# Fast Facts

## Australia's beef industry

## The industry turnover of the beef cattle farming sector in 2020–21 was \$23.2 billion and accounted for 34% of the total industry turnover in that year (*MLA State of the Industry Report – 2022*).

At the time of publication, figures included in this document were the most up to date available but may be subject to revision.

#### Herd facts and figures:

- There are 52,421 agricultural businesses involved in the cattle industry (*MLA State of the Industry Report 2022*)
- 24.4 million head of cattle (including dairy cattle) in Australia as of June 2022 (Australian Bureau of Statistics, 2023).

#### People in the industry:

• Around 192,000 people are directly employed in the red meat industry, including on-farm production, processing and retail (*MLA State of the Industry Report – 2022*).

#### How much is produced?


- In 2022, Australia produced approximately 1.87 million tonnes carcase weight (cwt) of beef and veal (ABS)
- In 2022, 2.7 million grainfed cattle were marketed (feedlot turn-off) 47% of all adult cattle slaughtered, a new record, which is 11% above the 10-year average. (ALFA/MLA Quarterly Lot Feeding brief).

#### What is the value of production?


- The gross value of Australian cattle and calf production (including live cattle exports) in 2022–23 is forecast at A\$14 billion (ABARES Agricultural Commodities Outlook, March 2023).
- Cattle are estimated to have contributed 30% of the total farm value of A\$69 billion in 2020–2021 (*MLA State of the Industry Report 2021*).

#### Domestic value and consumption:

- Domestic expenditure on beef was approximately A\$11.6 billion in 2022 (MLA estimate).
- Australians ate around 19.2kg of beef per person in 2020 (*MLA State of the Industry Report 2022*).



### Australia's beef industry

#### Export value and volume:

- In 2022, Australian beef exports totalled 854,000 tonnes swt, down 4% year-on-year (DAFF).
- The value of total beef and veal exports in 2022 was A\$10.4 billion (MLA).
- Australian live cattle exports totalled 602,000 head exported, down 22% from 2021 (DAFF).

#### Australia's top five beef and veal export markets in 2022





#### Australia's place in the world:

- Australia has approximately 1.5% of the world's cattle herd in 2021. (MLA State of the Industry Report - 2022).
- Australia is the 4th largest beef exporter in the world behind Brazil, India and the US (MLA State of the Industry Report - 2022).




