- GOOD technology will:
- ✓ Improve animal welfare outcomes
- ✓Increase profitability
- ✓ Decrease workload and/or expenses
- ✓ Reduce stress







Technology in Action in the Rangelands

- It doesn't have to be computers and wifi
- Some of the best technology is the simplest









Example 1 - Mineral Supplement Feeding

- The most common mineral deficiencies in cattle, sheep and goats in Australia are of copper, selenium, cobalt and phosphorus.
- Feeding supplement can have a positive effect on animal behaviour that will make handling them easier & less stressful.
- Feeding mineral supplement & urea can increase calving rates, will help breeders maintain body weight & lactation and will increase the appetite of cattle
- Seek professional advice in both the diagnosis and correction of deficiencies and make sure you test your soil, feed and WATER
- Determine the benefits and costs in your situation.
- Remember: Technology is a tool to make your life & work EASIER







Example 2 – Telemetry

- Telemetry is the in situ collection of measurements or other data at remote points and their automatic transmission to receiving equipment (telecommunication) for monitoring.
- There are many different types of telemetry available do your research!
- We currently have 9 sites using a point to point wi-fi connection which has saved us an average of 500km of driving every week.
- It has reduced our stress, especially when we're away from the station.







Take home messages

- Do your research ask other producers their experiences.
- Get help animal nutritionists, farm business consultants, IT professionals all will help you make the right decisions for the right reasons.
- There are A LOT of different products on the market that may fix your problem check, double check and then check again to make sure you're choosing the right product or combination for your unique circumstances.
- Start small & scale up.
- Don't be afraid to look outside the pastoral industry for solutions & inspiration.
