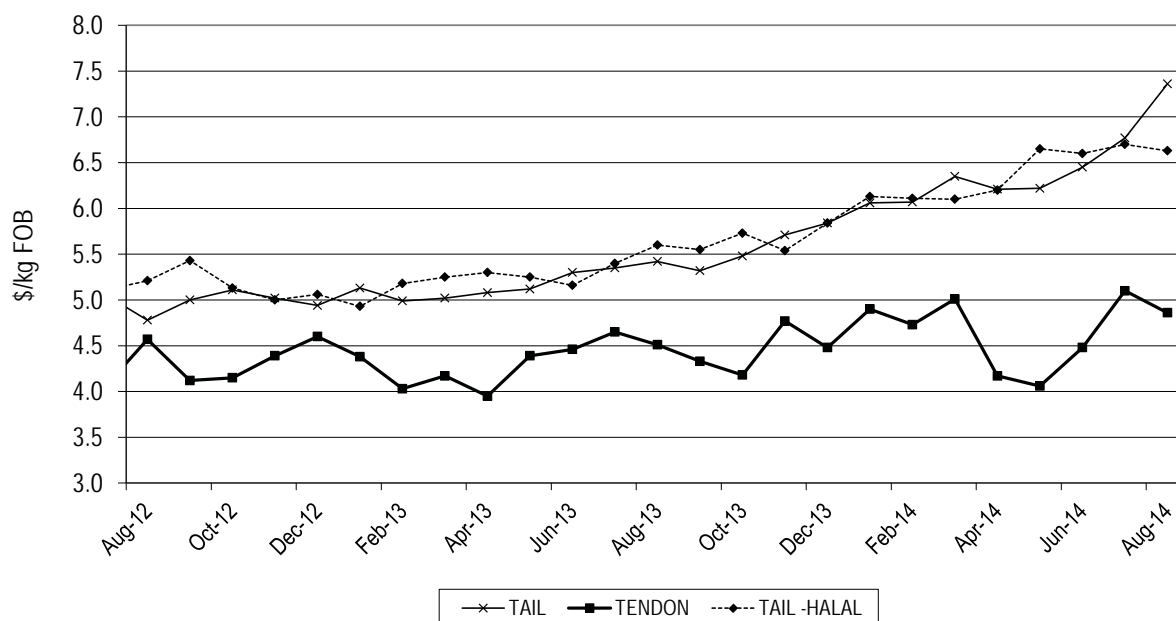
Prices of rumen pillars showed a slight rally last month but prices are down year on year with the average price of high weight-range pillars (>700g) \$1.62/kg lower at \$7.85/kg.

Demand in the Korean market is firm. Thick skirt prices were 71¢ higher across the year at an average price of \$5.42/kg and the average price of thin skirt was 95¢ higher also at 5.42/kg. The Japanese market is not matching the Korean price for thick and thin skirt and product is going mainly to Korea.

The average price of weasand was higher at about \$3.19/kg up from around \$2.00 a year ago.

Tails and Tendons

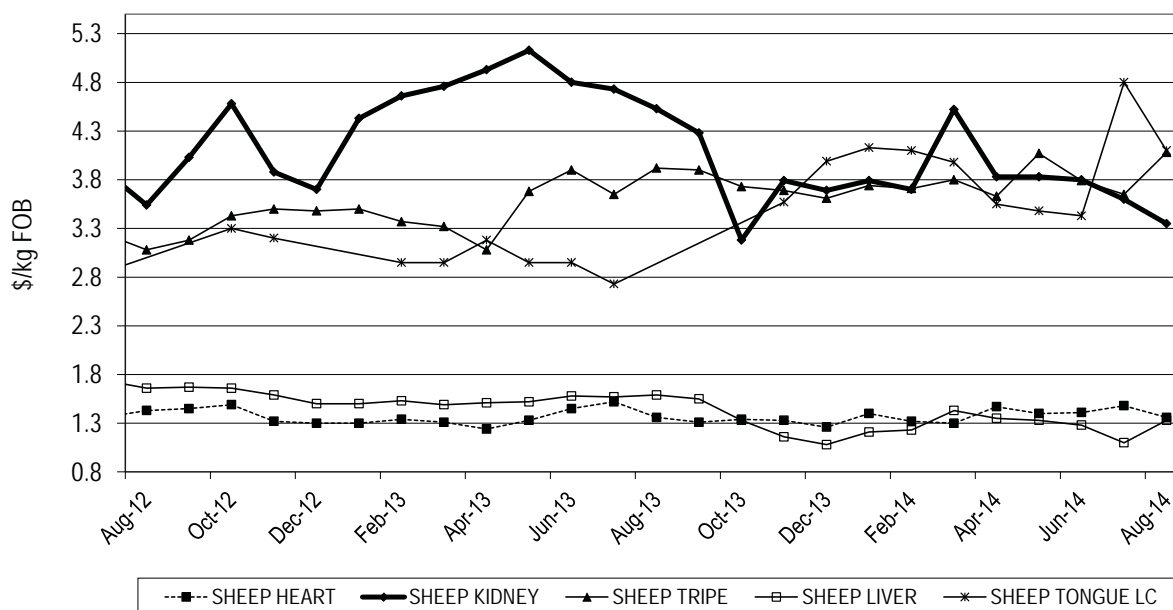
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices continued to rise, up \$1.94 to \$7.36/kg whilst halal tails rose \$1.03 to \$6.63/kg year on year. Tendons have improved 35¢ to average \$4.86, back slightly from last months 2 year high.

Sheep Offals

Figure 6: Trends in sheep offal prices

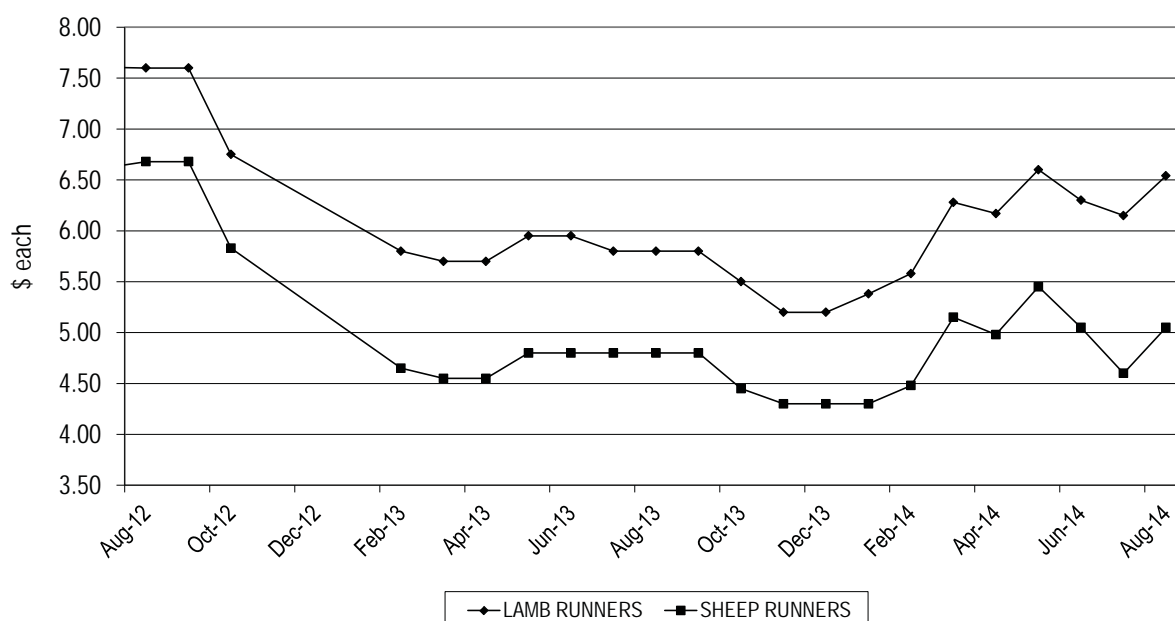


Sheep hearts finished at the same price as last year, \$1.36/kg exw.

Sheep tripe prices were 16¢ higher at an average price of \$3.35/kg. Demand for tripe in Hong Kong is reported to be steady.

The average price of kidneys was \$1.18 lower than a year ago falling to \$3.35/kg the lowest price in 30 months. The price of sheep livers was 26¢ lower at an average price of \$1.33/kg.

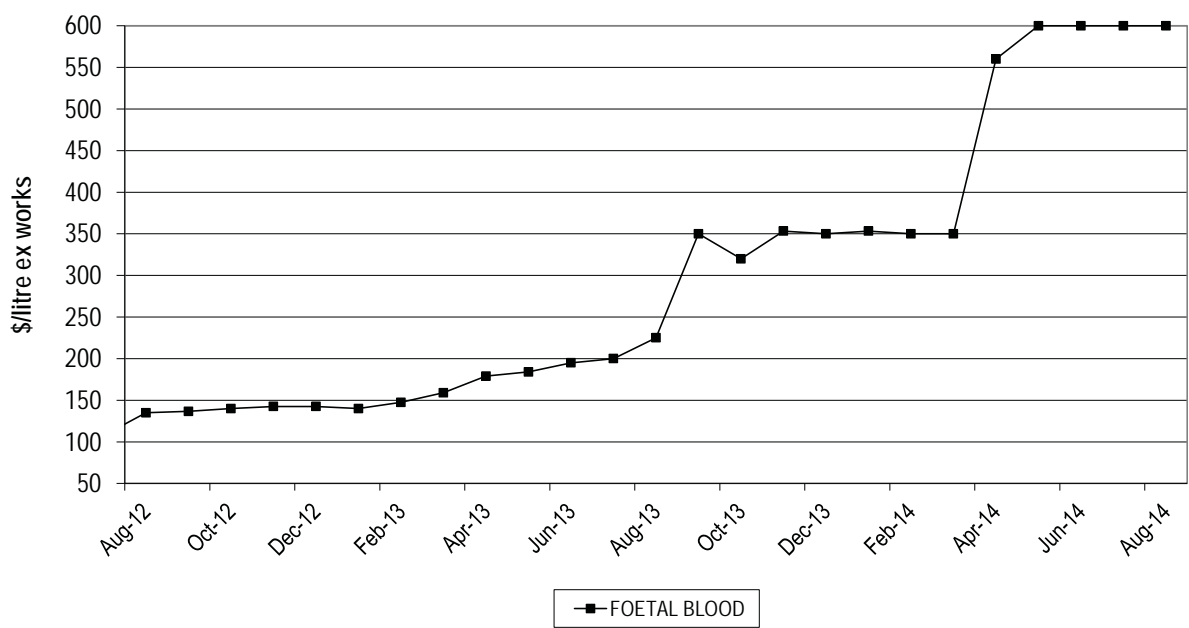
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb runners was 74¢ up on last year at \$6.54/piece. The average price of sheep runners rose 25¢ to \$5.05/piece.

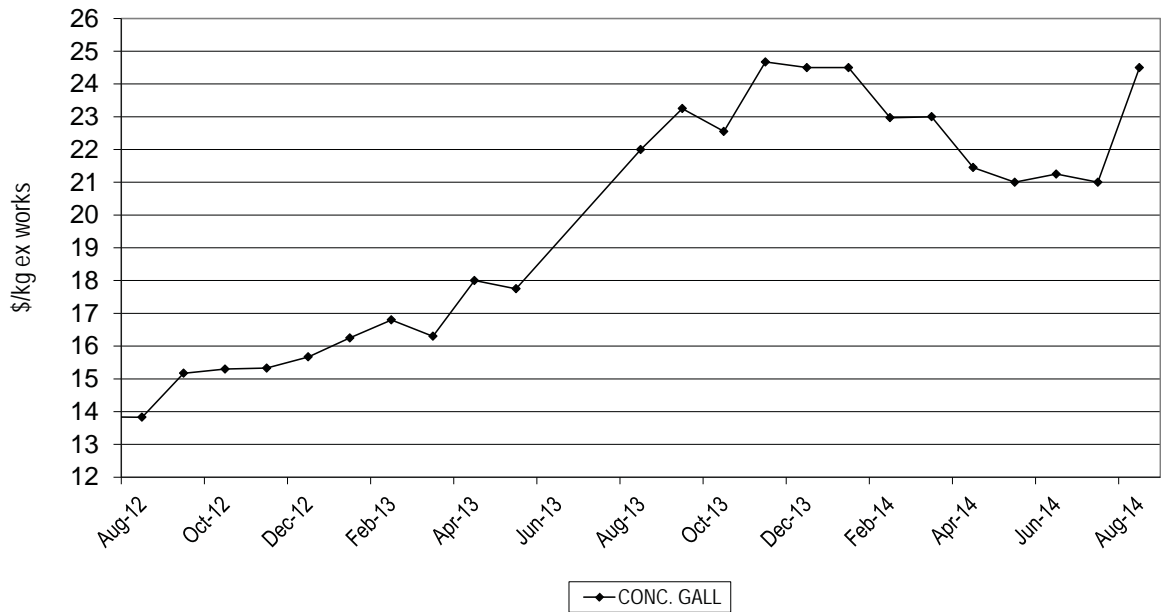

The average price of foetal calf blood was \$600/litre in August, a massive \$375 rise as the two big players continue to compete for market share.

Concentrated gall has risen \$2.50 across the year but was helped by a \$3.50 improvement over last month.

Figure 8: Trends in rendered co-product prices

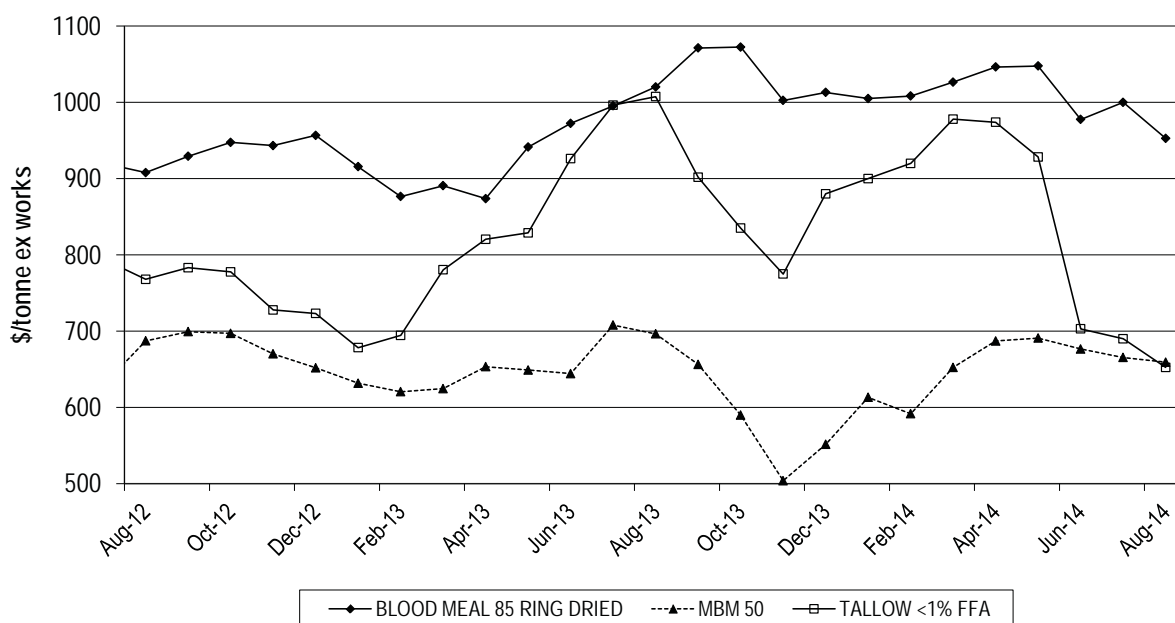


Figure 8 shows the trends in prices paid for rendered co-products. Prices are bulk ex-works/tonne.

Tallow prices slumped \$355/tonne due to the withdrawal of the Singapore based renewable fuel processor, Neste Oil from the market in June this year. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$652.50/tonne ex. works. Neste Oil may return to the market for Australian tallow but may not pay large premiums compared with the other markets. In the meantime traders are re-establishing the traditional markets in China, Taiwan and Pakistan where tallow has to be priced relative to palm stearine. The price of palm stearine in August at US\$670/tonne FOB Malaysia .

Meat and bone meal prices were slightly weaker across the year with the average price for 50% protein MBM down to \$659.40, a fall of around \$37.00. Despite the continuing ban on poultry meals to Indonesia and China prices remain firm.

The average price of blood meal was \$67.50 lower than last year at \$953/tonne.

Two Month Exchange rate

The AUD/USD exchange rate fell sharply, starting the month at 0.934 to finish at 0.875, a fall of around 6¢ with predictions of further falls against a strengthening US dollar which should assist exports. Movement against other major currencies was not as marked.

This keeps optimism high amongst the trade for markets remaining firm for offals in the foreseeable future.

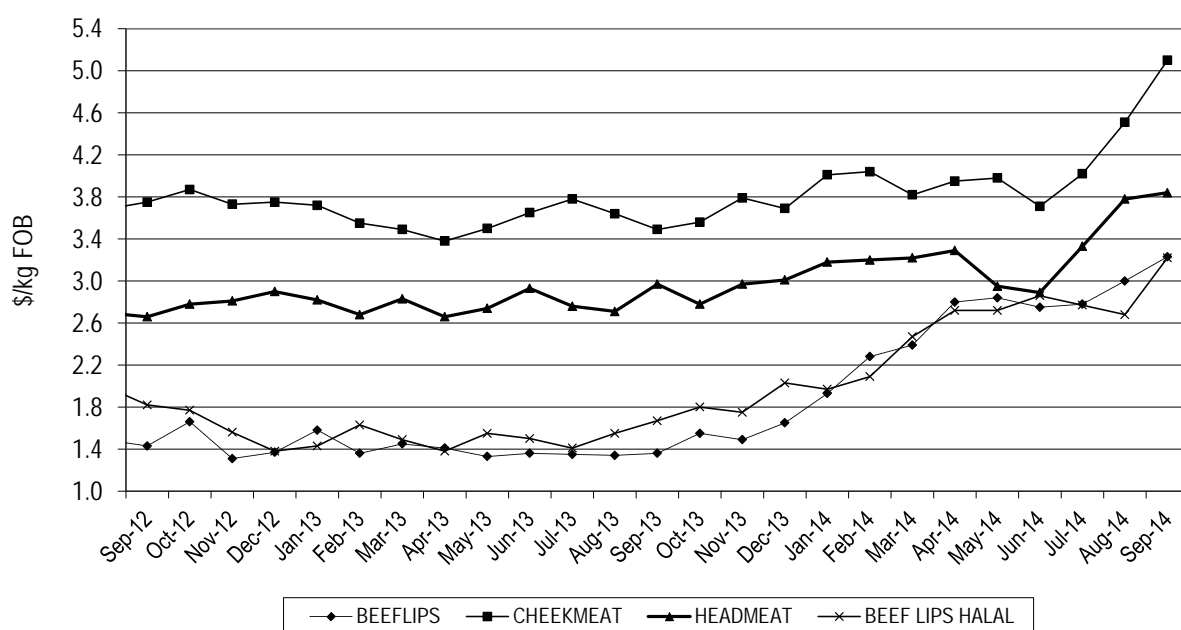
The China market is quiet due to their autumn holidays with buyers not returning until October 9.

Rendered meals are under pressure from new season soybean meal and tallow continues to languish.

Hides continue steady with support from the lower dollar despite a slowing in the leather market.

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices



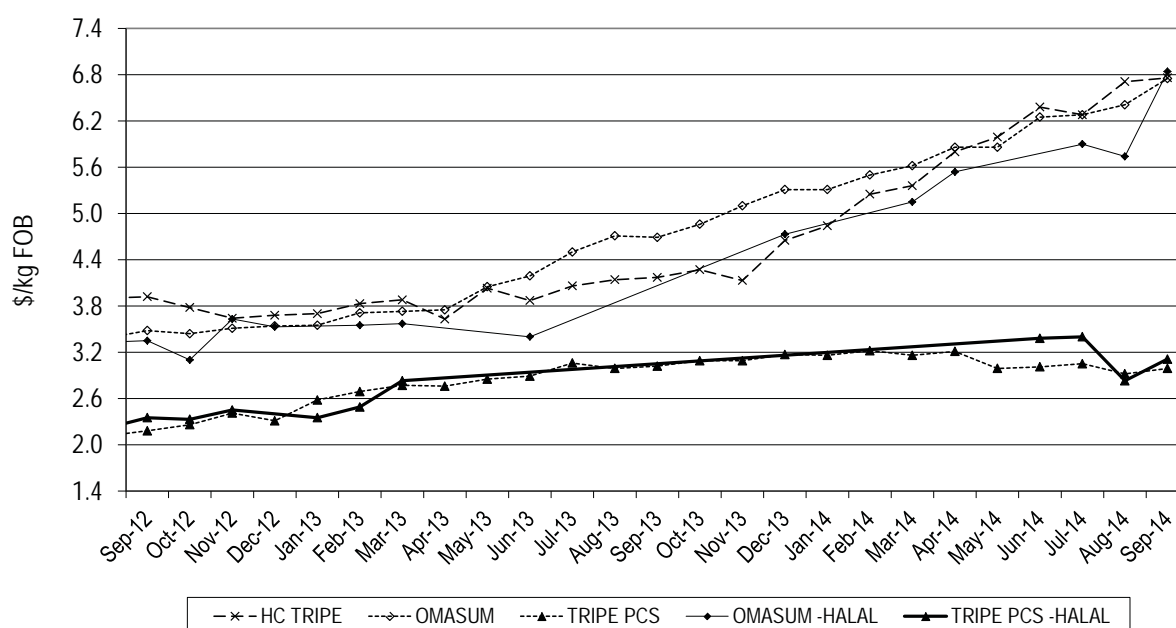
Head offals continue their strong performance with firm improvement year on year and steady monthly improvement also.

Cheek meat has improved \$1.61/kg over the September price last year to average \$5.10/kg and was consistently reported with a 60¢/kg improvement month on month.

With the average price of beef lips following suit to improve \$1.87/kg to an average of \$3.23/kg and Halal lips up \$1.55 to \$3.22 shows an improvement of over 100% on last year.

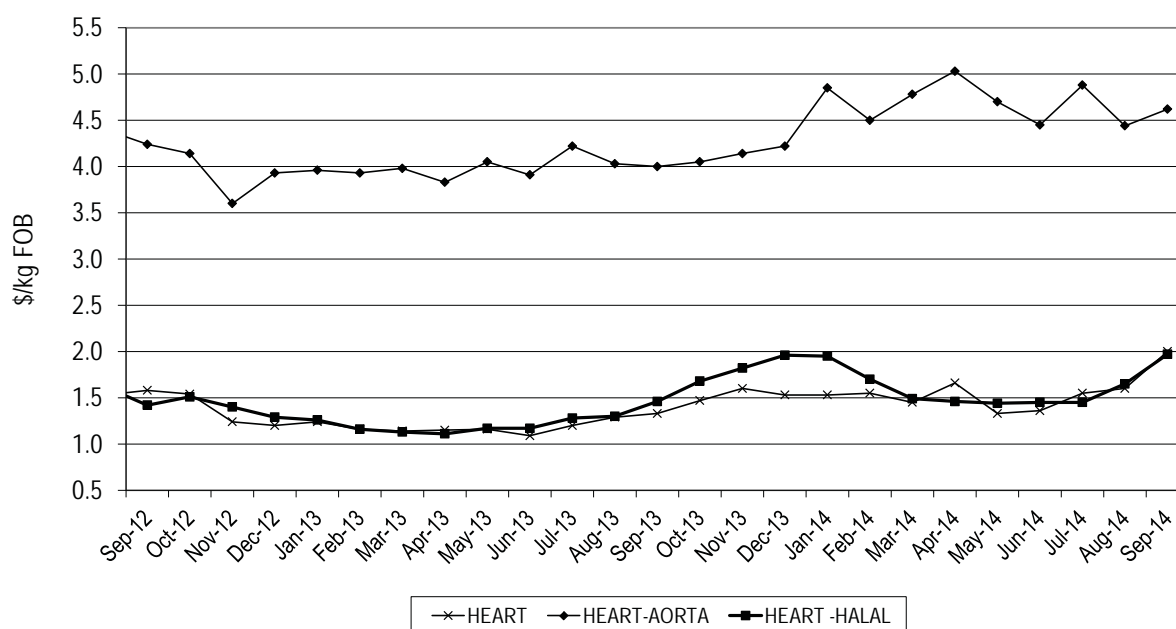
Head meat also strengthened over the same period to rise 87¢/kg trading at \$3.84/kg.

Whist tripe pieces both halal and non-halal continue to hold their own, trading very steadily across the year at around the \$3.00/kg mark the on-going strength of the omasum market continues to surprise. As the graphs show it has been a linear growth since early last year. The current record price of \$6.75/kg for non-halal product represents an increase of 44% on last year or \$2.06/kg improvement. Similarly honeycomb tripe, mainly to Taiwan, is up \$2.59 on a year ago, to trade at \$6.76/kg.

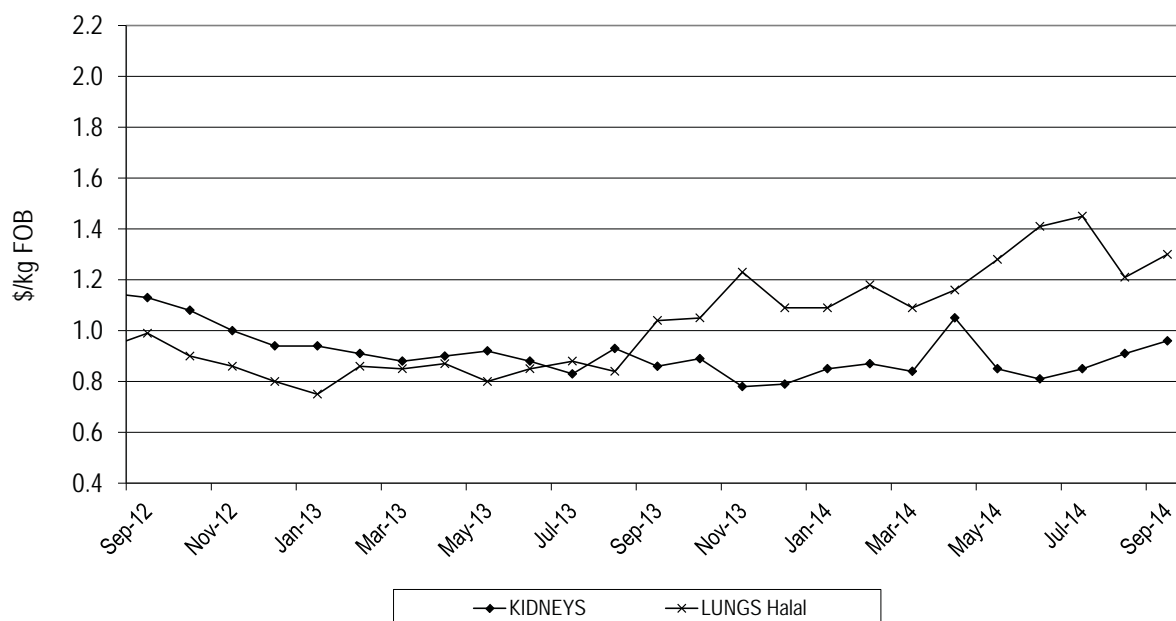
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



Heart products continue their firm trend with non-halal hearts up over the year by 67¢/kg averaging \$2.00/kg which is also a 40¢/kg improvement on last month. Halal hearts at \$1.97/kg are 51¢/kg up on this time last year and 32¢/kg up compared to last month.

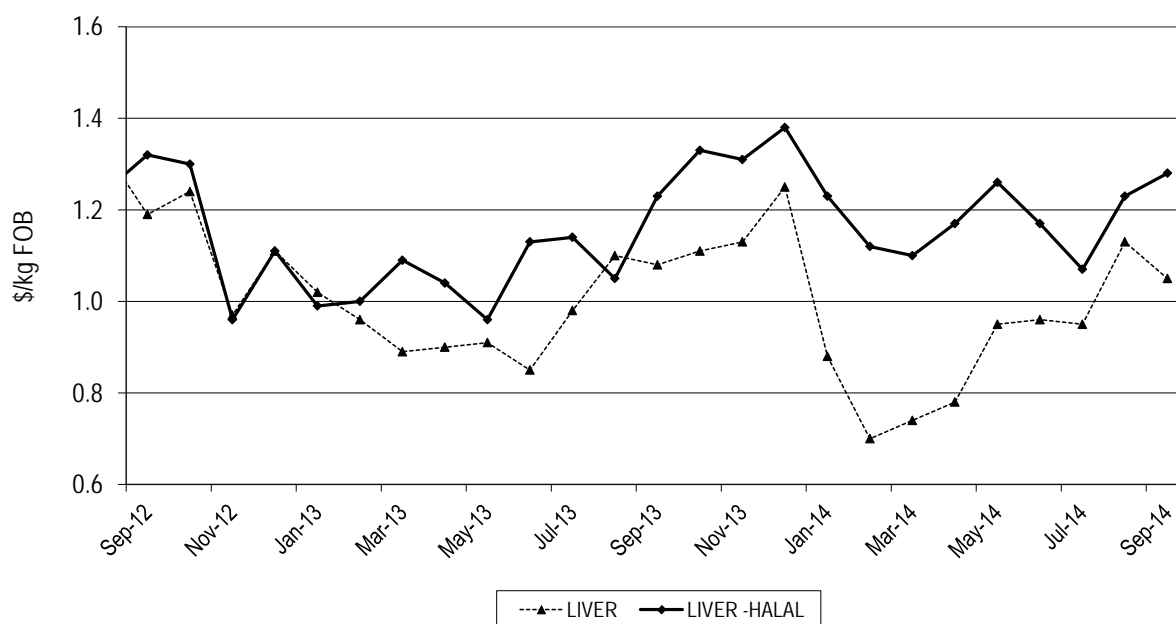
Aorta rose 62¢ to average \$4.62/kg since last September and continues the strong market which began July 2013.

Kidneys are showing an improvement to trade at 96¢/kg which is 10¢/kg up on last year and a similar improvement over the last 2 months. 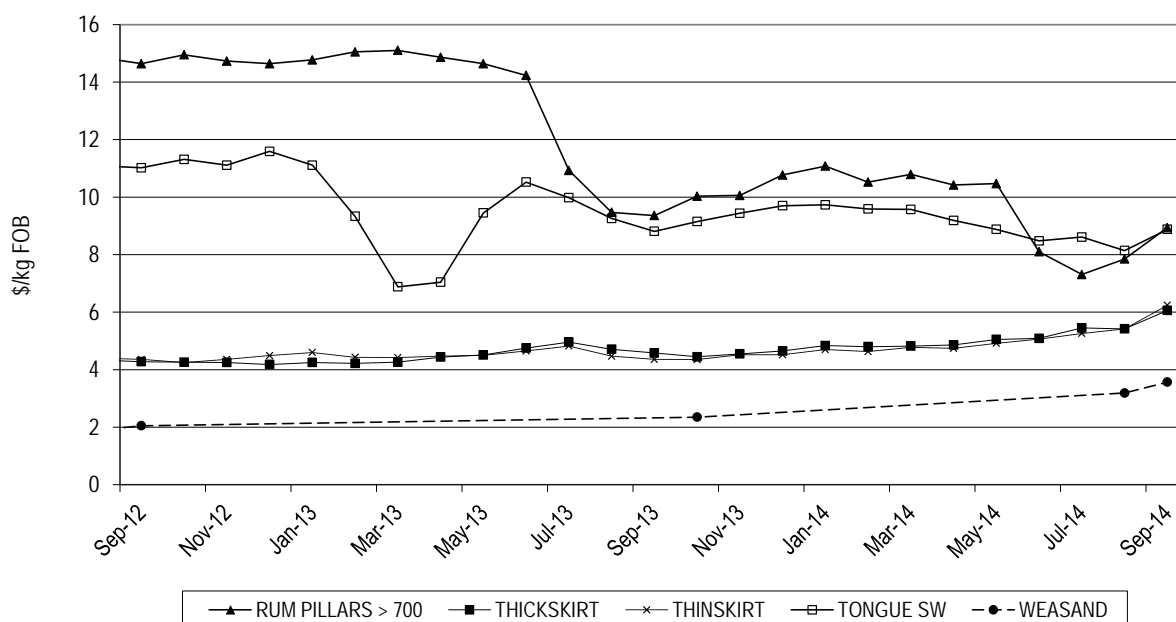
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



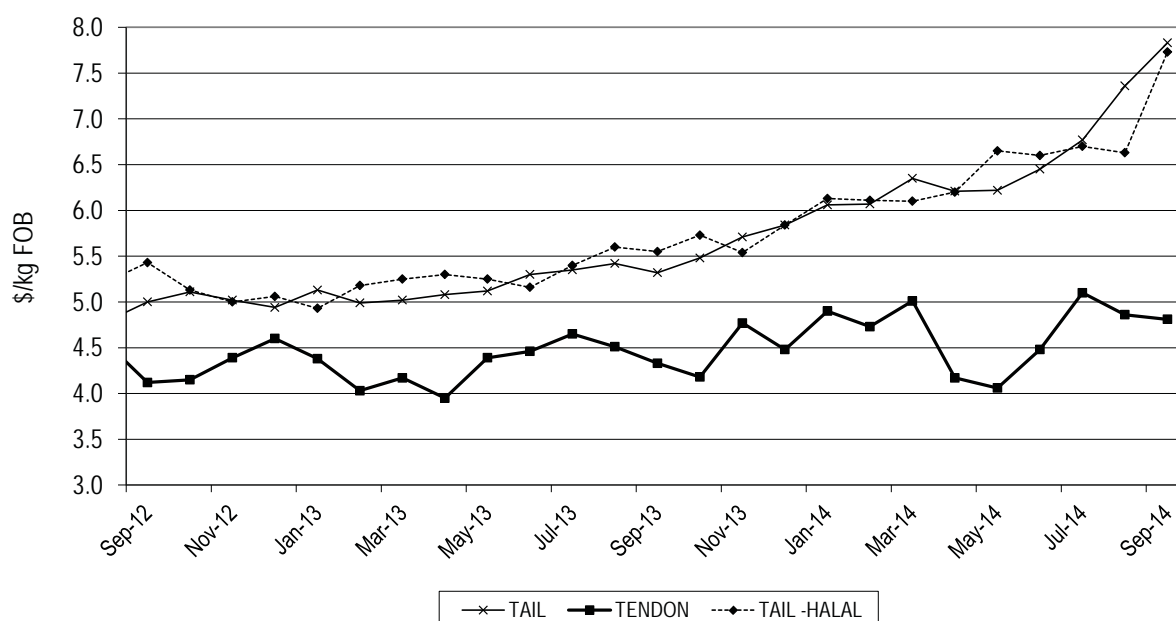
Tongues are steady compared to last year, up 7¢/kg across the year to sell at \$8.88/kg which corrected last month's downward trend by rising 74¢/kg.

Prices of rumen pillars continued to rally but prices are down year on year with the average price of high weight-range pillars (>700g) 42¢/kg lower at \$8.94/kg.

Demand in the Korean market is firm with overall increase of 10% in volumes. Thick skirt prices were \$1.48 higher across the year at an average price of \$6.06/kg and the average price of thin skirt was \$1.88/kg higher also at \$6.24/kg. The average price of weasand was higher at about \$3.19/kg up from around \$2.00 a year ago. Interest in weasand is starting to show with \$3.57/kg sales compared to no reports last year.

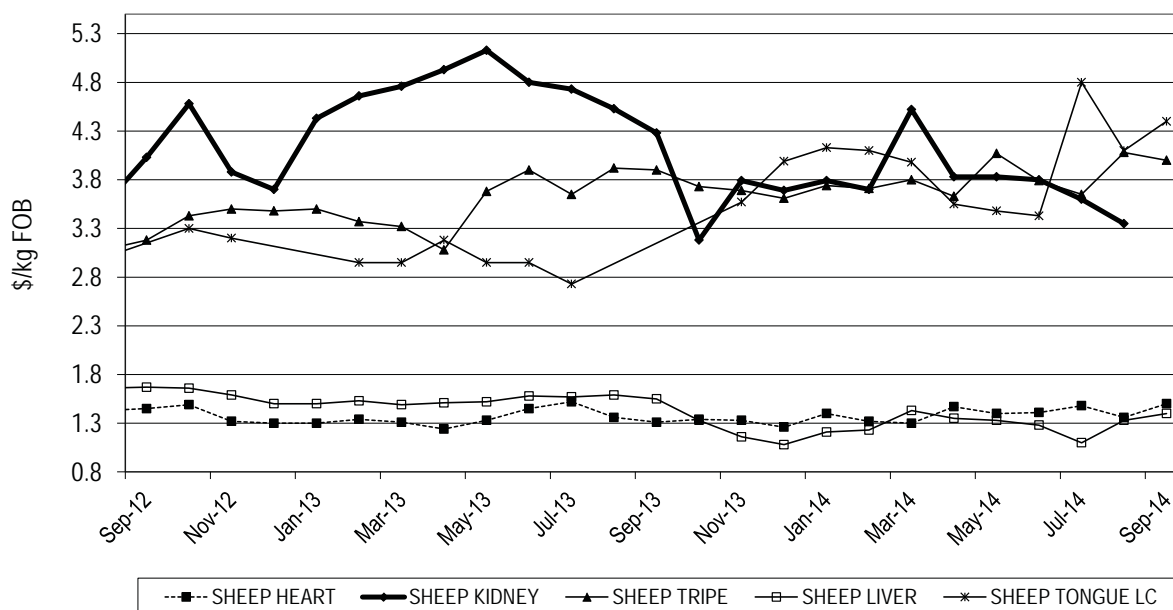
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices

Figure 6: Trends in sheep offal prices

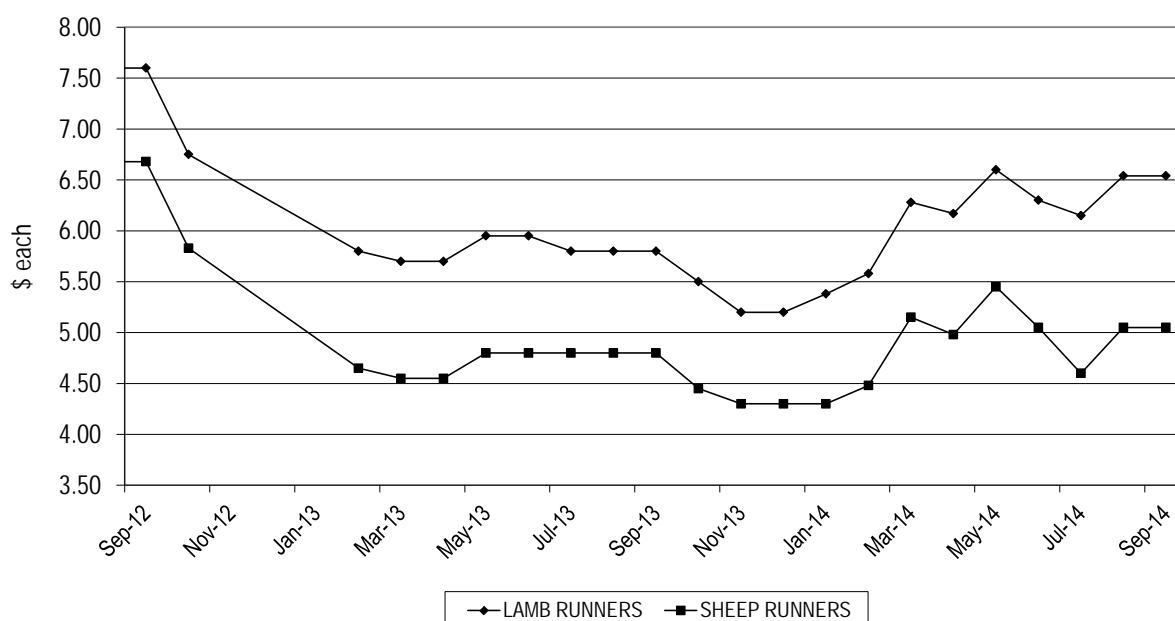


Sheep hearts finished have improved 19¢ over the same time last year at \$1.50/kg exw.

Sheep kidneys were not reported this month. The price of sheep livers was 15¢ lower over the year but was up on last month at an average price of \$1.40/kg.

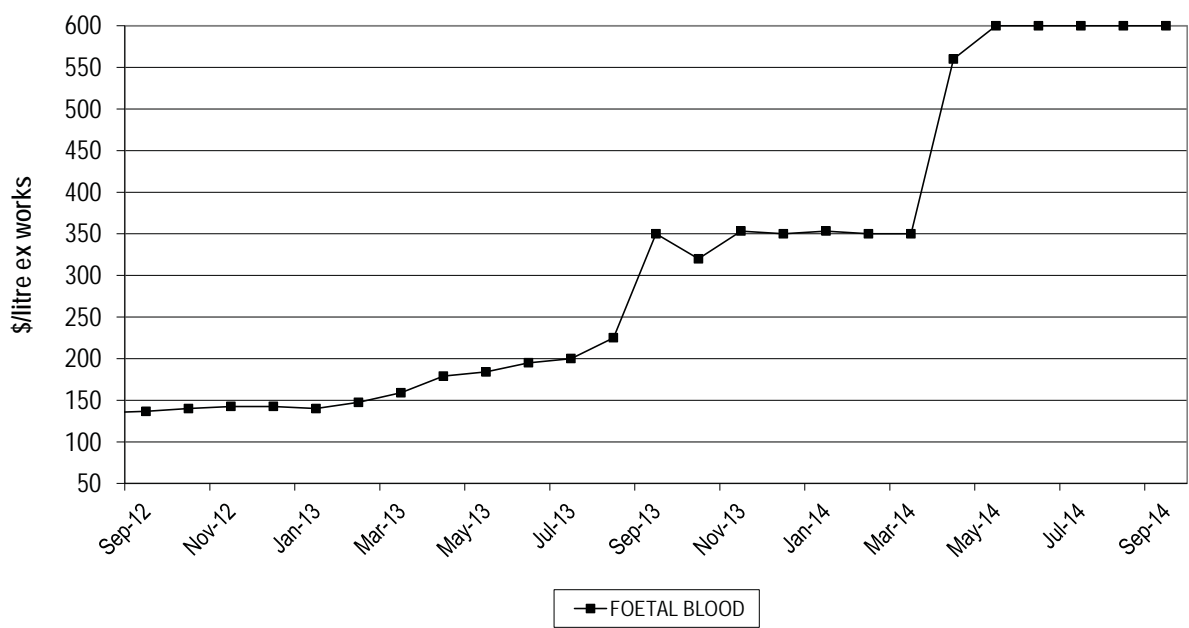
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices

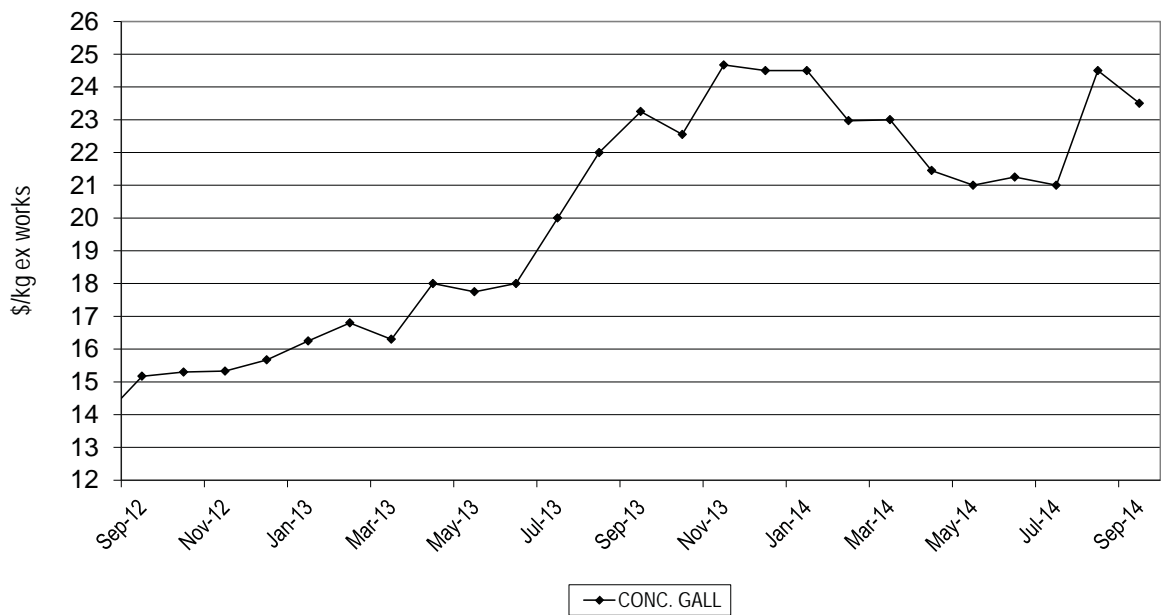

Figure 8: Trends in rendered co-product prices

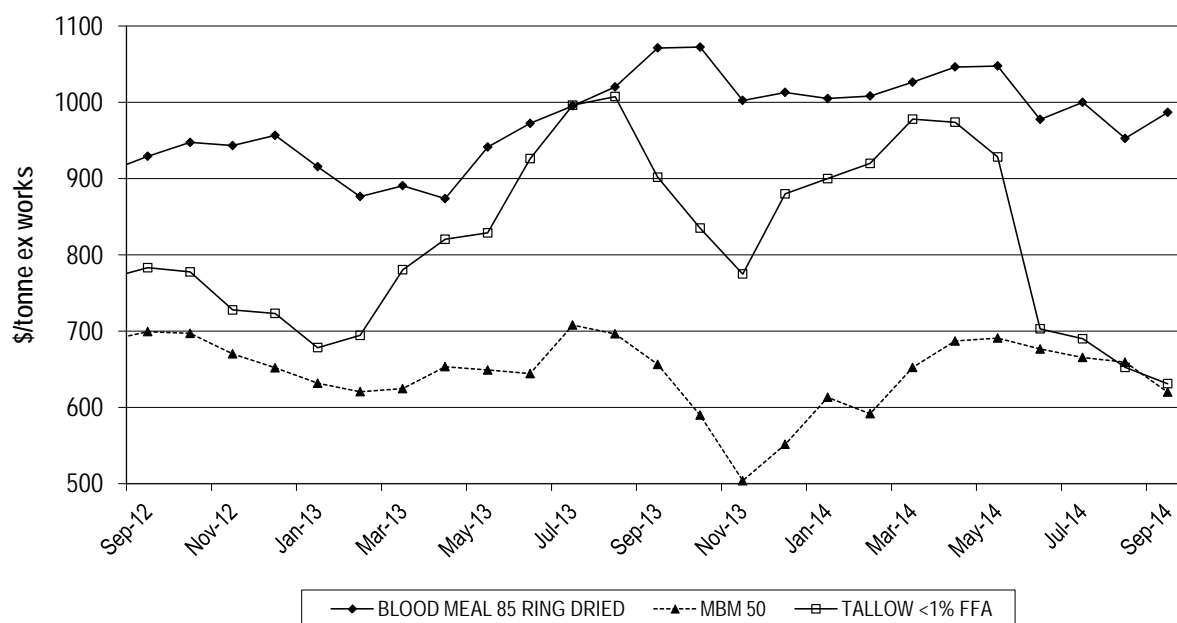


Figure 8 shows the trends in prices paid for rendered co-products. Prices are bulk ex-works/tonne.

