Chris Wendelborn Farming for the long term – getting the most out of each paddock

Chris works on a family owned and operated beef property – one of five properties within the company. He's currently employed as project development and grazing manager and uses holistic grazing methods for their grasslands. Chris was a delegate in The Leucaena Network's recent tour to view the work of CIPAV (The Centre for Research into Sustainable Agricultural Production Systems) and CIAT (The International Centre for Tropical Agricultural Research) in Colombia, and to attend the Tenth Global Silvopastoral Congress in Paraguay. Jill Alexander Managing the landscape – why is it important to value natural assets?

Originally from a grazing and cropping property south-west of Roma, Jill started her career as a pasture agronomist for the Department of Primary Industries (DPI) working on native and sown pasture research trials. During her 13 years with DPI, she moved around Queensland working on grazing land management projects ranging from ground-truthing carrying capacity models in the Desert Uplands to developing and delivering grazing management training workshops to landholders across Queensland and the Northern Territory. In 2011, Jill started her own business, Applied Ag, where she continues to work with private landholders, pastoral companies and government organisations to improve grazing land management.



Simone Parker Beef economics – putting the real value on natural capital and its use

Simone's connection to regional areas and the beef industry is the driving force behind her interest in helping pastoral businesses to prosper in a sustainable manner.
