# **Beef Co-products**

Beef offal prices in June were firmer across most items while lips. aorta, tongues and tails were softer.



### Head offal

Head meat averaged \$6.65/kg which was \$1.46/kg higher year-on-year and 28¢/kg above last month. Cheek meat was \$1.02/kg dearer than year-ago levels, averaging \$9.00/kg, to be 37¢/kg firmer month-on-month.

Lip export prices to the US and Mexico eased 45¢/kg month-on-month, averaging \$4.32/kg to be 22¢/kg down on last year. Halal lips averaged \$4.68/kg to be 22¢/kg softer than June 2021 and 38¢/kg easier than last month.






## Beef offal trends

Omasum eased 7¢/kg from last month, to average \$8.17/kg, up 97¢/kg from year-ago prices. Halal omasum averaged \$8.00/kg, up 87¢/kg year-on-year but 60¢/kg lower month-on month.

Halal tripe pieces averaged \$3.20/kg up 27¢/kg year-on-year and 30¢/kg firmer than last month. Non-halal tripe pieces were not reported. Honeycomb tripe averaged \$7.30/kg to be 73¢/kg above year ago prices but 20¢/kg down on last month.





### Beef offal trends continued...


Aorta eased to average \$10.50/kg down \$1.53/kg month-on-month but was \$1.62/kg above the June 2021 price.

Heart prices were up from last month, averaging \$3.00/kg, to be 53¢/kg below year-ago levels but 46¢/kg above the May price. Halal hearts averaged \$3.25/kg, firming 2¢/kg month-on-month but down 82¢/kg from June 2021.



Kidneys were again not reported.

Halal lungs averaged \$4.48/kg, up 88¢/kg year-on-year but 49¢/kg lower than last month.

### Beef offal trends continued...

Liver prices averaged \$1.89kg, down 2¢/kg month-on-month but 32¢/kg firmer than year-ago levels. Halal livers were 8¢/kg down on last month's price to average \$1.93/kg up 21¢/kg on last year prices.




## Japanese and Korean Offals

Tongue prices were \$2.45/kg down from May to average \$16.90/kg and were \$5.37/kg below year-ago levels.

Thick skirt was \$1.41/kg firmer year-on-year and 28¢/kg higher than last month, averaging \$10.47/kg. Thin skirt also averaged \$10.47 to be 84/kg above last month and 96¢/kg firmer year-on-year.

Rumen pillars firmed with heavy weight product averaging \$11.40/kg, up 23¢/kg month-on-month but \$1.41/kg lower than June 2021 levels.

## Tails and Tendons

Tail prices fell 50¢/kg from last month, averaging \$15.63/kg, to be 7¢/kg below year-ago levels. Halal tails averaged \$15.78/kg, down 46¢/kg from last month but \$1.33/kg above year-ago prices. Tendons were not reported.



# **Sheep Co-products**

Sheep offal prices were firmer.

### Sheep offal

Sheep hearts averaged \$5.78/kg, up 86¢/kg month-on-month and \$1.79/kg dearer than year-ago levels. Sheep kidneys were reported at \$4.72/kg which was 4¢/kg above the May average but \$1.40 down year-on-year. Sheep liver averaged \$1.89/kg to be 73¢/kg softer month-on-month and 7¢/kg lower than June 2021.

Sheep tripe averaged \$3.40/kg to be \$2.10 down from June 2021 but 23¢/kg above last month . Long cut tongues were not reported.




Figure 8: Trends in sheep offal prices

Lamb runners averaged \$7.07/piece firming 49¢/piece year-on-year but 7¢/piece down from May while sheep runners were reported at \$6.07/piece, down 34¢/piece month-on-month but up 34¢/piece year-on-year.



# **Pharmaceutical products**


Pharmaceutical products remained steady.

The average foetal calf blood price has firmed \$80/litre year-on-year to average \$610/litre, but was \$5.00/litre down from last month.



### Concentrated gall averaged \$24.50 to be \$1.75/kg up on June 2021 price and 25/kg softer month-on-month..

# **Rendered products**

Rendered products remained bouyant while tallow prices remain very strong based on biofuel demand from Singapore and the USA coupled with reduced production.



The price for 50% protein MBM firmed \$22/tonne from last month, averaging \$773/tonne which was \$91/tonne above June 2021 levels. Blood meal averaged \$1297/tonne, up \$228/tonne compared with last year's price and \$17/tonne firmer month-on-month.

Tallow prices remain firm, with the price for 1% FFA tallow averaging \$2450/tonne, up \$870/tonne from June 2021 and \$62/tonne above last month's price.



# **Hides**

The hide market continues to ease further with orders difficult to finalise whilst shipping and energy costs continue to rise. Market recovery is expected to take quite some time with high stock levels of raw material on hand.

Local prices for hides were softer across the board and remain under strong downward pressure.




### Figure 13: Trends in hide prices (East Coast Ex Works)