Tallow continues to struggle to find a floor. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$631.20/tonne ex. works which is \$21 down on last month and \$270 down on the heady days a year ago when renewable fuel subsidies overseas drove prices to record levels. The price of palm stearine rallied late in September to finish at US\$695/tonne FOB Malaysia up \$25 which may help tallow prices if suitable markets can be found.

Meat and bone meal prices continued to fall with new season soy being offered at a significant discount as it moves into harvest. MBM is down around \$40/tonne from August and weaker across the year with the average price for 50% protein MBM down to \$620, a fall of around \$36.00.

The average price of blood meal was \$84.50 lower than last year at \$986/tonne but that represents an improvement of \$34 on last month.

USA hide processors with low kills are pushing tanners hard for price increases however meeting strong resistance. Meantime with higher than normal kills, Australian hide processors are more flexible with selling prices and business is being concluded on more negotiable terms. Leather markets have slowed down and tanners are unable to get any improvement in leather prices.

Chinese tanners have also turned their attention to cheaper Brazilian hides & better valued European hides. In spite of reduced supply of USA hides, Chinese tanners are prepared to change from USA sourced hides to other origins in order to make ends meet. The lower A\$ has helped conclude sales at prices that were not quite there beforehand and this has flowed onto green hide market which has moved \$1 to \$2 higher.

The AUD/USD exchange rate was relatively steady during October but down 7¢ on same time last year, which certainly has had an effect on price movements across the year.

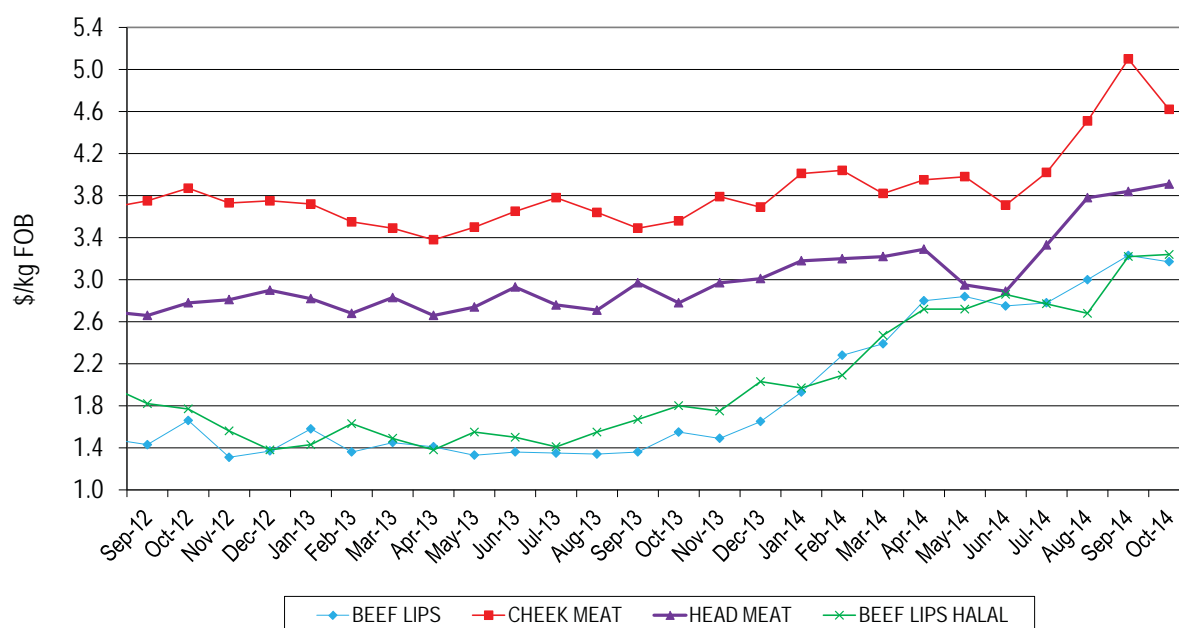
The majority of offals have rallied during the month, with the south-east Asian harvest holidays behind us. Rendered meals remain under significant pressure from new season soybean meal as well as lower priced MBM from USA competing in export markets.

Tallow seems to have finally kicked again, with improvement in most grades. The Taiwan gutter grease scandal has made exporters nervous about committing to shipments of Pure Beef Tallow to a market that usually takes around 6000mt per month.

Hides continue steady with support from the lower dollar, despite a slowdown in the leather market.

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices



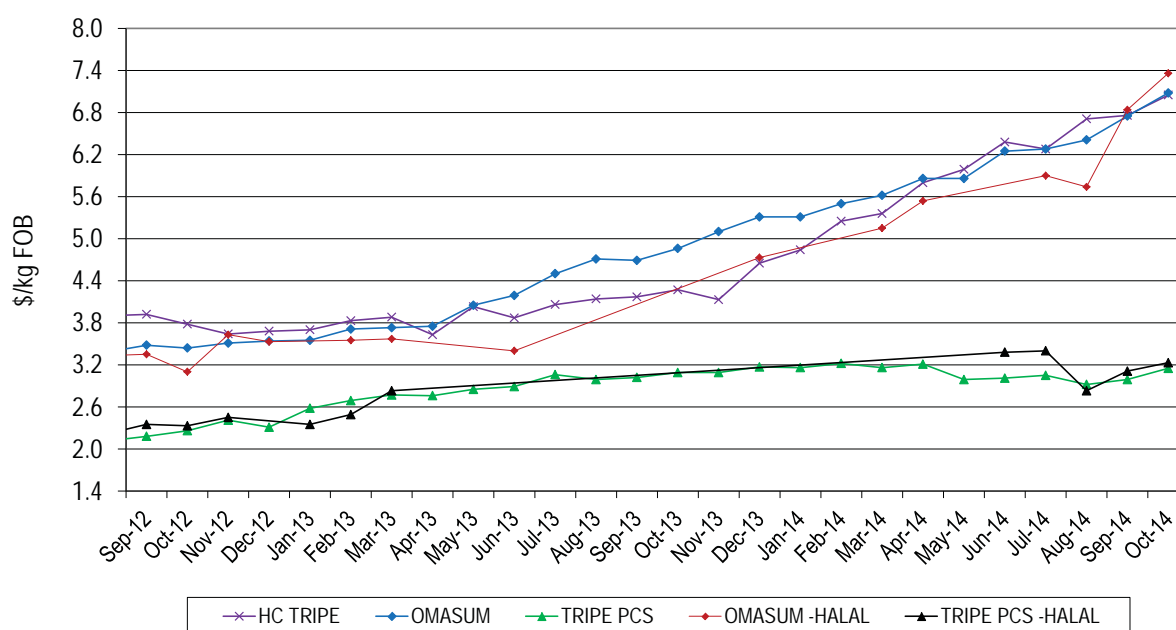
Head offals continue their strong performance, with firm improvement year-on-year but they have probably found their ceiling at the moment. Cheek meat has improved \$1.62/kg over the October price last year, to average \$4.62/kg, which was consistently reported 38¢/kg down month-on-month.

With the average price of beef lips steady at an average of \$3.17/kg and Halal beef lips at \$3.24, this continues to show an improvement of over 100% on last year.

Head meat also strengthened over the same period, rising \$1.13/kg and trading at \$3.91/kg.

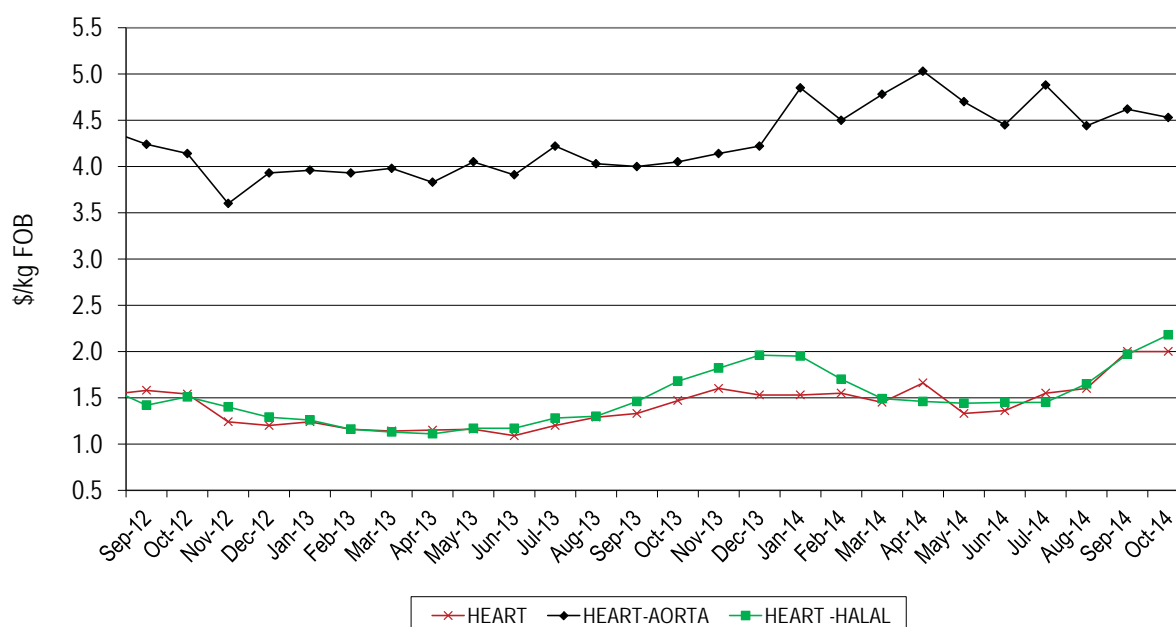
Beef Offal Trends

While tripe pieces, both halal and non-halal, continue to hold their own, trading very steadily across the year at around the \$3.00/kg mark, the omasum and honeycomb tripe markets march on. As the graphs show there has been a linear growth since early last year. Record prices of \$7.08/kg for non-halal omasum and \$7.36/kg for halal product represent an increase of 45% on last year. Similarly honeycomb tripe, mainly to Taiwan, is up \$2.78 on a year ago to trade at \$7.05/kg.

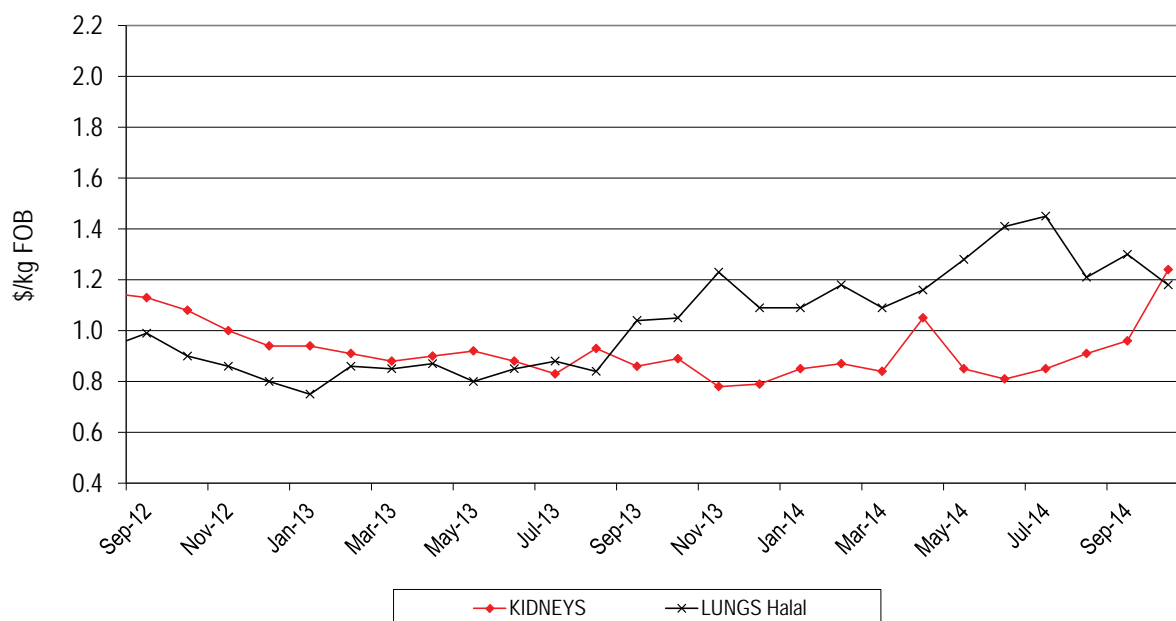
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



As with other red offals, heart products also continue their firm trend, with non-halal hearts up over last year by 53¢/kg, averaging \$2.00/kg, which is on a par with last month. Halal hearts at \$2.18/kg are 50¢/kg up on this time last year and 21¢/kg up compared to last month.

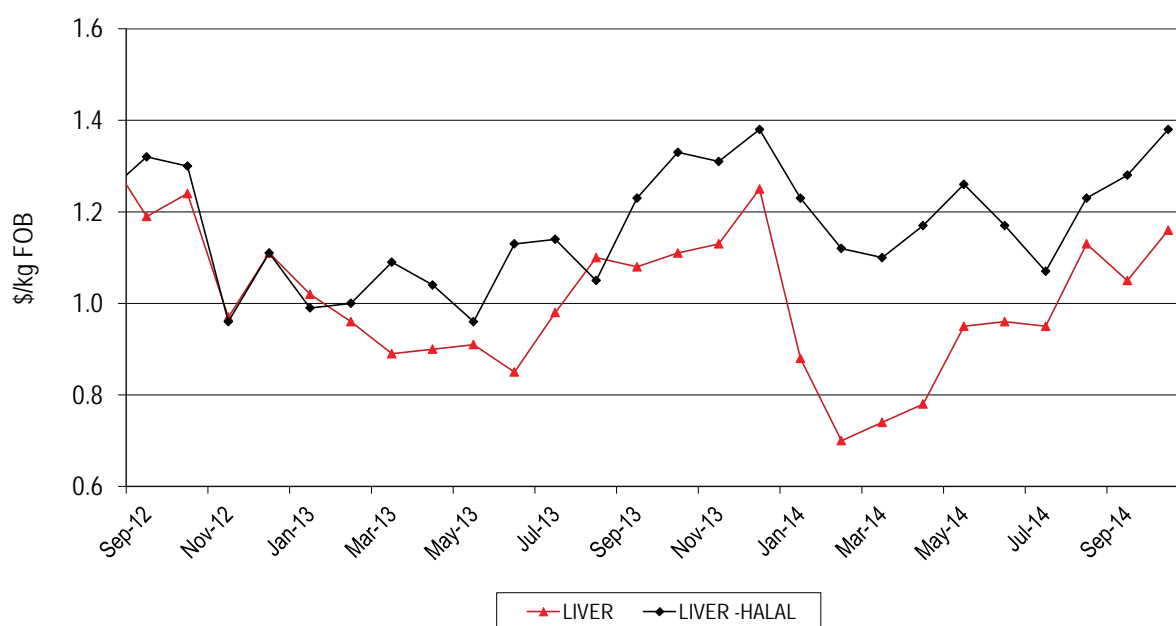
Aorta steadied to average \$4.53/kg, up 48¢/kg since last October.

Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

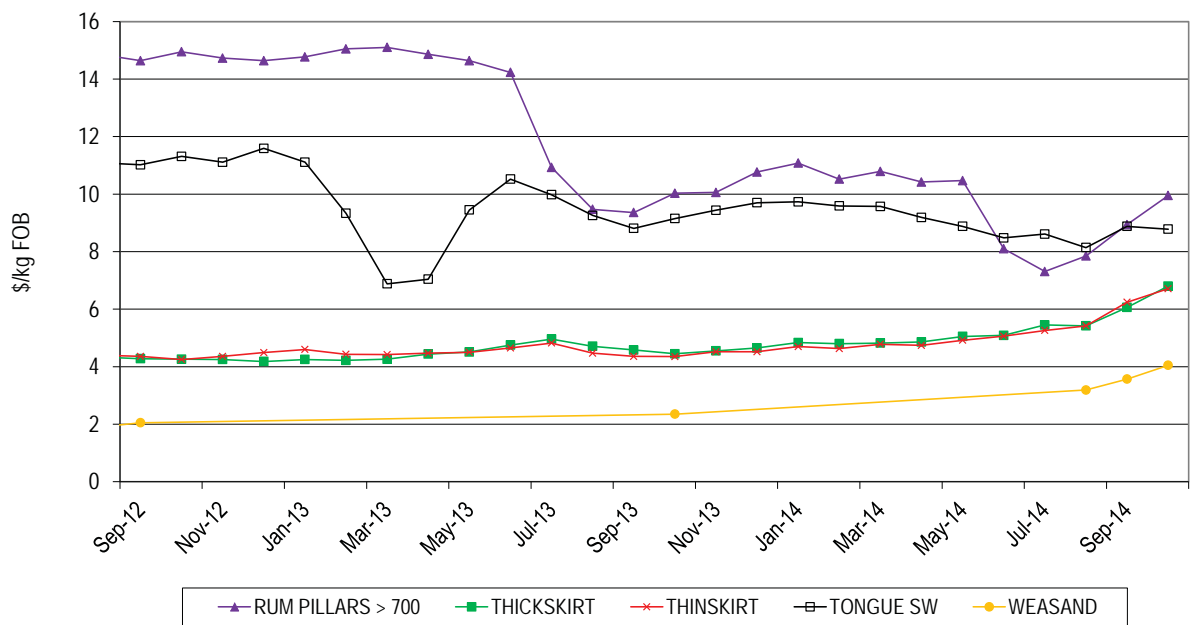


Livers, both halal and non-halal, were steady compared to last year with prices only reflecting the exchange rate variation to trade at \$1.38/kg and \$1.16/kg respectively.

The widespread strength of the offal market to south-east Asian markets is very much related to the higher prices being seen on beef cuts, and in particular to the 90CL prices, which is putting beef cuts out of reach of many consumers.

Additionally, with the approach of the end of year plant closures, prices should remain firm with diminished supply.

Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices

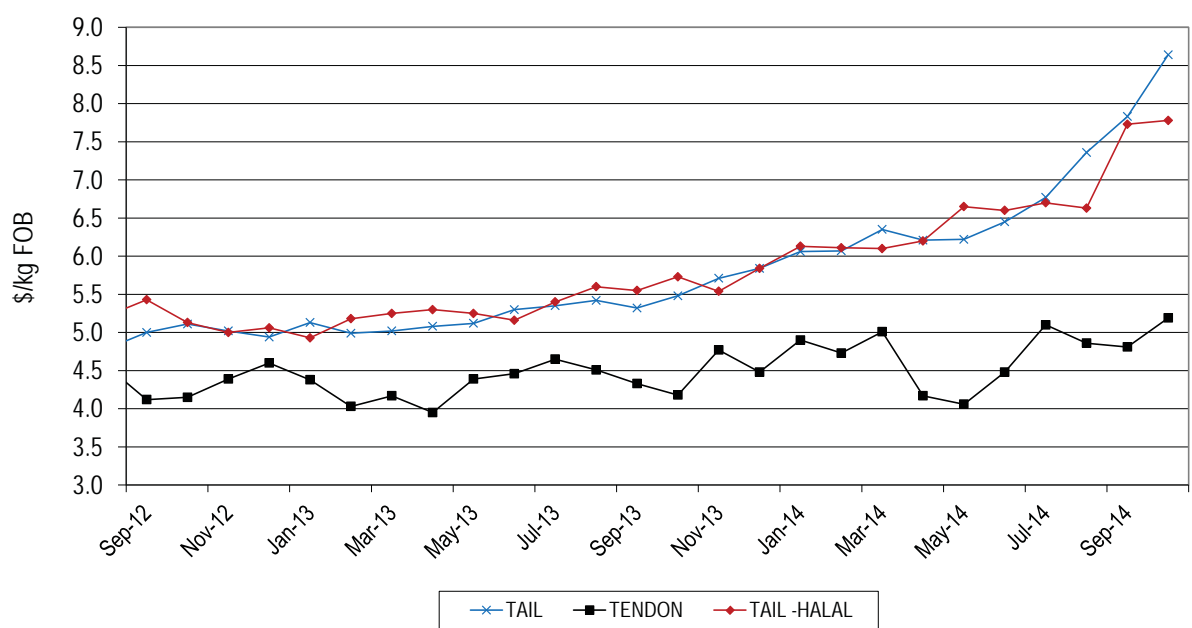


Japan / Korea

All products in this category showed wide variations in reported prices which appear to be timing related. The average price of tongues is relatively stable so is believed to be reasonably accurate. Prices of rumen pillars continued to rally and are expected to improve next month. Demand in the Korean market continues to improve. Thick and thin skirt prices were \$2.35 higher across the year, at an average price of around \$6.80/kg, which also shows a 70¢/kg improvement over last month. The average price of weasand was higher at about \$4.05/kg, up from around \$2.00 a year ago. These improved prices will motivate processors to start collection of weasand again, with sales very hard to come by until recently.

Tails and Tendons

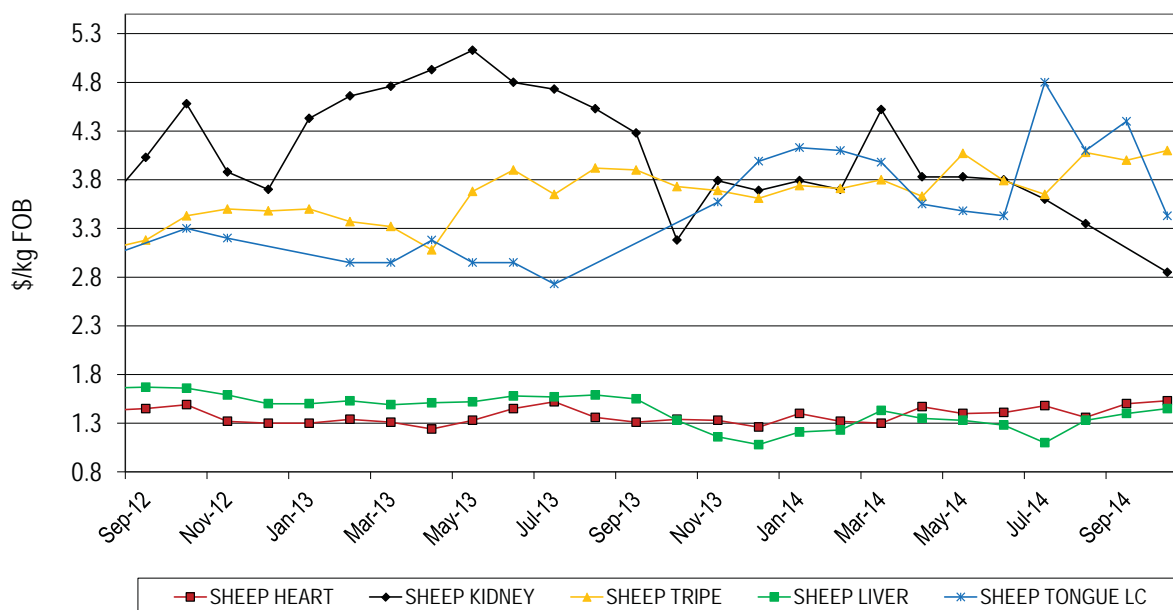
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices continued to rise, up 80¢ from last month and an improvement of \$3.16 over last year. They averaged \$8.64/kg while halal tails rose \$2.05 across the year to trade at \$7.78/kg, on par with last month. Tendons have improved 101¢ to average \$5.19, up 38¢ from last month's price.

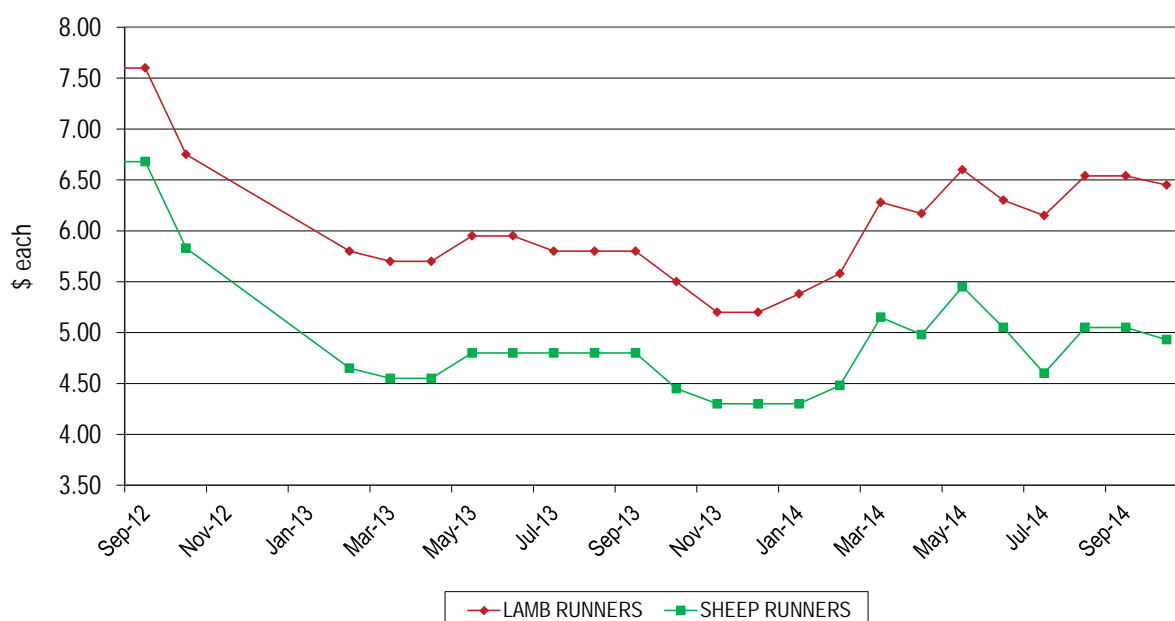
Figure 6: Trends in sheep offal prices

Sheep kidneys are the only reported item to not follow the trend and have continued to decline on average across the year and are trading 33¢/kg lower than this time last year.

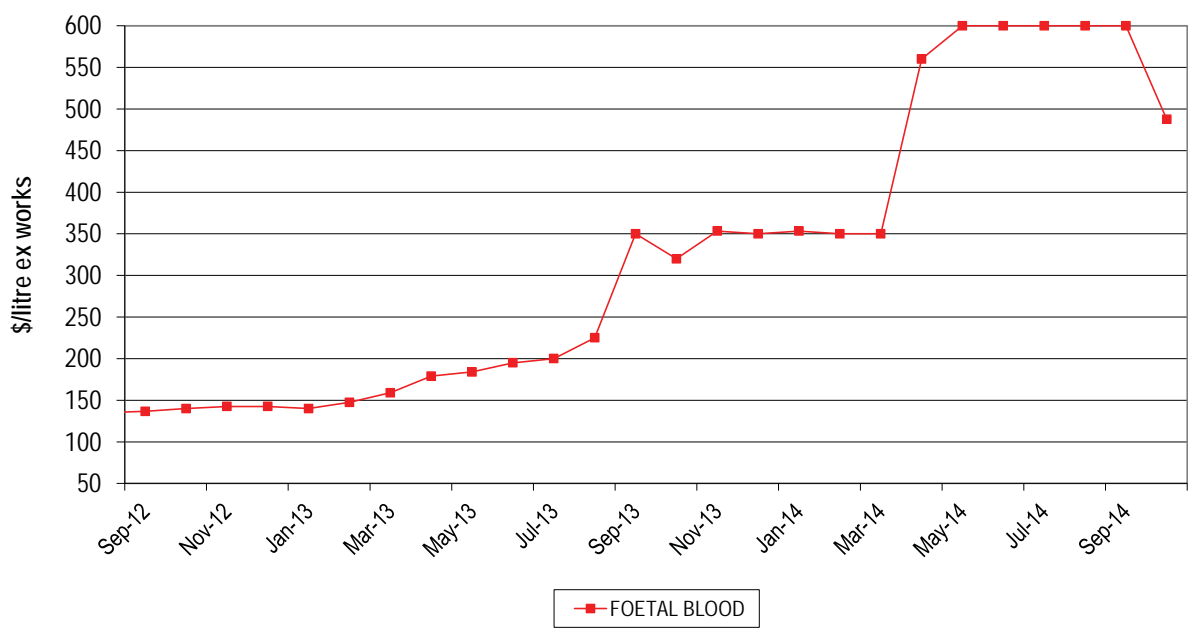
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices

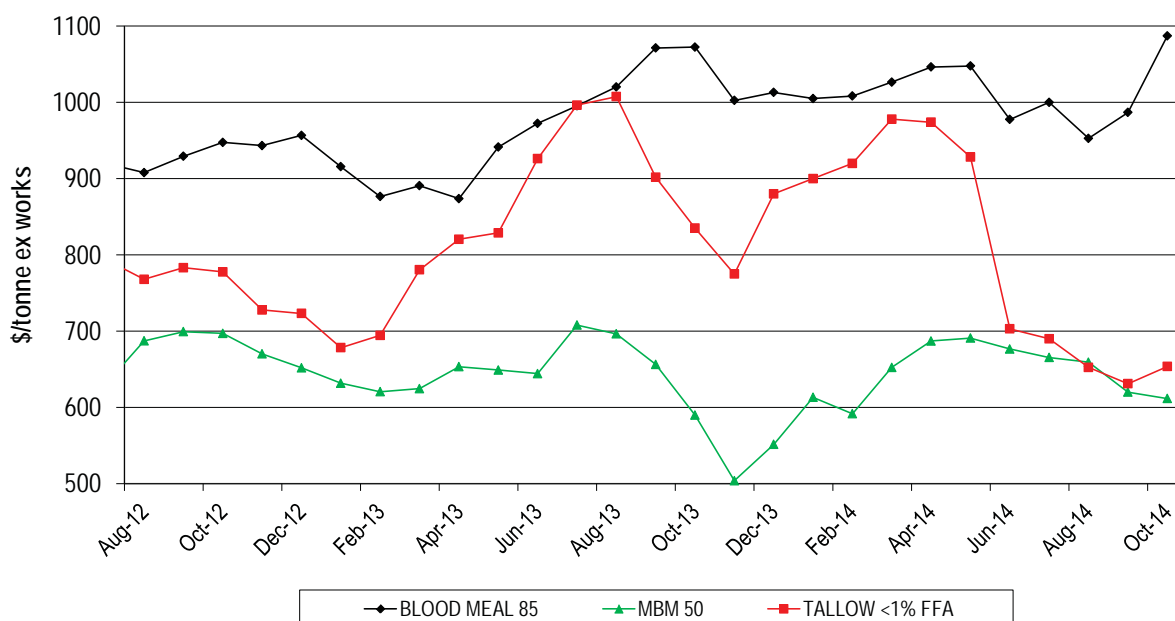
Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices

Tallow is still somewhat vulnerable, but showed some resilience early in the month. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$654/tonne ex. works which is \$23 up on last month and \$180 down on the renewable fuel subsidy prices of a year ago. The price of palm stearine rallied during October to finish at US\$714/tonne FOB Malaysia, up \$19 which has helped drive tallow prices. However price indications later in the month we not as confident.

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices continued to fall on the back of soybean meal. MBM values will need to continue to drop to remain competitive in feed rations. Major export markets are carrying high priced MBM inventory which on reduced usages will last longer and therefore affect demand moving forward into Nov/Dec. The average price of blood meal was on parity with last year at \$1087/tonne but that represents an improvement of \$155 on last month.

The domestic hide market during October benefitted from a lower exchange rate and stable selling prices and this has led to higher green prices for the month. USA hide processors were adamant hide markets were stronger than what they were and kept offering higher prices. This intransigence benefitted hide processors from other parts of the world selling into a softer leather market where tanners were able to cover their needs. Asian tanners are indicating that leather orders for this time of year are well below their forecasts and are certainly lower than levels of a year ago. As a result, many tanners have reduced production levels and are showing little interest in purchasing more hides at the current high levels of raw hides. Also, they are struggling to raise leather prices on any new business for their next month of sales.

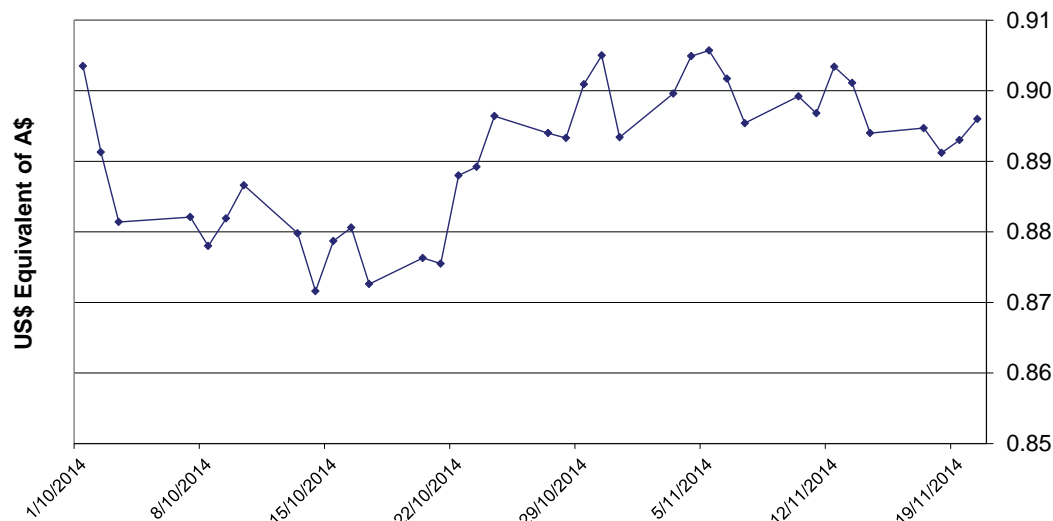

Two Month Exchange rate

The AUD/USD exchange rate has hovered below the 90¢ mark which is 3¢ down on same time last year, so the currency adjustment year on year is reducing. Red offals to Egypt have been in demand, lifting prices whilst other cuts have traded steadily. Omasum remains strong along with demand from China. Rendered meals remain under pressure from abundant soybean meal and lower priced MBM from USA is competing in export markets.

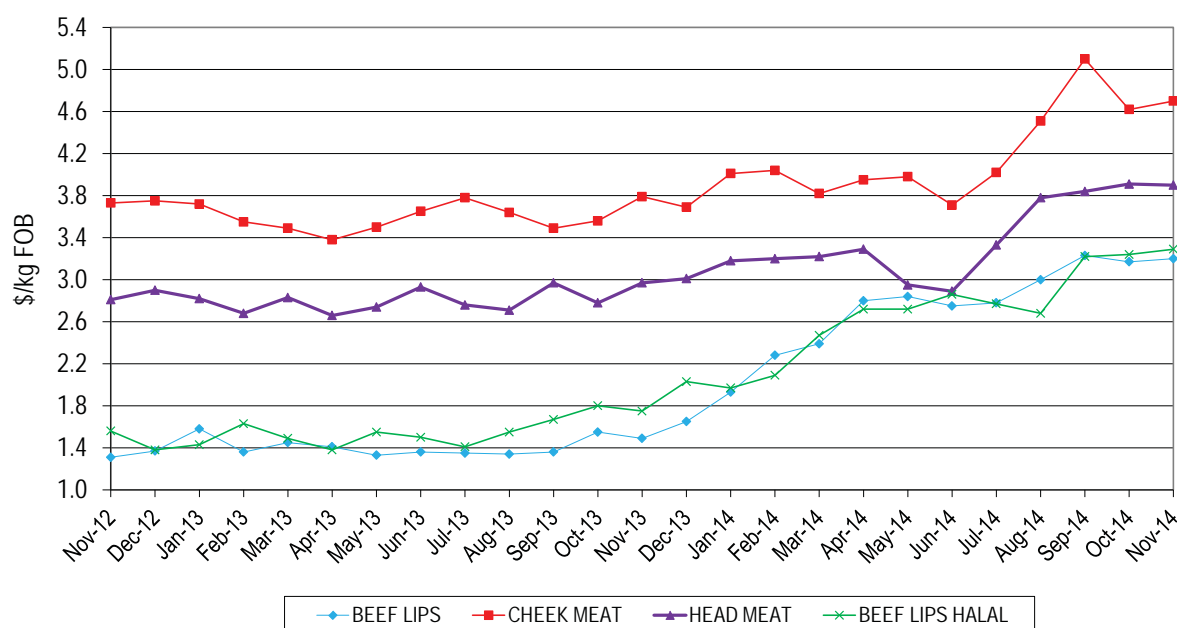
Tallow continues to fall however there seems to be some renewed interest from Singapore, albeit at light volume and lower pricing.

After a good run for the last couple of years hide markets are showing all the signs of a major correction going forward.



Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

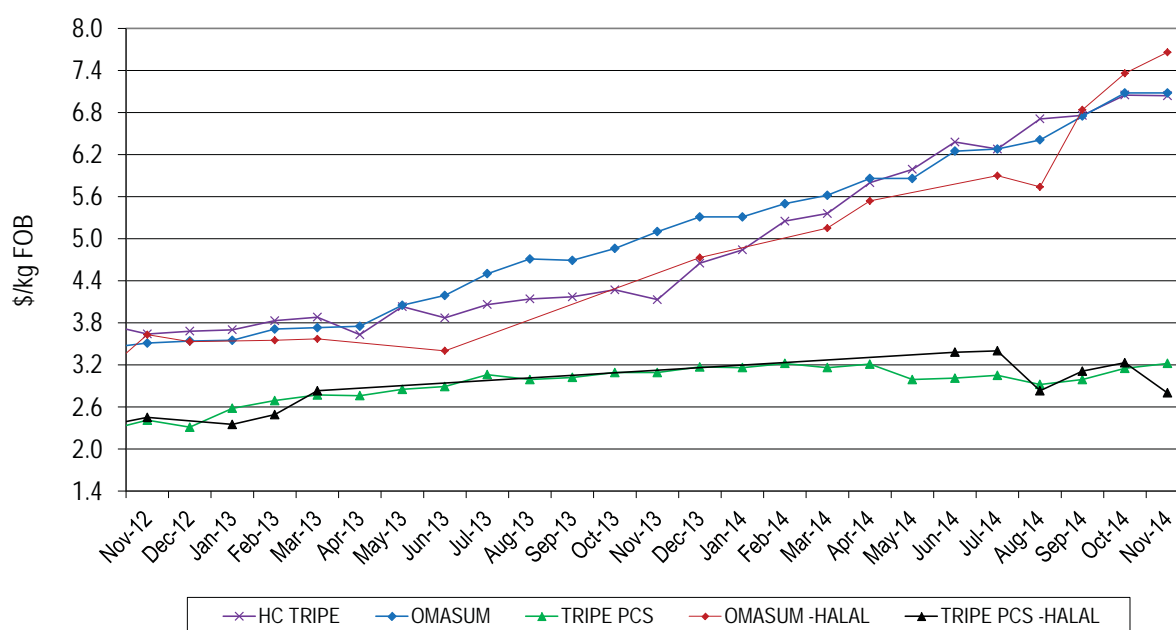


Head offals continue their strong performance, with firm improvement year-on-year but as we said last month they have probably found their ceiling at the moment. Halal cheek meat has improved 91¢/kg over the November price last year, to average \$5.33/kg.

With the average price of halal beef lips steady at an average price of \$3.29, this shows an improvement of \$1.54/kg on last year.

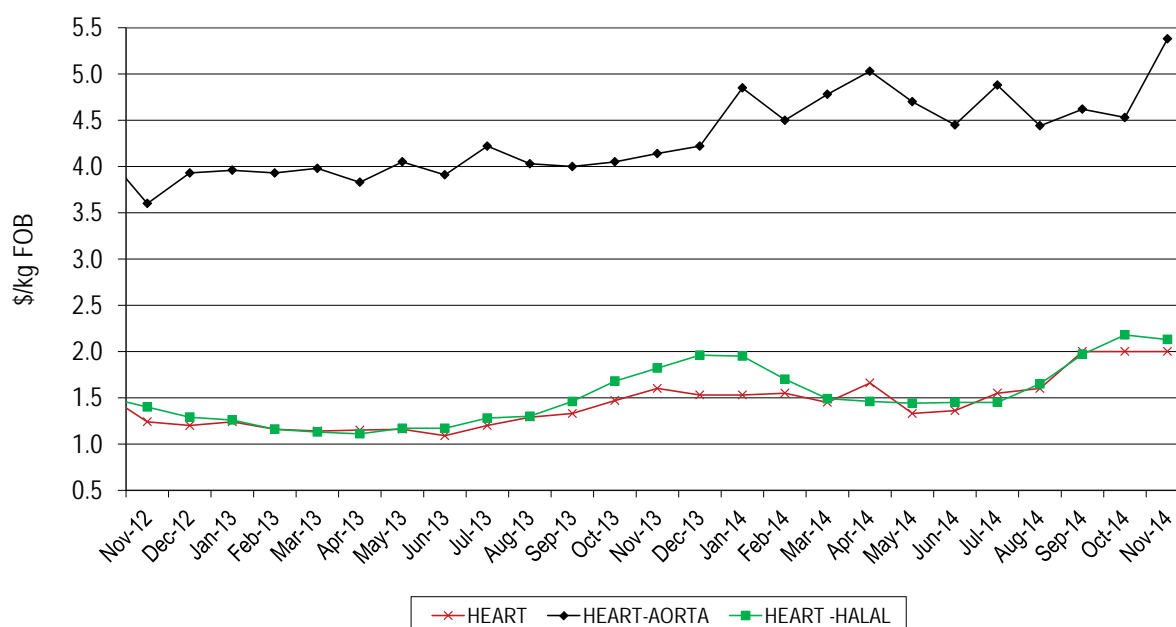
Halal head meat also strengthened over the same period, rising \$1.03/kg, to trade at an average of \$4.44/kg.

While tripe pieces, both halal and non-halal, continue to hold their own, trading very steadily across the year at around the \$3.00/kg mark, the omasum and honeycomb tripe markets march on. As the graphs show there has been a linear growth since early last year. Record prices of \$7.08/kg for non-halal omasum and \$7.66/kg, up another 30¢/kg for the month, for halal product represent an increase of 45% on last year. Similarly honeycomb tripe, mainly to Taiwan, is up \$2.91 on a year ago to trade at \$7.04/kg.

