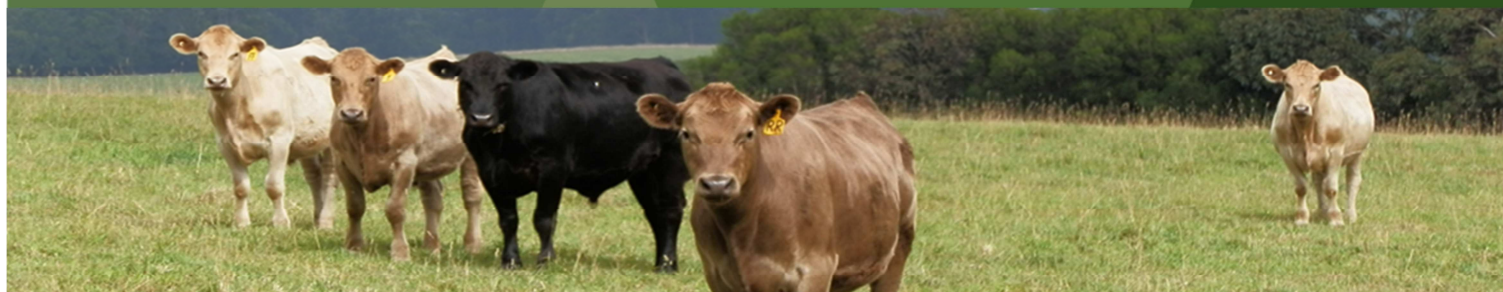


2016 Border Beef Conference
