So what are the top performing producers doing differently to achieve this?

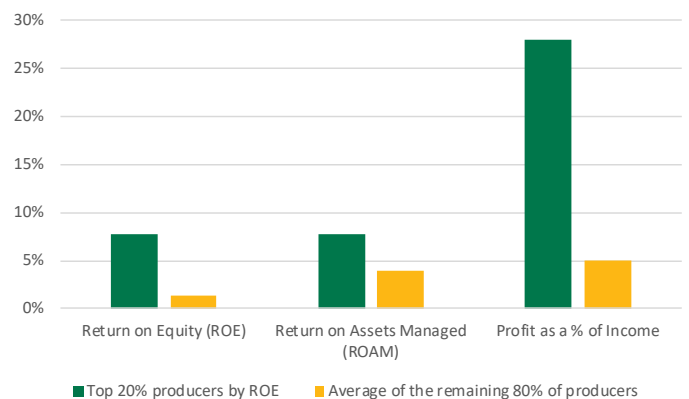
At this workshop we will explore the answers to gain an understanding of the key profit drivers in your business.