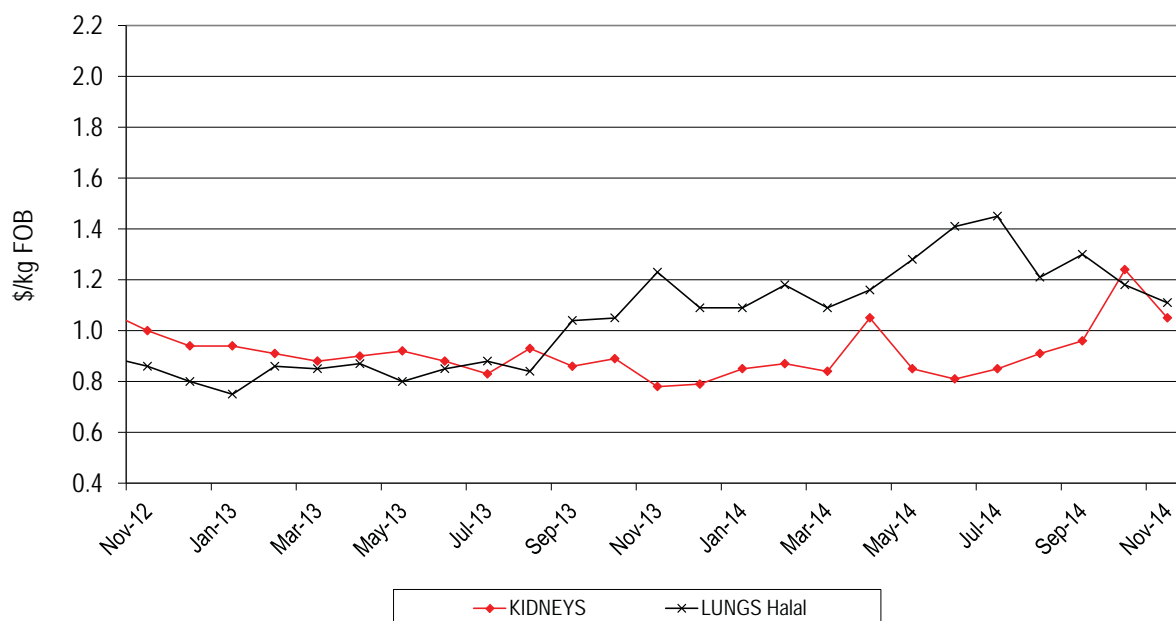
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



As with other red offals, heart products also continue their firm trend, with non-halal hearts up over last year by 40¢/kg, averaging \$2.00/kg, which is on a par with last month. Halal hearts at \$2.13/kg are 31¢/kg up on this time last year but down 5¢/kg compared to last month.

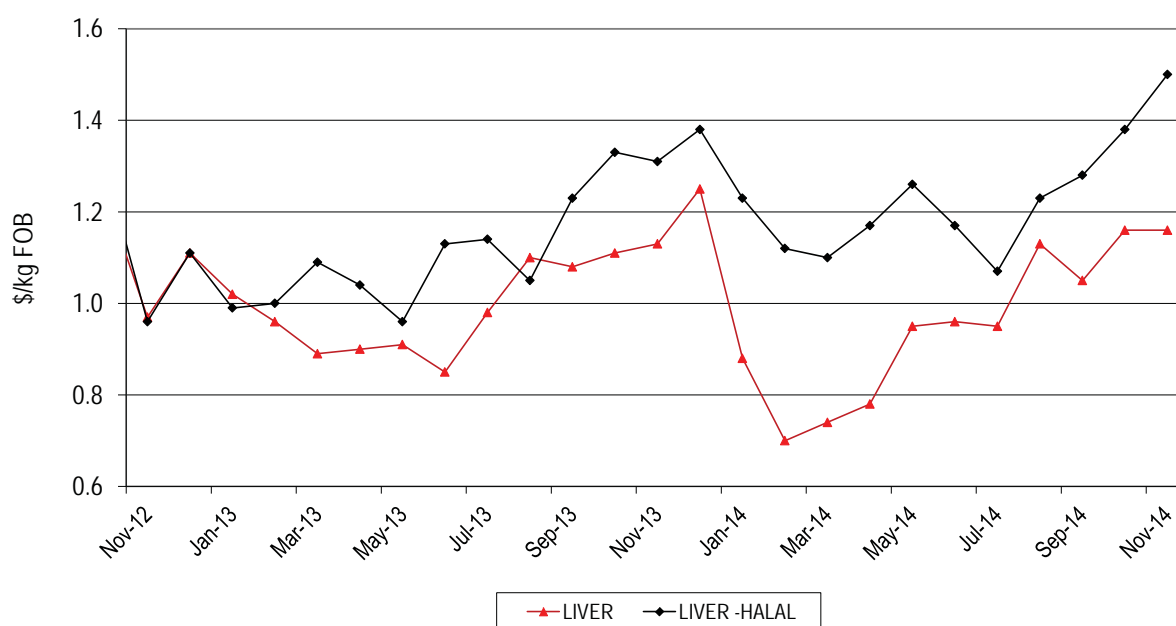
Aorta may have steadied last month but it jumped again this month to average \$5.38/kg, up 85¢/kg since last November.

Kidneys were back on last month to trade at \$1.04/kg which is still 27¢/kg up on last year, however there were significant variations in prices reported which seems to be related to the timing of sales. Lungs continued to fall across the board, down 12¢/kg to \$1.11/kg, while non-halal product was not reported.

Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

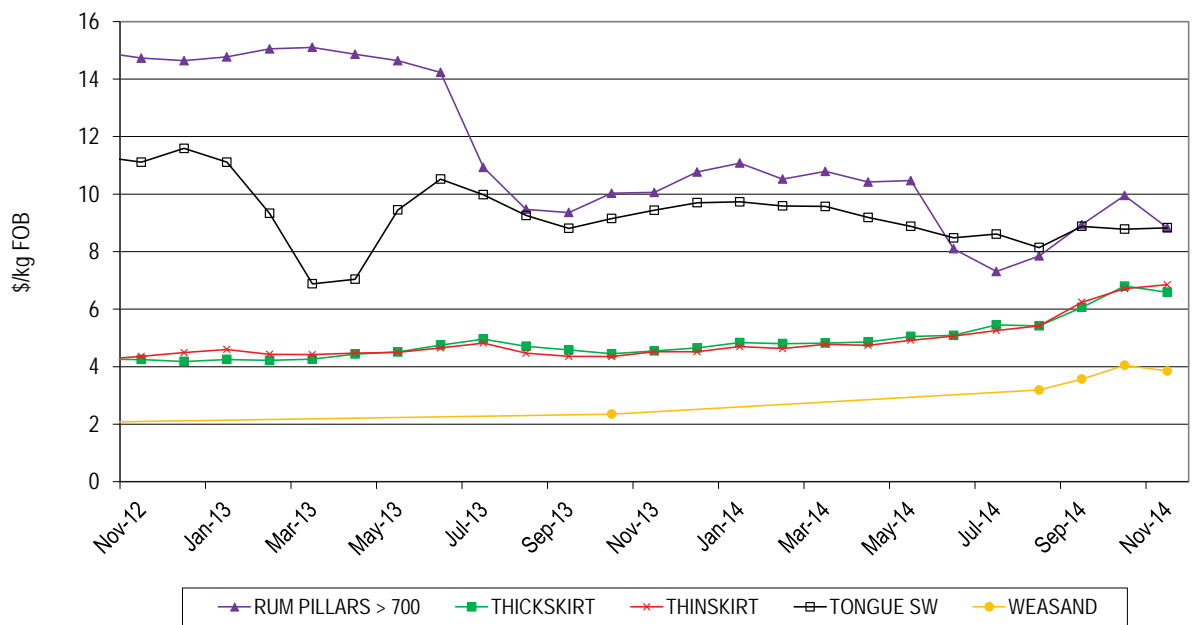


Livers were steady compared to last year to trade at \$1.16/kg however halal livers rallied to \$1.50/kg up 19¢/kg year on year.

With the softening of the 90CL trim market there may also be a softening of offal market in South East Asia. However, with the approach of the end of year plant closures, prices should remain firm with diminished supply.

Japanese and Korean Offals

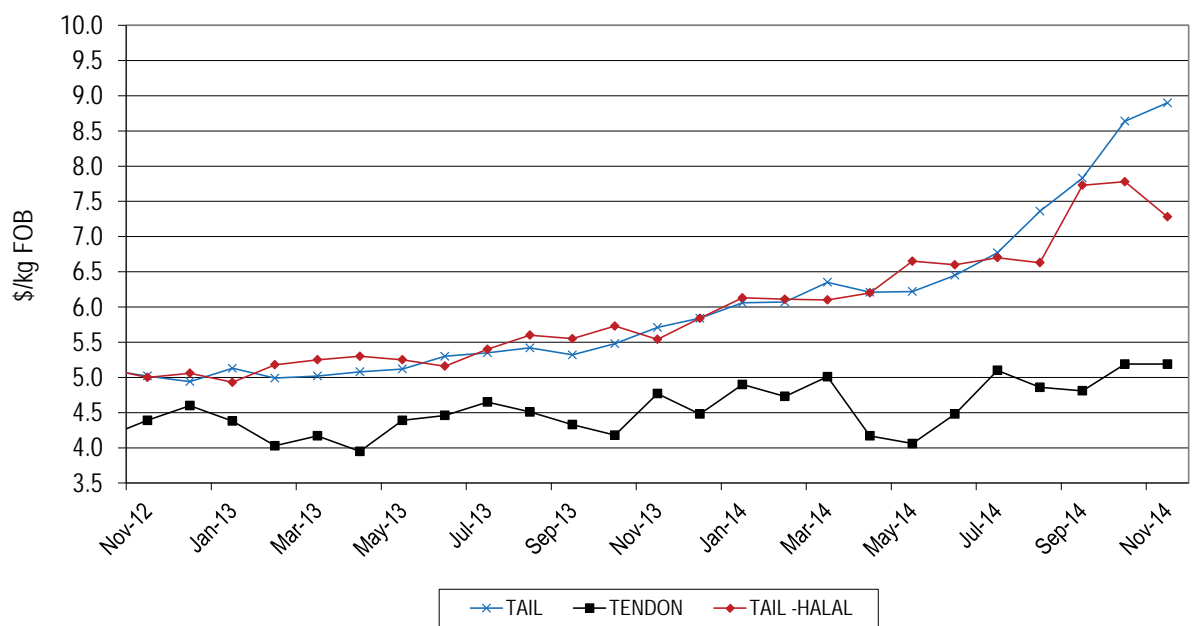
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The average price of tongues is down by 61¢/kg across the year but stable month on month with demand remaining firm. Prices of rumen pillars, particularly the heavy weight range were back from the spike last month. Demand in the Korean market is steady. Thick and thin skirt prices were around \$2.10 higher across the year, at an average price of around \$6.80/kg, which is steady when compared to last month. The average price of weasand was higher at about \$3.85/kg, up from around \$2.00 a year ago.

Tails and Tendons

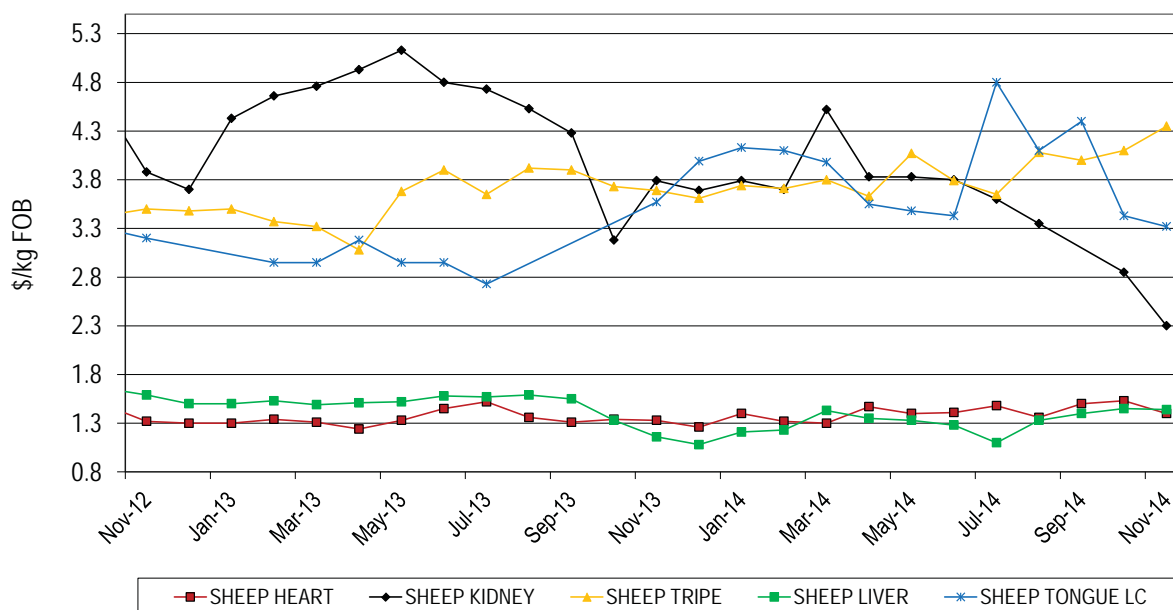
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices continued to rise, up 26¢ from last month and an improvement of \$3.19 over last year, averaging \$8.90/kg. Halal tail prices rose \$1.74/kg across the year to trade at \$7.28/kg, down 50¢/kg on last month. Tendons have improved 42¢/kg to average \$5.19, on par with last month's price.

Sheep Offals

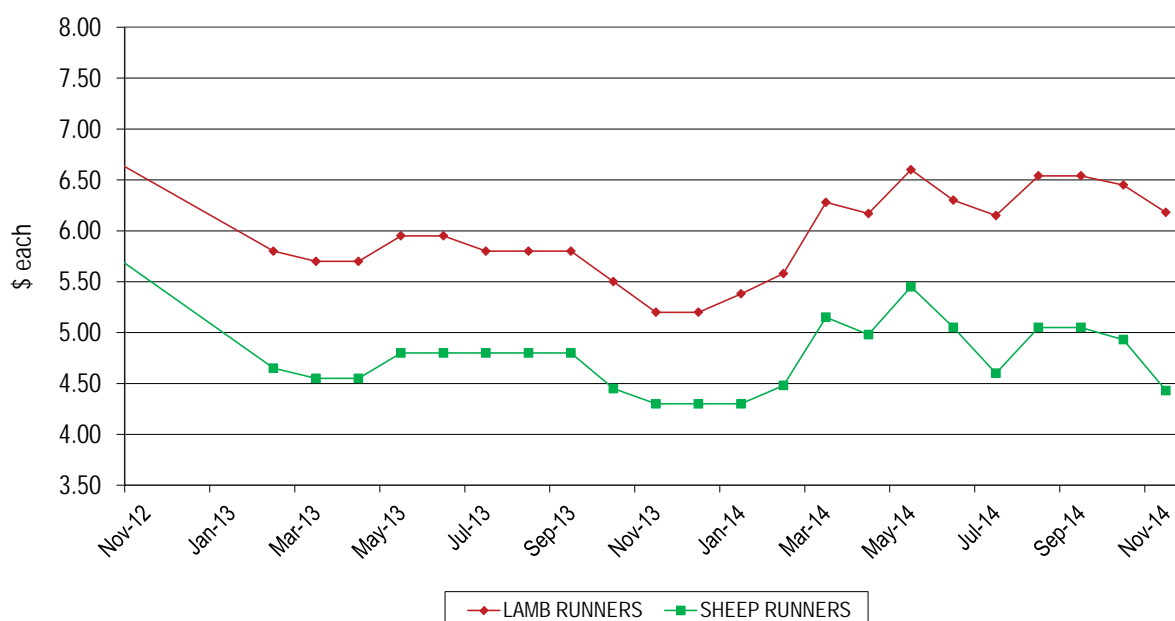
Figure 6: Trends in sheep offal prices



Sheep offals are trading relatively steady with slight improvements across the year. Sheep tripe prices have improved 66¢/kg across the year to trade at \$4.35/kg, 25¢/kg up on last month.

Sheep kidneys are the only reported item to not follow the trend and have continued to decline, trading at \$2.30/kg, down \$1.49/kg on average across the year and 55¢/kg lower month-on-month.

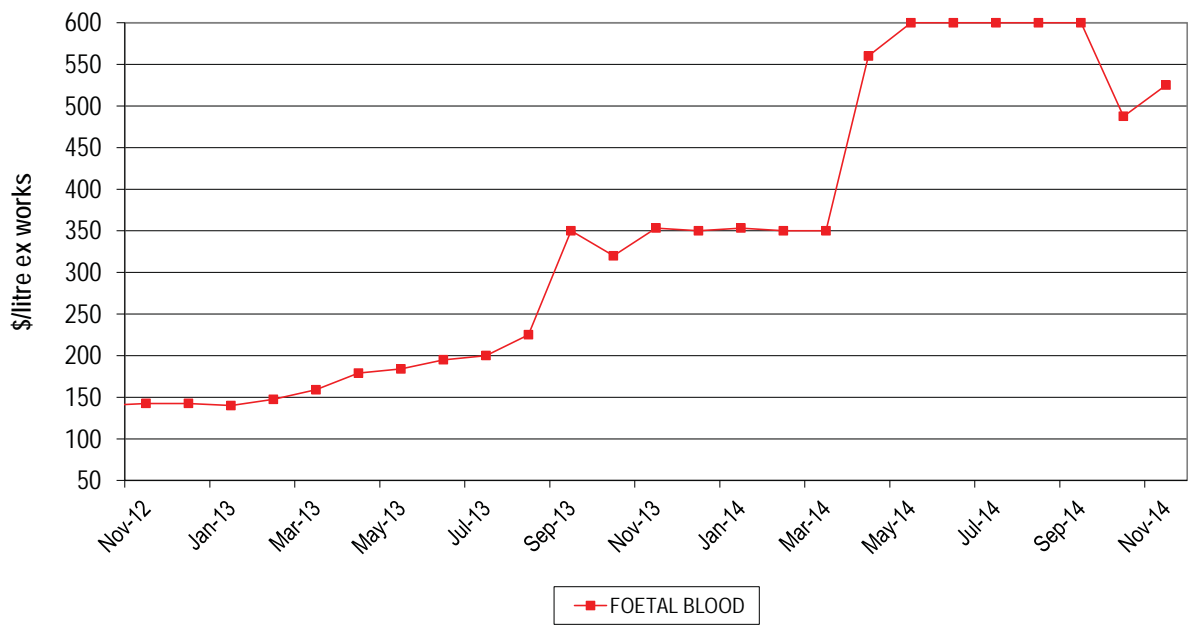
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners fell slightly this month, trading at \$6.18/piece for lamb and \$4.43/piece for sheep – this is up 98¢/piece for lamb and 13¢/piece for sheep runners compared to last November.

Foetal calf blood has steadied after last week’s correction, however it was lightly reported and may still have some downward pressure applied.

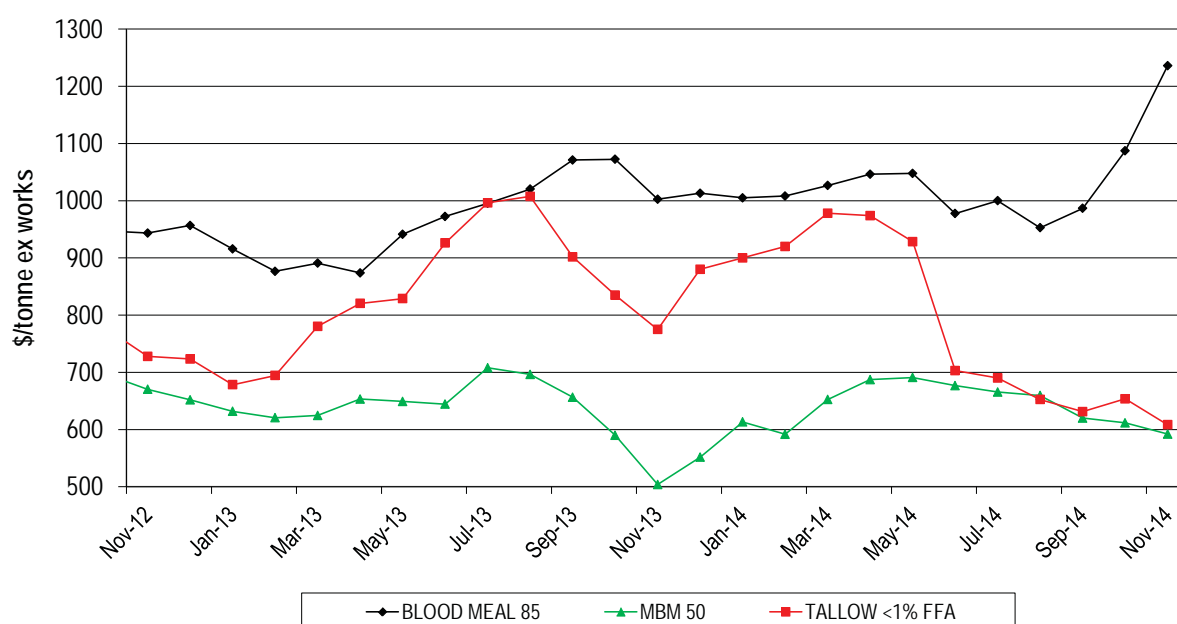
Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



Concentrated gall has also seen some price correction, however it also was lightly reported this month, but the trend certainly indicates a downwards move. The average price is down \$3.92/kg on last year and \$2.50/kg on last month.

Rendered Products

Tallow remains very much in the doldrums, losing another \$45 on last month's price, reversing last month's quotes plus some. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$608/tonne ex. works which is \$166 down on the renewable fuel subsidy induced prices of a year ago. The price of palm stearin was slightly down at \$US690/tonne FOB Malaysia. There did not seem to be too much confidence in the tallow market for a reversal of this trend. Exports of pure beef tallow to Taiwan remain difficult.

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices continued to fall on the back of soybean meal. MBM values will need to continue to drop to remain competitive in feed rations. Major export markets are carrying high priced MBM inventory which, on reduced usages, will last longer and therefore affect demand moving forward into Nov/Dec. Strong kills throughout Australia are also providing sufficient supply.

Blood meal has jumped \$149/mt to average \$1236/tonne which represents an improvement of \$233/mt on last month. Increased aquaculture demand is driving demand on the back of short inventory.

Hide markets have had a good run for a couple of years but sooner or later it had to end. The cost of leather kept increasing and became uneconomical and many made the decision to reduce or turn away from leather and use more synthetics in their articles.

Factors, such as reduced demand for leather, slowdown in the Chinese economy, high raw costs, among other reasons, have precipitated a market on the slide. In the past, reduced kills from USA would see hide markets surge but tanners are now more adept at using hides from other parts of the world (Europe, Australia, Brazil) and they are able to cover shortfalls from the USA.

It is reported many hide processors are trying to forward sell as many hides as possible as what is not sold today will be sold at a lower price later. Hide markets are showing all the signs of a major correction going forward.

China Australia Free Trade Agreement

China and Australia recently agreed to finalise a free trade agreement that will provide preferential outcomes for Australian beef and lamb products over countries such as EU, US and Canada and will put Australia on equal footing with New Zealand, Chile, and ASEAN.

Key outcomes for the red meat industry include

- Elimination of tariffs on beef imports (currently ranging from 12 - 25%) within 9 years
- Elimination of 12% tariff on beef offal within 4 - 7 years
- Elimination of tariffs on sheepmeat (currently ranging from 12 - 23%) within 8 years
- Elimination of the 18% tariff on frozen sheepmeat offal within 7 years
- Elimination of the 7% tariff on sheep skins over 4 years
- Elimination of tariffs on beef hides and skins (currently ranging from 5 - 8.4%) between 2 and 7 years
- Elimination of 8% tariff on tallow over 4 years

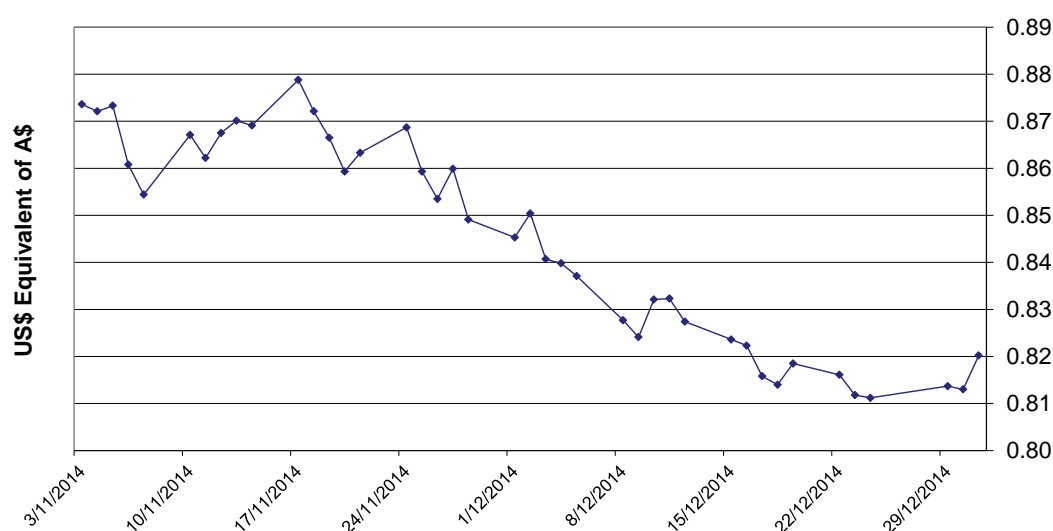

Two Month Exchange rate

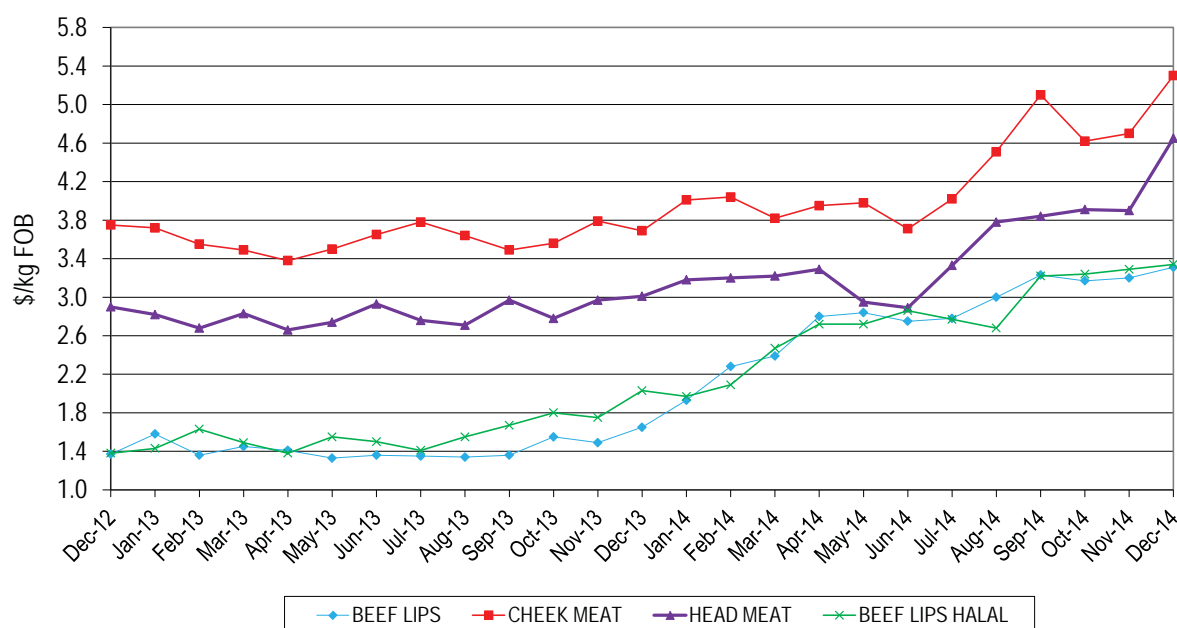
The AUD/USD exchange rate eased in December to finish the month at 82¢ which is 7¢ down on same time last year and is reflected in improved prices in general. Omasum continued its strong showing, supported by demand from China. Meat and bone meal (MBM) continued to soften due to abundant soybean meal and lower priced MBM from the USA competing in export markets. Blood meal prices rose sharply due to increased local aqua demand and a shortage due to high exports in previous months.

Tallow has strengthened marginally on renewed interest from Singapore and an increase in palm stearin prices. With reduced hide prices over the last couple of months having created interest in Australian hides again, export prices have stabilised somewhat, assisted by the fall in the Aussie Dollar.



Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices



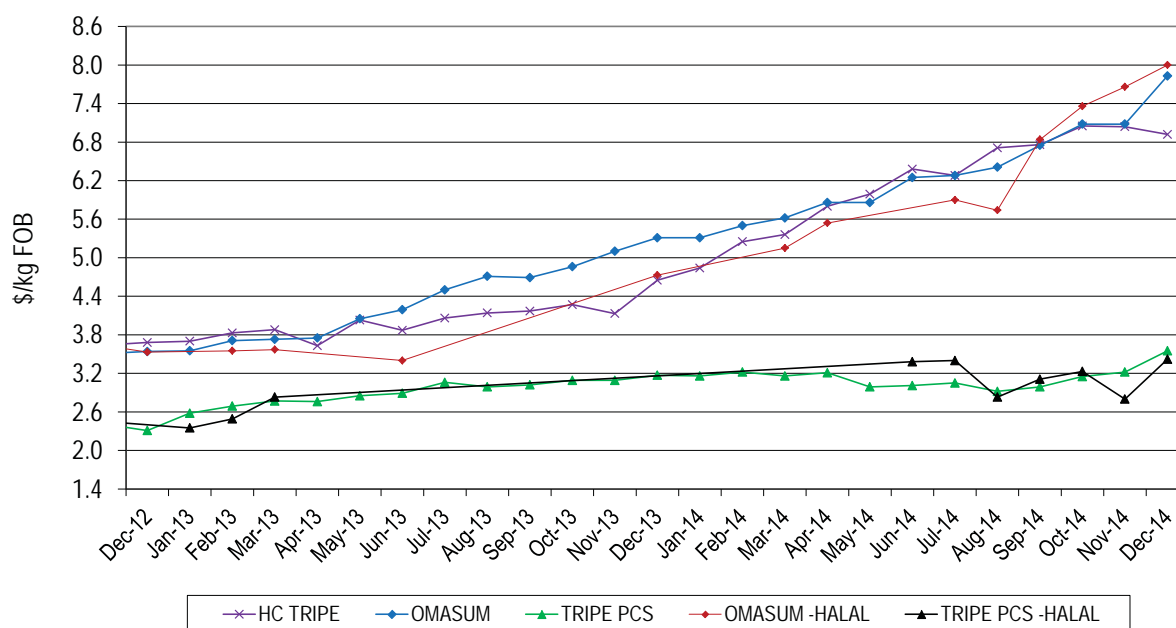
Head offals continue their strong performance, with firm improvement year-on-year but this time the majority of the rise was based on the falling dollar. Cheek meat improved \$1.61/kg over the November price last year, to average \$5.30/kg.

Beef lips rose \$1.66/kg, to finish at \$3.31/kg, while halal lips traded at \$3.34/kg, up \$1.31/kg on last year.

Halal head meat also strengthened over the same period, rising \$1.64/kg, to trade at an average of \$4.65/kg.

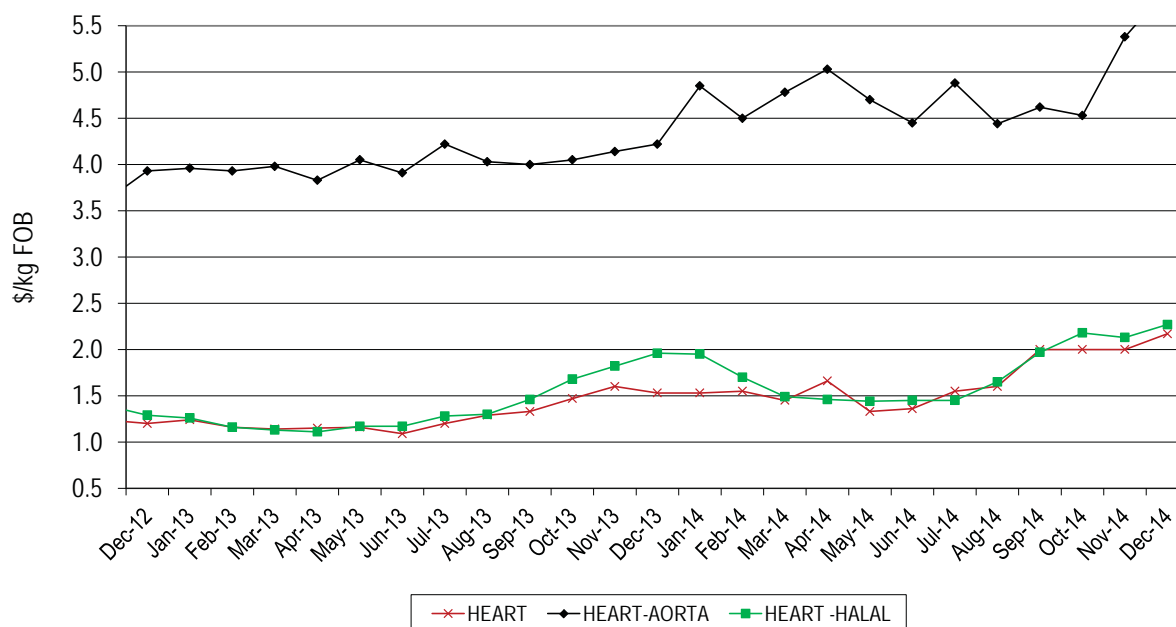
Beef Offal Trends

Tripe pieces, both halal and non-halal, improved to \$3.55/kg and \$3.42/kg, respectively, while omasum continued north. As the graphs show there has been a linear growth since early last year. Record prices were recorded of \$7.83/kg for non-halal omasum and \$8.00/kg, up another 34¢/kg for the month, for halal product. Similarly, honeycomb tripe, mainly to Taiwan, was up \$2.27/kg on a year ago to trade at \$6.92/kg which represents a fall of 12¢/kg for the month, somewhat against the overall trend.

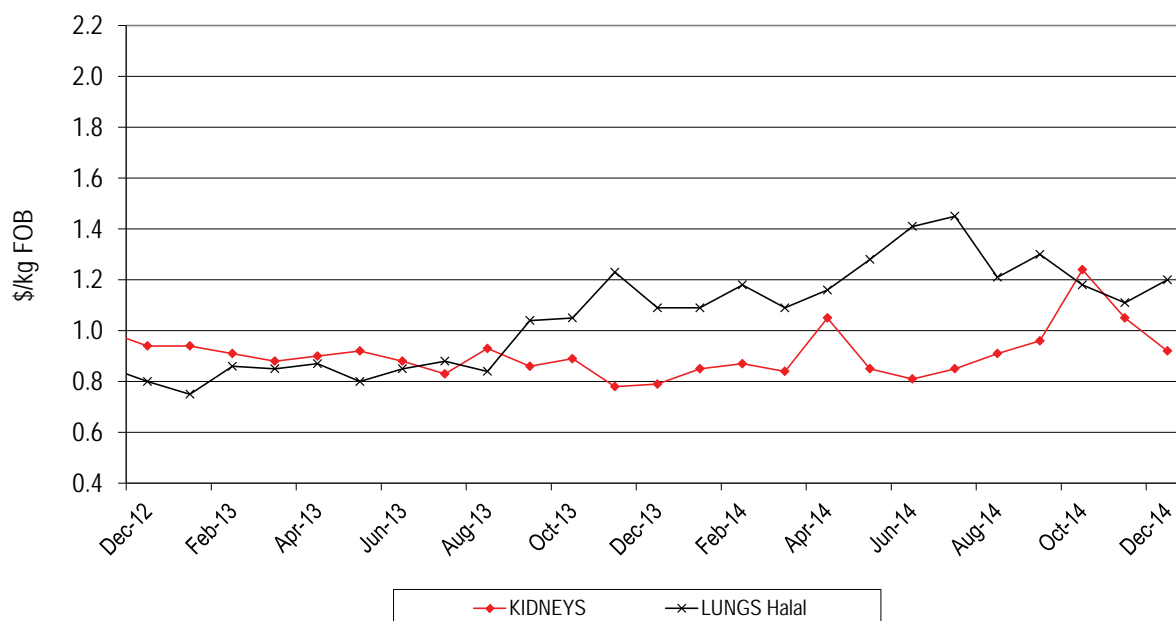
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



As with other red offals, heart products continued to trade strongly. Non-halal hearts were up 64¢/kg year on year, averaging \$2.17/kg, which is 17¢/kg better than last month. Halal hearts, at \$2.27/kg, were 31¢/kg up on this time last year and 14¢/kg up compared to last month.

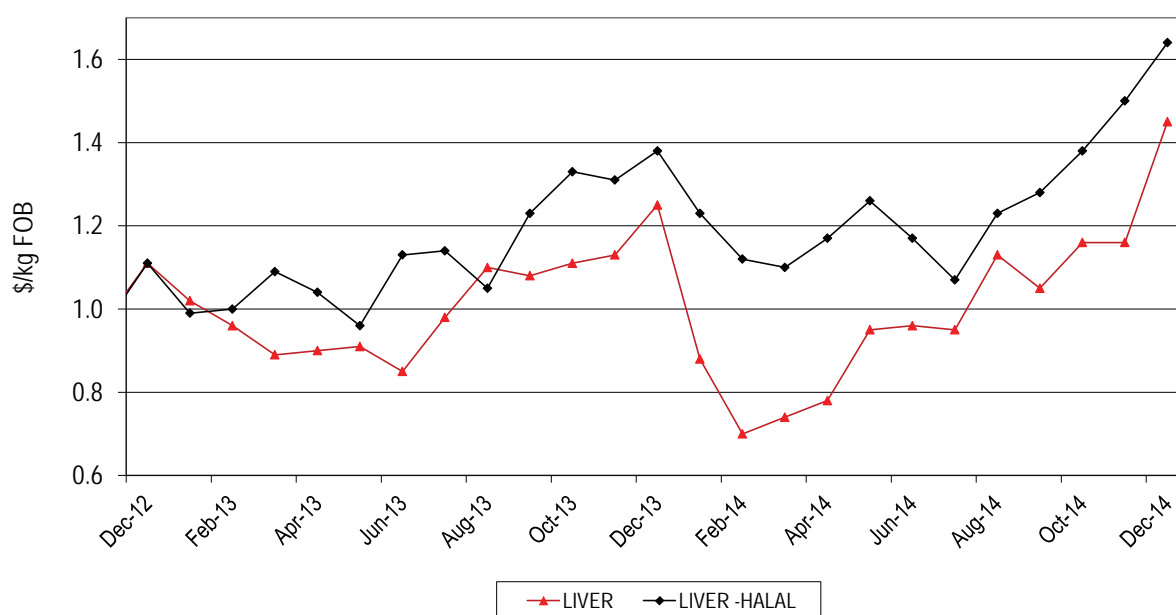
Aorta also continued upward again this month to average \$5.90/kg, up \$1.68/kg since last December.

Kidneys continued their downward trend due to poor demand and fell a further 13¢/kg month-on-month, to trade at 92¢/kg, but this is still 13¢/kg up on last year. Lungs were also in poor demand, with no reports of non-halal product sold, while halal product was firm at \$1.20/kg, with only the falling dollar assisting in maintaining a steady return.

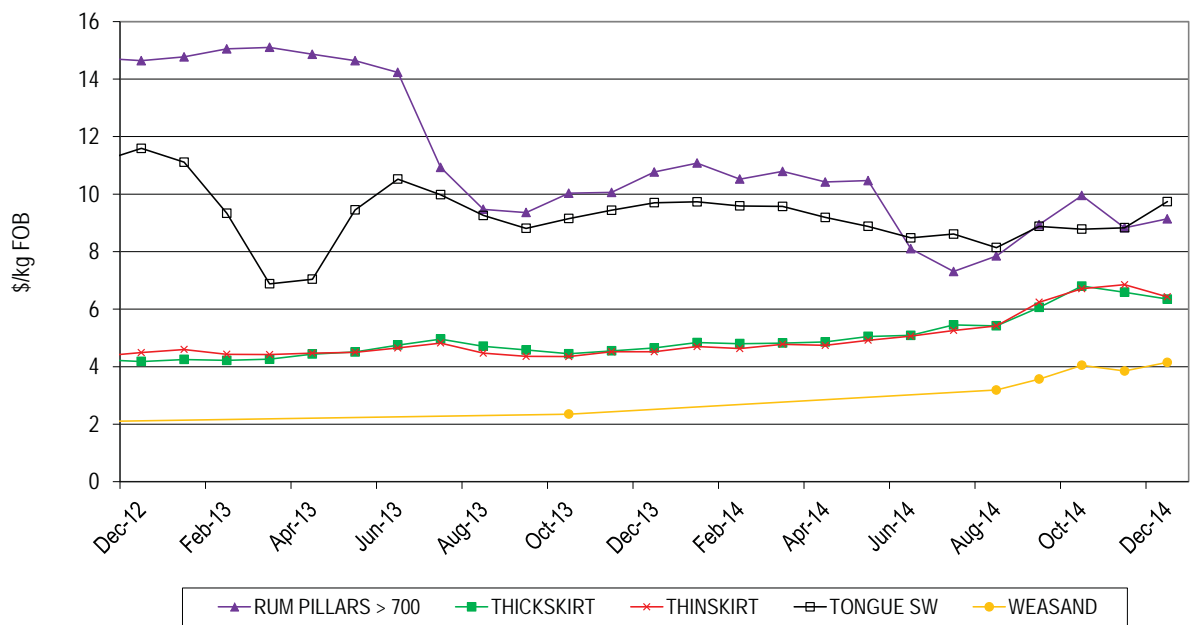
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



Livers were stronger by 20¢/kg over last year to trade at \$1.45/kg which was a 29¢/kg month-on-month improvement, while halal livers rallied to \$1.64/kg, up 26¢/kg year-on-year and 14¢/kg on last month.

The end of the year generally shows a rally as customers ensure adequate stocks are available to cover the end of year plant closures. This traditional improved demand for the month, backed by the diminishing Australian dollar, saw the South East Asian market really assist with an end of year rally in value back to the carcass.

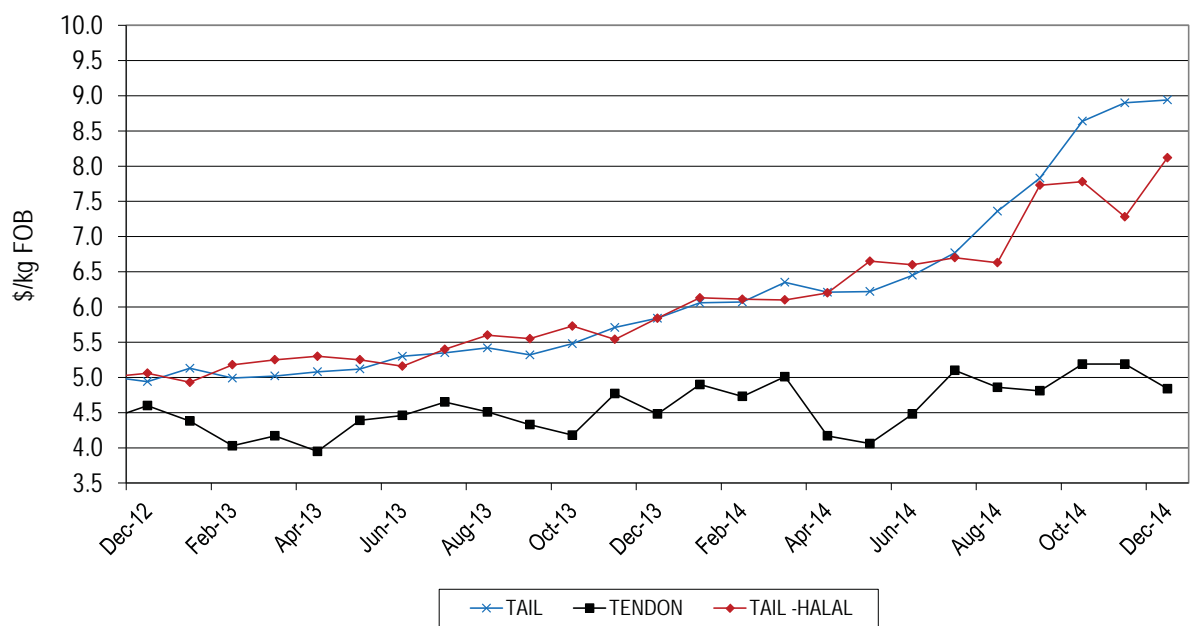
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The average price of tongues is on par with this time last year and up 91¢/kg month-on-month, driven by the falling dollar. Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars improved 31¢/kg over last month to trade at \$9.14/kg which is down \$1.63/kg on last year. Demand in the Korean market is steady. Thick skirt traded \$2.40/kg up on last year at \$6.35/kg and thin skirt prices were \$2.95/kg higher for the same period, at an average price of \$6.43/kg, which is down 42¢/kg when compared to last month. The average price of weasand was higher, at about \$4.15/kg, up from around \$2.00/kg received a year ago. Overall demand for frozen offals into these markets remains subdued and certainly does not reflect the effect of the fall in dollar.

