



Lot feeding brief

Results for the September quarter 2019 feedlot survey

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November 2019

■ Cattle on feed numbers reported a modest, 28,000 head decline in the September 2019 quarter, to 1,119,329 head. The number of cattle on feed has been sustained over one million head for the sixth consecutive guarter.

■ Despite an overall decline in the number of cattle on feed, both NSW and Queensland feedlots reported increases of 5,000 and 7,400 head respectively, from the June 2019 quarter.

■ Feeders were the driving force of cattle price movements in the September quarter, with feeder buyers of EYCI eligible cattle trading at an average premium of 53¢ to restockers. Competition for young cattle throughout the lot feeding sector has been buoyed by the robust value of finished cattle throughout 2019.

■ The national saleyard feeder steer indicator averaged 294¢/kg live weight (lwt) in the September quarter, an increase of 4% from the previous quarter and 5% above year-ago levels.

■ The Queensland 100-day grainfed steer OTH indicator rose 11% year-on-year to average 589¢/kg cwt in the September quarter. Throughout the quarter, the indicator steadily increased to be in line with record prices set in October 2016. Strong export demand for grainfed beef, particularly in Asian markets, has seen prices for finished cattle improve throughout the year.

Figure 1: Cattle on feed

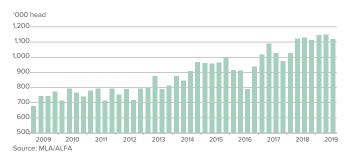


Figure 2: Quarterly grainfed beef exports

■ For the September quarter, wheat ex-Darling Downs averaged \$401/tonne, while barley averaged \$400/tonne, representing a decline of 7% and 6% year-on-year, respectively. Grain prices have seen an overall decline from the beginning of 2019, however remain elevated compared to historical levels.

■ During the September quarter the A\$ averaged US69¢, back 2% from the June quarter. Throughout the quarter, the A\$ fluctuated within the US67-71¢ trading band. Trade talks between the US and China, the strength of Australia's economy, as well as RBA interest rate decisions remain key factors to watch moving forward.

■ Australian grainfed beef exports totalled 81,233 tonnes shipped weight (swt) for the September quarter, a decline of 2% from the same quarter last year, yet 2% above the June 2019 quarter.

Figure 3: Grainfed cattle turn-off

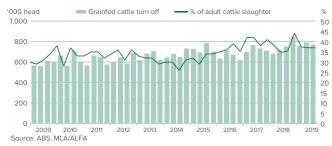


Figure 4: Feed grain and feeder steer prices

■ Grainfed exports to China increased 45% year-on-year to 19,990 tonnes swt for the September quarter. The underlying demand for red meat in China, fuelled by the African Swine Fever (ASF) outbreak has helped support grainfed exports across all product categories.

■ Volumes to Japan eased 14% year-on-year for the September quarter, totalling 35,318 tonnes swt, while grainfed exports to Korea declined 16% from year-ago levels to 13,973 tonnes swt. Increased competition, as higher volumes of US beef enter both markets, has impacted Australian shipments.
