### About the *Improving lamb survival on leguminous pasture* project:

The ‘Improving lamb survival on leguminous pastures’ Producer Demonstration Site is a 4-year project driven by the Longford Red Meat Group in Tasmania. This project is demonstrating four different feedbase and grazing management strategies and the link to lamb red gut cases. Over four years the project looks to identify strategies for reducing red gut cases, minimising lamb mortalities, and improving productivity.