Tails and Tendons

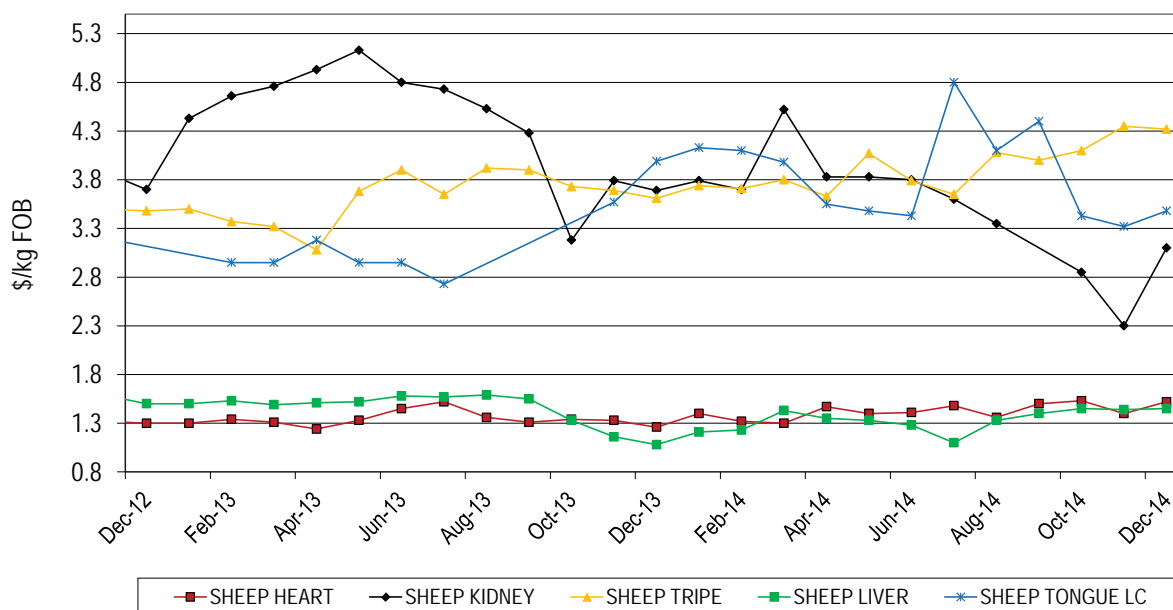
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices steadied, up 4¢/kg from last month which is an improvement of \$3.10/kg over last year, averaging \$8.94/kg. Halal tail prices rose \$2.28/kg across the year to trade at \$8.12/kg, up 84¢/kg on last month. Tendons improved 36¢/kg year-on-year to average \$4.84, which is a fall of 35¢/kg on last month's price.

Sheep Offals

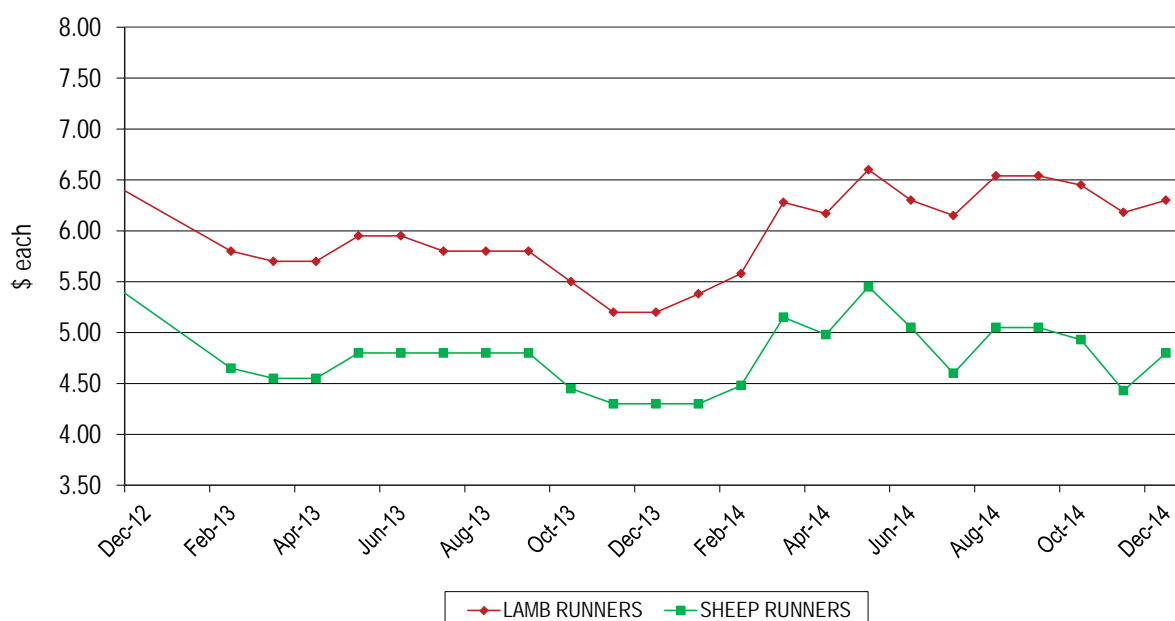
Figure 6a: Trends in sheep offal prices



Sheep offals are trading relatively steady with slight improvements across the year. Sheep tripe prices improved 71¢/kg across the year to trade at \$4.32/kg, 3¢/kg down on last month.

Sheep kidneys have reversed their recent trend and improved 80¢/kg on last month, to trade at \$3.10/kg, but still down 59¢/kg on year ago levels.

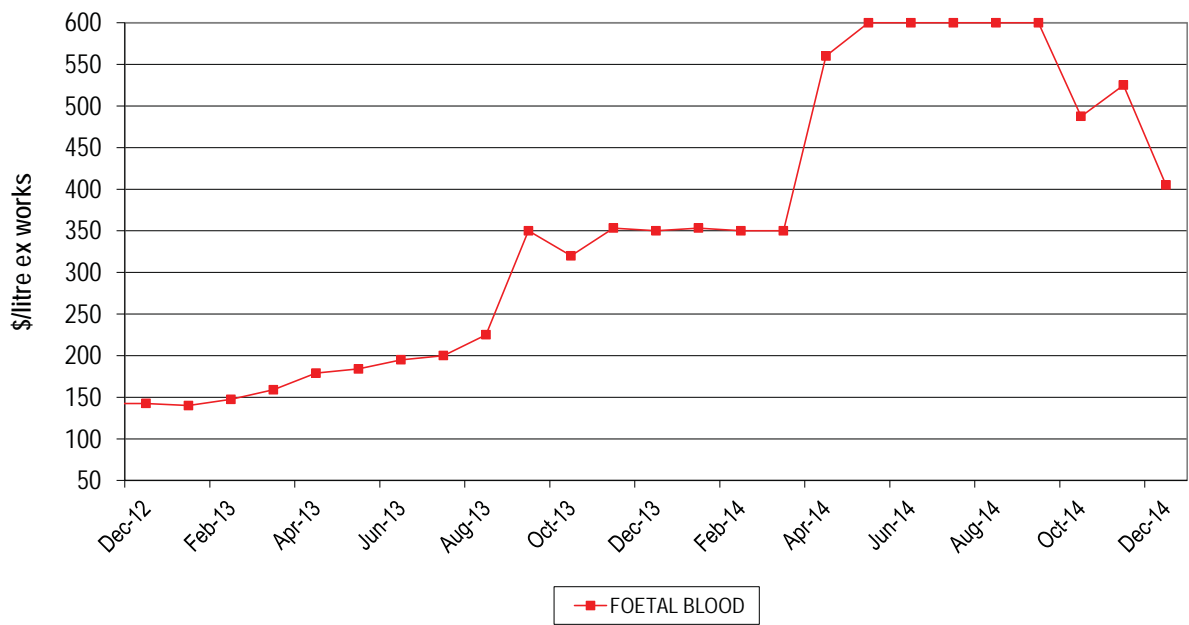
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners recovered slightly this month, trading at \$6.30/piece for lamb and \$4.80/piece for sheep – up \$1.10/piece for lamb and 50¢/piece for sheep runners compared to last December.

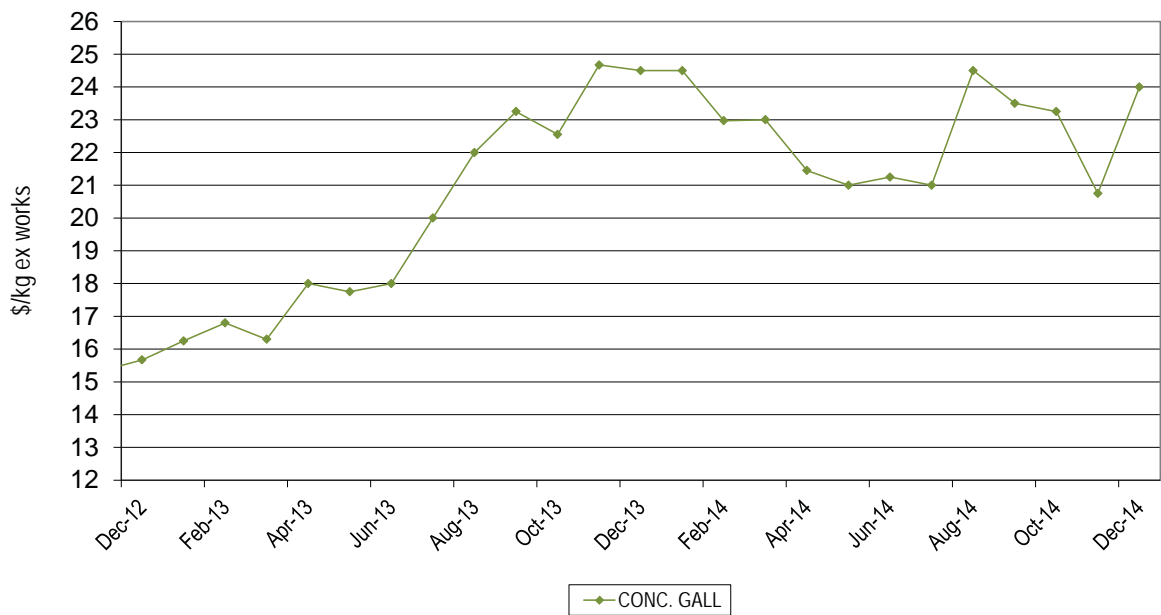

Foetal calf blood is still falling and only some longer term contracts seem to be holding average prices where they are – \$350/litre is closer to today’s reality.

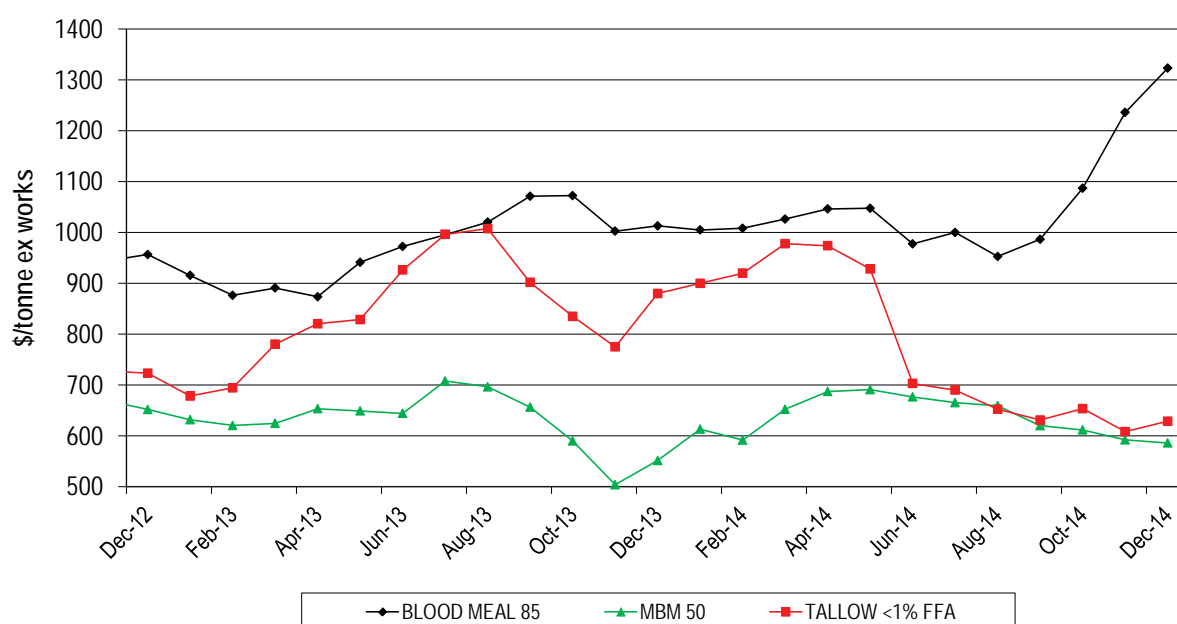
Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



Concentrated gall has reversed its trend from the last three months. The average price is still down 50¢/kg on this time last year however it improved \$3.25/kg on last month.

Rendered Products

Tallow rallied slightly this month, improving \$20/tonne on last month's price. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$629/tonne ex. works – down \$251/tonne on the renewable fuel subsidy induced prices of a year ago. While the price of palm stearin fell to \$US675/tonne FOB Malaysia, due to the weaker AUD, it was a \$30/tonne rise in Aussie dollar terms.

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices continued to soften on the back of soybean meal. MBM values will need to continue to drop to remain competitive in feed rations. Major export markets are still carrying high priced MBM inventory which, on reduced usages, will last longer and thus still affect demand. Strong kills throughout Australia are also providing sufficient domestic supply.

Blood meal jumped \$310/tonne year-on-year to average \$1323/tonne which represents an improvement of \$87/tonne on last month. Increased domestic aquaculture demand, on the back of short inventory due to previous export shipments, is driving this surge in prices.

The Australian hide market predicated the trend developing in hide prices, with significant softening in the trade between the USA and China compared to a month ago. The flow on effect of this price reduction to Australian hide prices was somewhat diminished due to industries earlier adjustment. With the assistance of an easing AUD, we may see a steadying of domestic pricing.

However problems being experienced by overseas buyers in opening of Letters of Credit in a timely manner are creating difficulties for exporters in shipping confirmed sales and adding to the exposure hide processors and exporters are facing.

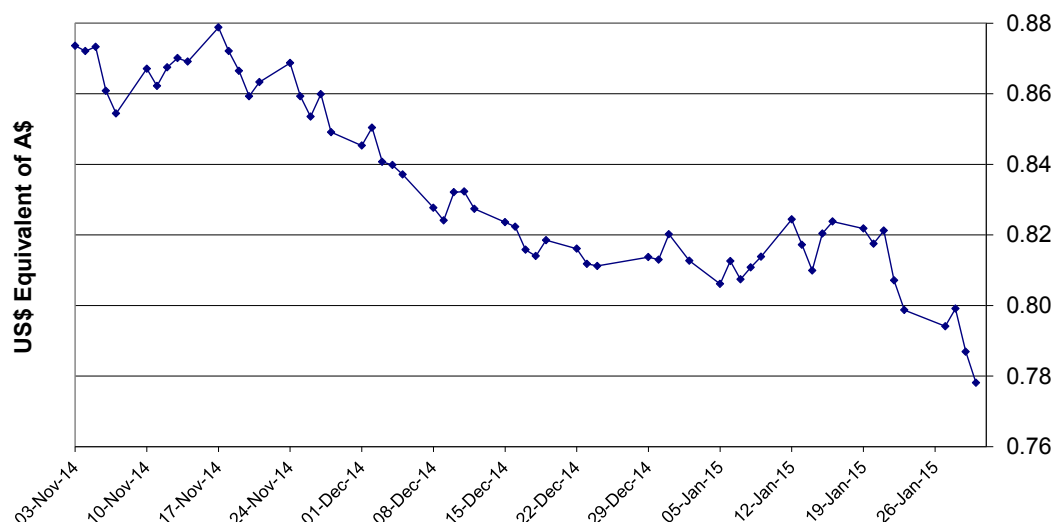

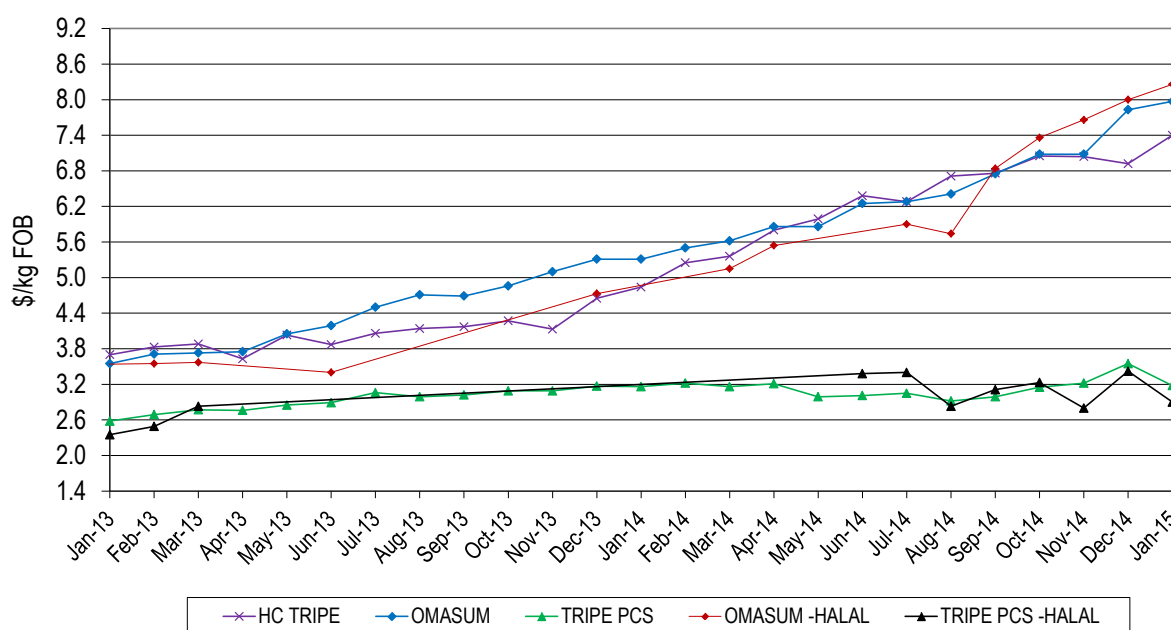
The AUD/USD exchange rate has continued south to finish the month at 78¢, down 9¢ on same time last year and continuing to improve prices in AUD terms in general. Indonesia has implemented a strict policy in an effort to promote self-sufficiency in supply of beef to the market and to lower the price to consumers. This has seen exports to Indonesia for January drop dramatically. Omasum and honeycomb tripe continue the linear improvement in price, supported by demand from China.

Two Month Exchange rate



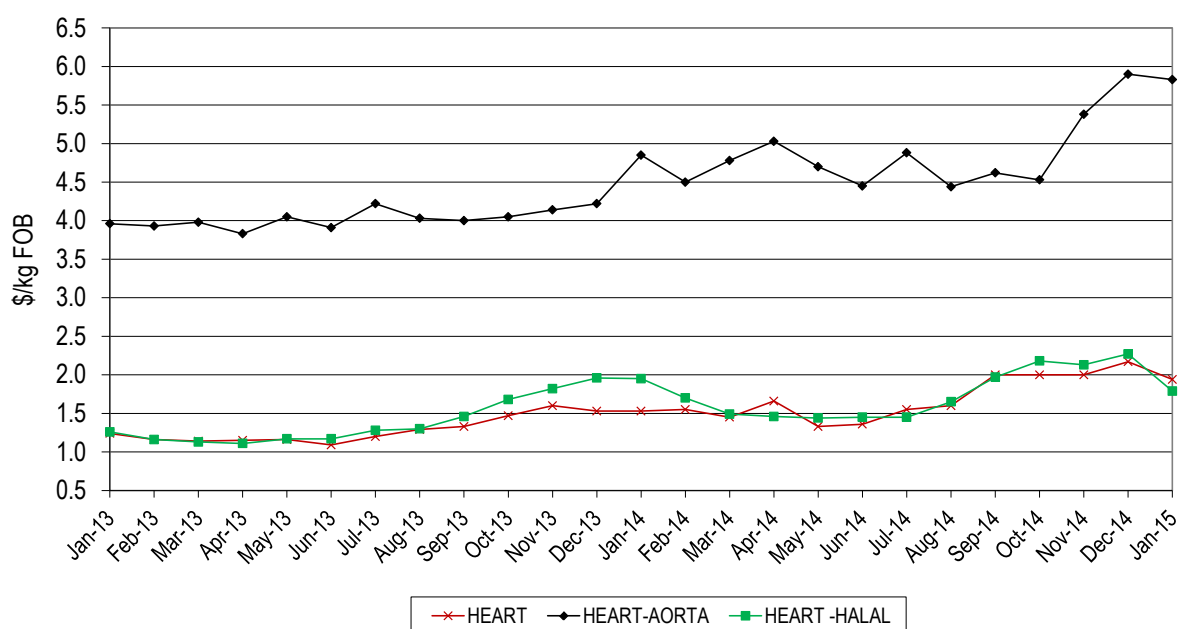

Tripe pieces, both halal and non-halal, reversed last month's rise to fall to an average of \$3.18/kg and \$2.90/kg, respectively, while omasum and honeycomb tripe continued north. Records continue to be broken, with \$7.97/kg being paid for non-halal omasum and \$8.26/kg, up another 26¢/kg for the month, for halal product. Following the same trend, honeycomb tripe was up \$2.56/kg on a year ago to trade at \$7.40/kg, representing a jump of 48¢/kg for the month.

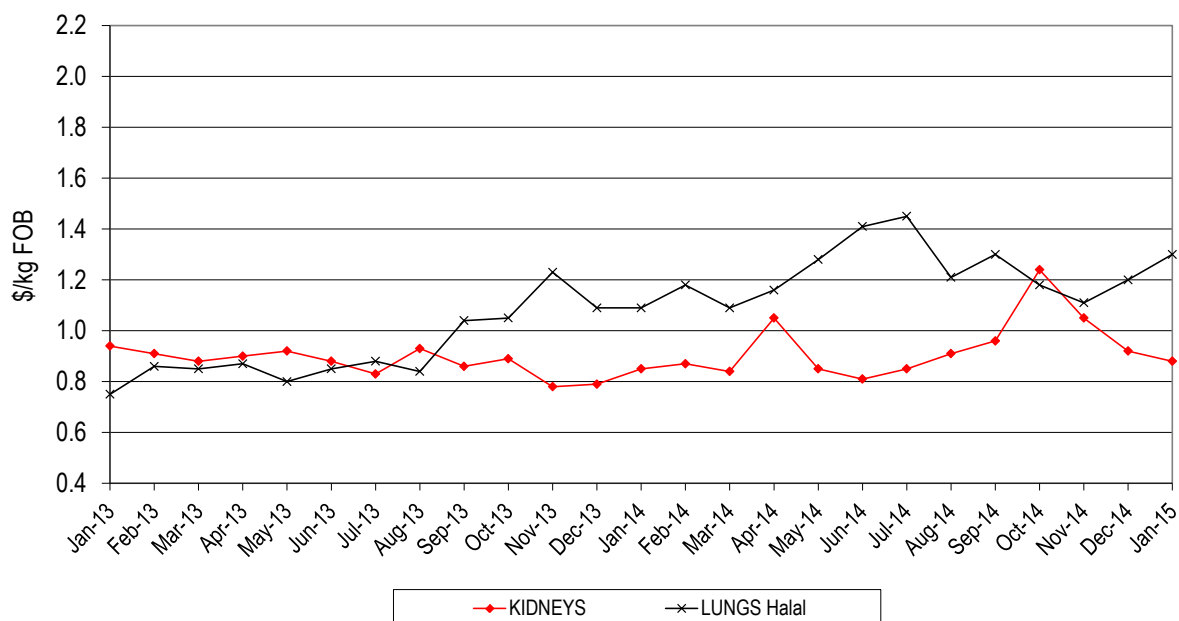
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



Heart products have been the only items to fall across the board this month. Non-halal hearts were down 23¢/kg on last month but still 41¢/kg stronger year-on-year, averaging \$1.94/kg. Halal hearts, at \$1.79/kg, were 16¢/kg down on this time last year and 48¢/kg down compared to last month. Again, the Indonesian slowdown is the contributing factor with other cheaper markets needing to be found.

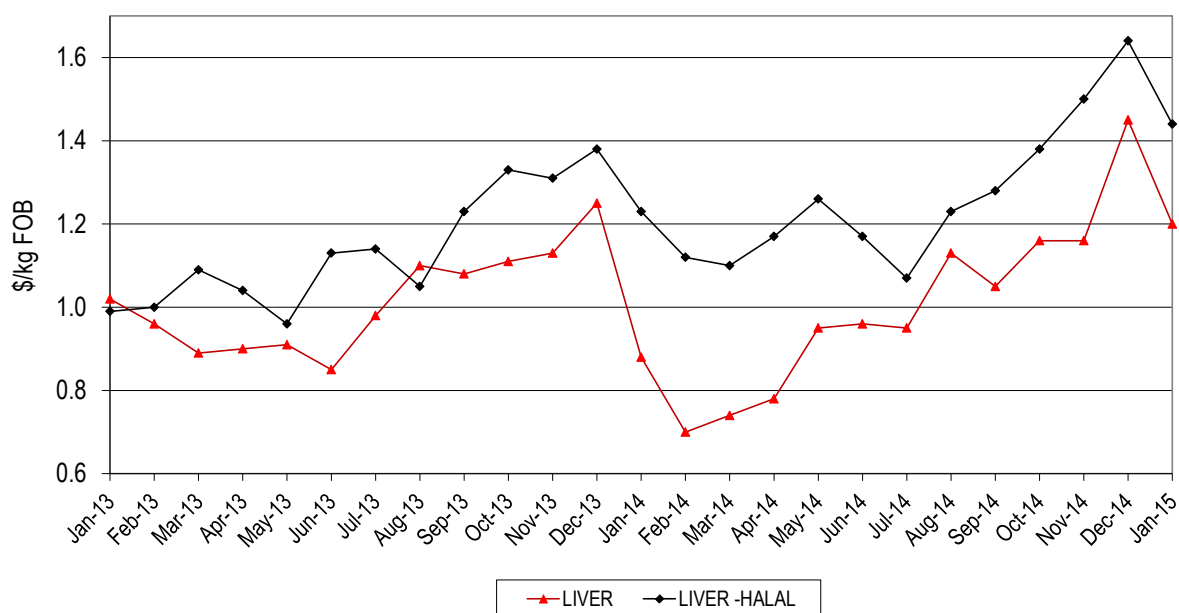
Aorta levelled out this month to average \$5.83/kg, down 7¢/kg on last month but up 98¢/kg on last January.

Kidneys continued their downward trend due to poor demand and fell a further 4¢/kg month-on-month to trade at 88¢/kg, in line with last year. Non-halal lungs spiked to \$1.62, up 66¢/kg on last year, while halal product was firm at \$1.30/kg, with the falling dollar assisting in maintaining a steady return.

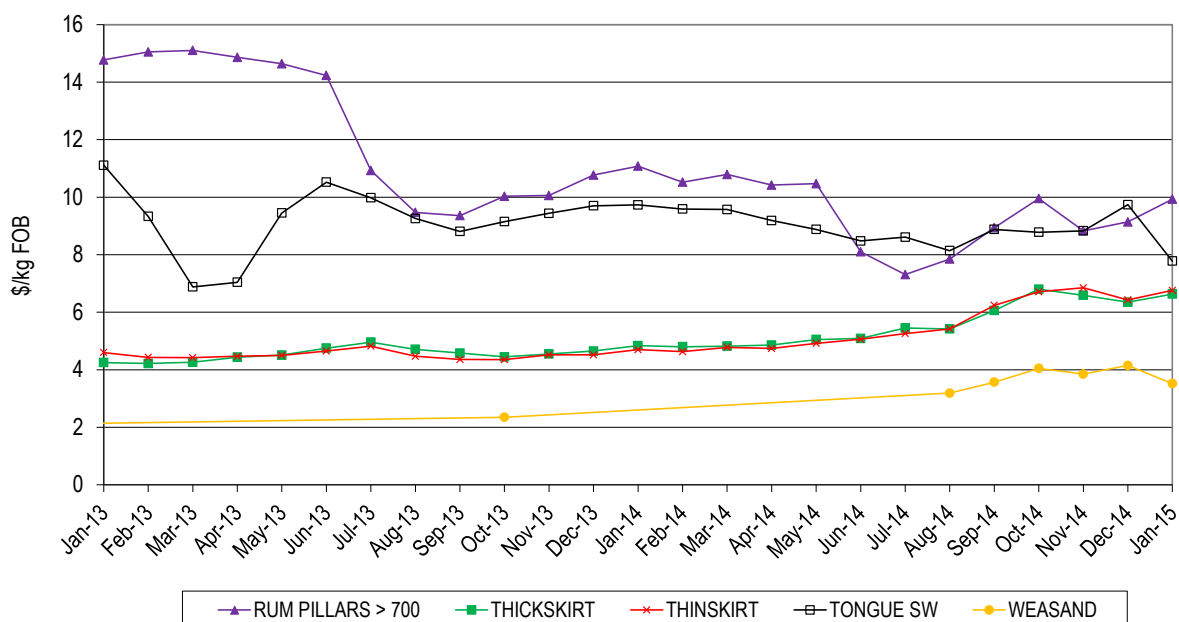
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



Livers were also under pressure with prices dropping by 25¢/kg over last month to trade at \$1.20/kg, up 32¢/kg year-on-year, while halal livers averaged \$1.44/kg, up 21¢/kg year-on-year but down 20¢/kg on last month. With predicted short kills heading into the New Year, supply will be limited, supporting the market across all products going forward.

Japanese and Korean Offals

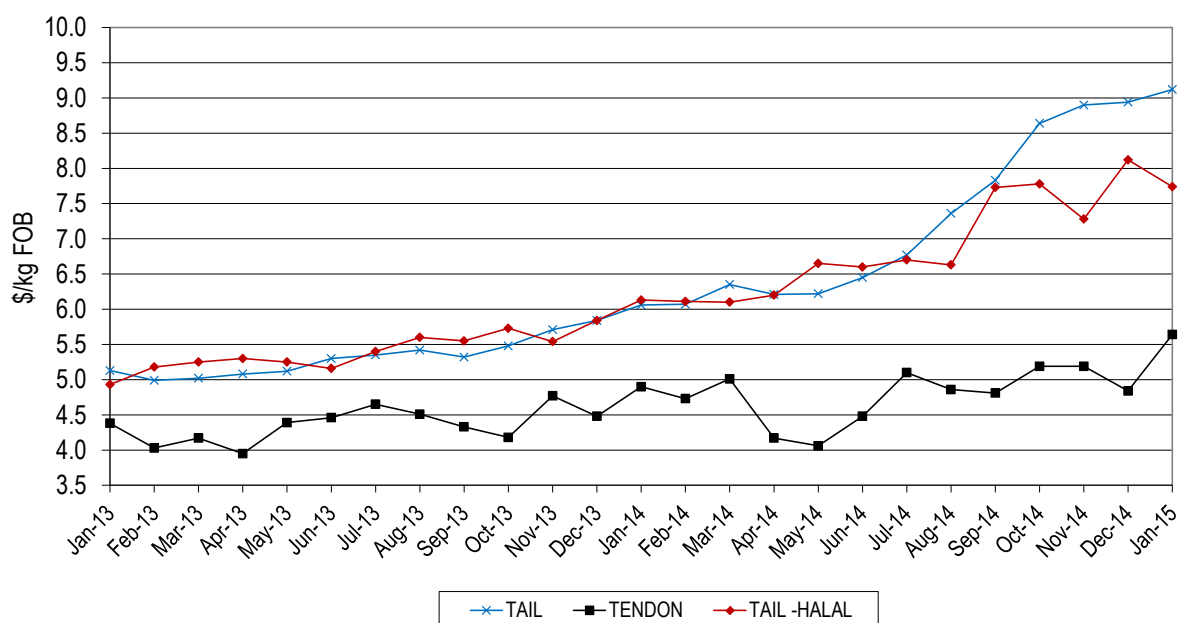
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The price of tongues took quite a hit this month, down \$1.96/kg compared to last month and last year despite the falling dollar. Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars improved 79¢/kg over last month to trade at \$9.93/kg but still down \$1.15/kg on last year. Demand in the Korean market remains steady. Thick skirt traded \$1.79/kg up on last year, at \$6.63/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$2.06/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$6.63/kg and reversing last month's fall in price, driven by the falling dollar. The average price of weasand fell by 63¢/kg for the month to \$3.52/kg, up from around \$2.00/kg received a year ago. Overall demand for frozen offals into these markets remains subdued and even the dollar could not really assist too much.

Tails and Tendons

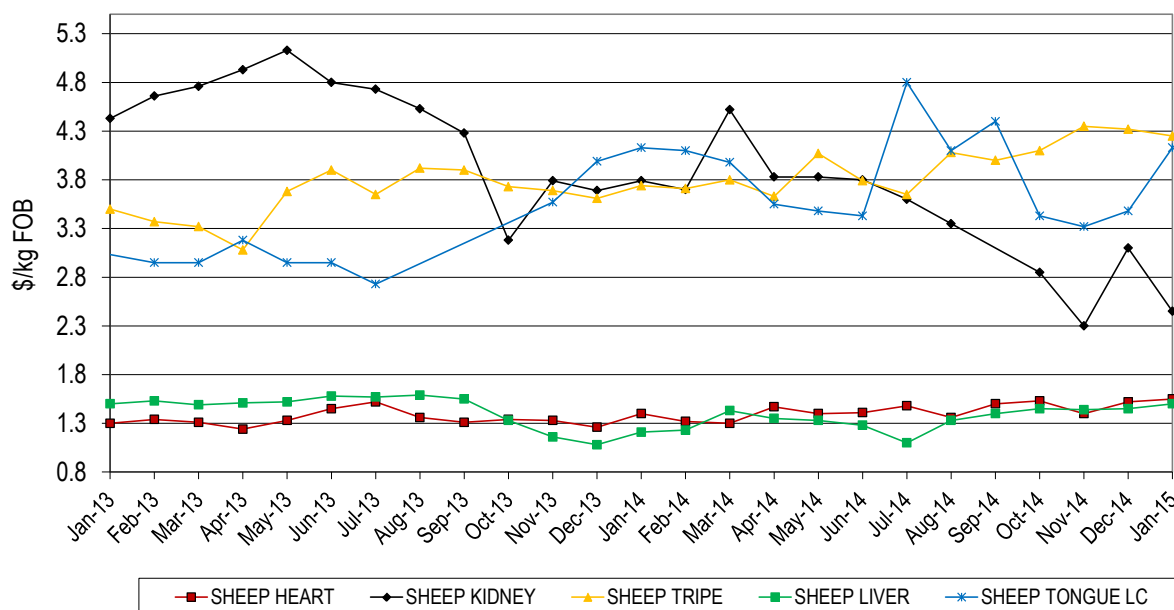
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices steadied, up 18¢/kg from last month and an improvement of \$3.06/kg over last year, averaging \$9.12/kg. Halal tail, however, fell 38¢/kg across the month to trade at \$7.74/kg, but up \$1.61/kg on last year. Tendons, however, improved 74¢/kg year-on-year to average \$5.64, up 80¢/kg on last month's price.

Sheep Offals

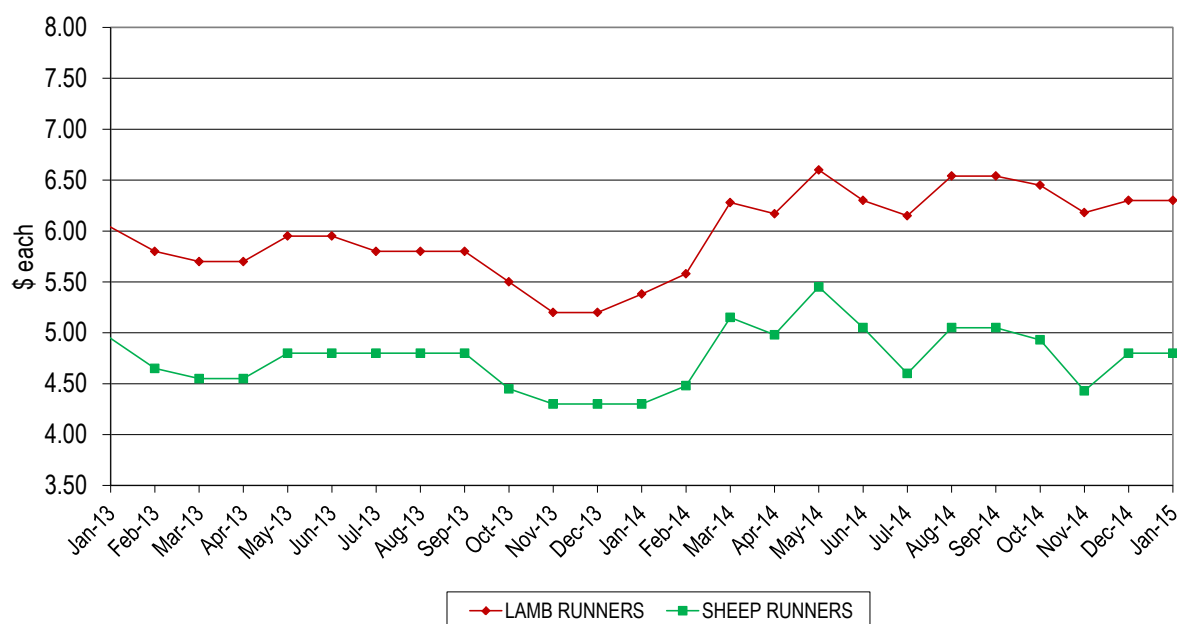
Figure 6a: Trends in sheep offal prices



Sheep offals traded relatively steady, with tongues bucking the trend, up by 65¢/kg, while kidneys followed the beef trend and fell 65¢/kg. Tongues traded at an average of \$4.13/kg while kidneys fell to \$2.45/kg.

Sheep tripe prices improved 51¢/kg across the year to trade at \$4.25/kg, 7¢/kg down on last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year, hovering around \$1.50/kg, and averaged \$1.55/kg this month.

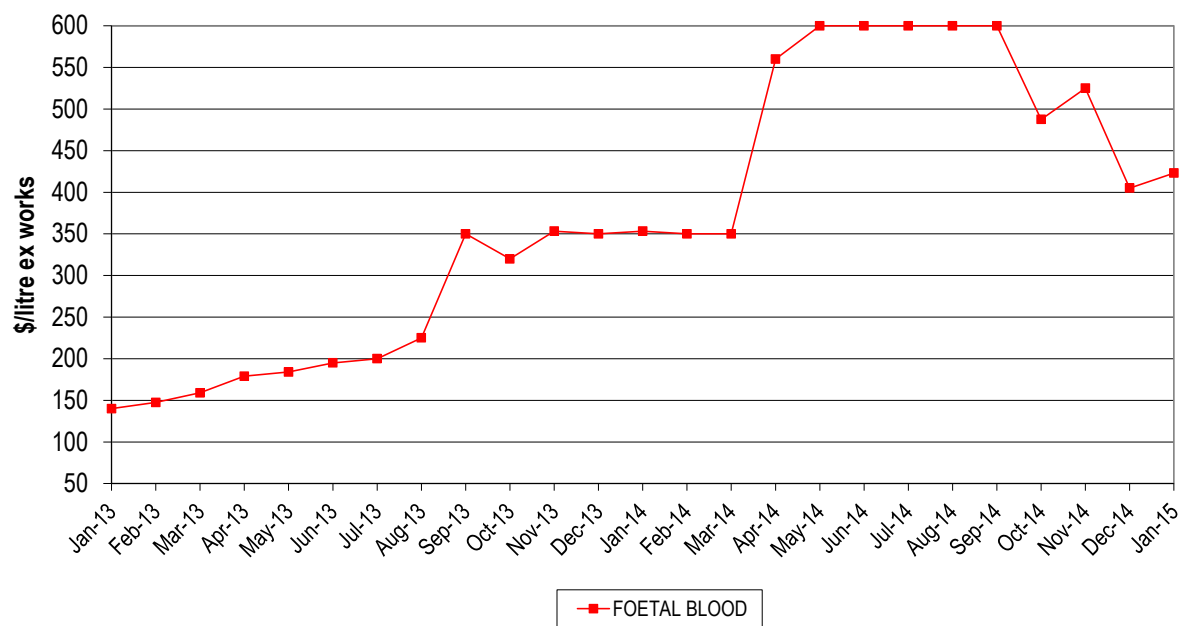
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners was steady, trading at \$6.30/piece for lamb and \$4.80/piece for sheep, the same as reported in December.

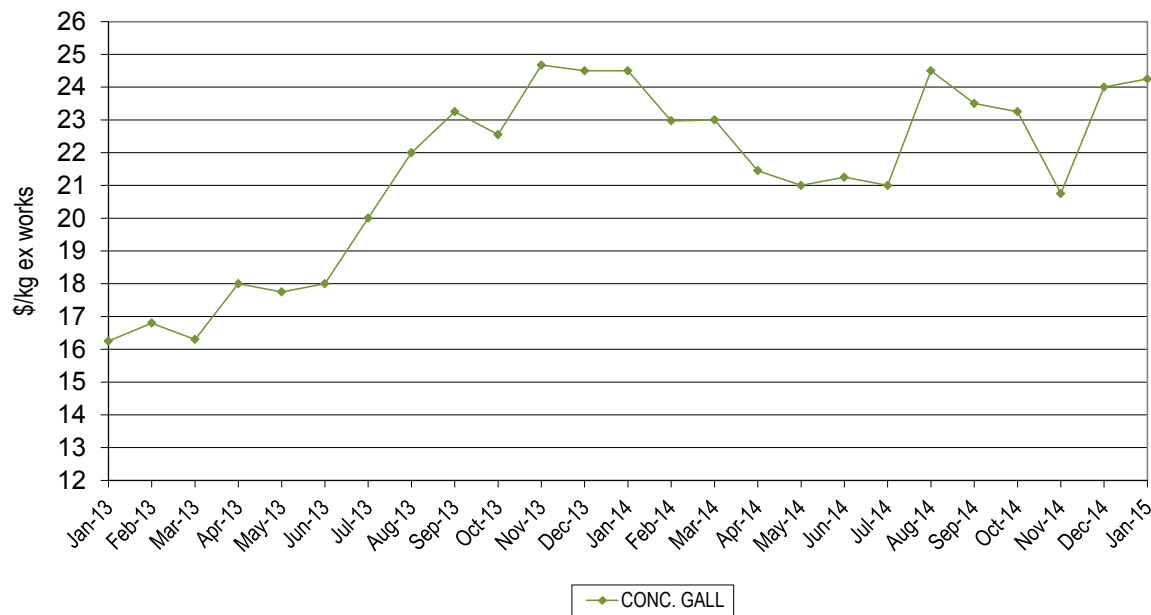

Foetal calf blood is still very widely quoted with big variation of prices reported. The real market has still got some downside.

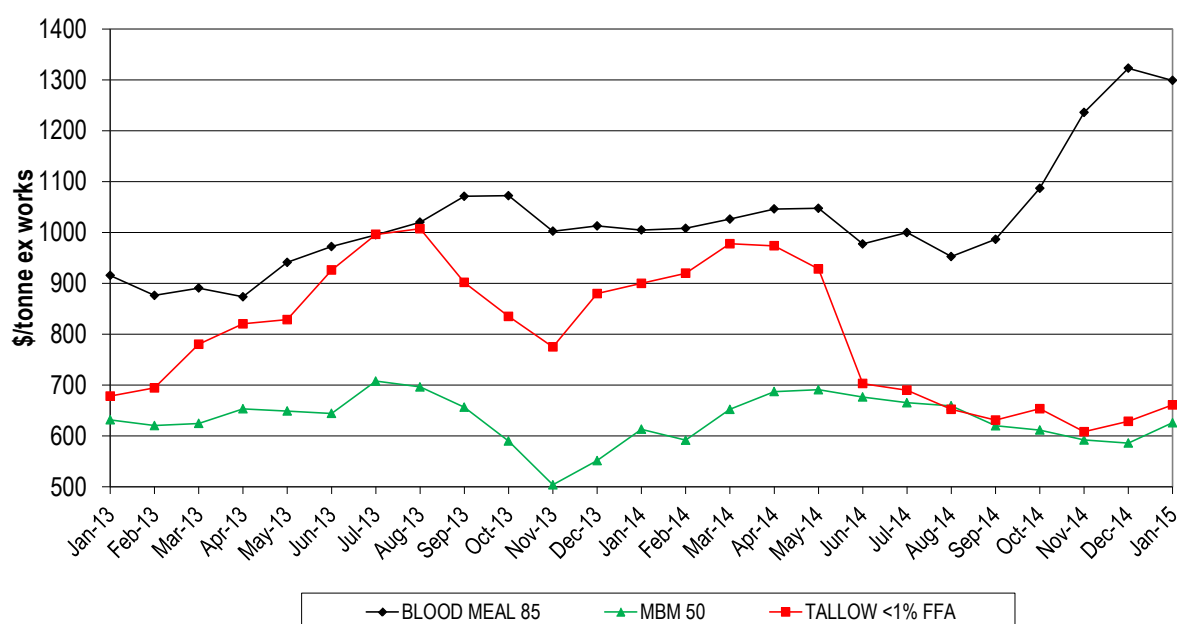
Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices

Tallow rallied slightly again this month, improving \$32/tonne on last month's price. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$661/tonne ex. works, still down \$239/tonne on the renewable fuel subsidy prices of a year ago. While the price of palm stearin fell A\$35/tonne, the renewed interest from biodiesel kept the price firm on the back of reduced production.

