## Directions to "Coolagh" from Barcaldine

Head out of Barcaldine on the Blackall road, about 45km turn right onto the Home Creek turn off. Continue down this road until you come to a T intersection and turn right (Avington Road). Continue on this road until you come to a fork in the road (just past an old shearing shed) stay right at the fork. Continue on this road until you come to the homestead. Coolagh is about 105km from Barcaldine.

#### Directions to "Coolagh" from Blackall

Head out on the Barcaldine road and turn left onto the Avington Road (about 18km). Continue on this road until you come to a fork in the road (just past an old shearing shed) stay right at the fork. Continue on this road until you come to the homestead. Coolagh is about 86km from Blackall.

### Directions to "Coolagh" from Isisford

Head out of Isisford on the Blackall road, then turn left onto the Isisford/Blackall River road. Continue on this road until you come to the Barcoo River, once you have crossed the river about 500 metres turn left. Continue on this road all the way to the homestead.
