Live export statistics

This edition of LiveLink includes the latest trends in Australian live export trade statistics and prices. Please note that all export data over the past nine months may later be revised.

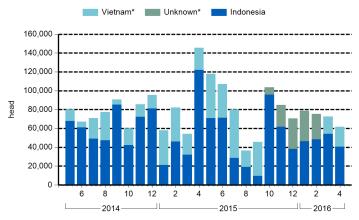

At the end of the first trimester (T1 - January to April), Australian live cattle exports (feeder, slaughter, breeder) were estimated at just over 411,500 head, down 6% from the corresponding period last year.

Over the T1 period, live cattle exports to **Indonesia** were just over 192,200 head, down 13% from the year prior. Looking forward, technical recommendations by the Indonesian Ministry of Agriculture have been put forward, requesting approval for an allocation in the T2 period (May-August) of 250,000 head (feeder cattle), with import permits officially issued by the Indonesian Ministry of Trade in early May. After the first four months of the year, exports to **Vietnam** (feeder, slaughter, breeder cattle) were estimated to have totalled more than 90,000 head.

As the Northern Australian wet season came to a close, increased cattle numbers resulted in lower average live export prices in the later stages of April and into May. In April, **Feeder steers** delivered to **Darwin** averaged 303c/kg lwt, while steers destined for the same markets delivered to **Townsville** averaged 283c/kg lwt.

Data specifications

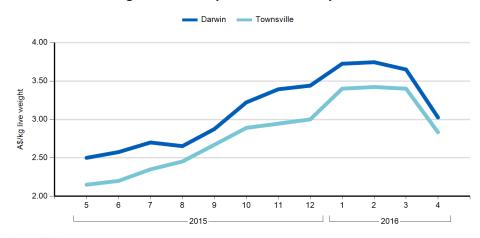
Due to the timing of live export trade data being released, both Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) and Department of Agriculture and Water Resources (DAWR) data is used in this report. The most recent month and, at times, second most recent month trade data comes from DAWR. This data is then updated when ABS data is released.

* During the period October 2015 to February 2016, the ABS did not disclose feeder and slaughter cattle trade data to Vietnam, China and Japan. However, the vast majority of these cattle were destined for Vietnam. In addition, trade data by individual port was also not disclosed over this period. The trade data by destination and by port over this period is aggregated into the "Unknown" category.

** DAWR does not report on individual ports. Port data is updated when released by the ABS.

All pricing data is collected by Meat and Livestock Australia from a range of sources.

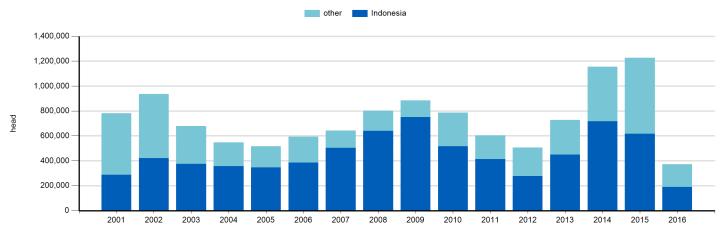
Figure 2 Live export feeder cattle prices

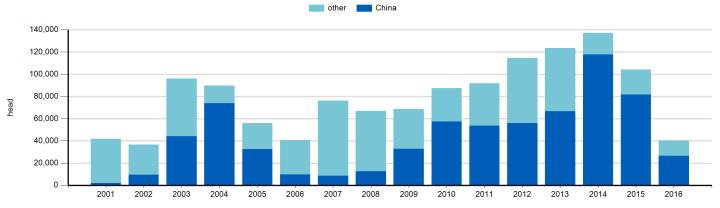

Figure 5 Sheep exports by region - past 12 months

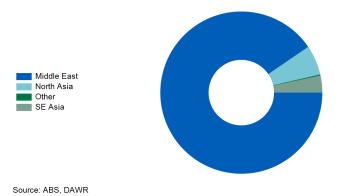
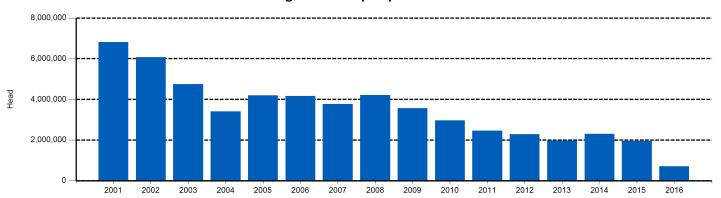


Figure 6 WA live export wether price

LiveLink - May 2016

At the end of the first trimester (T1 – January to April), Australian sheep exports were up 36% from the same period the year prior, at just over 798,802 head. Kuwait continued to dominate volume, with just under 250,000 head imported so far this year – almost increasing threefold from the year prior. Most of the change is explained by **Kuwait** taking sheep that would have otherwise gone to Bahrain which imported 110,000 head in T1 in 2015 and zero in T1 2016. This significant change in volume demonstrates the depth in Kuwait's demand for Australian sheep meat.

Additionally, for the January to April period exports to **Qatar** increased 98%, to 188,000 head, while shipments to the **UAE** declined significantly year-on-year, to just over 42,600 head. **Oman** was another exception at 85,200 head in T1 compared to 9,000 head for the same period last year. Additionally, exports to **Bahrain** have continued to suffer greatly from the removal of the import subsidy, with no recorded shipments since September last year.





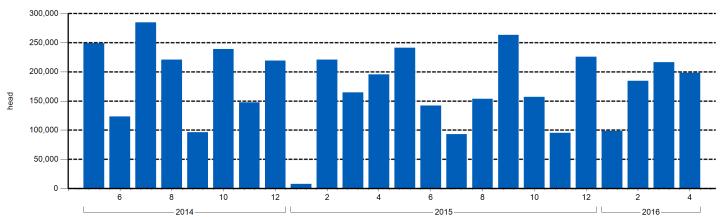

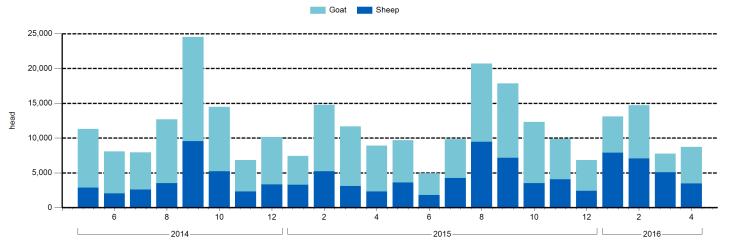
Figure 9 Sheep exports

Figure 10 Goat and sheep exports to Malaysia & Singapore



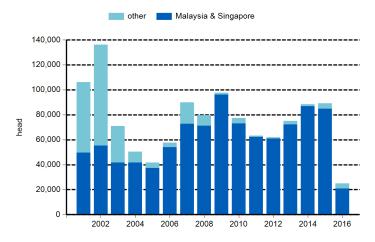

For the January to April period, goat exports declined 16% from the corresponding period the year prior at just over 25,000 head. Although declining (27%) year-onyear, live goat exports to Malaysia continued as the most prominent market destination after the first four months of the year, at just over 20,800 head. Exports to the UAE, a new airfreight market, reached almost 3,300 head, of which over 2,000 were supplied in March alone.