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices rallied due to the lower dollar and, like tallow, the reduced availability due to lower production over the summer break.

Blood meal has reversed its trend and, despite showing an almost flat position with last month prices, continued to drop during the month with prices now being quoted in the low \$1200's/tonne ex-works.

Hide processors enter 2015 with tanners continuing to keep downward pressure on hide prices brought about by slow leather markets.

Reports from China claim we can expect to see many small tanneries close as they struggle against the medium and larger tanneries who have deeper pockets and are able to absorb higher manufacturing costs created by the stricter environmental controls.

Domestically, as with other products, the weaker dollar has cushioned the fact that USD export prices are falling. With Chinese New Year approaching markets will remain subdued.

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$/each or \$/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

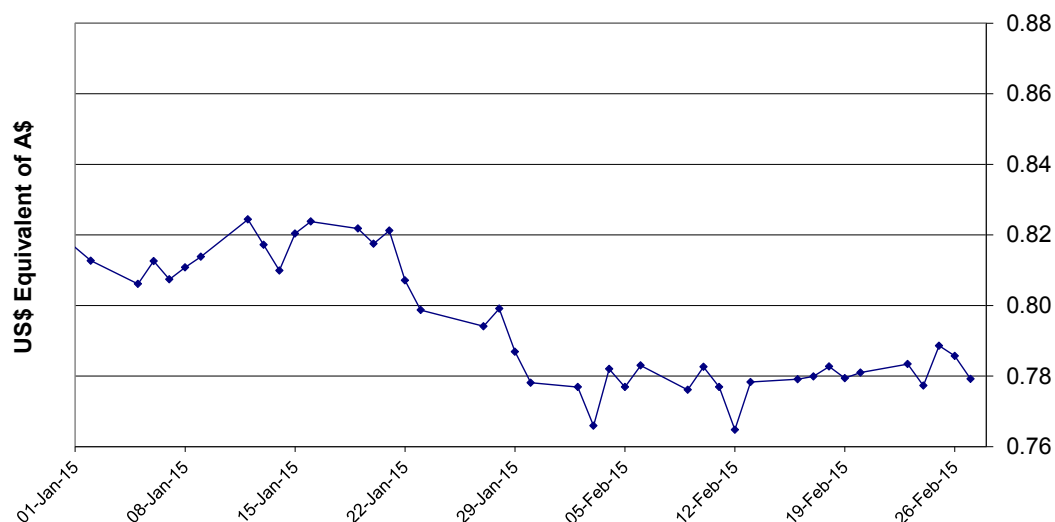
The AUD/USD exchange rate has continued to languish to finish the month at 78¢, down 11.5¢ on same time last year and helping to support AUD export prices. Indonesia has continued a strict policy to stop the import of offal with only tails and tongues permitted. This has seen offal exports to Indonesia almost stop. Omasum into Hong Kong continued the linear improvement in price however honeycomb tripe reversed sharply.

Meat and bone meal prices for late month sales

dropped dramatically and will be reflected in average March prices. Blood meal prices slipped somewhat due to reduced demand. Tallow has plateaued on the back of falling palm stearin prices.

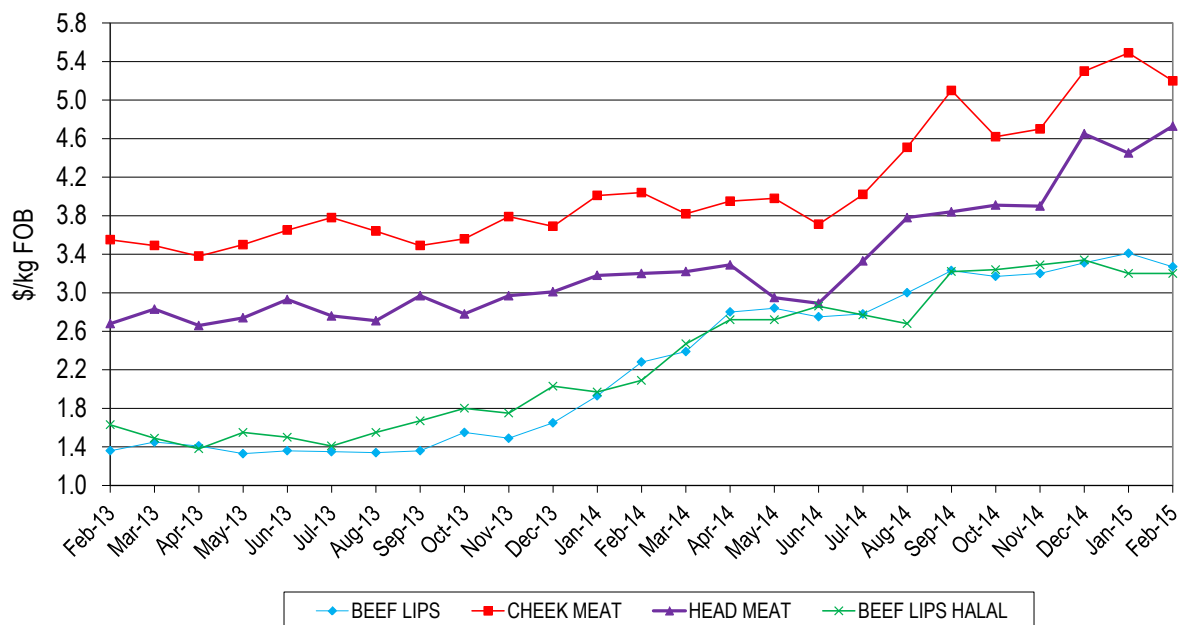
Hide prices have improved somewhat, but this is a temporary aberration due to the port congestion issues on the west coast of USA delaying shipments out of there and tanners turning to Australia to fill the gap. With the port strikes ended, demand for Australian hides is expected to diminish somewhat.

Head Offal Prices

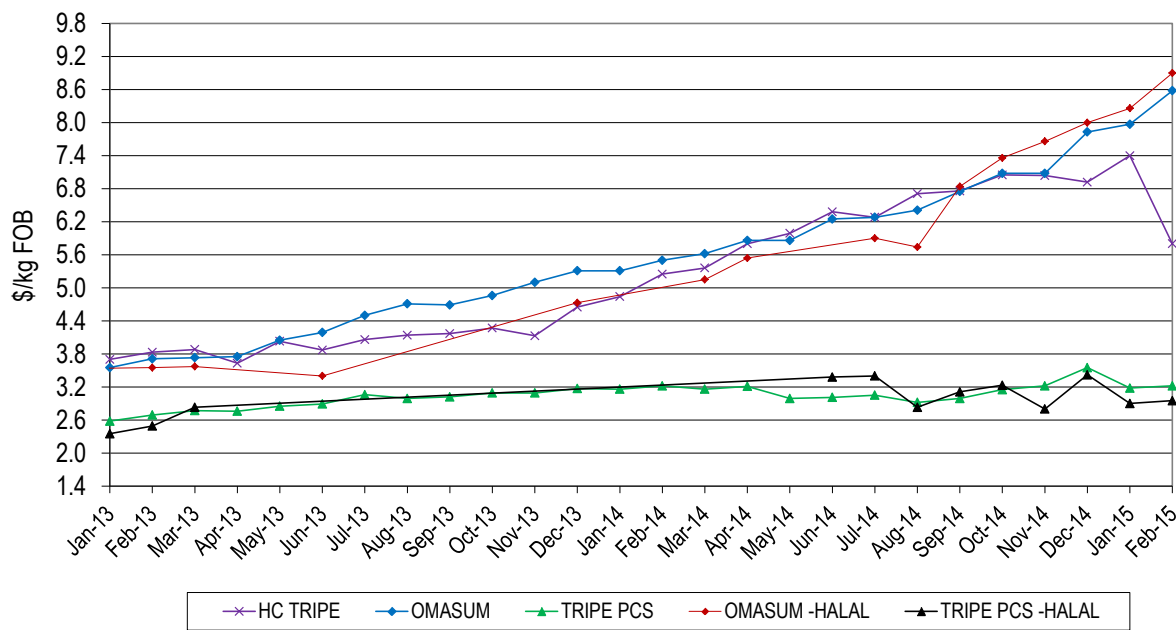
Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices



Head offals, in general, continue their strong performance, with firm improvement year-on-year but again the majority of the rise was driven by a falling dollar. Cheek meat improved \$1.16/kg over the February price last year to average \$5.20/kg, down 29¢/kg on last month. Lips fell 14¢/kg to average \$3.27/kg. Halal lips traded at \$3.20/kg, up \$1.11/kg on last year however even with the price last month.

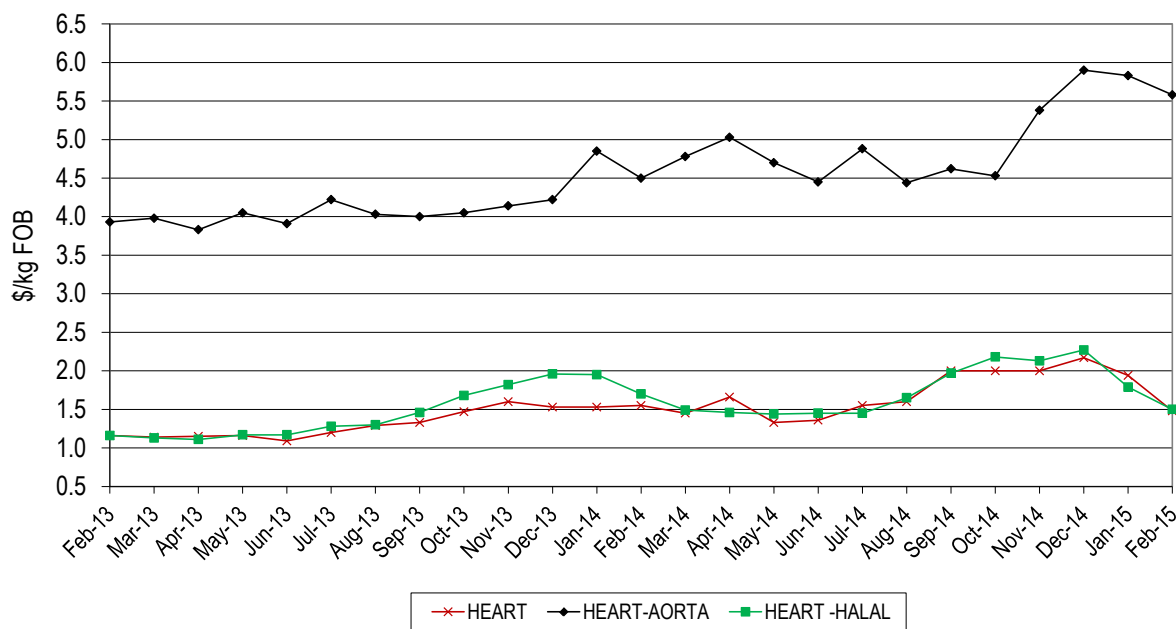
Halal head meat is on par with the price 12 months ago, averaging \$3.20/kg, but back \$1.25/kg month-on-month. The offal ban in Indonesia is certainly driving the halal price reduction as sellers scramble to find new markets.

Both halal and non-halal tripe pieces improved slightly, at \$3.22/kg and \$2.95/kg respectively, while honeycomb tripe fell \$1.60/kg, which is still 55¢/kg up on last year. Records continue to be broken, with omasum finding \$8.58/kg and halal omasum moving up to \$8.90/kg, up another 64¢/kg for the month. Non-halal product has now risen \$3.08/kg year-on-year while halal product is running a parallel path. A number of responses were well above the average price as expected with such a wide differential.

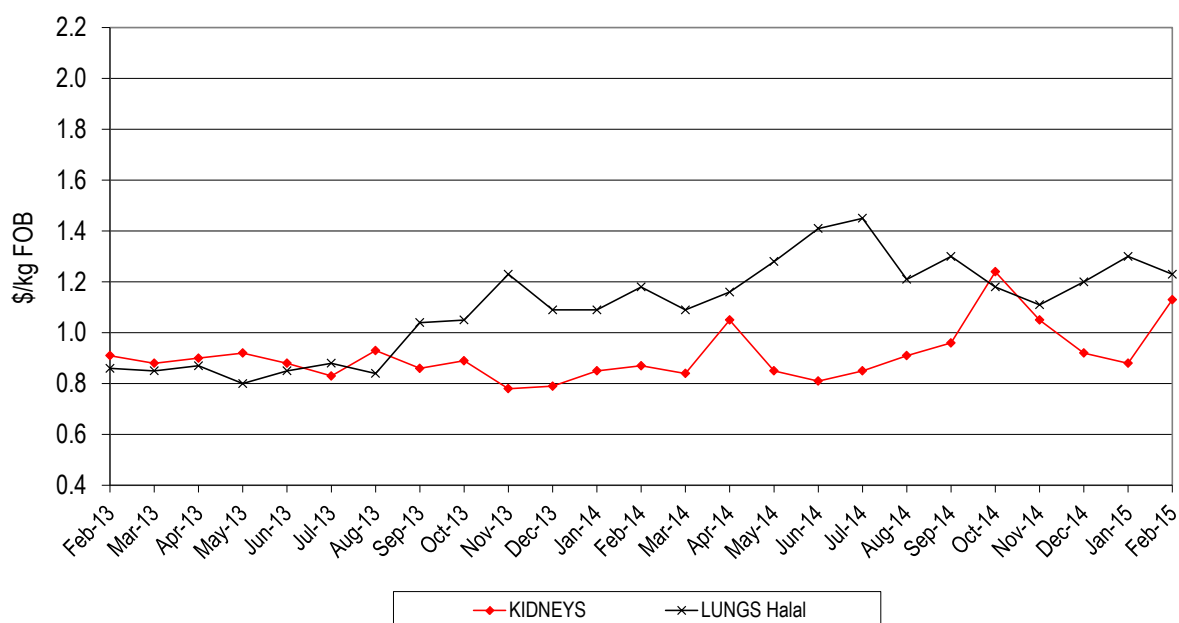
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



Heart products traded down again this month. Non-halal hearts were down a further 46¢/kg on last month and back 7¢/kg year-on-year, averaging \$1.48/kg. Halal hearts, at \$1.50/kg, were 20¢/kg down on this time last year and down 29¢/kg compared to last month. Again, the Indonesian slowdown is the contributing factor with other cheaper markets needing to be found.

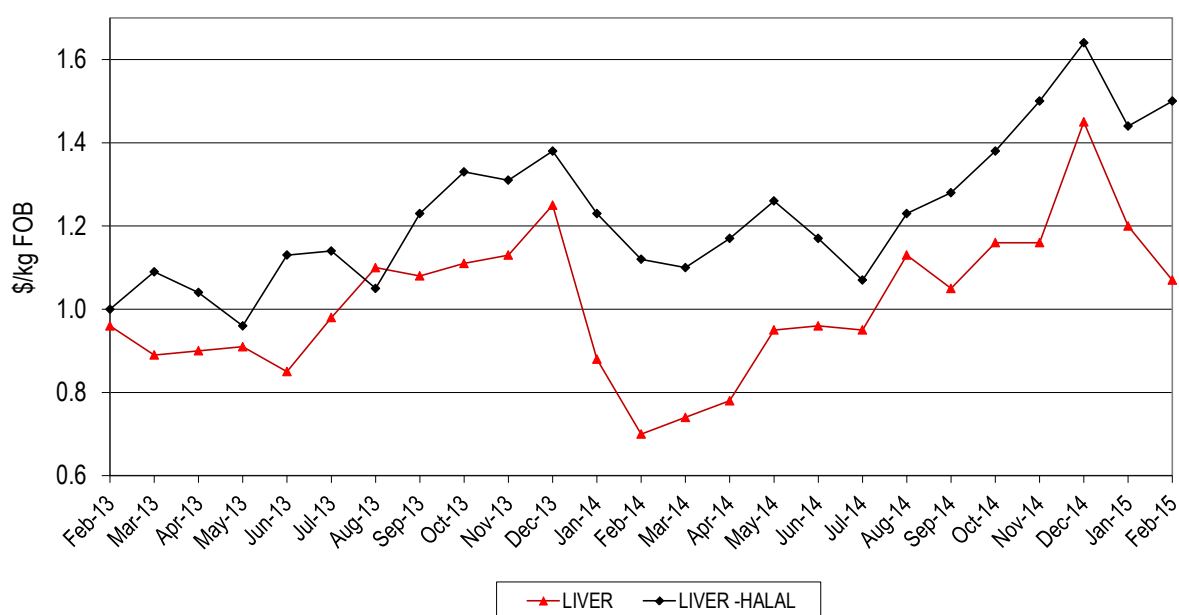
Aorta fell slightly this month to average \$5.58/kg, down 25¢/kg on last month but up \$1.08 on February last year.

Kidneys rallied somewhat to jump from 88¢/kg last month to \$1.13/kg in February, up 26¢/kg on last year. Non-halal lungs maintained \$1.62, up 44¢/kg on last year, while halal product slipped to \$1.23/kg, with the falling dollar assisting in maintaining a fairly steady return.

Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

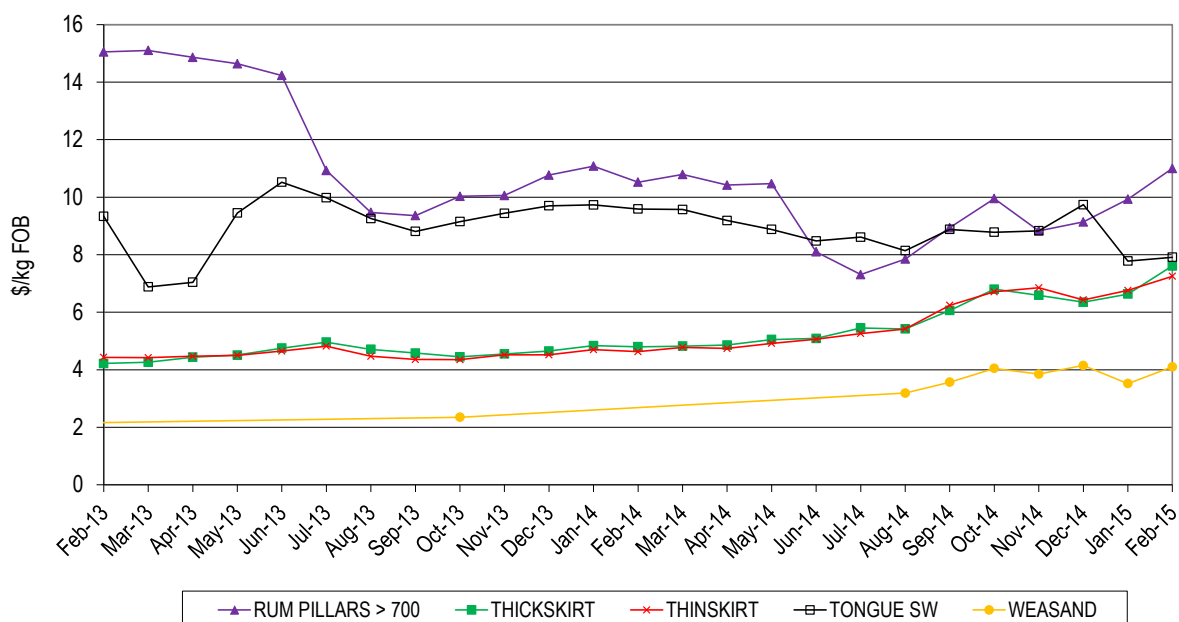


Livers remained under pressure, with prices dropping a further 13¢/kg over last month to trade at \$1.07/kg, still 37¢/kg up year-on-year, while halal livers averaged \$1.50/kg into Egypt, which represents a rise of 38¢/kg year-on-year and 6¢/kg on last month.

The major concern remains the ban on offal into Indonesia, with such a sudden ban meaning sellers have been really struggling to find new markets, albeit at reduced prices. It remains to be seen what will happen as stocks run out and whether consumer demand will reverse the decision. In the meantime the few local Indonesian abattoirs processing along western lines are doing brisk business.

Japanese and Korean Offals

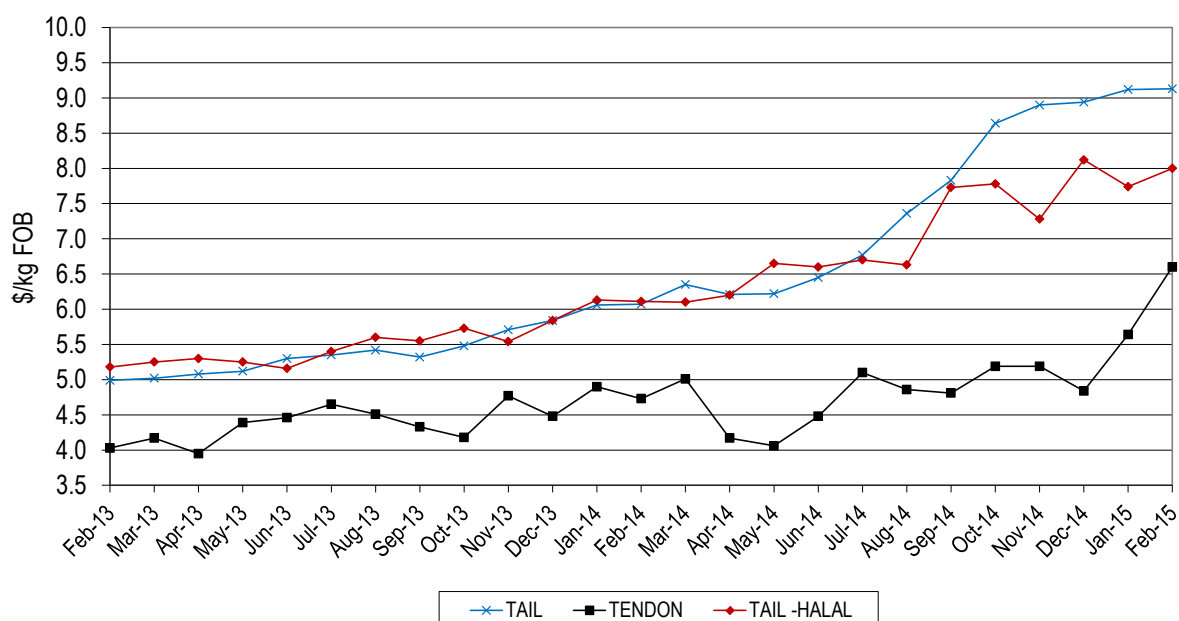
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The price of tongues continued to be subdued in February, up 13¢/kg compared to last month but down \$1.68 on last year, despite the falling dollar. Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars improved \$1.07/kg over last month, to trade at \$11.00/kg which is 48¢/kg on last year. Demand in Korea for rumen pillars remains steady. Thick skirt traded \$2.81/kg up on last year, at \$7.61/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$2.62/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$7.25/kg – all of this despite a correction in the 90CL price. The average price of weasand improved by 58¢/kg for the month, to trade at an average of \$4.10/kg, up from around the \$2.00/kg mark received a year ago. Overall demand for frozen offals into Japan remains subdued, despite a falling dollar, while Korean demand remains steady.

Tails and Tendons

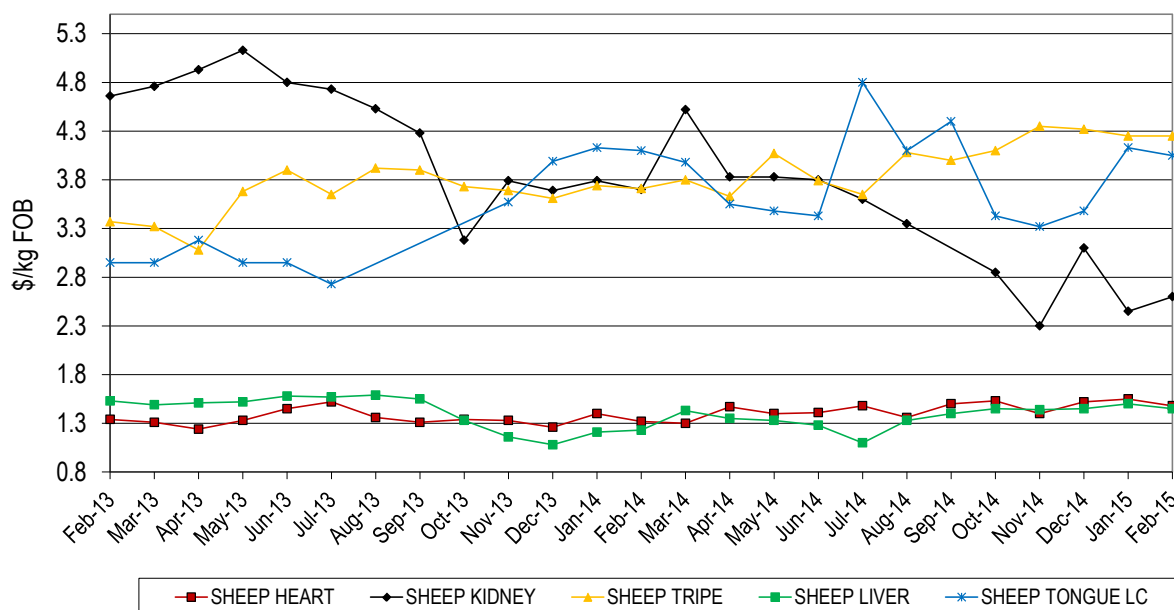
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices remained in line with last month and \$3.06/kg over last year, averaging \$9.13/kg. Halal tail rallied 26¢/kg across the month, to trade at \$8.00/kg, unable to match the non-halal market. Tendons improved \$1.87 year-on-year to average \$6.60, continuing the trend from last month.

Sheep Offals

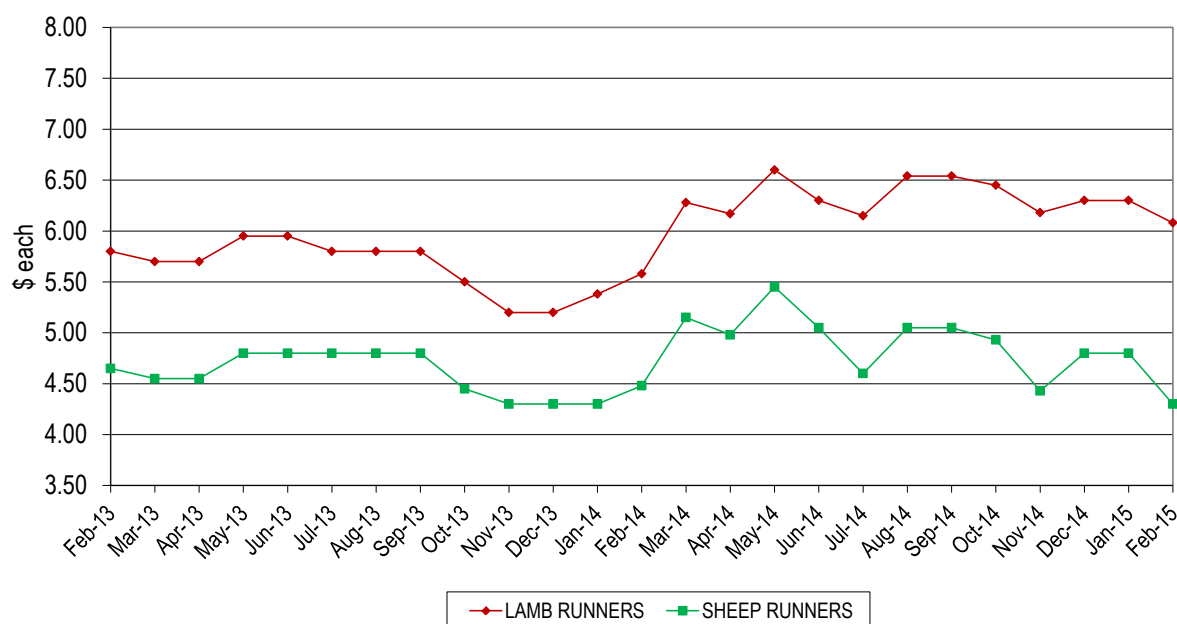
Figure 6a: Trends in sheep offal prices



Sheep offals traded steady across the board. There is pressure from China looking to buy kidneys with the fat attached, however veterinary requirements prevent this from occurring. Tongues traded at an average of \$4.05/kg while kidneys rallied slightly to \$2.60/kg.

Sheep tripe prices improved 54¢/kg across the year to trade at \$4.25/kg, even with last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year, hovering around \$1.50/kg, and averaged \$1.48/kg this month.

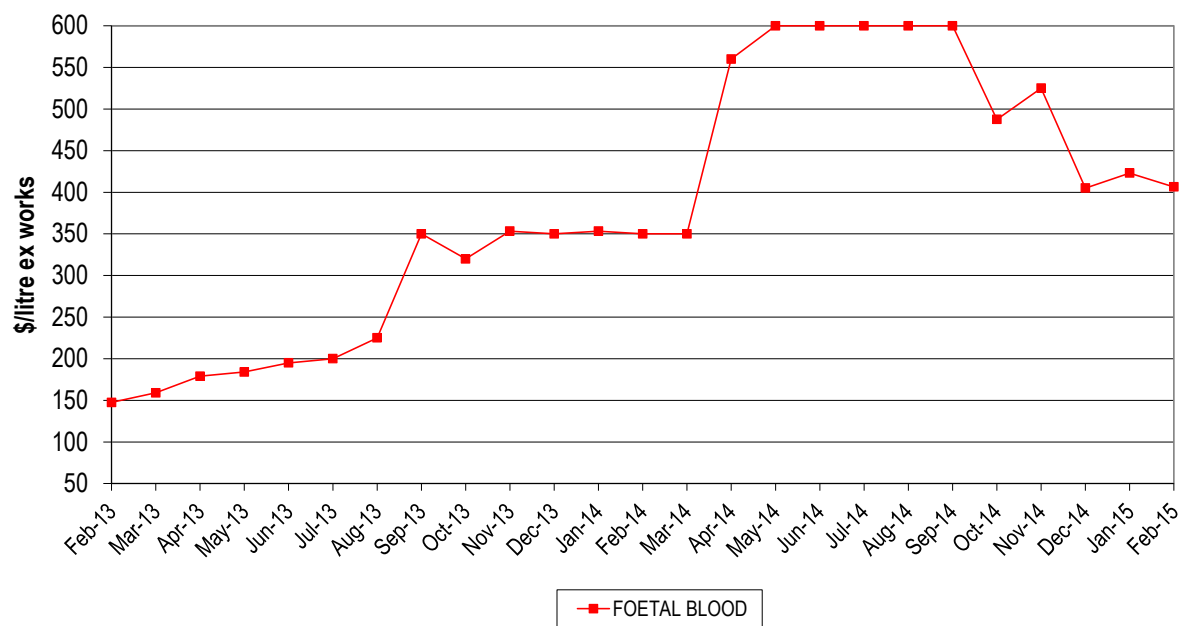
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners was steady, trading at \$6.08/piece for lamb and \$4.30/piece for sheep, however all sheep offals were lightly reported.

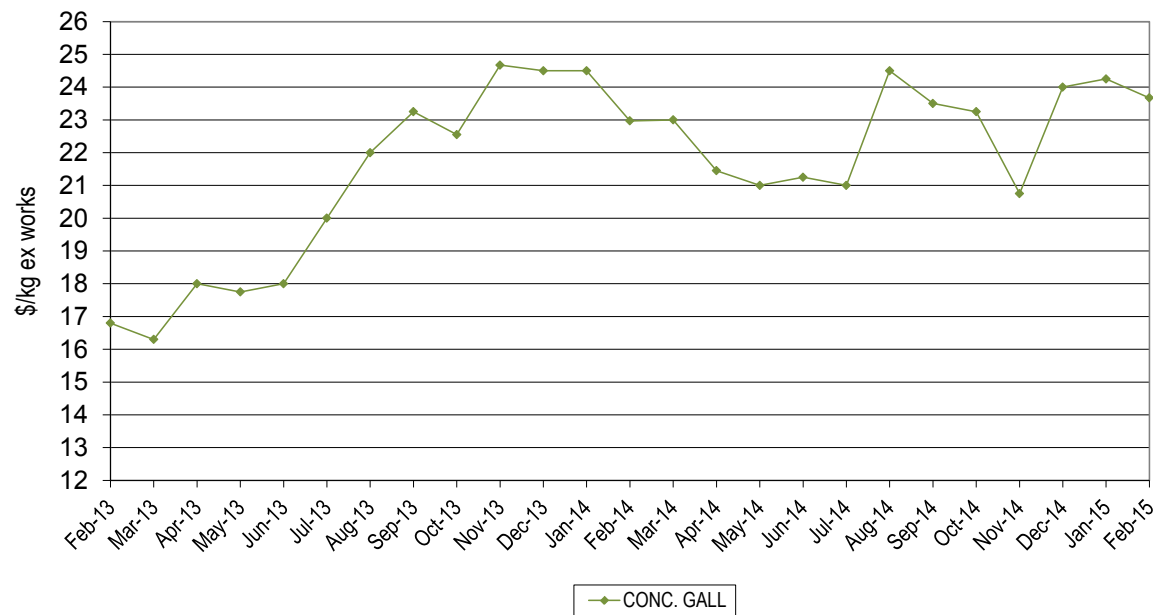
Pharmaceutical products

Foetal calf blood is still very widely quoted with big variations in prices reported. The real market has still got some downside.

Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



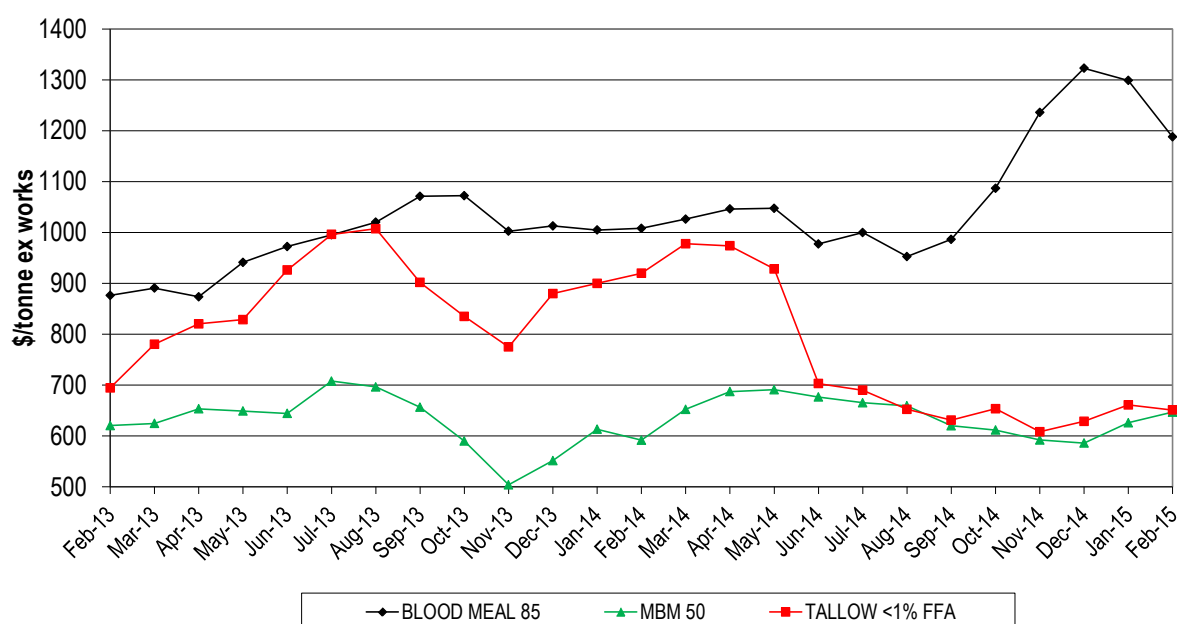
Concentrated gall remains fairly steady however it was also lightly reported. The average price is down 58¢/kg on last month however this was up 70¢/kg on last year's price.

Overall, the market is somewhat subdued because of market closures and will depend upon what develops over the next few months.

Timing of reports plays a large part in what we see and certainly there were significant differences in prices quoted for tallow at different times of the month, particularly the 4% product. The average price of 1% FFA tallow was \$651/tonne ex. works, still down \$269/tonne on the renewable fuel subsidy prices of a year ago.

Rendered Products

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices, while firm early in the month, tapered off sharply towards the second half of the month.

Overall values of MBM have softened on the back of cheaper protein sources, soy bean meal, and alternative origin meals, but have been cushioned by the easing AUD.

Blood meal continued to slide during the month with aquaculture demand falling and sellers having to find alternative feed sources like poultry which are at a discount to aqua feed. The average prices now being quoted are around \$1188/tonne ex-works, \$110/tonne down on last month and down \$180 on last year.

Tallow has plateaued on the back of continuing low palm stearin prices.

The world hide market is in a very difficult situation. The warning bells sounded back in Q4 2014 and, while the weakening AUD has cushioned the blow in Australia, keeping green hide prices firm, the overseas market is in turmoil.

Reduced demand from the Chinese domestic market and the Russian sanctions on imports of EU leather goods are part of the reason. The west coast USA port congestion also helped Australian sales as tanners looked to Australia to fill gaps in their order books. USA shipments are now returning to normal and that crutch will disappear, meaning demand for Australian hides will revert to normal and we expect the hide market to remain soft into the foreseeable future.

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$/each or \$/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

The AUD/USD exchange rate is still heading south and helping to support export prices. Indonesia has fallen off the radar after stopping the import of offal, with only tails and tongues permitted. Omasum into Hong Kong continued the linear improvement in price, with honeycomb tripe also back in the picture.

Meat and bone meal prices continued to fall and the price for blood meal dropped significantly.

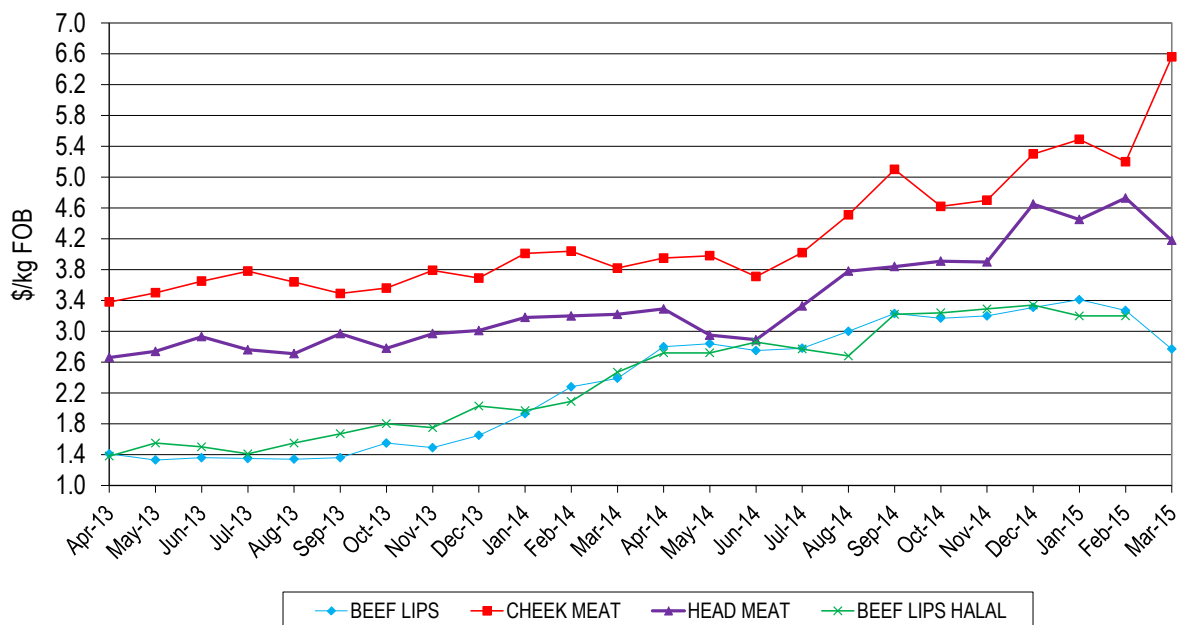
Tallow has now aligned itself well and truly to the palm stearin prices and is

slavishly following the trends in that market. Tallow really is a case of back to the future. Singapore is taking some tallow for bio-diesel production but at much reduced prices.

Hide prices have improved somewhat, but this is expected to be temporary and is only supported by the falling dollar. The weaker Euro brought European hides into the Asian tannery market, and this has allowed tanners to force the USD price for hides down due to the increased competition from sellers.

Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

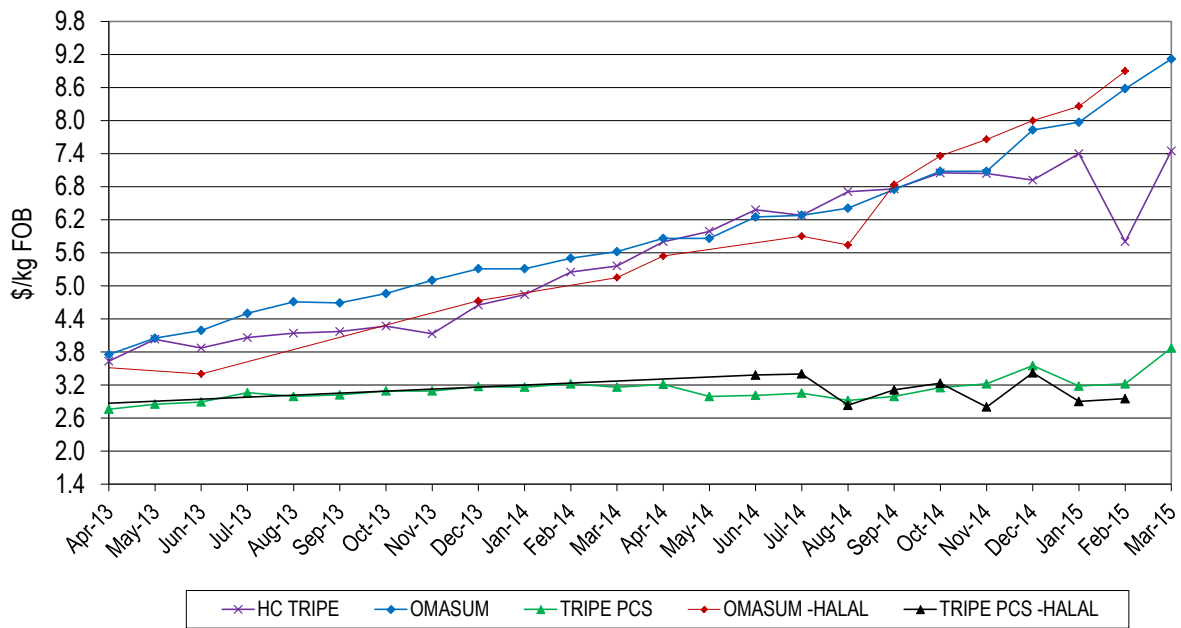


Head offals, in general, continue their strong performance, with firm improvement year-on-year but did come off somewhat on last month despite the falling dollar. Cheek meat improved \$2.74/kg over the March price last year, to average \$6.56/kg, up \$1.36/kg on last month. Lips fell 50¢/kg, to average \$2.77/kg. No halal prices were reported this month.

Exporters are still striving to find new markets for their halal product following the Indonesian ban and a lot of halal product is going to non-halal markets.

