

# Lot feeding brief

### Results for the September quarter 2023 feedlot survey

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#### **Summary**

- Numbers on feed continued an upward trend, increasing by 1,545 to 1,258,377 head. This small increase made the September quarter the second highest cattle on feed volume on record, only behind Q1 2022.
- Capacity figures increased to highest on record at 1,576,858, with utilisation at 80%.
- Quarterly turnoff fell by 10%, to 618,017 head in the September quarter, the lowest quarterly turnoff figure since Q4 2013.

#### From the previous quarter:

- In Q3 2023, numbers on feed remained relatively stable in most states. NSW and SA saw small increases of 3% and 1% respectively. There was a small drop of 5% in Victoria.
- WA numbers on feed fell by 42% from the June quarter to 30,405 head, the lowest figure in the state since September 2021.
- For the second quarter in a row, Queensland recorded its highest number of cattle on feed on record, rising by 2% to 774,052 head.
- Capacity figures in each state were steady, though nationally increasing by 21,231. Utilisation rates kept at 80%, just above the 5-year utilisation average (79%).

Figure 1: Cattle on feed

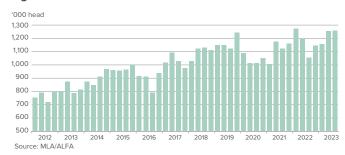


Figure 2: Quarterly grainfed beef exports

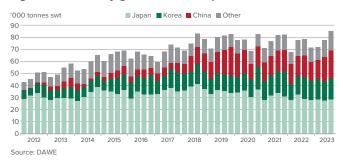

#### **Grainfed exports**

- Grainfed beef exports increased by 10% to 85,050 tonnes, making Q3 2023 the largest quarter on record.
- After easing in Q2, Japan and South Korea markets recovered, increasing by 3% and 10% respectively.
- Exports to China maintained growth for the third quarter in a row to 22,998 tonnes, a 30% increase year on year, making this the second largest export quarter on record.
- Japan remained Australia's largest market for grain fed cattle making up 33% of total export volumes, though down 10% on the 5-year average. The Korean market maintains a 21% market share, and China's market share is up 5% on 5-year averages to 27%.
- Despite record grainfed exports, the grain fed beef share of total meat exports dropped last quarter due to elevated grassfed supply hitting markets.

## Domestic feeder cattle price, supply and weights

- The NLRS feeder steer indicator dropped 46 cents quarter on quarter, with a -42% change year on year.
- Feeder steer head count through saleyards was up, reaching 80,397 head, a 23% increase on yardings year on year.
- Average feeder steer weights have remained relatively stable at 408kg/head, 8kg lower than the June quarter.

Figure 3: Grainfed cattle turn-off

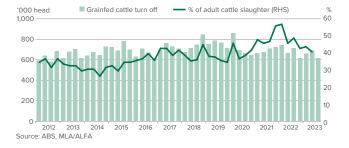
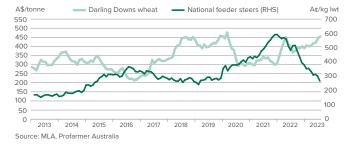


Figure 4: Feed grain and feeder steer prices



#### **Grain prices**

- Darling Downs wheat prices rose for the third quarter in a row, growing by 8% to \$439/tonne.
- Compared with year-ago levels, Q3 2022 was 13%, or \$49/ tonne lower than the current guarter.
