




# Co-product market report

## **Beef Co-products**

Beef offal prices in October were mixed across all items with halal tails showing a downward trend whilst aorta showed a sharp upturn.



#### Head offal

Head meat averaged \$6.85/kg which was \$1,48/kg higher year-on-year but but even with last month. Cheek meat was \$3.60/kg dearer than year-ago levels, averaging \$13.20/kg, down 30¢/kg month-on-month.


Lip export prices to the US and Mexico eased 15¢/kg month-on-month, averaging \$4.45/kg to be 34¢/kg down on last year. Halal lips averaged \$6.01/kg to be 98¢/kg firmer than October 2021 and 85¢/kg higher than last month.



#### Beef offal trends

Omasum firmed 40¢/kg from last month, to average \$8.90/kg, up \$1.53/kg from year-ago prices. Halal omasum averaged \$9.00/kg, up \$1.77/kg year-on-year but \$1.20/kg softer month-on month correcting a sharp spike last month.

Halal tripe pieces averaged \$2.57/kg up 57¢/kg year-on-year but 6¢/kg lower than last month. Non-halal tripe pieces averaged \$2.47/kg to be 36¢/kg firmer year-on-year but 10¢/kg lower month-on-month. Honeycomb tripe averaged \$8.10/kg to be 93¢/kg above year ago prices and 10¢/kg up on last month.




#### Beef offal trends continued...

Aorta eased to average \$13.23/kg up \$4.08/kg month-on-month and was \$3.41/kg above the October 2021 price.

Heart prices were up from last month, averaging \$2.96/kg, to be 68¢/kg below year-ago levels but 50¢/kg above the September price. Halal hearts averaged \$3.38/kg, easing 3¢/kg month-on-month and down 23¢/kg from October 2021.






Kidneys were not reported this month.

Halal lungs averaged 3.79/kg, down 20¢/kg year-on-year and 59¢/kg lower than last month. Non-halal lungs returned 1.90/kg to be 61¢/kg below October 2021 but even month-on-month.


Figure 4: Trends in beef offal prices



#### Beef offal trends continued...

Liver prices averaged \$1.89kg, even month-on-month and 19¢/kg firmer than year-ago levels. Halal livers were 29¢/kg down on last month's price to average \$1.81/kg down 8¢/kg on last year prices.

Figure 5: Trends in beef offal prices




### Japanese and Korean Offals

Tongue was not reported.

Thick skirt was 70¢/kg firmer year-on-year but \$1.03/kg lower than last month, averaging \$10.70/kg. Thin skirt averaged \$11.67/kg to be 23¢/kg below last month but \$1.62/kg firmer year-on-year.

Rumen pillars eased with heavy weight product averaging \$10.38/kg, down 79¢/kg month-on-month but \$3.12/kg lower than October 2021 levels.


Figure 6: Trends in Japanese offal prices



#### Tails and Tendons

Tail prices firmed 20¢/kg from last month, averaging \$11.50/kg, to be \$7.40/kg below year-ago levels. Halal tails averaged \$10.75/kg, down \$1.24/kg from last month and \$7.61/kg below year-ago prices. Tendons averaged \$12.90/kg to be \$3.40/kg higher year-on-year and \$1.00/kg up from last month.

## **Sheep Co-products**

Sheep offal prices were mixed this month.


#### Sheep offal

Sheep hearts averaged \$5.85/kg, up 9¢/kg month-on-month and \$1.47/kg dearer than year-ago levels. Sheep kidneys were reported at \$4.08/kg which was 71¢/kg below the September average and \$1.97/kg down year-on-year. Sheep liver averaged \$2.85/kg to be 34¢/kg firmer month-on-month and 77¢/kg higher than October 2021.

Sheep tripe was not reported.

Long cut tongues were reported at \$6.90/kg up \$1.20/kg from a year ago but 45¢/kg lower than last month.

Lamb runners averaged \$7.13/piece firming 43¢/piece year-on-year and 3¢/piece firmer than September while sheep runners were reported at \$6,13/piece, up 10¢/piece month-on-month and 50¢/piece higher year-on-year.

Pharmaceutical products were mixed this month.

The average foetal calf blood price has firmed \$90/litre year-on-year to average \$612.50/litre, which was \$2.50/litre down from last month.

Concentrated gall averaged \$25.50/kg to be \$1.00/kg up on September 2021 price but even month-on-month.

### **Rendered products**

Rendered products remained buoyant while tallow prices remain very strong based on biofuel demand from Singapore and the USA.



The price for 50% protein MBM eased \$76/tonne from last month, averaging \$660/tonne which was \$76/tonne below October 2021 levels. Blood meal averaged \$1162/tonne, up \$8.50/tonne compared with last year's price but \$166.50/tonne softer month-on-month.

Tallow prices remain firm, with the price for 1% FFA tallow averaging \$2620/tonne, up \$557/tonne from October 2021 and \$184/tonne above last month's price to set a new record price.

### **Hides**

This month's market news is a continuation of previous months, that is, supply and demand are out of balance with many more hides available than tanners can use for leather orders. Rising interest rates, inflation, and cost of living pressures are taking a toll on the leather business, especially on the shoe and furniture sectors.



Local prices for hides were steady across the board and remain very weak.


Figure 13: Trends in hide prices (East Coast Ex Works)