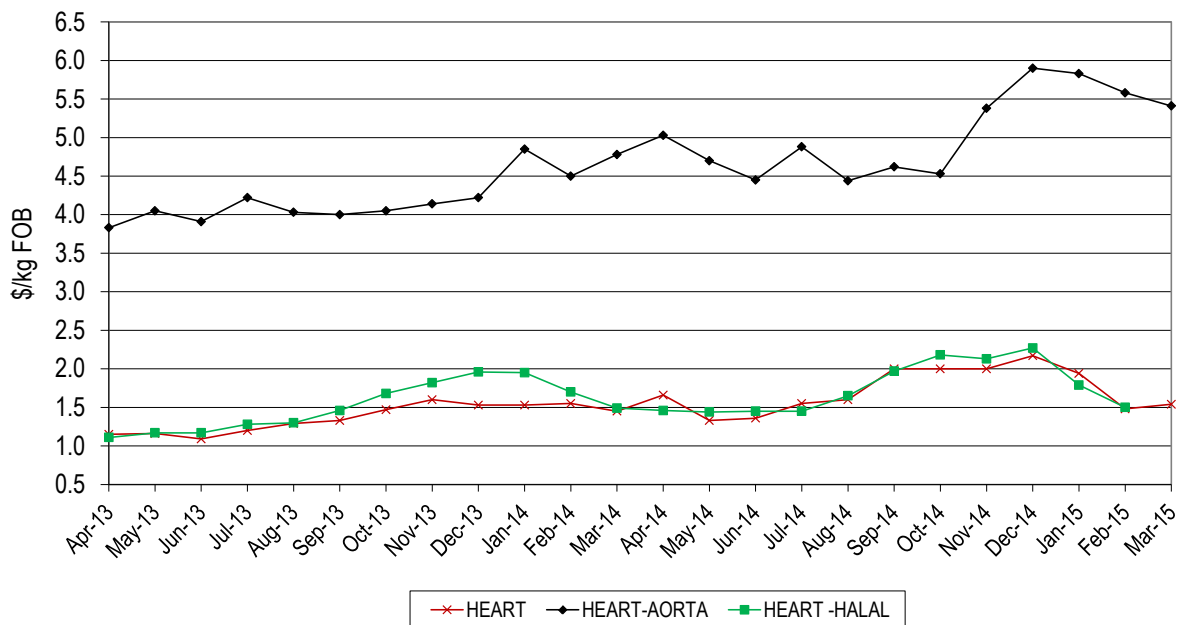
Beef Offal Trends

Figure 2: Trends in beef tripe prices



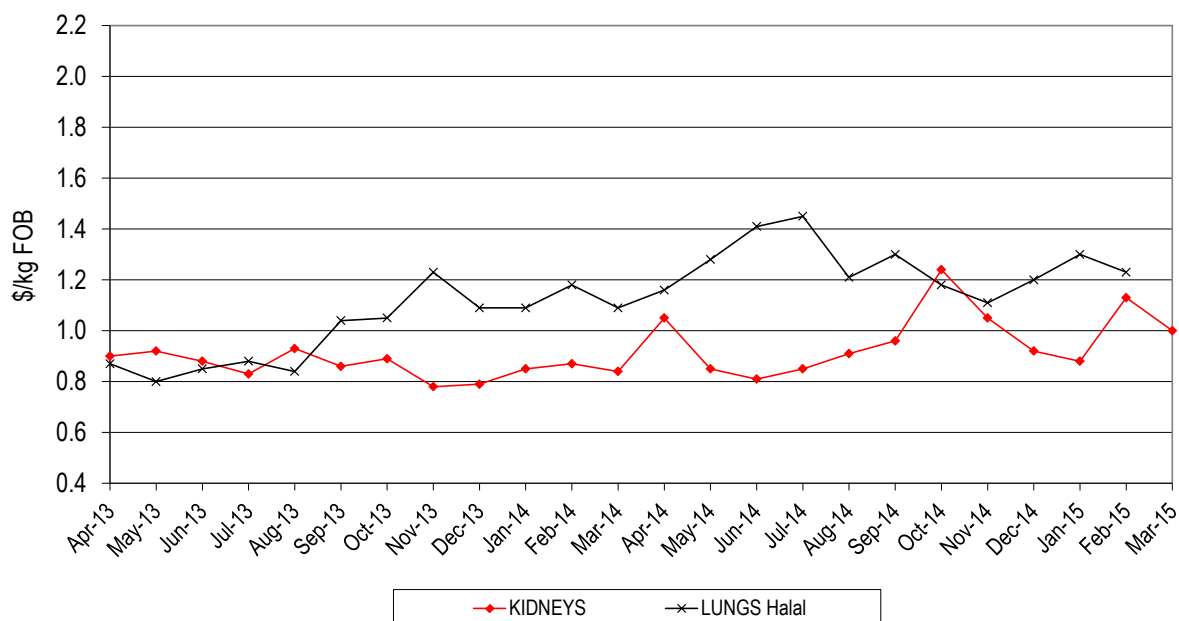
Tripe pieces improved by 65¢/kg to realize an average of \$3.87/kg, which is the highest price seen in some time, while honeycomb tripe reversed last month's drop and regained the January price of \$7.45/kg, which is \$2.09/kg up on last year. Records continue to be broken, with omasum climbing to \$9.12/kg up another 54¢/kg for the month. Non-halal product has now risen \$3.50/kg year-on-year.

Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



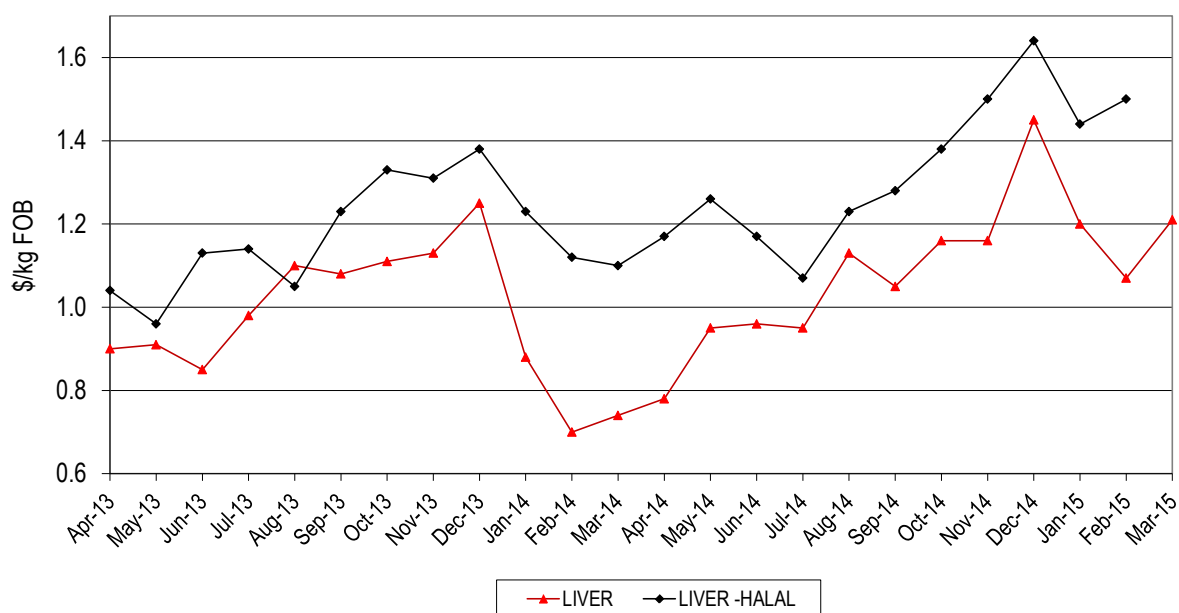
Heart products traded steadily this month. Non-halal hearts were up 6¢/kg on last month and 9¢/kg year-on-year, averaging \$1.54/kg. Again Halal hearts mainly ended up in the non-halal market. Aorta fell slightly again this month to average \$5.41/kg, down 17¢/kg on last month but up 63¢/kg on March last year.

Kidneys slipped 13¢/kg, to record \$1.00/kg in March, up 16¢/kg on last year. Non-halal lungs moved 3¢/kg down, to finish at \$1.59, up 50¢/kg on last year, while halal product, also going into the non-halal market, were also supported by the falling dollar, helping to maintain a fairly steady return.

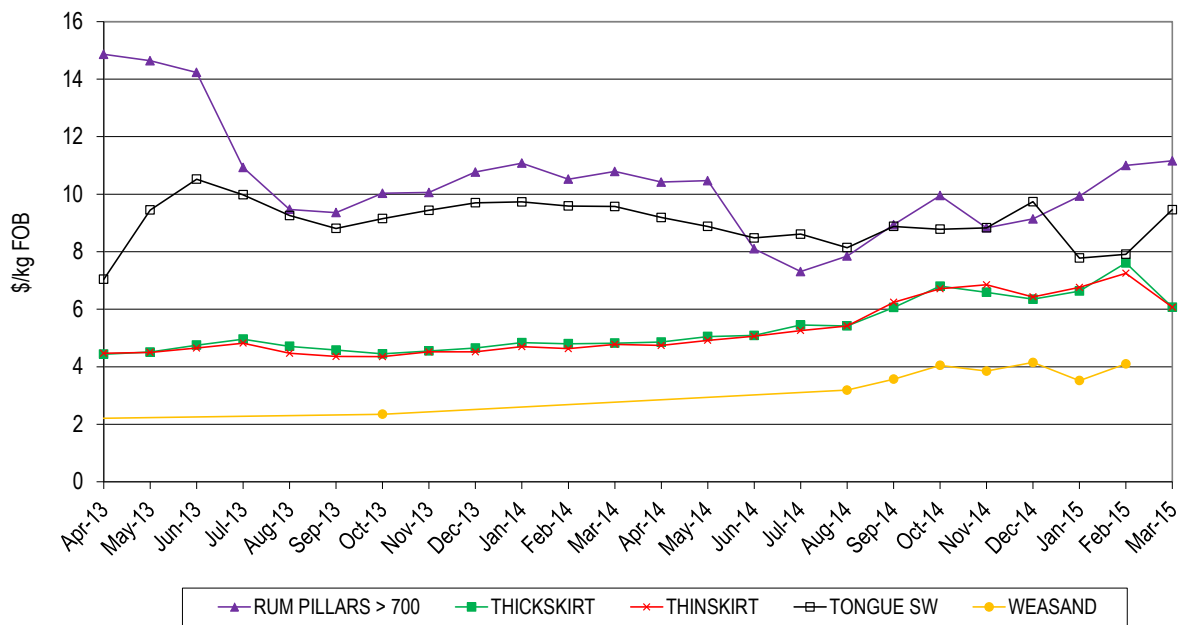
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



Livers rallied after last month's fall, with prices improving 14¢/kg over February, to trade back at \$1.21/kg, which is 47¢/kg up year-on-year.

No reports of halal sales were received however that may well be a result of the Easter break and some respondents not getting the reports in before they went on leave. Export volume into Egypt increased again in March, predominantly made up of liver shipments.

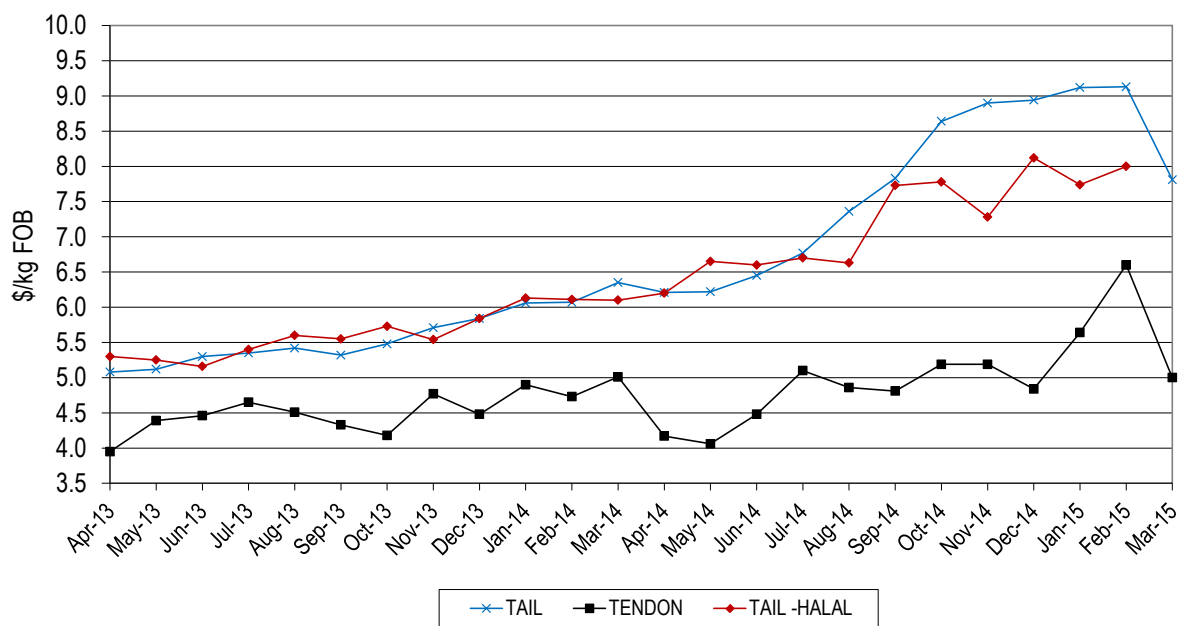
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The price of tongues spiked this month, up \$1.55/kg compared to last month, which is only 11¢/kg down on last year, but again the falling dollar had a big effect on that result. Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars stabilised and traded at \$11.16/kg which is 37¢/kg up on last year. Demand in Korea for rumen pillars remains steady. Thick skirt traded \$1.25/kg up on last year, at \$6.07/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$1.29/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$6.07/kg also. Weasand was not reported this month. Overall demand for frozen offals into Japan remains subdued, despite a falling dollar, while Korean demand remains steady.

Tails and Tendons

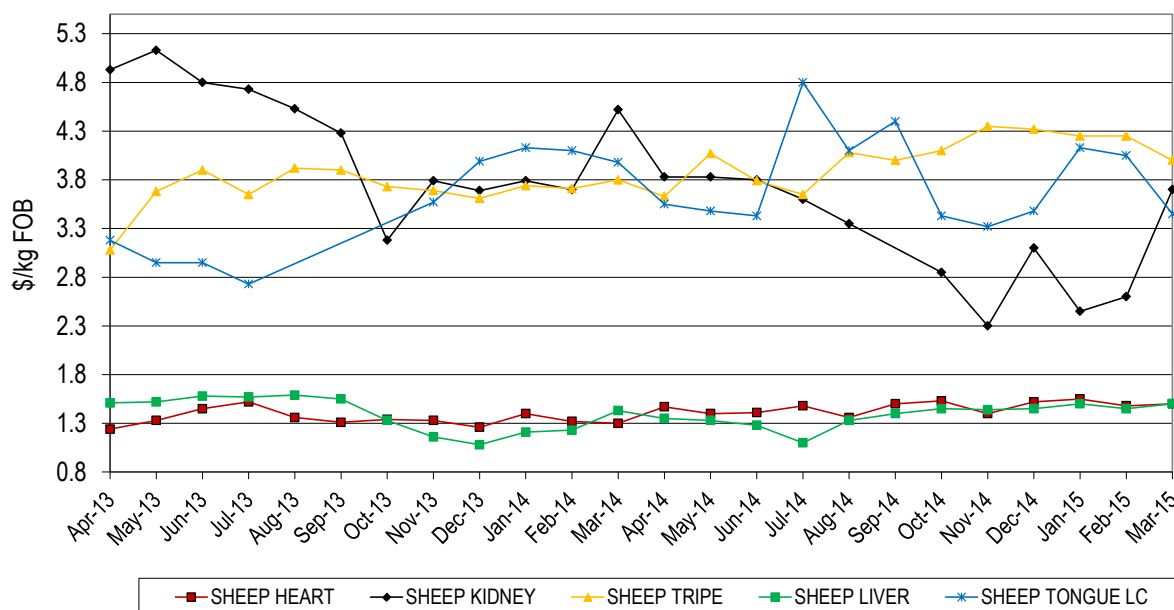
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices took a dive this month but were still \$1.46/kg above last year, averaging \$7.81/kg, which is down \$1.32 on last February. Tendons also received a correction to trade down \$1.60/kg month-on-month, to average \$5.00, which is on parity with the price a year ago.

Sheep Offals

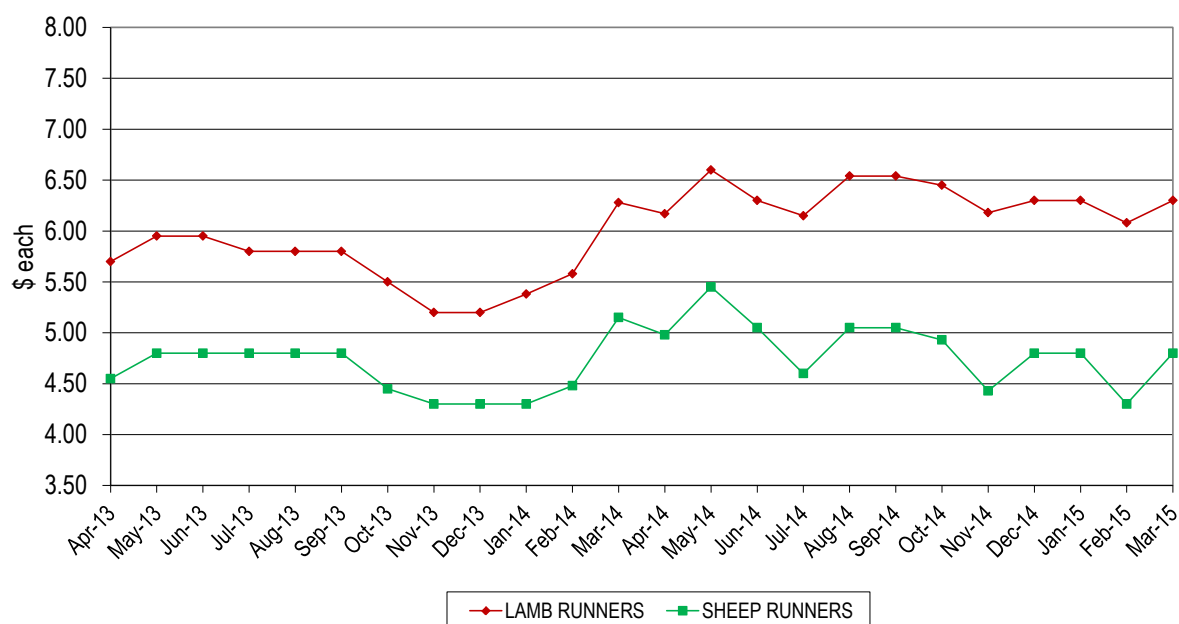
Figure 6a: Trends in sheep offal prices



Sheep offals continued to trade steady across the board. Tongues traded down, at an average of \$3.45/kg, while kidneys rallied significantly to \$3.70/kg. They were, however, lightly reported so we will need to check again next month to see if this is an aberration.

Sheep tripe prices improved 20¢/kg across the year, to trade at \$4.00/kg, 25¢/kg down on last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year, still hovering around \$1.50/kg, and averaged \$1.50/kg this month.

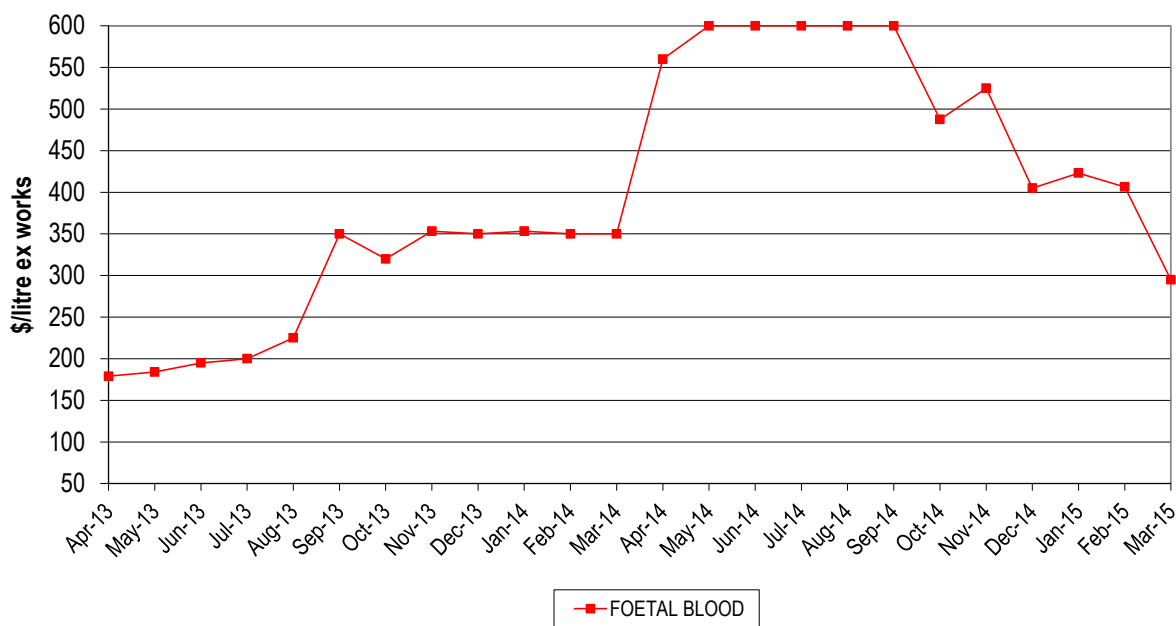
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners was steady, trading at \$6.30/piece for lamb and \$4.80/piece for sheep, however all sheep offals were lightly reported.

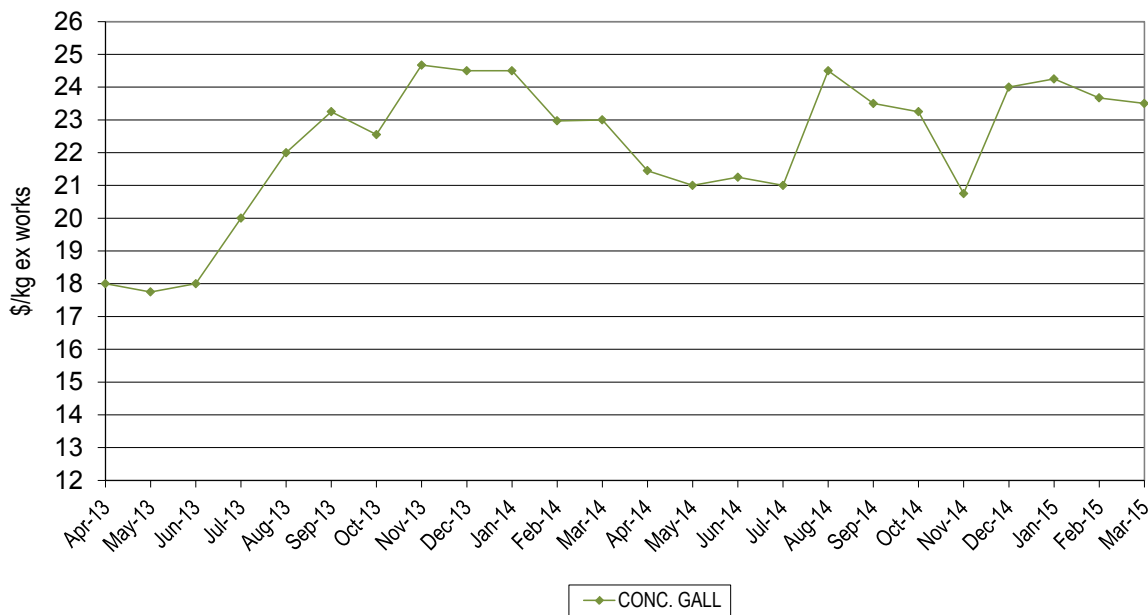
Pharmaceutical products

The foetal calf blood average price is now around where the real market is, as long term contracts dry up. There may still be some downside.

Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices

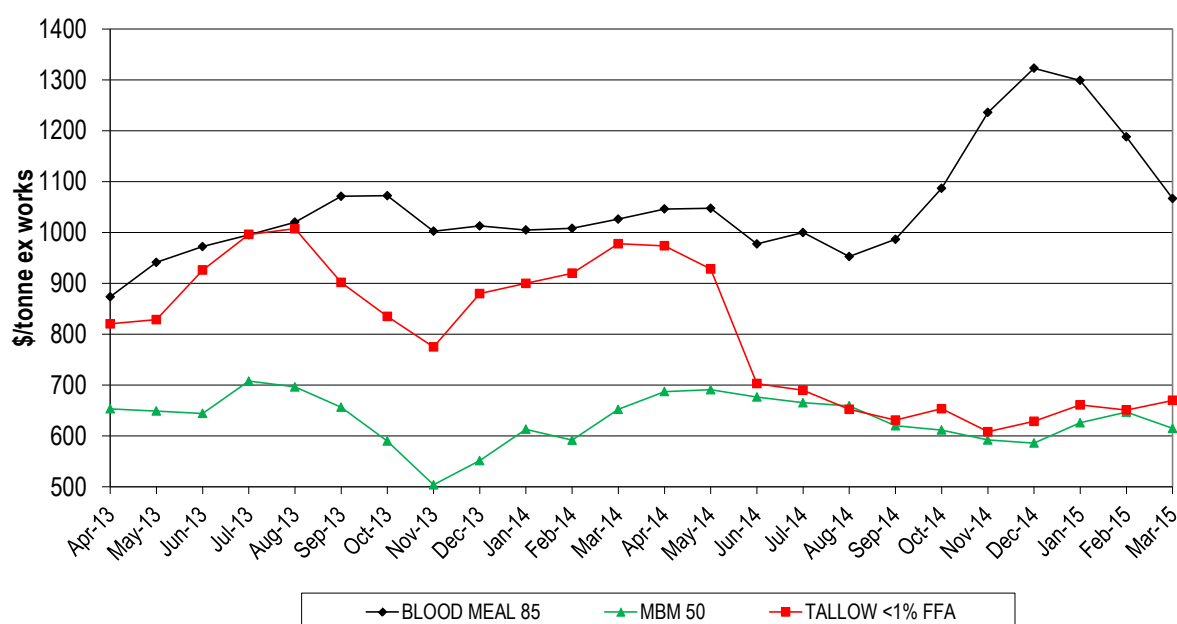


Concentrated gall remains fairly steady however it was also lightly reported. The average price is down 17¢/kg on last month however this was up 50¢/kg on last year's price.

Overall, the market is somewhat subdued because of market closures and will depend upon what develops over the next few months.

Rendered Products

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices have continued to decline throughout the month, with soybean meal production remaining strong and keeping prices down to clear large stocks. Accordingly reduced use of MBM in feed rations has meant local sales are at significant discount to export prices.

Blood meal prices continued the slide that started last month with aquaculture demand still very low and sellers having to find alternative feed sources, such as poultry rations, which are at a discount to aqua feed. The average prices now being quoted are around \$1068/tonne ex-works, a further \$120/tonne down on last month.

Tallow remains soft on the back of continuing low palm stearin prices and large supply volumes of palm stearin in the market. Limited interest from Singapore has not helped improve prices for tallow either. The price of 1%FFA tallow averaged \$670/mt, to rise \$20/mt on last month, while 2%FFA product realised \$642/mt, up \$7/mt on last month.

Hide markets remain challenging at the moment, despite local prices improving across all classes due to the softer Australian dollar. With the softening of the Euro, supplies from Europe at lower prices are putting pressure on Australian and US hides sellers to reduce prices to compete. The only positive in the leather trade is automotive and upholstery tanners have orders. Nevertheless, these tanners are aware of the abundance of material, due to the soft shoe, handbag and garment market, and they are able to take a hard line on prices. It will be interesting to see what happens following the annual Asia Pacific Leather Fair in Hong Kong which was held at the end of March.

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$/each or \$/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

The AUD/USD exchange rate steadied this month to recover to near US\$0.80. Beef offal exports for the month were fairly sluggish. Omasum into Hong Kong has hit the price barrier, with prices falling significantly, along with honeycomb tripe also feeling the pressure.

Foetal blood prices are now aligned to the current market, six months in the making as long term contracts expired.

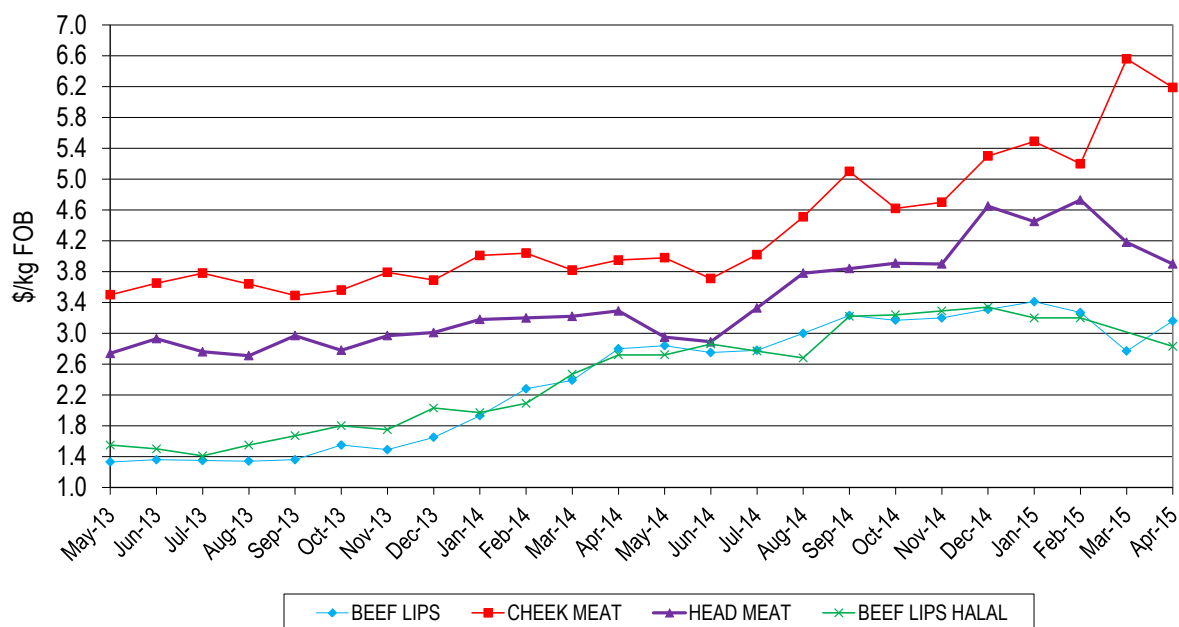
Meat and bone meal prices have stabilised with export support however the price for blood meal continues southward.

Tallow is seeing additional support, with demand from Singapore improving for biodiesel production. Sales are back around the 20,000mt per month level.

Hide prices came under a lot of pressure this month, with Asian tanners struggling to secure orders at current price levels. US exporters' offer prices are significantly down, with other origins following suit. This will have a flow on effect locally.

Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

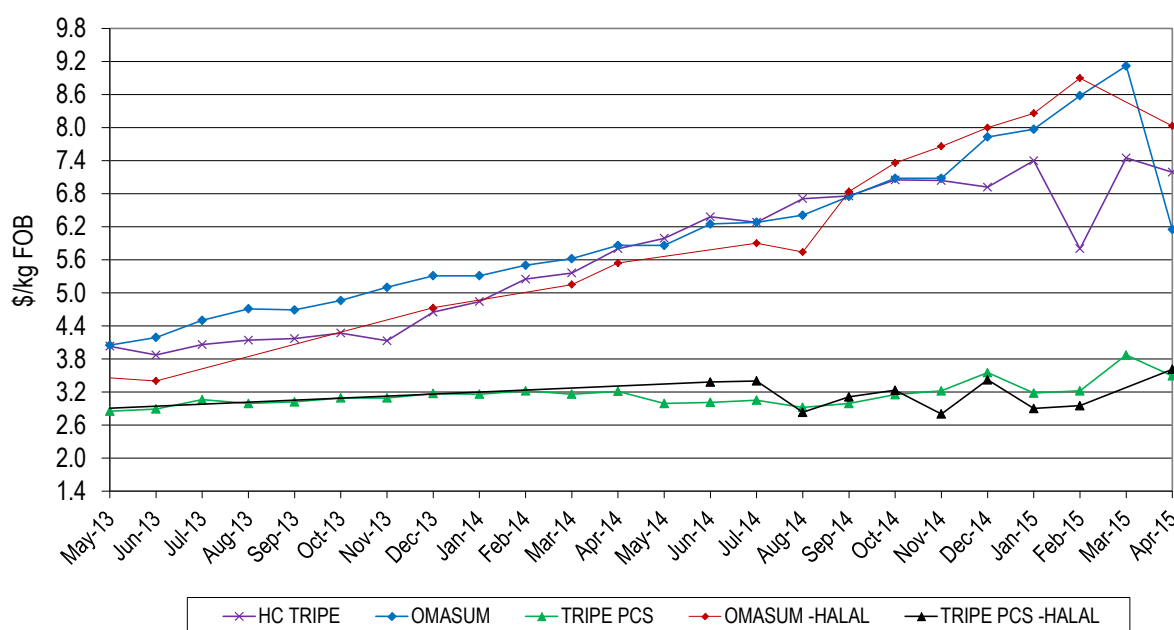


Head offals softened slightly but continue their strong performance, maintaining a large improvement year-on-year and still supported by the falling dollar. Cheek meat is \$2.24/kg better than the March price last year at \$6.19/kg, but down 37¢/kg on last month. Lips rose 39¢/kg, to average \$3.16/kg. Halal lips returned \$2.83/kg, which is 11¢/kg up on last year.

Exporters are still striving to find new markets for their halal product following the Indonesian ban and a lot of halal product is going to non-halal markets. Export volumes are down 2,000mt for the month, spread across all markets.

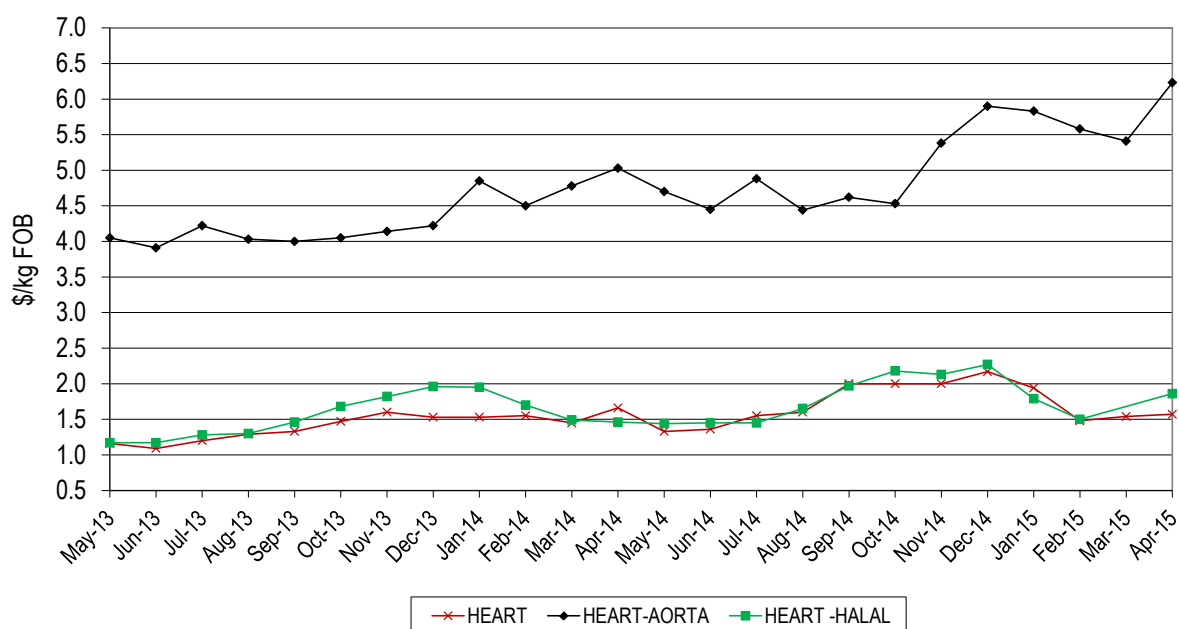
Beef Offal Trends

Figure 2: Trends in beef tripe prices



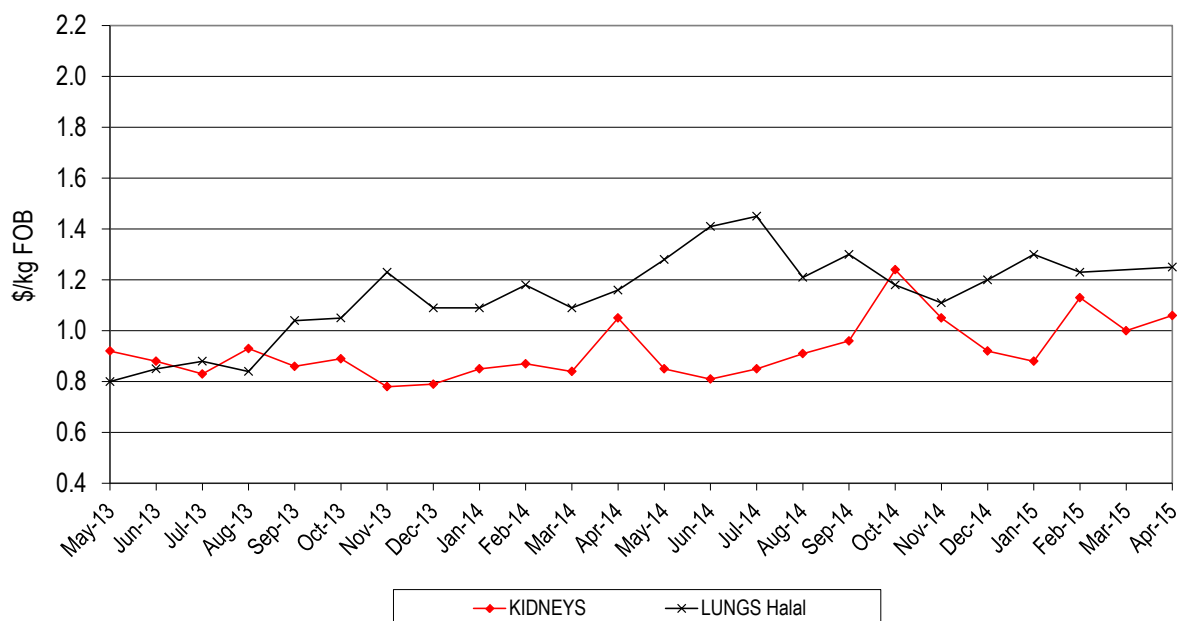
Most tripe lines were weaker for the month. Tripe pieces fell by 38¢/kg, to realize an average of \$3.49/kg, which is 28¢/kg up on last year. Honeycomb tripe saw a downward correction of 26¢/kg, to \$7.19, which is still \$1.39/kg up on last year. Omasum prices hit a brick wall and are now averaging \$6.15/kg, down \$2.97/kg for the month. Halal product fared better, to average \$8.03/kg, for a year-on-year gain of \$2.49 however it remains to be seen if it can hold in the face of a weak market.

Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



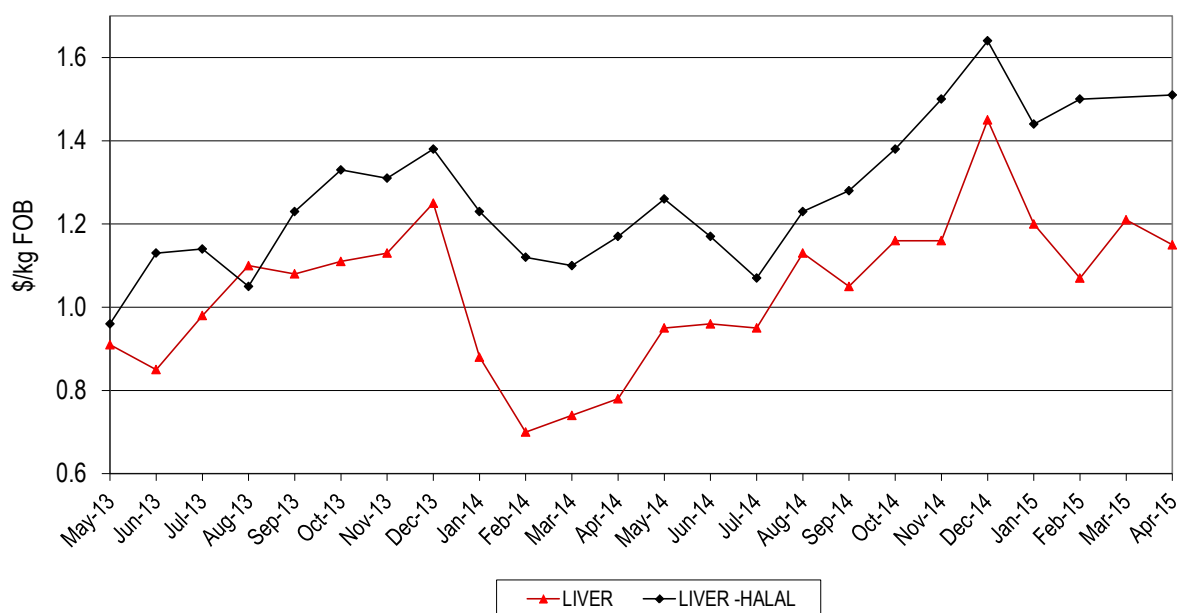
Heart products continued to trade steadily this month as they have done for quite some time. Non-halal hearts were up 3¢/kg on last month but down 9¢/kg year-on-year, averaging \$1.57/kg. Again, halal hearts mainly ended up in the non-halal market but there were some sales at \$1.86/kg for those lucky enough to find a buyer. Aorta bucked the trend to average \$6.23/kg, up 82¢/kg on last month and \$1.20/kg on Aprilpc last year.

Kidneys rallied slightly to record \$1.06/kg, up 6¢/kg for the month but in line with last year. Non-halal lungs were very lightly reported while halal product traded steadily, supported by the falling dollar, to trade at \$1.25/kg, which is just 9¢/kg above the price this time last year.

Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

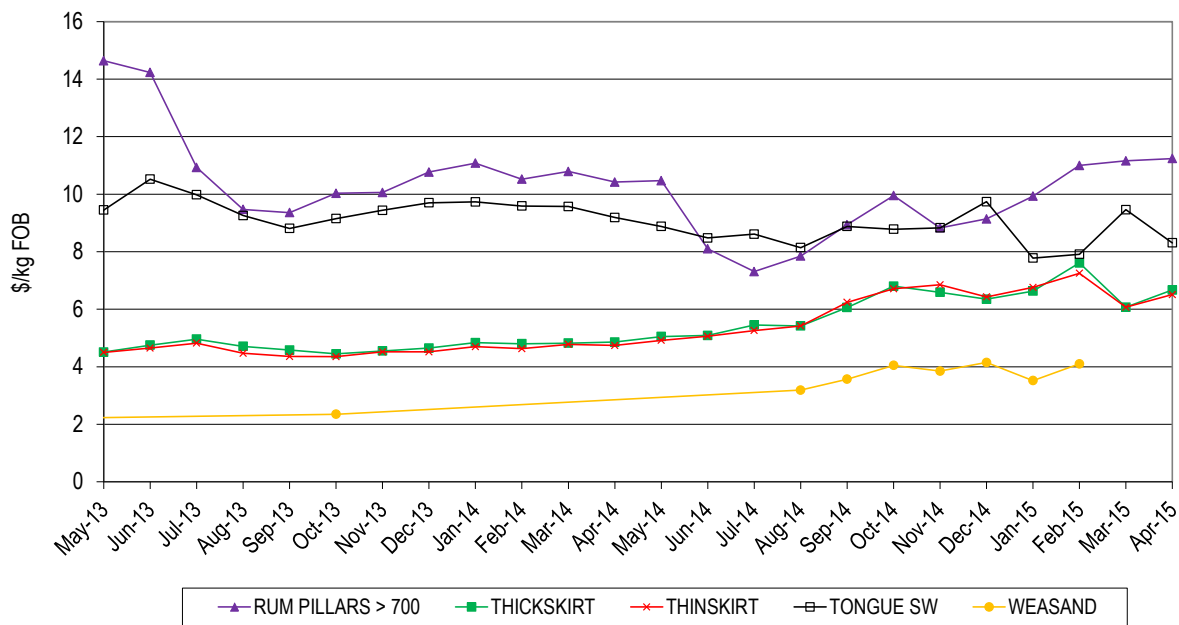


Livers were also fairly lack lustre, with prices for non-halal product falling by 6¢/kg across the month, to trade at \$1.15/kg, however this is 37¢/kg up year-on-year.

Halal liver prices were consistent with the reported February prices, which supports previous comments from last month that the Easter break interfered with price reports being submitted.

Halal sales averaged \$1.51/kg, which is up 34¢/kg year on year. Export volume into Egypt remained solid for the month, and this newly developed volume of sales is certainly supporting the halal liver price.

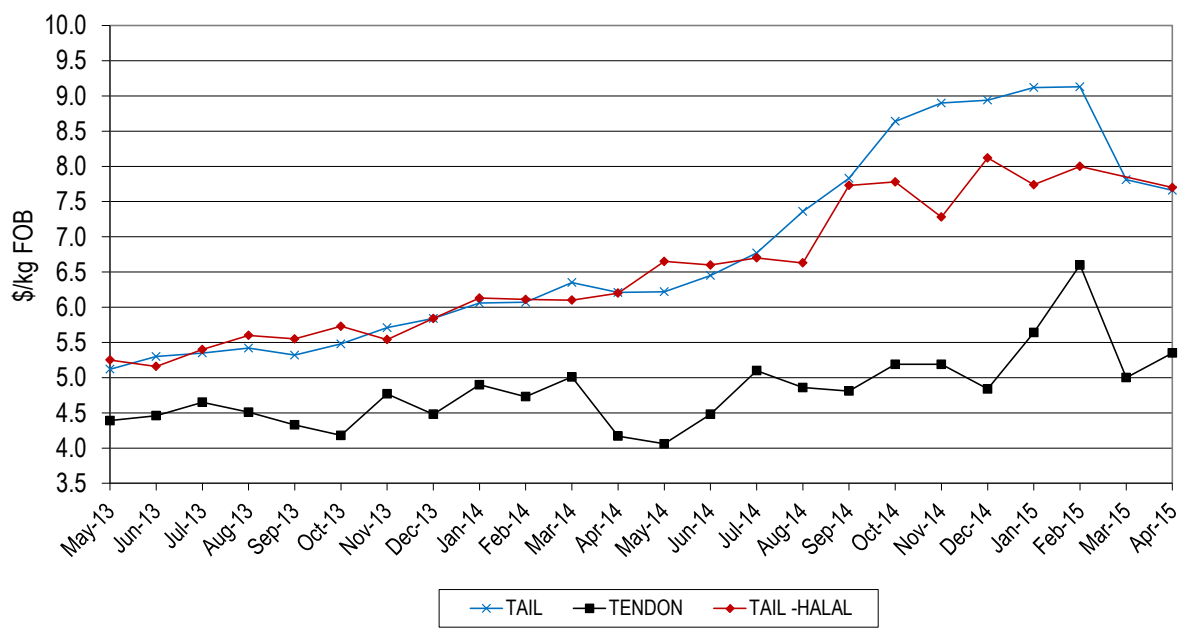
Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



The price of tongues corrected this month, reversing the \$1.55/kg jump last month, with average prices returning to \$8.31/kg, which is 88¢/kg down on last year but, again, the falling dollar had a big effect on minimising that result. Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars remained steady, to trade at \$11.24/kg, which is 82¢/kg up on last year. Demand in Korea for rumen pillars remains steady. Thick skirt traded \$1.81/kg up on last year, at \$6.67/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$1.77/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$6.51/kg. Weasand was not reported again this month. Japan and Korean sales volumes of frozen offals are both up 14% year on year and sales volumes to both nations are very similar in tonnage.

Tails and Tendons

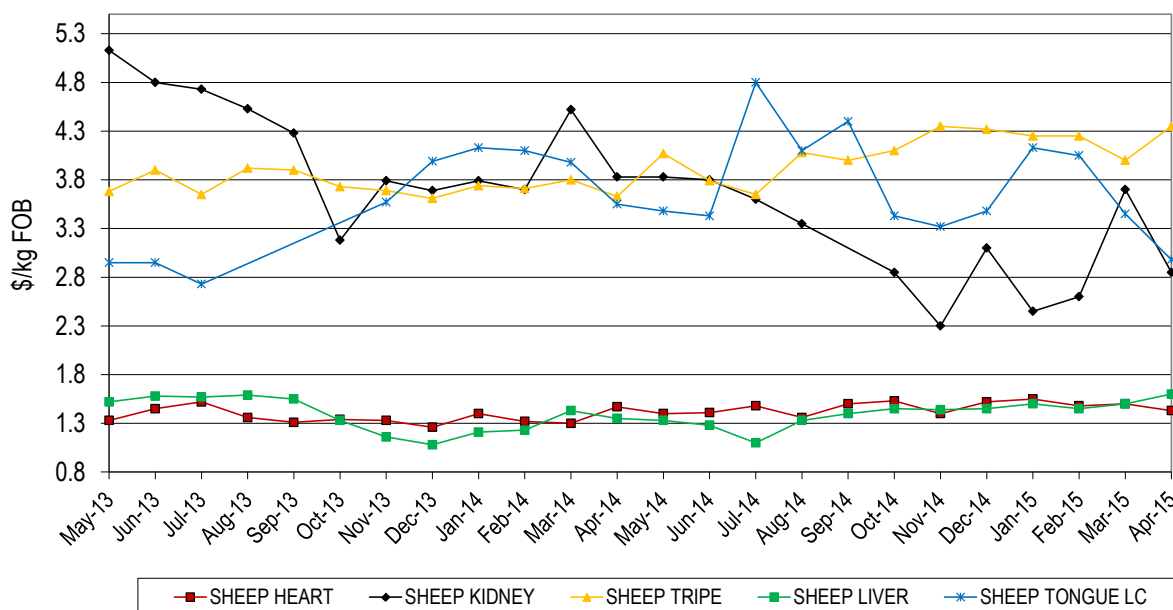
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices steadied this month and non-halal and halal prices were almost on a par, averaging \$7.66/kg and \$7.70, respectively, and around \$1.50/kg up on last year. Tendons rallied slightly, up 35¢/kg month-on-month, to average \$5.35, which is \$1.18 above the price a year ago.

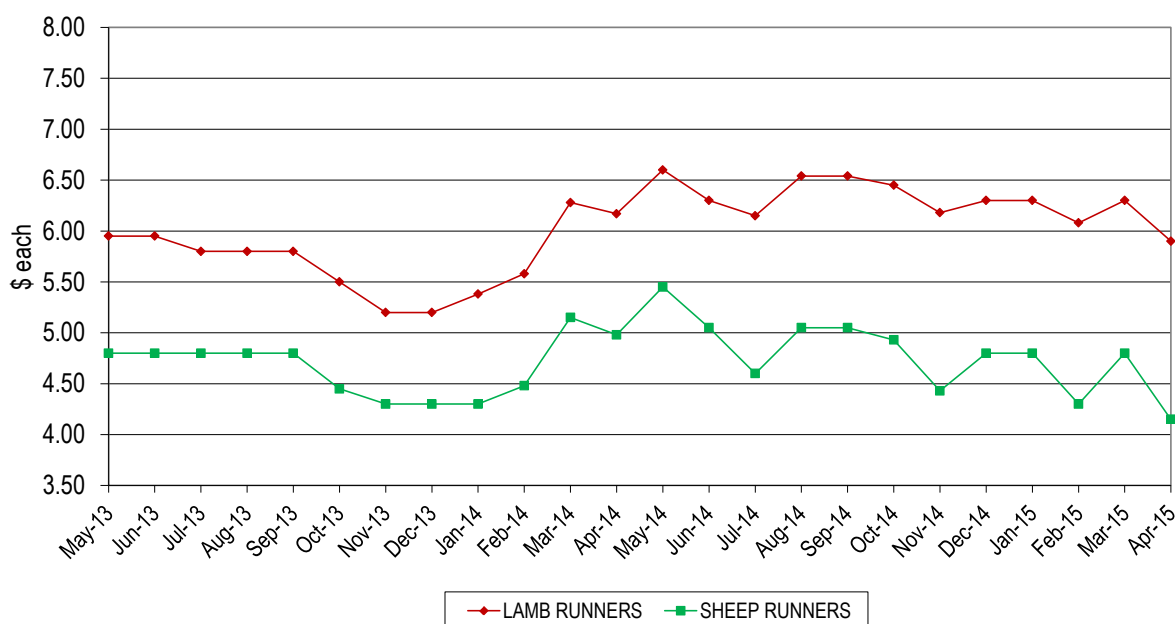
Sheep Offals

Sheep hearts and livers traded steadily month-on-month, with only small movements reported. Tongues traded down, at an average of \$2.98/kg, while kidneys came back to \$2.85/kg, reversing last month spike and finishing 25¢/kg up on the price two months ago. Last month's spike looks like an aberration. Sheep tripe prices improved 72¢/kg across the year, to trade at \$4.35/kg, 35¢/kg up on last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year and averaged \$1.43/kg this month, while livers improved 10¢/kg, to average \$1.60/kg.

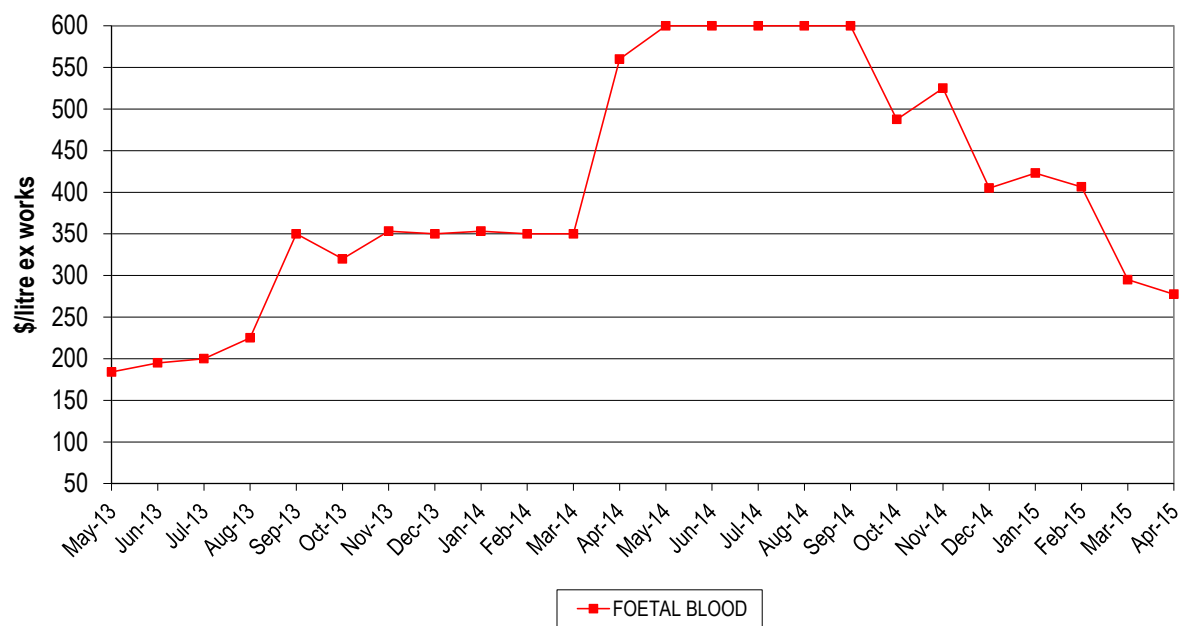
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners fell slightly this month, with \$5.90/piece being realised for lamb, which is 40¢/piece down on last month, and \$4.15/piece for sheep, down 65¢/piece however, all sheep offals were lightly reported.

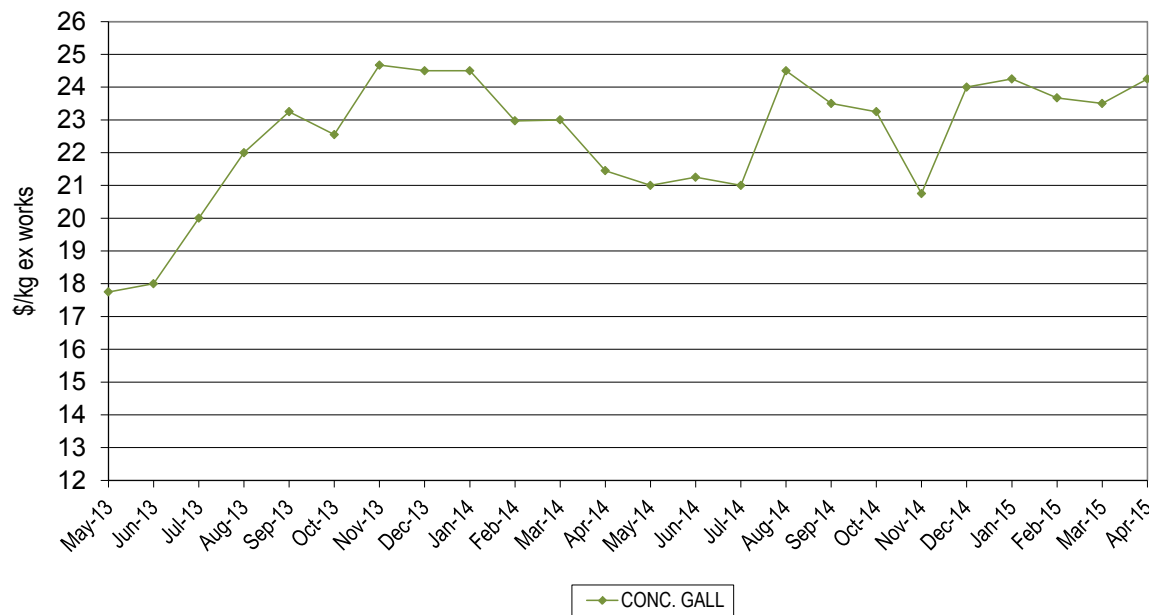

The foetal calf blood average price is now in alignment with buyers quotes of \$270/litre. The last of the long term contracts have expired and plants are reporting equivalent prices again.

Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



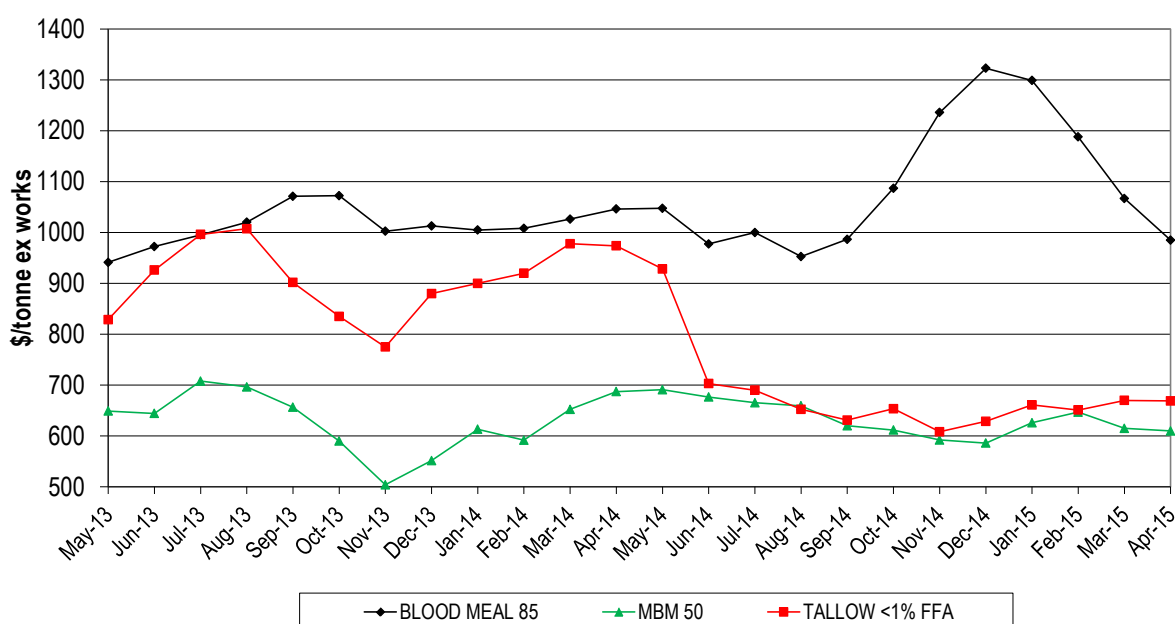
Concentrated gall remains fairly steady however it was lightly reported. The average price has improved 75¢/kg on last month which is an increase of \$2.80/kg on last year's price.

The market for frozen offals in general is fairly soft because of market closures which are reflected in sales volumes falling 13% for the month.

However the volume of sales into the higher priced markets of Japan, Korea and Hong Kong, while back somewhat in volume this last month, have certainly been assisting the return to the carcass over the course of the year.

Rendered Products

Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices have stabilised this month, and while soybean meal prices continue to fall, the recent BSE incident in Canada has opened an opportunity for Australian product to fill the shortfall in Indonesia at much improved prices. This has created a widening gap between domestic prices, with plenty of soybean meal stocks available to Australian feed millers. Accordingly, reduced use of MBM in feed rations has meant local sales are at significant discount to export prices.

Blood meal prices continued the slide that started in February, with aquaculture demand still very low and sellers having to find alternative feed sources, such as poultry rations, which are at a discount to aqua feed. The average prices now being quoted are around \$985/tonne ex-works, a further \$82/tonne down on last month with further falls expected.

Tallow looks likely to improve somewhat with renewed interest from Singapore. The price of 1%FFA tallow averaged \$669/mt, on a par with last month, mainly due to the recent rally of the Aussie dollar.

Hide prices started to come under pressure as demand from China waned. Concerns are being expressed by some exporters around the world of buyers looking to renege on contracts due to falling offer prices, particularly from US exporters.

Many were hoping the Hong Kong leather fair would stimulate a new round of business but it only confirmed the business is well down on last year.

We can expect further price adjustments until tanners see some light at the end of the tunnel and a return to profitability.

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$/each or \$/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

The Aussie Dollar was volatile in May, peaking at just over 81US¢ and finishing the month at just under 77US¢. Beef offal prices for the month were fairly sluggish. Omasum into Hong Kong recovered almost \$2/kg after last month's fall in price however this is expected to be short lived. Honeycomb tripe continued its downward trend.

Foetal blood prices have steadied to more sustainable levels.

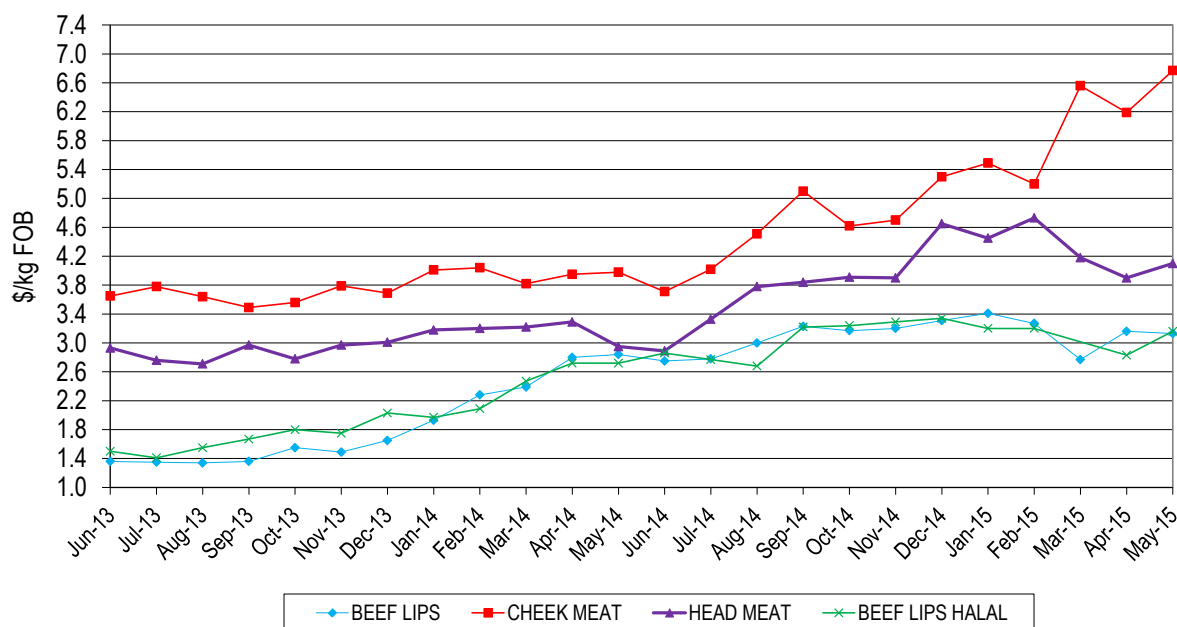
Meat and bone meal prices are steady with export support however the price for blood meal continues southward.

Tallow also remains fairly steady, with improving orders from Singapore keeping demand steady. Sales into Singapore remain around the 20,000mt per month level.

Hide prices continued to suffer this month, with Asian tanners showing little interest at current price levels. Prices are expected to continue the downward trend over the next few months. Sheep skins on the other hand improved.

Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

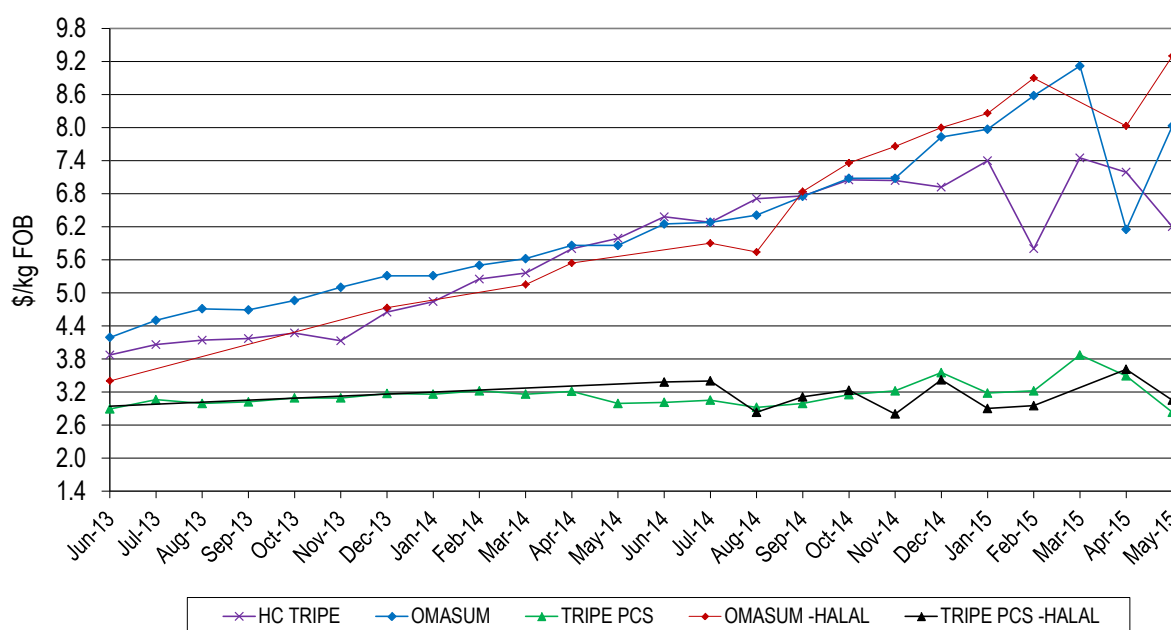


Head offals in general continue to maintain a large improvement year-on-year, also being supported by the falling dollar. Cheek meat is \$2.79/kg better than the May price last year at \$6.77/kg, up 58¢/kg on last month, while head meat is trading \$1.15/kg higher year-on-year and 20¢/kg up on last month. The Korean cold stores have plenty of cheek meat in stock so prices are expected to soften moving forward.

Lips are coming under some pressure both in USA and Mexico, however their prices are still better than alternative markets such as South Africa.

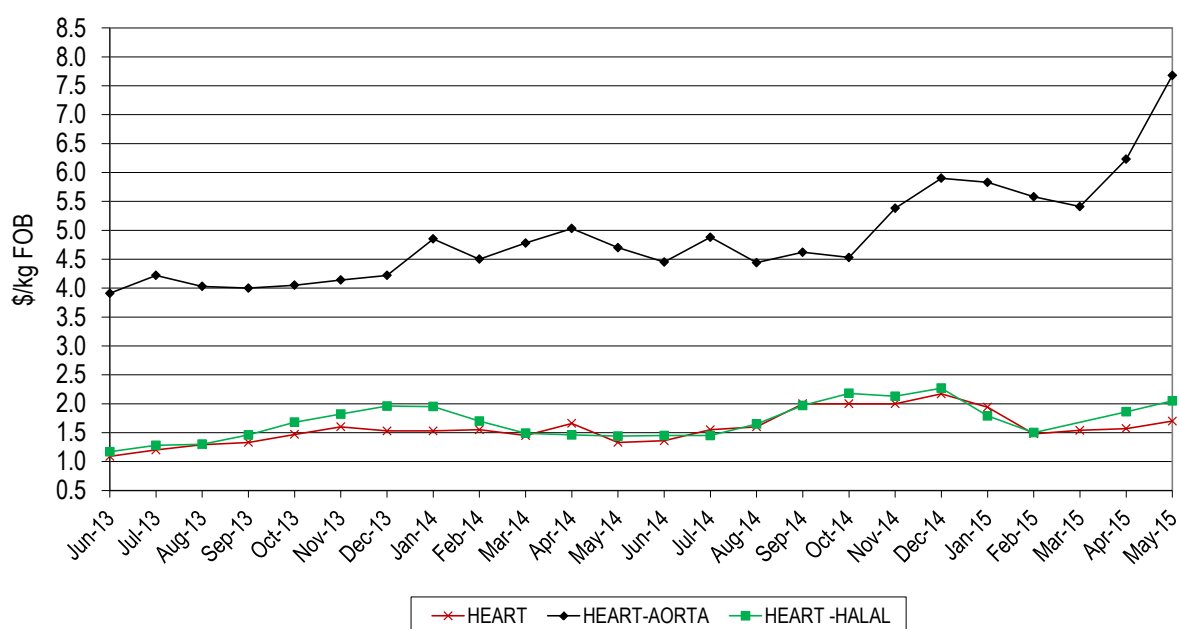
Beef Offal Trends

Most tripe lines were weaker for the month. Tripe pieces fell by 66¢/kg, to realize an average of \$2.83/kg, which is 16¢/kg down on last year. Honeycomb tripe saw a downward correction of 99¢/kg, to \$6.20/kg, which is still 21¢/kg up on last year. Omasum prices, whilst recovering \$1.88/kg for the month, are looking at a major correction over the next few weeks with sales looking very difficult to achieve.

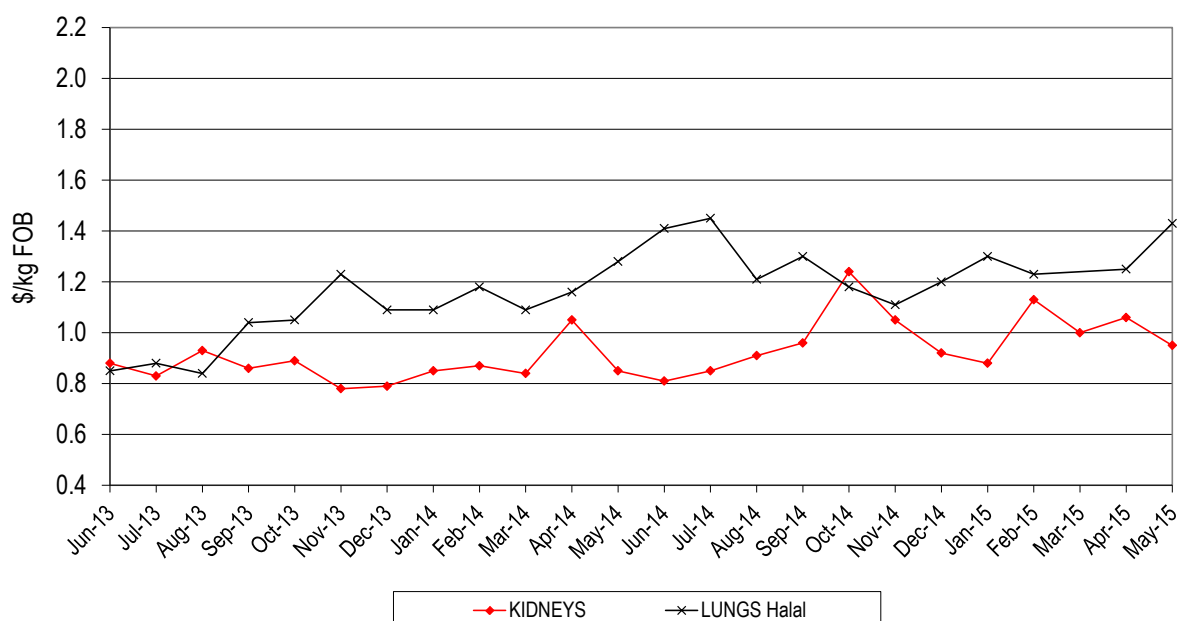
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



Heart products continued to trade steadily this month as they have done for quite some time. Non-halal hearts were up 13¢/kg on last month and up 37¢/kg year-on-year, averaging \$1.70/kg. Halal hearts found an average of \$2.05/kg, which is an improvement of 19¢/kg over last month and a welcome 61¢/kg over the same time last year.

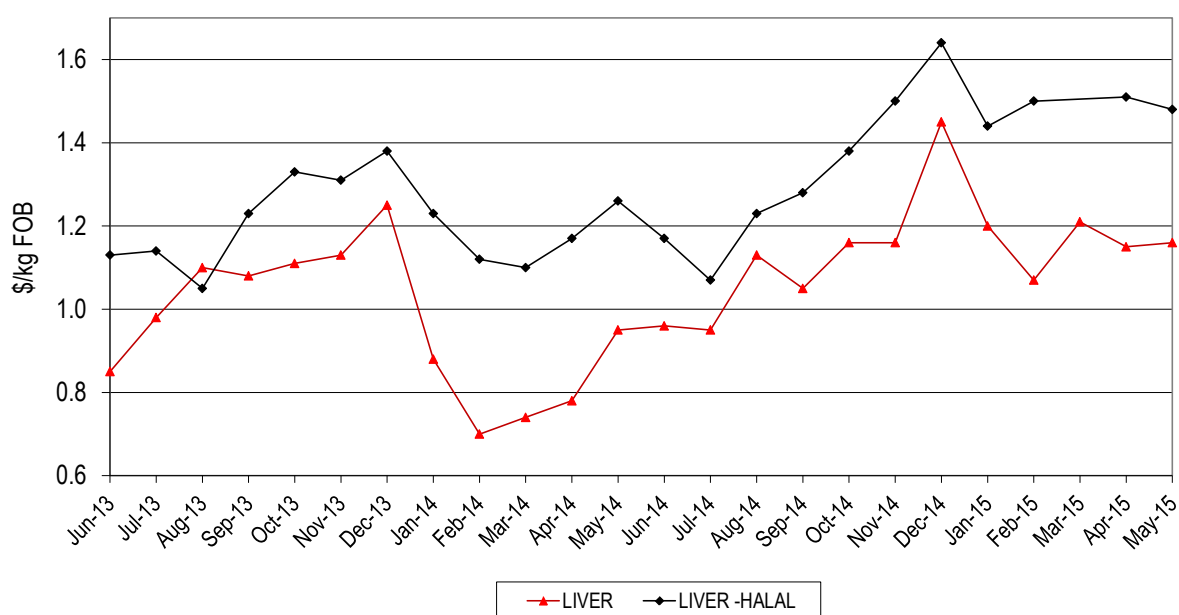
Aorta was the big winner in May, sharply trending upward to average \$7.68/kg, up \$1.45/kg on last month and a healthy \$2.98/kg rise over May prices last year. The market into China is looking very firm into the future.

Kidneys and lungs both continued to achieve a fairly steady price, with slight variations averaging out over the 12-month period. Kidneys recorded 95¢/kg, down 11¢/kg for the month but a 10¢/kg improvement over last year. Non-halal lungs were very lightly reported while halal product traded firm, supported by the falling dollar, to average \$1.43/kg, which is 15¢/kg above this time last year and 18¢/kg up on April.

Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices

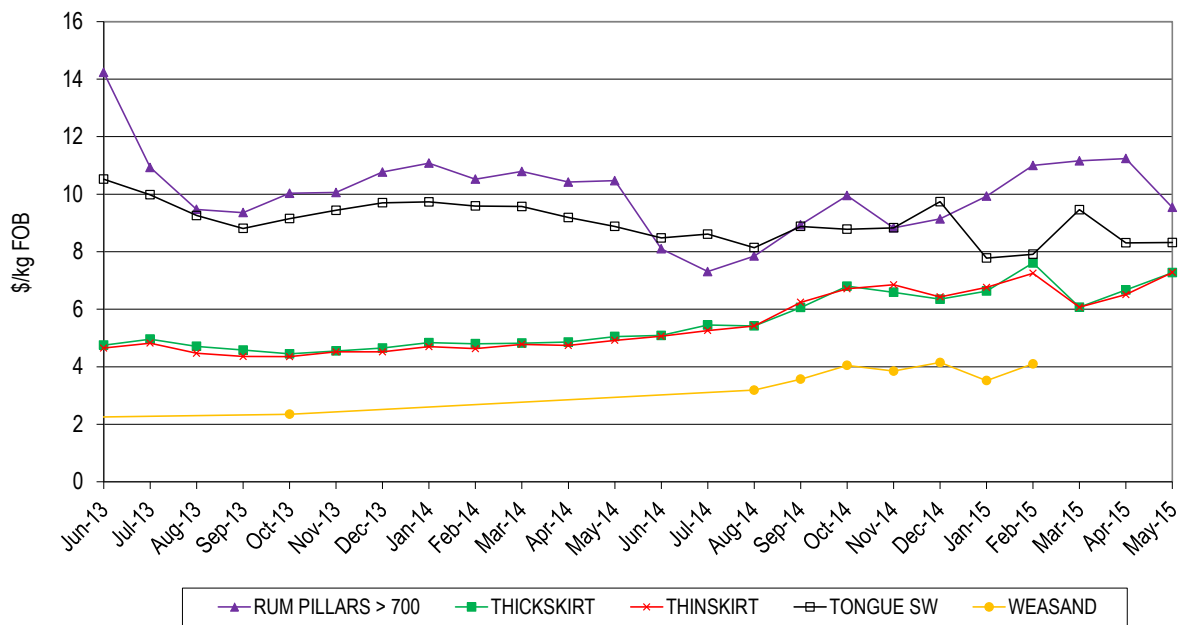


Livers were steady across the month, with prices for non-halal product improving just 1¢/kg since April, to trade at \$1.16/kg, however this is 21¢/kg up year-on-year.

Halal sales averaged \$1.48/kg, down 3¢/kg on prices recorded in April, however these prices are an improvement of 34¢/kg year on year.

Egypt continues to lead the way on halal liver sales.

Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



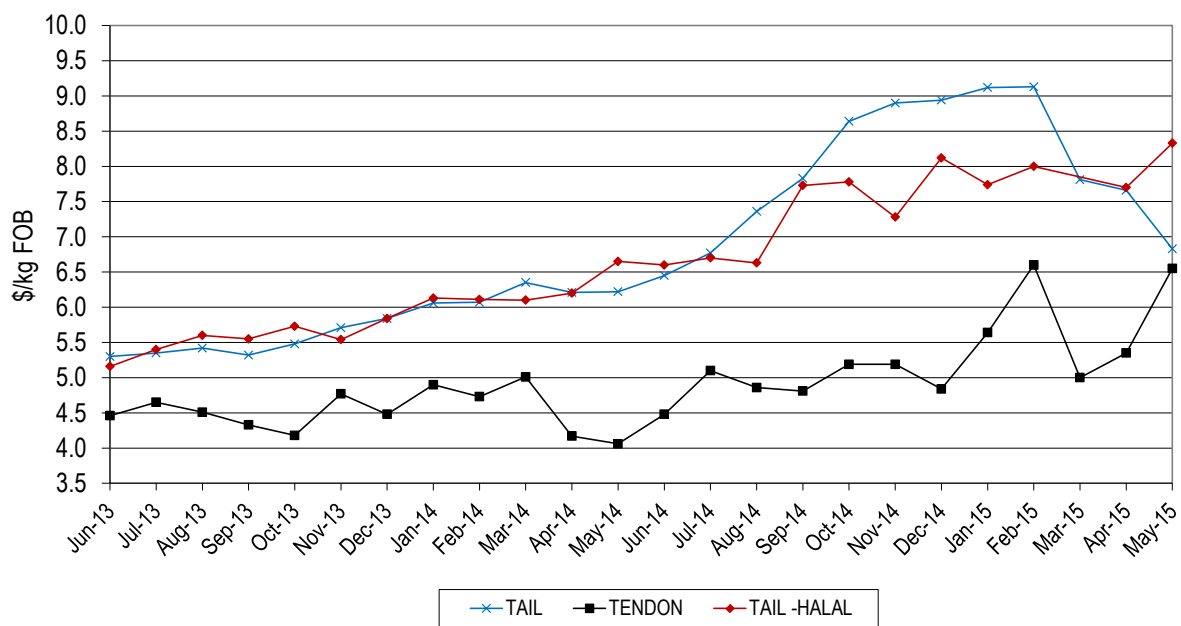
The price of tongues steadied this month, trading just 1¢/kg higher than April, with average prices returning \$8.32/kg. With US Dollar prices under pressure this is 56¢/kg down on last year. Thick skirt traded \$2.22/kg up on last year, at \$7.27/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$2.36/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$7.28/kg. With full bond warehouses in Japan awaiting third quarter quota, it is expected the market will remain soft looking to the future.

Prices of heavy weight range rumen pillars also fell sharply, to trade at \$9.54/kg, a fall of \$1.70 since April and 93¢/kg lower than this time last year. Again high stock levels in the cold stores are affecting prices.

Prices are going to remain under pressure for both markets.

Tails and Tendons

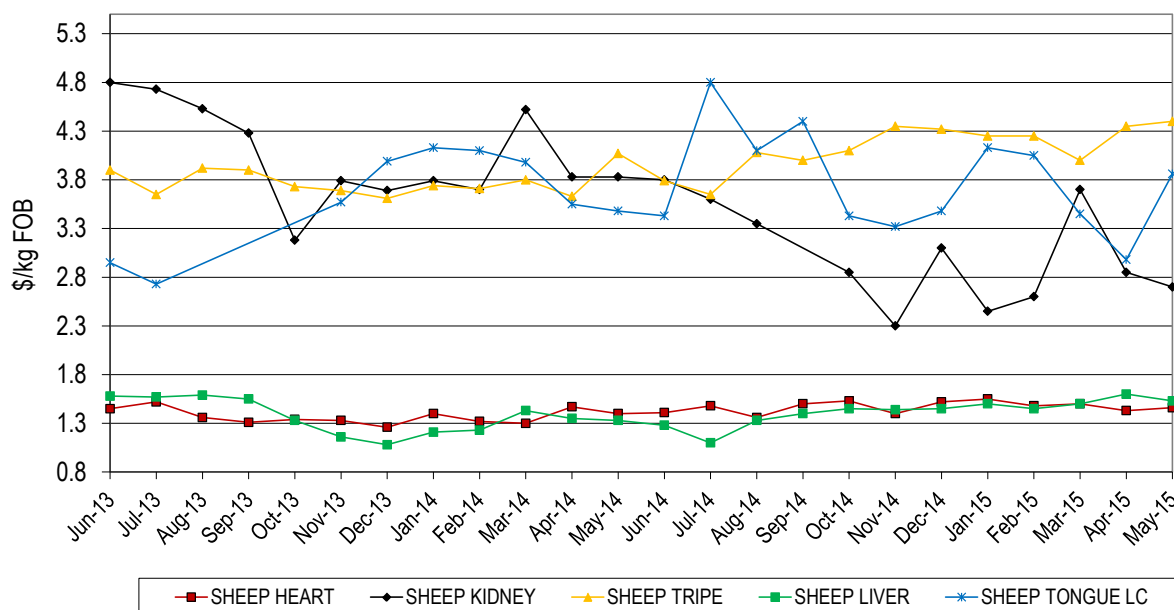
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices in Japan also suffered, averaging \$6.83/kg, down 83¢/kg since April. Halal tails fared better, at \$7.70/kg, which is \$1.68/kg up on last year's price and 63¢/kg better than April. Tendons improved by \$1.20/kg month-on-month, to average \$6.55, which is \$2.49 above the price a year ago.

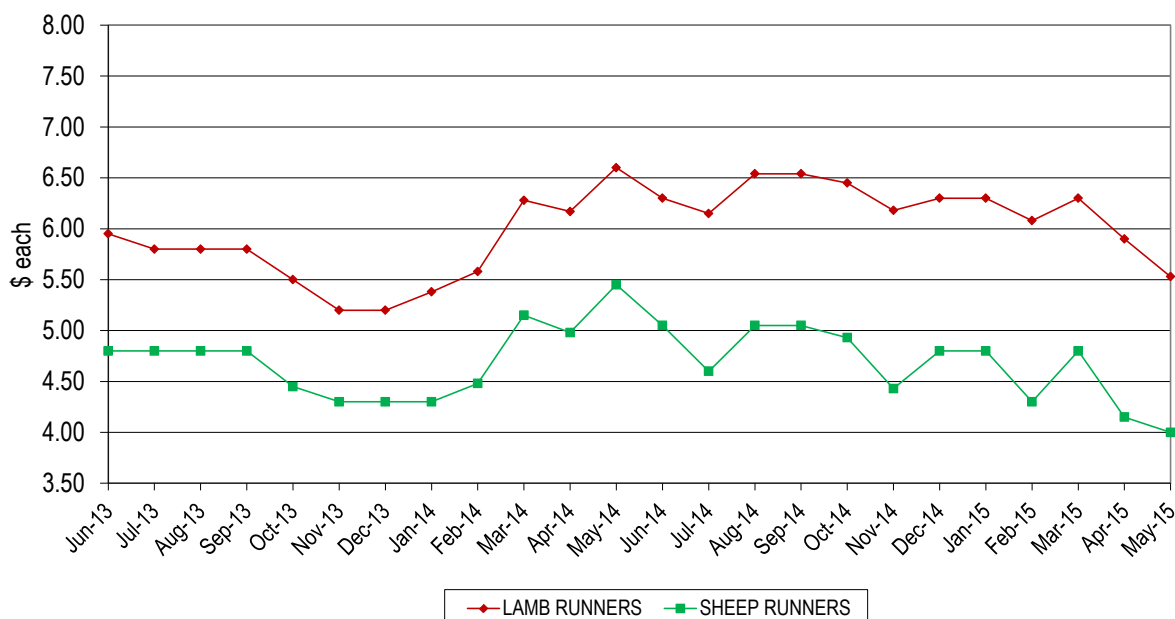
Sheep Offals

Sheep hearts and livers continued to trade steadily as they have all year, with only small movements reported. Tongues recovered, to average \$3.86/kg, while kidneys fell 15¢/kg month-on-month, to record \$2.70/kg. Sheep tripe prices improved 33¢/kg across the year, to trade at \$4.40/kg, which is 5¢/kg up on last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year and averaged \$1.46/kg this month, while livers fell 7¢/kg, to average \$1.53/kg.

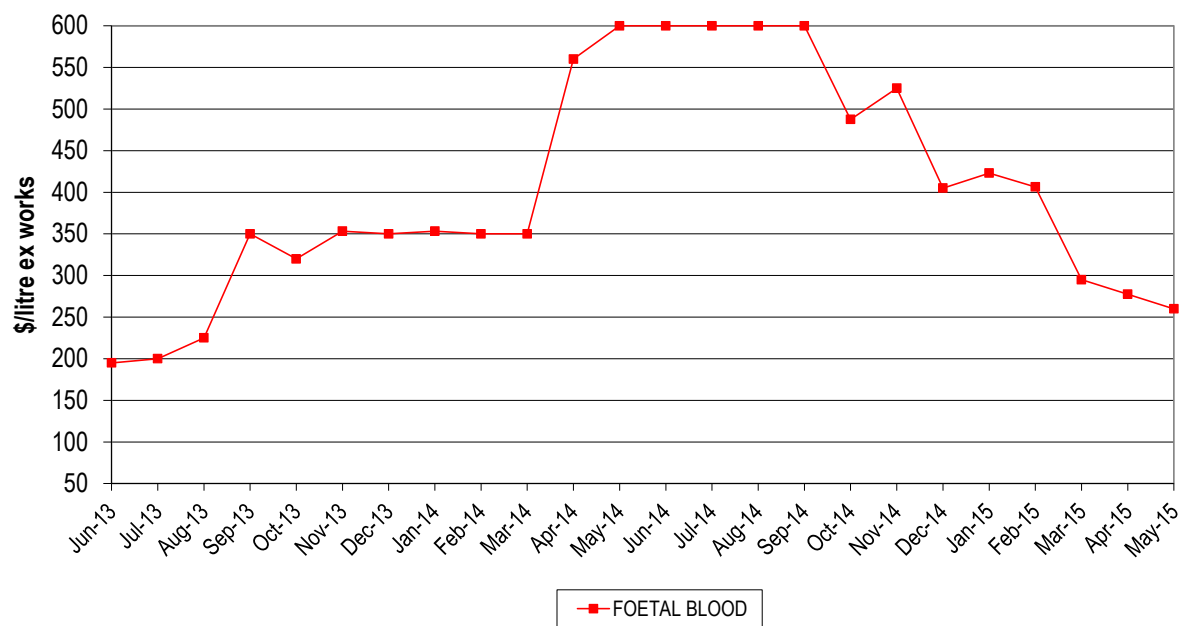
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners were under pressure during the month, with \$5.53/piece being realised for lamb, which is 37¢/piece down on last month's price, and \$4.00/piece for sheep, down 15¢/piece month-on-month. However, once again, all sheep offals were lightly reported.

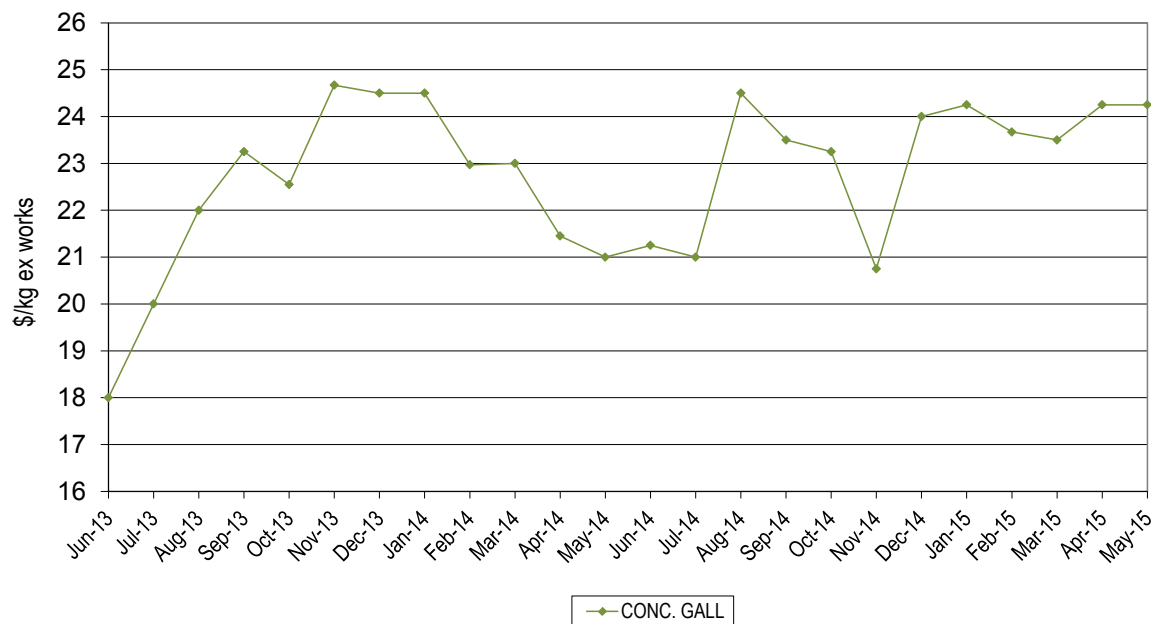
Pharmaceutical products

The foetal calf blood average price of \$260/litre appears to have now stabilised to around a workable price for buyers.

Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



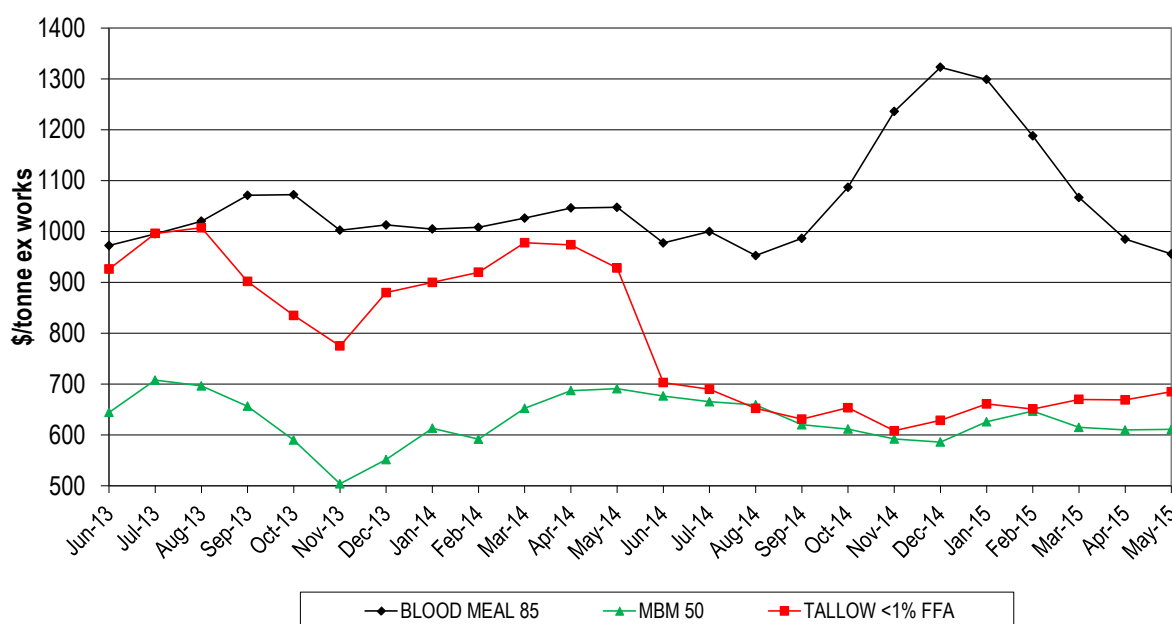
Concentrated gall remains fairly steady however it was lightly reported. The average price of \$24.25/kg is identical to last month, which is an increase of \$3.25/kg on last year's price.

The market for frozen offals in general is fairly soft because of market closures and red offal quota in Japan being over-subscribed. This is expected to deliver a downward trend for a number of offals as we go forward into the third and fourth quarters of the year.

Traders are expecting a difficult time, with lower prices becoming the answer to buyer reluctance and the need to re-position some items to alternate, lower value markets.

Rendered Products

Figure 8: Trends in rendered co-product prices



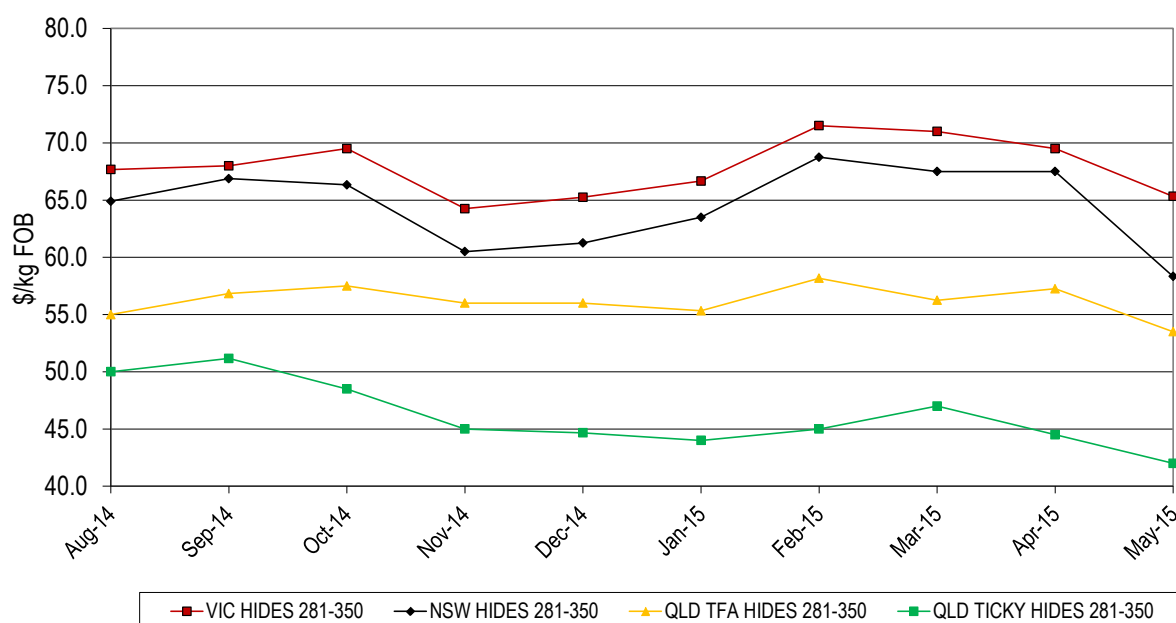
Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices have stabilised this month and, while soybean meal prices continue to languish and keep a lid on domestic sale prices, export sales to Indonesia are helping hold the price steady. This has created a widening gap between domestic and export prices, with plenty of soybean meal stocks available to Australian feed millers. Accordingly, reduced use of MBM in feed rations has meant local sales are at significant discount to export prices.

Blood meal prices continued the slide that started in February, with aquaculture demand still very low and sellers having to find alternative feed sources, such as poultry rations which are at a discount to aqua feed. The average prices now being quoted are around \$956/tonne ex-works, a further \$29/tonne down on last month with further falls expected.

Tallow looks likely to improve somewhat with renewed interest from Singapore. The price of 1%FFA tallow averaged \$685/mt, \$16/mt up on last month.

Hides

Hide prices continue to come under pressure and, as the graph shows, the trend is certainly downwards. Leather markets are generally weak on reduced orders and tanners are reluctant to commit to purchases. All in all the hide market is fairly messy and will take some weeks to resume trading again, albeit at lower prices which are not expected to rebound in the short term.

Sheep skins, particularly those with a heavier cover, have seen the market improve.

The China market for skins, with 12mm of wool for the clothing market, is strong and improving, particularly with the short supply caused by reduced slaughter numbers. The less than 12mm of wool market is still weak, as it is based on the lining market, however the short supply should see a marked recovery here too.

Table 1 shows the average price, reported as \$/kg FOB Australian port; ex. works \$/tonne for rendered co-products and ex. works \$/each or \$/head for hides, skins and sheep runners.

The Aussie Dollar floated around 77US¢ to 78US¢ during June and finished the month just under 77US¢, right where it started. Beef offal prices for the month traded well down across the board. Omasum into Hong Kong, as predicted last month, was very slow and prices fell \$3.23/kg, but it was also very lightly reported. Aorta also followed the same downward trend, falling \$3.48/kg.

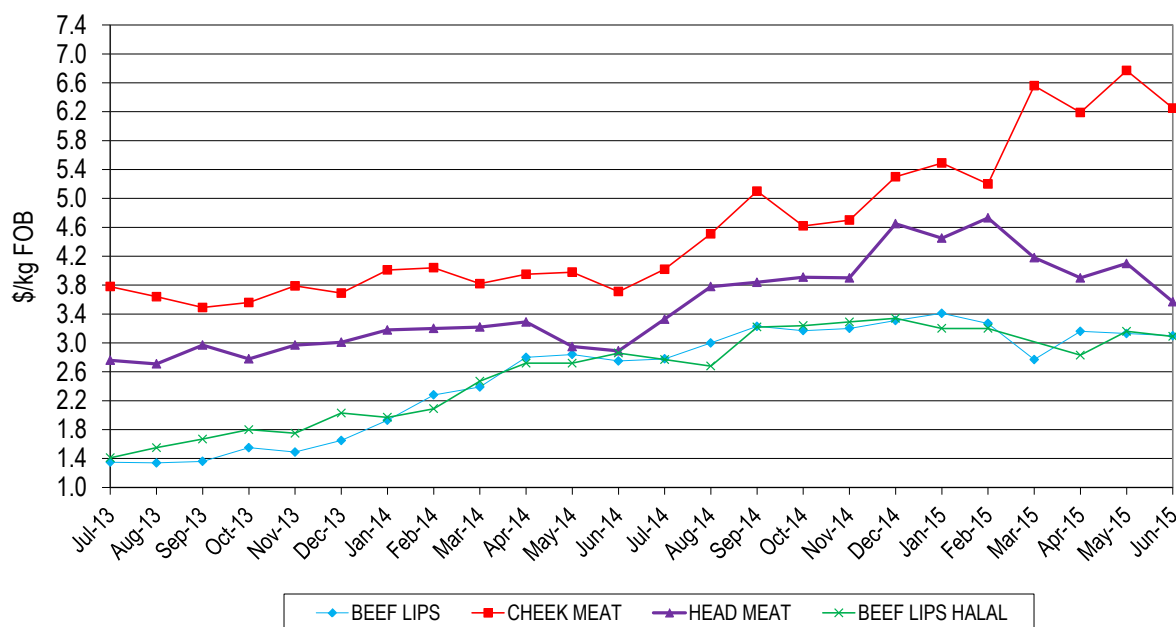
Foetal blood prices continued the downward trend.

Meat and bone meal prices showed a slight improvement, with good export support, while the price for blood meal improved on the back of stronger domestic demand. Tallow also remained fairly steady. The renderer's symposium being held this month on the Gold Coast will bring many buyers and sellers together.

Hide prices continued to suffer in June, with many buyers unable or unwilling to open letters of credit and reneging on higher priced contracts. There are reports of lots being sold up to three times before shipment taking place. Sheep skins on the other hand remained firm.

Head Offal Prices

Figure 1: Trends in beef head offal prices

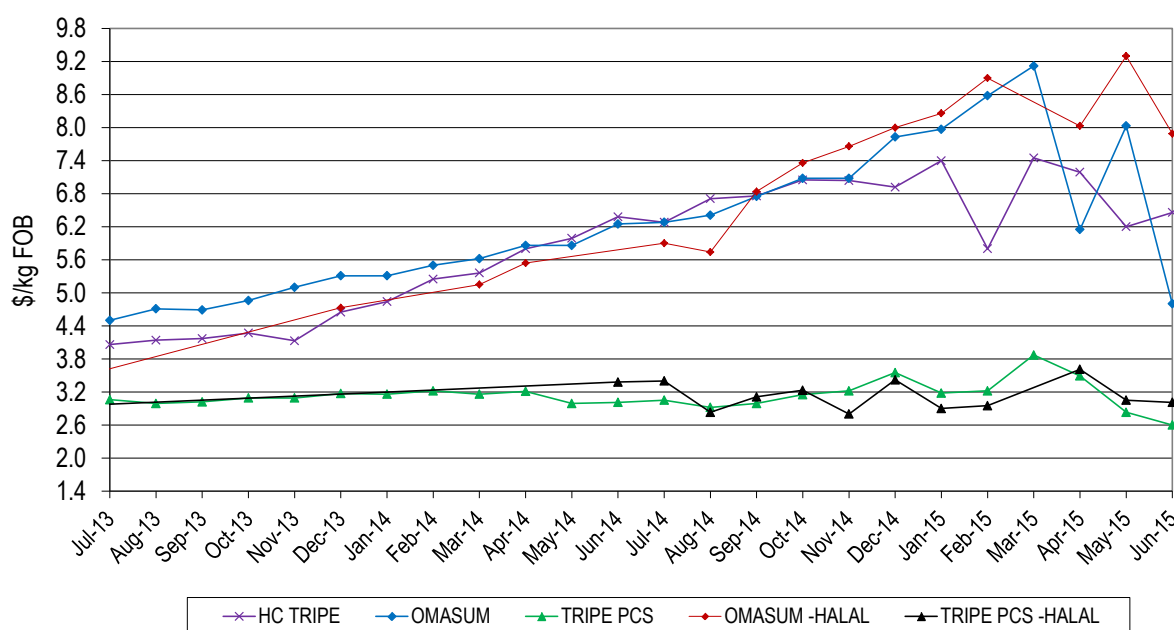


Head offals, in general, continued to maintain an improvement year-on-year however month-on-month a fall was recorded. Cheek meat is \$2.54/kg better than the May price last year, at \$6.25/kg, which is 52¢/kg down on last month, while head meat is trading 68¢/kg higher year-on-year but down 53¢/kg on last month, at \$3.57/kg. The Korean cold stores remain well stocked so prices are expected to remain soft for a while yet.

Lip exports to the US and Mexico were on a par with last month, showing prices just 3¢/kg down on last month, at \$3.10/kg, which is still 35¢/kg up on last year.

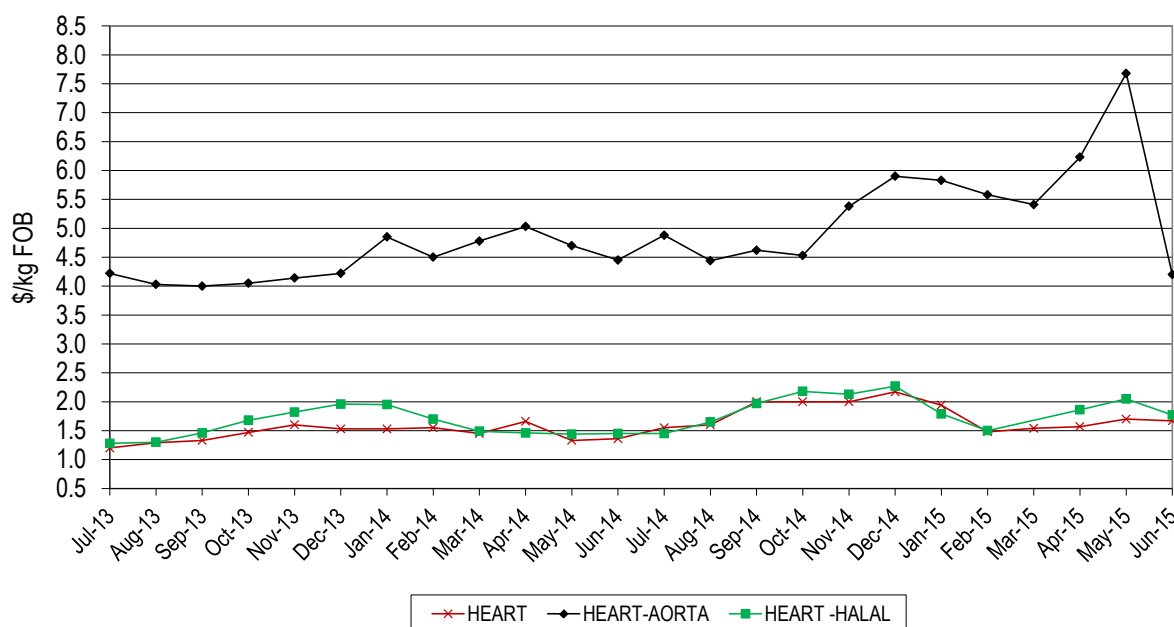
Beef Offal Trends

As expected omasum prices plummeted \$3.23/kg for the month, to trade at \$4.80/kg, but sales were very lightly reported. Halal omasum fared a little better, dropping \$1.41/kg, but this is right on par with the price last year. Most other tripe lines were also weaker for the month. Tripe pieces fell by 23¢/kg, to realize an average of \$2.60/kg, which is 41¢/kg down on last year. Honeycomb tripe bucked the trend, rising 26¢/kg to \$6.46/kg, which is 8¢/kg up on last year.

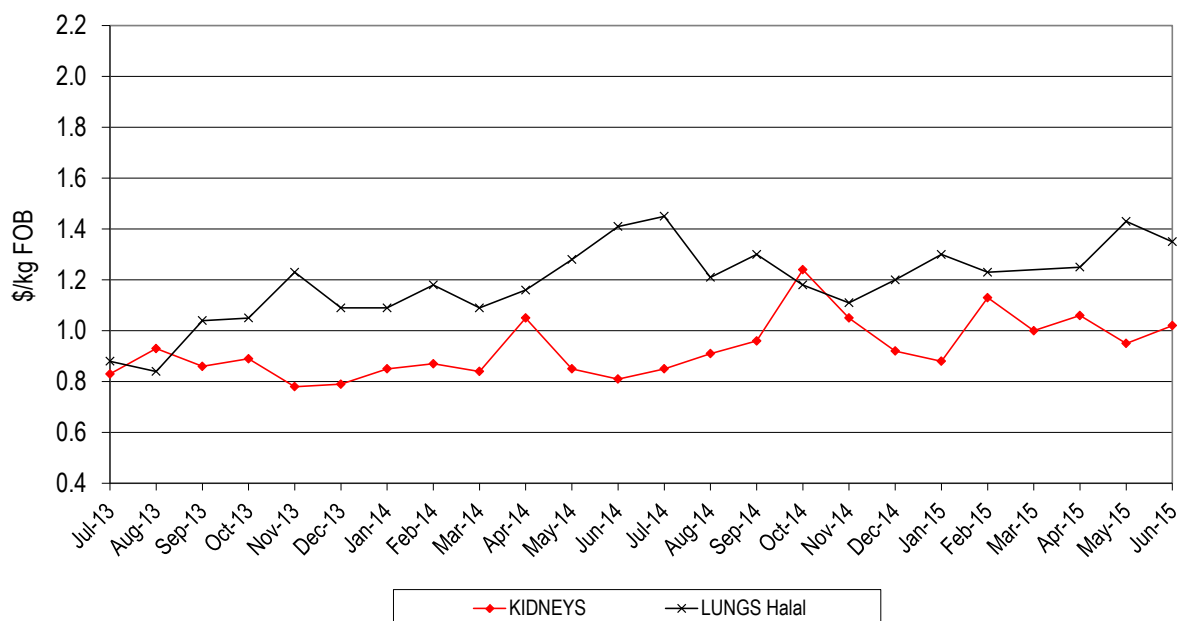
Figure 3a: Trends in beef offal prices



Aorta joined the omasum discount and fell by \$3.48/kg during the month, at \$4.20/kg, which is also 25¢/kg down on prices this time last year

Hearts continued to trade steadily this month as they have done for quite some time. Non-halal hearts were down 3¢/kg on last month and up 31¢/kg year-on-year, averaging \$1.67/kg. Halal hearts averaged \$1.77/kg, which is back 28¢/kg over last month but still 32¢/kg better than the same time last year.

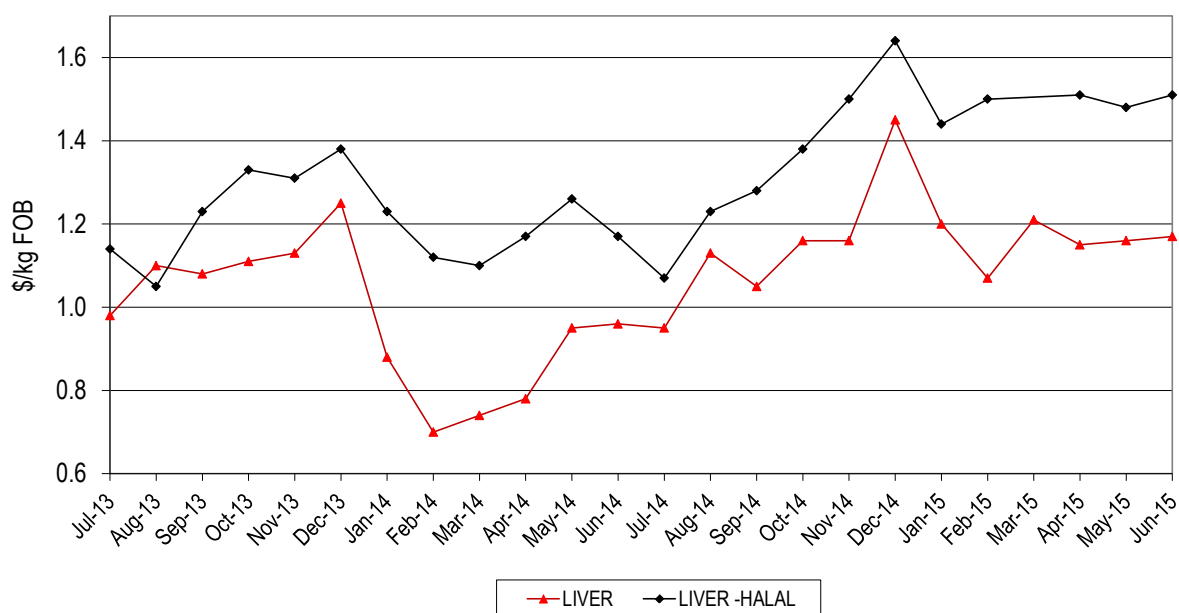
Figure 3b: Trends in beef offal prices



Kidneys recorded \$1.02/kg, up 7¢/kg for the month and a 21¢/kg improvement over last year.

Non-halal lungs were again not reported this month with packers unable to find a market at a workable price. However, halal product traded at \$1.35/kg, which is 6¢/kg down this time last year and 8¢/kg off the price last month.

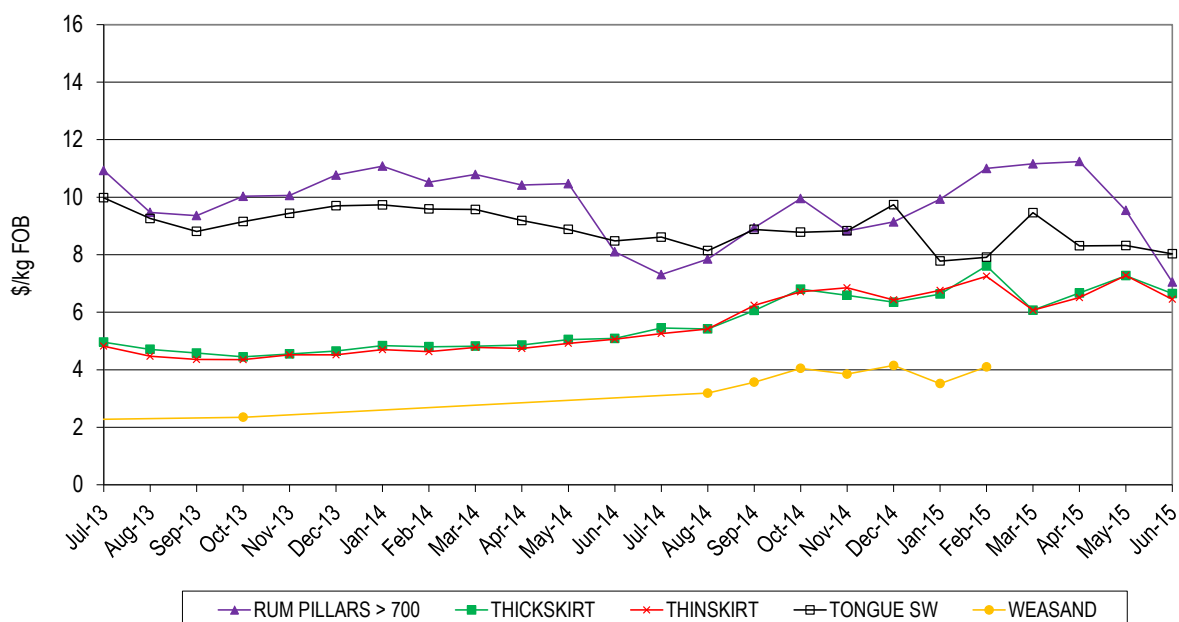
Figure 3c: Trends in beef offal prices



Livers were again steady across the month, with prices for non-halal product improving just 1¢/kg since May, to trade at \$1.17/kg, an improvement of 21¢/kg year-on-year.

Halal liver sales averaged \$1.51/kg, recovering the 3¢/kg drop last month and maintaining the 34¢/kg improvement over last year, with Egypt still showing strong demand.

Figure 4: Trends in Japanese offal prices



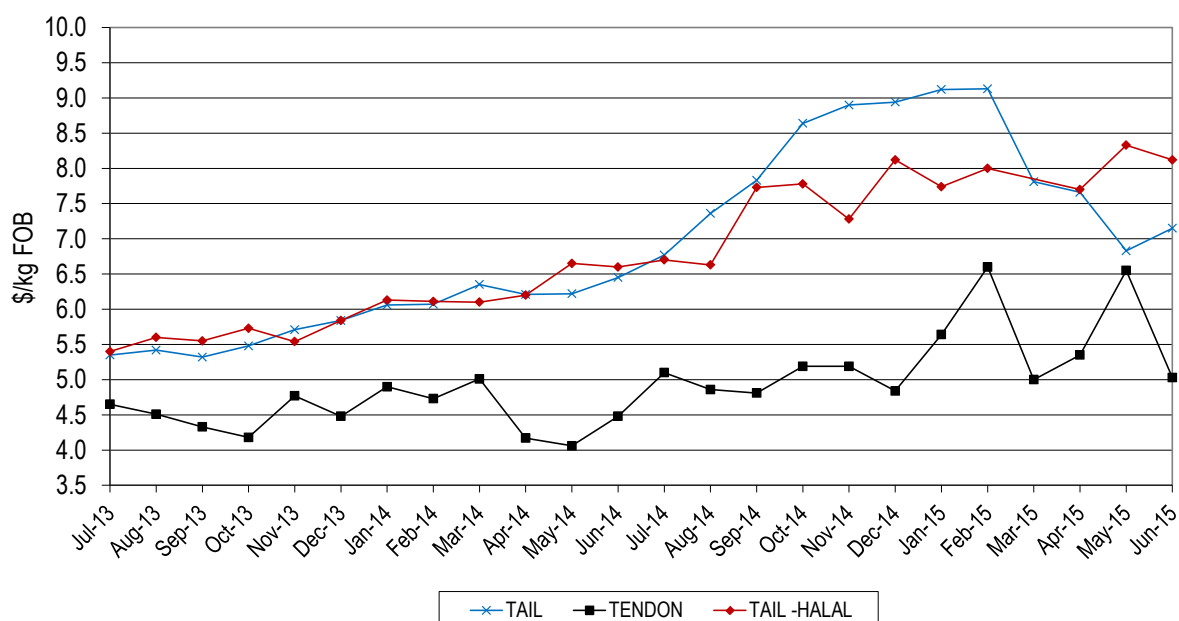
Tongue prices continued to ease this month, trading 29¢/kg lower than May, with average prices returning \$8.03/kg, a fall of 45¢/kg from the same period last year.

Thick skirt traded \$1.56/kg up on last year, at \$6.65/kg, and thin skirt prices were \$1.39/kg higher for the same period, averaging \$6.45/kg. Quota into Japan is looking likely to be filled well ahead of time which will have a major influence on prices into the future.

Prices of rumen pillars also fell sharply this month, down \$2.49/kg for the month, with heavy weight range product trading at \$7.05/kg. This represents a cumulative fall of \$4.19/kg since April and is \$1.05/kg lower than this time last year. Again high stock levels in the cold stores are affecting prices.

Tails and Tendons

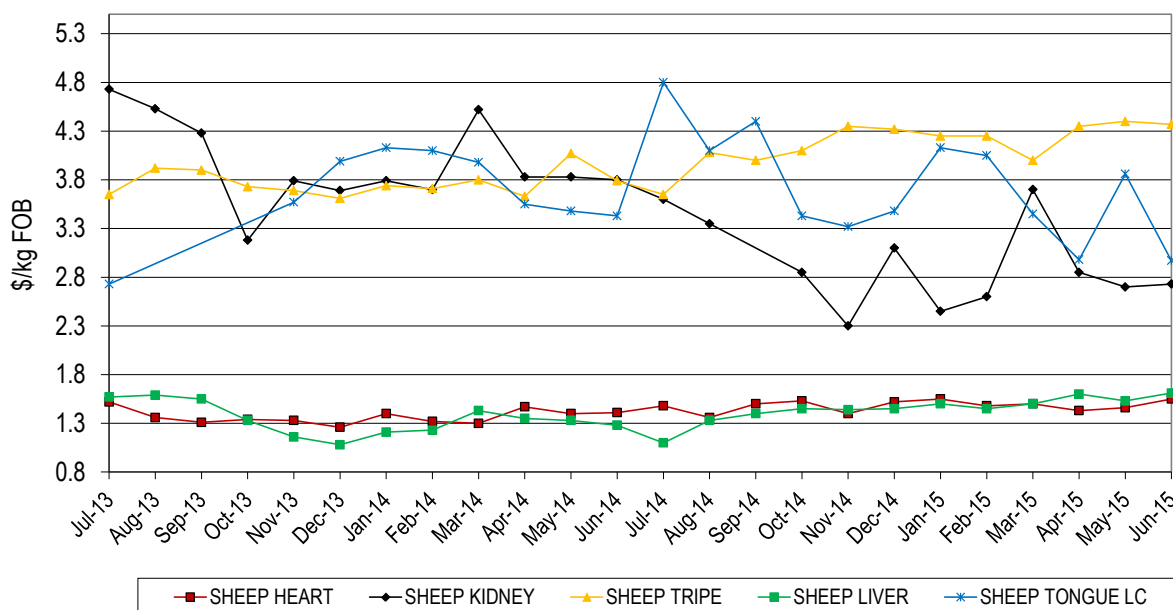
Figure 5: Trends in tail and tendon prices



Tail prices into Japan averaged \$7.15/kg, up 32¢/kg for the month. Halal tails, however, were almost a dollar better at \$8.12/kg, which is \$1.52/kg up on last year's price. Tendons followed the aorta path and slumped \$1.52/kg month-on-month, to average \$5.03, however this is 55¢/kg above the price a year ago.

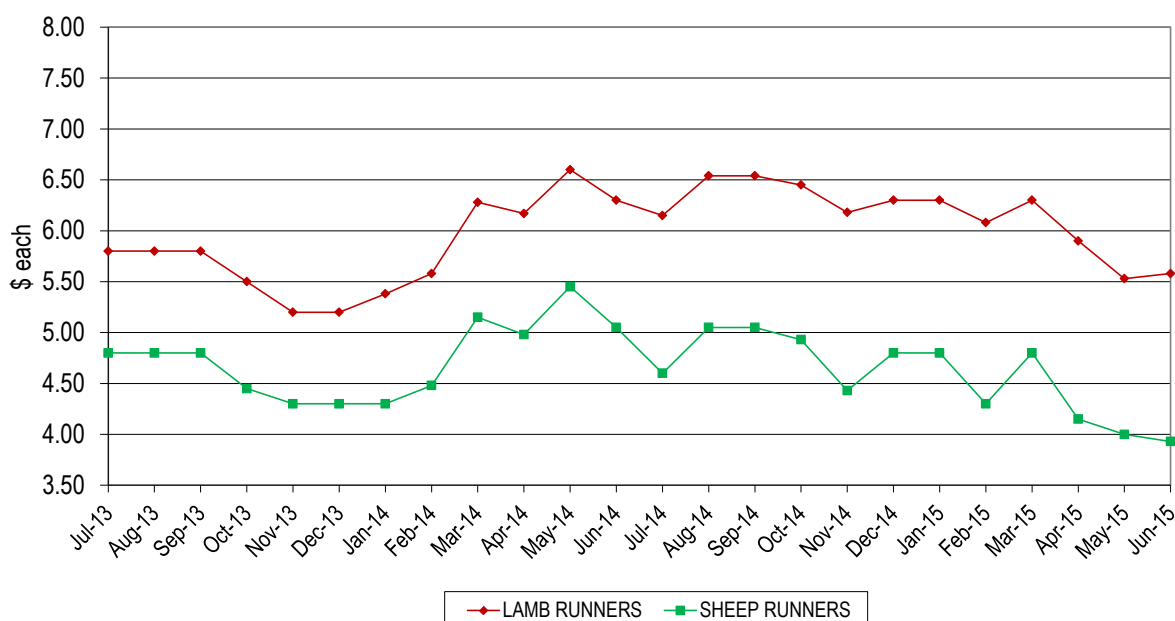
Sheep Offals

Sheep hearts and livers continued to trade steadily as they have all year, with only small movements reported. Tongues reversed their upward trend last month, to average \$2.97/kg, while kidneys rallied 3¢/kg month-on-month, to record \$2.73/kg. Sheep tripe prices improved 58¢/kg across the year, to trade at \$4.37/kg, which is 3¢/kg down on last month. Sheep hearts have been steady all year and averaged \$1.55/kg this month, while livers rose 8¢/kg, to average \$1.61/kg.

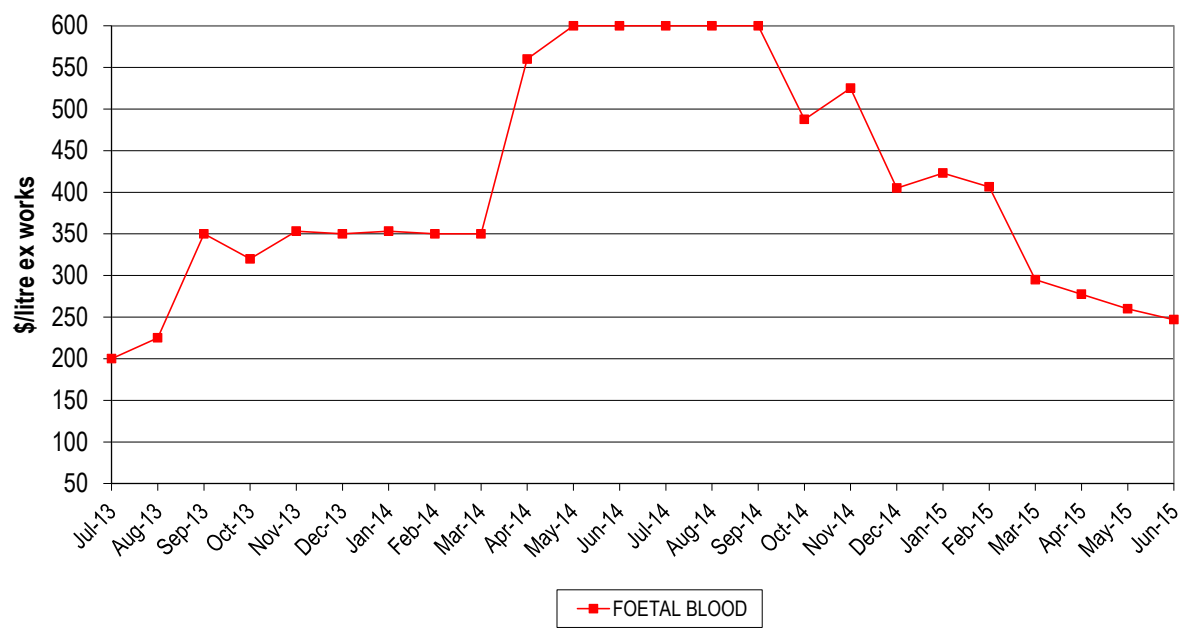
Figure 6b: Trends in runner prices



The average price of lamb and sheep runners settled during the month, with \$5.58/piece being realised for lamb, and, whilst this is 5¢/piece up on last month's price, it is down 72¢/piece on last year. Sheep runners averaged \$3.93/piece during June, back 7¢/piece month-on-month and \$1.12/piece down on last year's price.

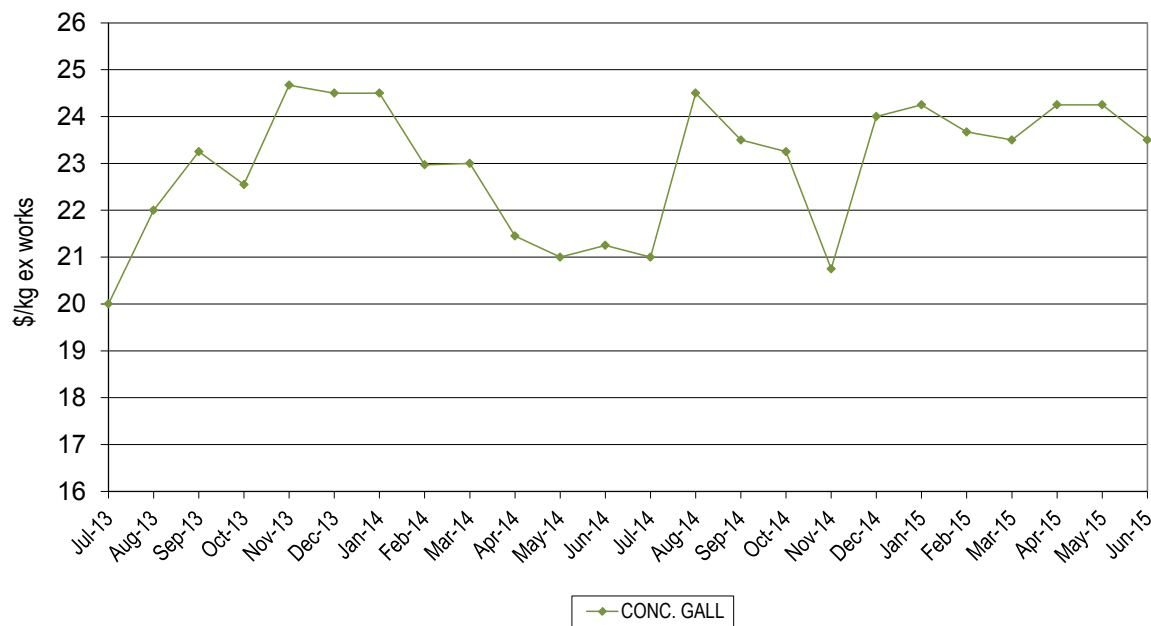
Pharmaceutical products

The foetal calf blood average price dropped to \$247/litre and buyers are again quoting lower prices going forward.

Figure 7b: Trends for concentrated gall prices



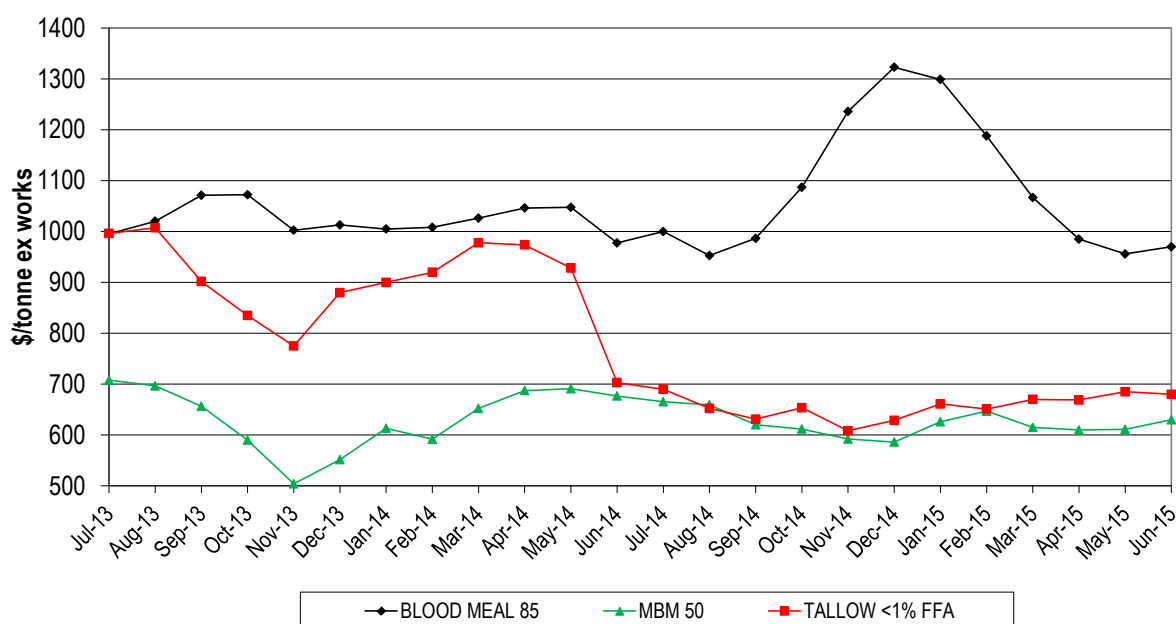
Concentrated gall remains fairly steady however it was again lightly reported. The average price of \$23.50/kg was from just two reports.

The market for frozen offals in general remains soft because of market closures and the red offal quota into Japan well ahead of schedule in shipments. This is expected to deliver a downward trend for a number of offals as we go forward into the third and fourth quarters of the year.

Russia has extended the ban on beef items from Australia for a further 12 months, with the Russian Prime Minister signing the decree last week.

Rendered Products

Figure 8: Trends in rendered co-product prices



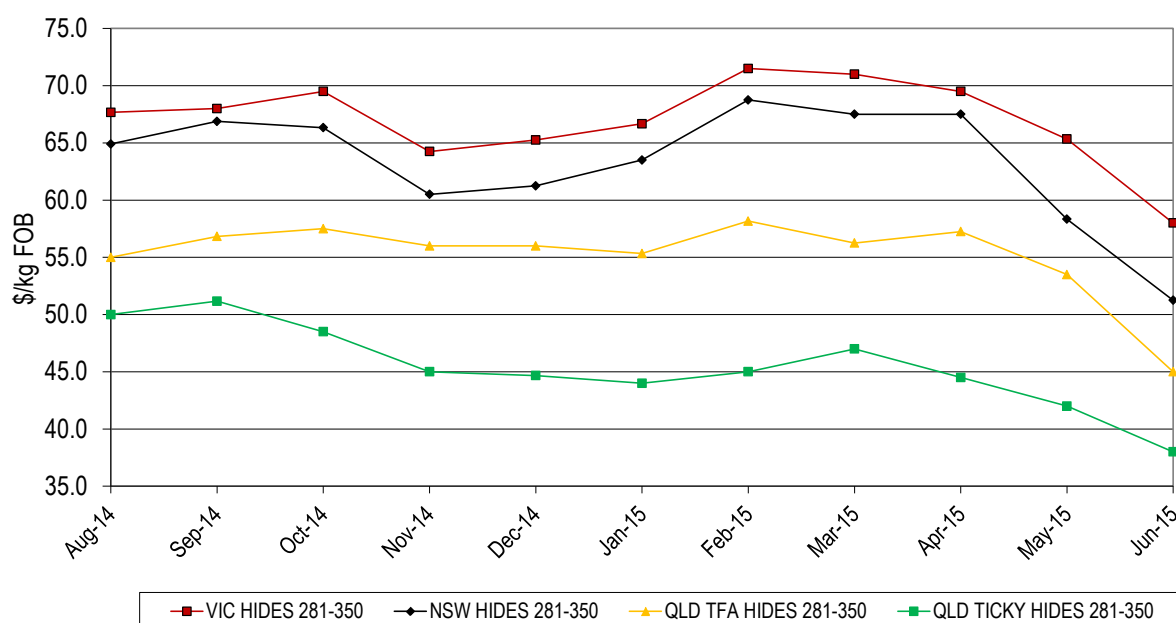
Meat and bone meal (MBM) prices have stabilised somewhat. While soybean meal prices remain under pressure and consequently keep a lid on domestic MBM prices, export sales to Indonesia are helping hold the price steady. With plenty of soybean meal stocks available to Australian poultry and swine feed millers the reduced use of MBM in feed rations domestically has meant local sales are at significant discount to export prices.

Blood meal prices have steadied on the domestic market with improved demand. The average prices now being quoted are around \$970/tonne ex-works, up \$14/tonne on last month, however this remains driven by domestic demand.

Tallow prices have stabilised over the last few months on the back of the Singapore bio-diesel market. The price of 1% FFA tallow averaged \$680/mt, down just \$5/mt on last month.

Hides

Hide prices continued to languish and, as the graph shows, the trend is certainly downwards. All traders reported very difficult conditions, with many buyers reneging on contracts due to their inability to open letters of credit or their desire to chase cheaper prices based on the ongoing price collapse. The reduced prices on splits are also not assisting the market. Add to this, the environmental impositions imposed by Chinese authorities are creating problems with production capacity and this looks like a difficult time ahead.

Sheep skins, particularly those with a heavier cover, remain firm.

The China market for skins, with 12mm of wool for the clothing market, is strong and improving, particularly with the short supply caused by reduced slaughter numbers. Those skins with less than 12mm continue to be under pressure with prices still weak, as this market is based on the lining market.
